





SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

This week we conclude our study of beautiful Livingston County during its 200th year bicentennial.

Last week we studied the third and fourth towns which were added after our beautiful county was established. This week we study the last and seventeenth town.

The Town of Ossian is the southernmost town in our county. "Ossian" was the blind narrator and purported 3rd Century author of a cycle of extremely popular epic poems published by the Scottish poet James Macpherson in 1761.

The Ossian area was first settled about 1804 near Ossian Center. The Town of Ossian was formed on Friday, March 11, 1808, from the Town of Angelica, while it was part of Allegany County. Ossian became part of Livingston County in 1856.

Part of the western town line and the southern town line are the border of Allegany County. Part of the east town line is the border of Steuben County. New York State Route 436 is a highway across the northern part of the town. Sugar Creek flows northeast near the center of the town.

The Hamlet of Ossian Center is located near the center of the town. The Hamlet of Westview is located on the northwest corner of the town on NY Route 436. The Rattlesnake Hill Wildlife Management Area is a state conservation area located in the western part of the town.

The first settlement was made by Judge Richard W. Porter, and his brother, James Porter, who migrated from New Jersey in 1804. Luther Bisbee was an early settler in the northwest corner of the town. The first child born in Ossian was Abraham Porter in 1805. Other early settlers were James Haynes and James Croghan who settled about 1806.

The first death was that of John Turner, who was killed by the fall of a tree in 1807. Jacob Clendenin settled in 1807. The first sawmill was built by Nathaniel Porter in 1808. Orrison Cleveland and William and John Gould and Heman Orton settled about 1810. Weston taught the first school in 1813 and 1814.

The first marriage was that of John Gelson and Betsey Shay in 1816. Oliver Stacy kept the first inn in 1817. The first church, Presbyterian, began on Tuesday, September 29, 1818. Daniel Canfield kept the first store in 1824. The first grist mill was built by John Smith in 1826. Notable person: Jacob Bisbee was born and lived in Ossian until 1858. He was one of the first rural musicians to produce a record.

We have concluded our study of our beautiful Livingston County. I would like to take this opportunity to wish Livingston County a very happy 200th Birthday as we near the end of 2021.

I would also like to suggest that you contact our wonderful historians with questions you may have or with information you may wish to share with them to enhance their libraries.

You will find three books very informative, and they are "A History of Livingston County" by Lockwood R. Doty – 1876 and 1925 and the "History of Livingston County" by James H. Smith – 1881.

You may wish to ask your local school district as to what they teach about our county. I would truly enjoy any comments or memories you may have of our county's history. It is very, very important to preserve our history as the primary purpose of history is to demonstrate the victories and errors of the past to assist us with our future. Ron Powell







Dangers of Indoor Tanning

During these cold winter months, some people choose to use tanning beds and booths. Once thought of as a "safe alternative" to natural sunlight, indoor tanning booths are just as dangerous as the sun to skin health. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) publicizes the dangers of indoor tanning and busts these

- common myths. Did you know:
- A base tan is not a safe tan.
 - Myth: A tan acts as the body's natural protection against sunburn.

Truth: A tan is the body's response to injury from UV rays, showing that damage has been done. It does little to protect you from future UV exposure.

• Tanned skin is not healthy skin.

Myth: Tanning gives people a "healthy glow."

Truth: Whether tanning or burning, you are exposing yourself to harmful UV rays that damage your skin. Every time you tan, you increase your risk of melanoma.

Controlled tanning is not safe tanning.

Myth: Indoor tanning is safe because you can control your level of exposure to UV rays.

Truth: Indoor tanning exposes you to intense UV rays, increasing your risk of melanoma – one of the most common cancers in people younger than 30 (especially younger women).

Skin cancer is the most common of all cancer types, and the number of cases has been climbing over the past decade. Today, more than 5 million skin cancers are diagnosed each year in the United States. That's more than all other cancers combined. The best way to protect yourself from skin cancer is to limit your exposure to UV rays, whether they come from the sun or from man-made sources such as indoor tanning beds.

- Avoid tanning beds and sunlamps. Both can cause serious long-term skin damage and contribute to skin cancer.
- Cover up. When you are out in the sun, wear clothing and a wide-brimmed hat to protect as much skin as possible. Protect your eyes with sunglasses that block at least 99 percent of UV light.
- Use sunscreen with "broad spectrum" protection and a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 30. Be sure to reapply at least every 2 hours, as well as after swimming or sweating. And always follow the directions on the label.
- Seek shade. Limit your direct exposure to the sun, especially between the hours of 10 am and 4 pm, when UV rays are strongest.
