## 2 nursing students earn \$2K scholarships at LTC

Two nursing students at Lakeshore Technical College have been awarded scholarships by the Wisconsin League for Nursing.

Pietje Markus received a \$2,000 Bader Philanthropies, Inc. Gerontology Pre-Licensure Scholarship. Courtney Hunn received a \$1,000 Pre-Licensure Associate Degree Nursing Deaconess Scholarship.

Markus and Hunn are among 19 recipients from around the state. The scholarships were issued based on program of study, interest in gerontology and mental health specialties, future nurse educators and general nursing focus.

Markus is a Nursing-Associate Degree Program student. She earned her Nursing Assistant Technical Diploma at LTC in 2005. She is employed as an emergency department technician at Aurora Sheboygan Memorial Medical Center and expects to graduate from LTC in May 2023.

Hunn, a Whitelaw resident, is also a Nursing-Associate Degree student. She anticipates graduating in May 2023.

"We are very proud of our students and all they achieve. Knowing how competitive these scholarships are, we were especially excited to see that Pietje and Courtney were the only two-year college students selected. They are excellent representations of the high caliber nursing education students receive here at Lakeshore Technical College," said LTC Dean of Nursing Michelle Zautner.

# Lakeland program aids students, employers

When students graduate from high school, they often think they need to choose between work and college.

Lakeland University has created a new program with major local employers that lets students do both.

Lakeland's Learn & Earn Program allows new members at partner companies to complete a full year of college while beginning their career at a company invested in their success. The three initial partner companies are Sargento, Masters Gallery Foods and Johnsonville, LLC.

The program is designed for upcoming or recent high school graduates who may want to earn a four-year degree, but because of a variety of reasons they have decided to enter the local workforce and not continue their education.

Learn & Earn leverages Lakeland's innovative Cooperative Education program, which allows students to earn academic credit for professional work experience along with their academic courses.

Lakeland will work with the student's employer to create a schedule that will allow them to balance their academic and career goals. Students in the Learn & Earn program will join a community of likeminded students who will be on the same academic and career journey.

"We want local high school graduates to understand that they don't have to pick between college or work, they can do both," said Rachel Carlton, dean of Lakeland's Kellett School for Undergraduate & Graduate Studies.

"And when individuals realize how affordable their education can be thanks to this partnership, it will truly open doors. Our Co-Op team is able to help individuals navigate the application process and help determine the types of careers individuals may be best suited for, leading to long-term success."

The program addresses the cost of school, which can be a barrier for many students and their families.

"By pairing Lakeland scholarships with competitive employer wages and tuition



benefits, students can start their career and finding an affordable way to complete a college degree," Carlton said. "Our program puts students in a position to graduate with little to no debt."

For the employers, the program is a new way to recruit members and expand their skill sets.

Johnsonville Owner Ralph Stayer said, "Other companies use their people to build a business, but at Johnsonville, we use our business to build our people."

Lakeland will assist students in choosing an employer partner that will be a match for their career goals. Lakeland's Co-Op team will help students navigate the application and on-boarding process with their chosen employer.

Upon hire, students will have a customized work schedule allowing them to work and take classes with a cohort of students who are on the same academic and career journey. Students will complete a full year of academic coursework, including Cooperative Education courses where students earn credit for their work-based learning.

The program follows a national trend of marrying work and going to school as a way for students to earn a college degree.

"With the cost out of reach for many families, a recent national study found that 74 percent of all parents of K-12 students would consider a route where their child would be hired directly out of high school by an employer that offers a college degree while working," Carlton said.

"One thing that has remained consistent is that college graduates on average earn more money during their lifetime and are less likely to be unemployed than those without a degree."







Our December Chamber Member Spotlight is Making Spirits Bright.

Making Spirits Bright was initiated in 2012 by the Sheboygan County Rotary Clubs to provide a quality, exciting, family event and to collect much needed pantry items. To accomplish that goal, Making Spirits Bright partners annually with the Sheboygan County Food Bank (Food Bank). The pantry donations received at Making Spirits Bright are presented to the Food Bank, thus assisting them with fulfilling their two-fold mission:

- · To feed the hungry through supporting and improving the food distribution system in Sheboygan County.
- · To guide individuals seeking assistance to appropriate resources to meet their other basic needs.


Donations from Making Spirits Bright are delivered nightly to the warehouse for

storage and later distributed to the ten individual food pantries that comprise the Food Bank as well as 29 other partners throughout Sheboygan County. Each pantry then distributes these goods locally to those who truly need them.

Over 3,500 households are served by the Food Bank and its partners each year. In addition to the dedicated pantry partners, a variety of smaller non-profit service organizations also benefit from donations such as Bridgeway & Beyond, Safe Harbor of Sheboygan, and Nourish Farms.

Making Spirits Bright is open to the public from 5 to 9 p.m. every night from Nov. 26 through Dec. 31 (closed Christmas Eve, Dec. 24). So there are 35 total nights for people to drive the route.








#### Tax rate decreased for 2021

The overall village tax rate decreased by \$.05 per \$1,000 of assessed value. Municipalities, counties and schools continue to do more with less. Over the last 10 years, the village has continued to hold its portion of the property taxes steady. If your house is assessed at \$200,000 your tax bill will decrease by approximately \$10, depending on the lottery credit and first dollar credit, which may mean an even greater decrease in taxes.

#### Preserve Apartment Development

The Village Board held a public hearing for a rezoning of the property

that would be used for the Preserve Apartment Development. After the public hearing, they approved a rezoning of the property at 604 S. Lincoln St. that would accommodate the apartment development proposal. The board also signed a letter of commitment to the project. These items were necessary for the development to apply for tax credits. General Capital and Danna Capital have applied for the tax credits and should hear back in April 2022 with a decision. The Planning Commission and Village Board will continue to work on this project over the coming months. The proposal is for two apartment buildings with approximately 110 units in total. There will be one building for workforce/affordable housing and one building that is market rate apartments. There are still a lot of pieces to this puzzle that will need to be negotiated and worked through for the project to go ahead. #### Mailbox placement and snow plowing

The U.S. Postal Service has guidelines to follow when placing your mailbox at your residence. The mailbox needs to be 41 to 45 inches from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox or the point of mail entry. The mailbox also needs to be six to eight inches back from the curb or curb line. Below is a drawing with these specifications. If your mailbox is damaged because of snow plowing and it does not meet the U.S. Postal Service guidelines, you will be responsible for any repairs or replacement that is needed.

#### **Snow Removal**

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period. Also, if you live at a corner intersection, remember you need to clear the sidewalk approaches to the streets.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto village streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.





# Elkhart Lake's Cody Schmitt becomes 4th to roll 900 series

Elkhart Lake native Cody Schmitt did something on the night of Tuesday, Nov. 16 which only three other people in state history have done.

Schmitt, 26, bowled a 900 series in the Tuesday Night League at Anchor Lanes—three consecutive perfect games, nothing but strikes.

It was only the 38th perfect 900 series verified by the U.S. Bowling Congress. It was the first time it has been done this year anywhere in the country.

Schmitt has now rolled 25 perfect games in his career and has 21 series in the 800s/900.


He said he rolled six warmup balls before his 900 series and all six of those were strikes as well. His next miss came two nights later when he left a 10-pin on his first ball in his Thursday league but still finished with an 853. He then rolled an 837 the following Tuesday.

Schmitt's previous high series had been an 879 in 2020, and he had an 859 in 2018.

He accomplished the perfect series on the final pair of lanes at Anchor Lanes, 11 and 12. That was where John Reiss rolled an 899 in 2000.

Schmitt's family has owned the lanes for about nine years. He officially has been running the Firehouse Pro Shop inside the center since the summer of 2019. He bowls as much as five times per week in addition to coaching the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School varsity bowling team.

As manager of the pro shop, Schmitt has access to new bowling balls a week or two before they are made available to the public. The ball he used to roll his 900 was still three days away from full release. But he said with a laugh that he was not in charge of oiling the lanes on the night of his 900 and that his dad will vouch for that.

# EL First Responders purchase ambulance

The Elkhart Lake First Responders have purchased an ambulance.

This volunteer group was looking for a vehicle to get personnel and equipment to various calls throughout the community. When this ambulance became available they recognized the opportunity to improve the services they can provide. The purchase could not have taken place without the support and very generous donation from Elkhart Cares.

The ambulance will be used at any call where specialized equipment may be needed. For example, at a car accident the emergency lighting on the vehicle will help to keep the scene visible for the safety of responders as well as any patients involved. The First Responders will also use the vehicle on fire calls to monitor the health of firefighters, and to transport training aids to CPR classes that are held throughout the community.

The new rig will allow for shelter from inclement weather conditions. "We've had several calls involving heat-related issues at the parade and the triathlon. Having a mobile space that is temperature controlled could be a real life saver," Michael Meeusen, service director of the First Responders, said. "This will be an invaluable tool to help us provide emergency care to the residents of the town and village, and we are very grateful for the support from Elkhart Cares that made it possible."
