# NESSAGE TO DICKINSON COUNTY PROPERTY TAXPAYERS

For many years your Taxpayer Association thought that if we encouraged local governments to hold their levy rate steady we were doing a good job. We are now

aware we have been looking at the issue of rising property taxes from the wrong perspective. The rapidly rising value of real estate is the real culprit causing our rapidly increasing property taxes. One would think new construction – particularly in Dickinson County – would supply enough

new property tax revenue to offset the impacts of inflation. We were wrong. A quick look at the trend of your property taxes will confirm that increasing valuations have been driving your property taxes higher.

The County Assessor cannot hold local property taxes down. Iowa law will penalize the Assessor who does not keep local property assessments in line with rising property values demonstrated by the property sales in the past year. The increasing property value will help your net worth, but that only helps you when you sell your property.

When your property tax bill arrives in August it is too late to do anything about the amount of your property tax. During the winter and spring are your best opportunities to have an impact on the amount of your property taxes.

**WINTER MONTHS** During January, February, and March the local taxing jurisdictions hold budget meetings to set their budgets for the coming fiscal year. For now that would be – **FY2023** – beginning July 1, 2022. The major local taxing jurisdictions are school districts, cities, county, and sanitary sewer district – in that order. Iowa law requires each government entity to go through a four step process to set their budget for the coming year:

- 1. Estimate the spending for the current fiscal year FY2022 that ends June 30, 2022.
- Determine the amount of existing property tax plus the new taxable valuations to arrive at a new higher taxable valuation amount. (The taxable valuations includes existing property valuations, new construction, and the added value added to existing property by the County Assessor based on the March 2021 taxpayer revaluation notices.)
- 3. Determine the amount of money needed to operate their government entity for the coming fiscal year FY2023. (During this budget setting process local governments are very mindful about not setting their operating budget so high that it causes an increase in the levy rate. Unfortunately, the higher assessed valuations caused by new construction and the added value from the assessor reassessment process provides a sizable increase in their operating budgets, without changing the levy rate. This is particularly true for high value lakeshore communities.)
- 4. Hold a Public Budget Hearing, that is noticed in advance, to receive public comments about the amount of tax dollars being requested to operate that public entity for FY2023

Each taxing jurisdiction in Iowa must report its FY2023 operating budget requirements to the County Auditor by March 30th (April 15th for school districts). The amount of the FY2023 operating budget will be used by the County Auditor to establish the levy rates for their taxing jurisdiction. Your levy rate is the total of all the levy rates that cover your property location.

**MARCH OF ODD YEARS (2021 & 2023)** During March of odd numbered calendar years the County Assessor must provide a written notice to each property owner of the assessed value of their property. During March the taxpayer can ask questions about this valuation increase or decrease (more likely an increase). If the taxpayer wants to file a protest about the valuation of their property they must file a written protest by the end of April of that year (2021). Your protest must show that a similar property to yours in the community is taxed at a lower rate. Broad complaints about high property taxes are ineffective. Your opportunity to file a written protest about your March 2021 property tax valuations is long since passed.

Your best way to control the level of property taxes is to communicate your concern about the level of property taxes to the officials that operate the government where your property is located.

- SCHOOL DISTRICTS Superintendent and School Board Members
- **CITIES** Mayor and City Council Members
- COUNTY Board of Supervisors (particularly the Supervisor for your district)
- SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT Superintendent and Board of Trustees

Most of these officials stand for election every two-four years or are appointed by these elected officials. They should be interested in your concerns. Budget discussions occur during January and February during regularly scheduled meetings. Sometimes Special Budget meetings are scheduled, but either way a Public Notice must be made several day in advance of the meeting, if two or more decision makers are present. During March a Public Notice regarding a Budget Hearing - required by Iowa Law - will be announced. You should make your feelings known about government spending in January and February, because by March the budget has already been finalized. Your Taxpayer Association can and does attend some of these budget meetings. The Taxpayer Association is not as effective as a taxpayer from that community.

Third, the local Farm Service Agency Director for each county will provide current information related to financial assistance available for cow-calf producers.

Paul was lured away from Parker Pen by former U.S. Representative for Iowa's sixth congressional district and former CEO Berkley Bedell (1921-2019) to become Research Director at Berkley and Company headquartered in Spirit Lake, Iowa. Paul moved his family to a very small and beautiful lowa town surrounded by five blue water lakes where he immersed himself in the process of creating innovative fishing lines, ski tow ropes, and fishing rods. He regularly enjoyed the many hunting and fishing opportunities found in the Iowa Great Lakes area.

Not one to settle down, after his retirement, Paul entered local politics where he served three terms as an elected Supervisor for the Dickinson County Board of Supervisors (2003-2018). 





### So Close, Yet Sill L's

Our big week of sports in the State of Iowa ended with a thud with all three big games ending in tough losses. Iowa State started the disappointments with a hard-fought 20-13 loss to #19 Clemson in the Cheez-It Bowl on Wednesday in Orlando. The Cyclones showed that they could go toe-to-toe with a program who has been in the last six College Football Playoffs, but playing without All-Americans Breece Hall and Mike Rose put the Cyclones behind the 8-ball from the start in a game where they were playing against mostly four and five-star recruits. As they have done all season, Iowa State dug themselves a hole through turnovers and missed opportunities, trailing 20-3 after a pick-six by a batted Brock Purdy pass midway through the third quarter. Also, as they have done all season, this Cyclone team kept fighting, trimming that lead to 20-13 and having one last shot to tie or win the game on the final possession. Unfortunately, the game ended much like many of the other six ISU losses in heartbreak, as Brock Purdy fumbled backwards on a fourth down play in which he had the first down near midfield but the ball went backwards to make it a turnover on downs and give Clemson their 10th victory of the season. It was encouraging to see so many young players step up and play well for the Cyclones, and also to see that the talent gap between a top-five program like Clemson and ISU is not that wide. I felt horrible for the senior class, particularly Purdy, who was simply trying to make a big play at the end but will sadly remember the fumble instead of all the big plays he made to keep ISU in the game. This class was definitely the best football class to play at Iowa State and they have definitely left the program in much better shape than when they entered it five years ago.

Orlando continued to be cruel to Iowans as Iowa lost a heart-breaker in the Citrus Bowl on Saturday 20-17 to Kentucky. This was a game of halves as Kentucky looked like they may run away from the Hawkeyes in the first half, taking a 13-3 lead into the break that could have easily been at least 20-3. Iowa did not back down at all in the second half and definitely looked like the better team, jumping back in the game on an Arland Bruce end-around run for a touchdown to trim the lead to 13-10. Iowa's defense stiffened and continued to sack (six times) Kentucky QB Will Levis while putting the offense in great field position with a string of dominant possessions. The Hawks would take their first lead of the game with 10:54 left on a short pass that tight end Sam LaPorte turned into a 36-yard TD with some great blocking by Iowa's line that escorted LaPorte into the end zone. It appeared the Hawks had the game won after a big fourth down stop, but the Hawks went conservative and punted on 4th and inches with 3:30 left in the game, giving the Wildcats one last chance. Levis took advantage of that, connecting with former Husker Wandale Robinson for a big play that put Kentucky at the Iowa one-yard line, and star running back Chris Rodriguez would put the Wildcats ahead with a six-yard scamper where he broke a tackle in the backfield on his way to breaking the Hawkeyes hearts. Iowa would have one last chance to win or tie the game with 1:48 remaining but Spencer Petras was hit as he passed with Iowa in Kentucky territory and the ball was intercepted for the third time of the day, securing the Wildcat's 10th win of the season. Iowa finishes with an impressive 10-4 record, but two straight losses to end the season will sting a bit, and a lot of what-ifs with a less-than impressive offense that

#8 Iowa State and #1 Baylor were locked up in a Big 12 battle between two of the four remaining undefeated teams in the nation. Baylor is the defending National Champion and they look like they're primed to defend that title with a roster that is loaded with length, athleticism, skill and toughness. Iowa State went toe-to-toe with the Bears but was unable to take them down, falling 77-72 before a raucous crowd at Hilton Coliseum. Baylor led most of the game, with their largest lead being at 14 in the second half but the Cyclones would not go away and had a chance to trim the lead to three with :30 left but a Caleb Grill three-pointer rattled in and out. Iowa State got a huge performance from Kansas transfer Tristan Enaruna, who scored a career high 23 points to go along with eight rebounds, and also got another solid game from star Izaiah Brockington, who added 18 points and eight boards. The Cyclones nearly took down the number one team in the nation while shooting just 1/14from three-point land and also committing 17 turnovers. This team continues to guard at an elite level and play well together, and when their guards are shooting it more consistently, they will have a chance to beat anyone in the country, especially at the rejuvenated Hilton Coliseum!

# Deadline Extended to Apply for Pandemic Support for Certified Organic and Transitioning Operations The U.S. Department of Agriculture Crop and livestock operations tran- and handlers of agricultural products

(USDA) has extended the deadline for agricultural producers who are certified organic, or transitioning to organic, to apply for the Organic and Transitional Education and Certification Program (OTECP). This program provides pandemic assistance to cover certification and education expenses. The deadline to apply for 2020 and 2021 eligible expenses is now February 4, 2022, rather than the original deadline of January 7.2022

"We listened to feedback from our stakeholders and are happy to provide organic producers, and those transitioning their operations, enough time to learn about the program and complete the application," said Zach Ducheneaux, FSAAdministrator.

Signup for OTECP, administered by USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA), began Nov. 8.

Program Background - Certified operations and transitional operations may apply for OTECP for eligible expenses paid during the 2020, 2021 and 2022 fiscal years. Signup for the 2022 fiscal year will be announced at a later date.

For each year, OTECP covers 25% of a certified operation's eligible certification expenses, up to \$250 per certification category (crop, livestock, wild crop, handling and State Organic Program fee). This includes application fees, inspection fees, USDA organic certification costs, state organic program fees and more.

sitioning to organic production may be eligible for 75% of a transitional operation's eligible expenses, up to \$750, for each year. This includes fees charged by a certifying agent or consultant for pre-certification inspections and development of an organic system plan.

For both certified operations and transitional operations, OTECP covers 75% of the registration fees, up to \$200, per year, for educational events that include content related to organic production and handling in order to assist operations in increasing their knowledge of production and marketing practices that can improve their operations, increase resilience and expand available marketing opportunities. Additionally, both certified and transitional operations may be eligible for 75% of the expense of soil testing required under the National Organic Program (NOP) to document micronutrient deficiency, not to exceed \$100 per year.

Producers apply through their local FSA office and can also obtain one-onone support with applications by calling 877-508-8364. The program application and additional information can be found at farmers.gov/otecp.

Additional Organic Support - OTECP builds upon USDA's Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP) which provides cost share assistance of 50%, up to a maximum of \$500 per scope, to producers and handlers of agricultural products who are obtaining or renewing their certification under the NOP. Although the application period for OCCSP ended Nov. 1, 2021, FSA will consider late-filed applications for those operations who still wish to apply.

Meanwhile, USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) recently made improvements to Whole-Farm Revenue Protection to make it more flexible and accessible to organic producers.







# Register Now for ISU's Crop Advantage Series in January

After a year hiatus, Iowa State University Extension and Outreach will again offer the Crop Advantage Series to producers at 14 locations across Iowa during January 2022, starting with Sheldon on January 4.

At these conferences, ISU Extension and Outreach specialists and field agronomists present the latest crop production research and information for the upcoming growing seasons to producers, agronomists, and industry leaders.

"There is no other program during the year when this many extension specialists present information at one location as occurs at Crop Advantage meetings," said Joel DeJong, field agronomist with ISU Extension and Outreach in Northwest Iowa. "In 2020, nearly 2,000 individuals attended one of the meetings across the state, representing all 99 Iowa counties and surrounding states Eighty-four percent of attendees responding to follow-up surveys said information from Crop Advantage would likely save them between \$5 and \$20 per acre."

Each Crop Advantage Series location has a slightly different agenda, with sessions held January 4 in Sheldon, January 5 in Storm Lake, January 11 in Okoboji, January 26 in Le Mars, and January 27 in Denison. The agenda generally features two morning keynote speakers and a customizable afternoon schedule, but agendas do vary.

For example, DeJong said that the Sheldon site on January 4 and the Storm Lake site on January 5 will both feature two morning keynote speakers. Dr. Chad Hart, ISUAg Economist, will begin the day at 10:00am with a session titled "2022 Crop Market Outlook." Extension Entomologist Erin Hodgson will follow with "Management Strategies for Corn Rootworm." After lunch, three 50-minute time periods where attendees can choose from three topics offered during each period, allows attendees to create their own educational agenda during the meeting. Topics include nutrient input decisions, weed management for 2022, gall midge and fall armyworm management, how cover crops and row spacing alter weed competition, carbon markets, on-farm research results and more.

"Every farm situation is unique, and that is why a menu of strategies is available for producers to choose from as they look to control costs, maintain or enhance productivity and search for profitability," DeJong said.

All Crop Advantage Series meetings are approved for Certified CropAdviser(CCA) continuing education credits, and every location offers the opportunity for private pesticide applicators to receive continuing education credits. To qualify for the pesticide continuing education, an individual must attend all day and add the session offered for this at the end of the day. The cost for the CCA credit or the pesticide continuing education is built into the registration cost of the conference.

Early registration for each location is \$60; late registration made less than seven days prior to the meeting or on-site is \$75 Registration also includes lunch and printed proceedings. Online registration and additional information are available at http://www. cropadvantage.org/ or from your local ISU Extension and Outreach office. DeJong reminds attendees that agendas will vary by site, so it is important to check out those details at the website above.






