



SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

The articles for the next two weeks are entitled: "Nine Shocking Signs of the Decline of the Traditional American Family".

Traditional family units are the foundation of any successful society, and that was certainly true for the United States during our formative years. But now a decline that has stretched on for decades has left the traditional American family in worse shape than ever before. Our entertainment is anti-family, our culture is anti-family and many of our politicians are openly antifamily. There is so much that is working against us, but if we do not get our families fixed, there is no way that we are ever going to have any hope of turning our nation around.

The following are 9 shocking signs of the staggering

decline of the traditional American family:

#1 The percentage of homes in the United States containing a married couple with children is at a record low. The number of United States homes with a married couple and children fell to a record low, according to new government data, as the pandemic further delayed weddings and more adults do not plan to have children at all.

The share of the United States's 130 million households headed by married parents with children under age 18 fell to 17.8% in 2021. This is a decline from 18.6% last year, according to the United States Census Bureau's 2020 Federal Census. That is down from more than 40% in 1970.

#2 Right now, just 23.1 million American homes contain a married couple with children. The last time that number was that low was in 1959. But in 1959 our total population was just 177 million. Today, it is 329.5 million. Young adults today view marriage as a commitment to which they do not wish to join. They are focused on the good life and the prosperity gospel which many churches have been preaching for decades.

#3 Nearly a third of all United States families with children are single parent families. Sadly, that percentage "has tripled since 1965". In 1950 about 5% of couples with children were not married compared to over 46% in 2022. In observance of "National Single Parent Day" on Sunday, March 21, 2021, it is worth noting that America has one of the highest levels of single-parent families with children in the world.

About 30 percent of America's families with children under 18 years of age, amounting to 10 million households, are single-parent families. The share of American families with children living with a single parent has tripled since 1965. Most of those single-parent families, approximately 75 percent, are headed by a mother only. Many men do not believe in providing for their wives and children and abandon their families when the responsibilities of fatherhood become too much for them. They believe it is perfectly alright to get their girlfriends pregnant but not to be a responsible father.

#4 More Americans are living alone than ever before. Right now, 37 million United States adults are living alone. That number has risen by more than 10 percent over the last decade, and it keeps increasing with each

#5 The birth rate in the United States is at the lowest level ever recorded. It fell another four percent last year, and every single demographic group is seeing decline.

Please reflect on how you can help change this disastrous trend.

January is Cervical Health Awareness Month

January is Cervical Health Awareness Month, and the Livingston County Department of Health wants you to know that there is a lot you can do to prevent cervical cancer. Each year, more than 11,000 women in the United States get cervical cancer (Center for Disease Control & Prevention; CDC).

HPV (human papillomavirus) is a very common infection that spreads through sexual activity, and it causes almost all cases of cervical cancer. About 79 million Americans currently have HPV, but many people with HPV don't know they are infected (CDC).

The good news?

- The CDC recommends 11-12 year olds get two doses of HPV vaccine to protect against cancers caused by HPV. The vaccines can be given starting at age 9.
- Cervical cancer can often be prevented with regular screening tests and follow-up care.
 In honor of National Cervical Health Awareness Month, the Livingston County Department of Health encourages:
- Routine cervical cancer screening for women ages 21 to 65 years old can prevent cervical cancer.
- Parents to make sure pre-teens get the HPV vaccine at age 11 or 12
- Teens and young adults up to age 26 also need to get the HPV vaccine if they didn't get it as pre-teens (CDC).

If you are sexually active:

- Use latex condoms the right way every time you have sex. This can lower your chances of getting HPV. But HPV can infect areas not covered by a condom so condoms may not fully protect against getting HPV:
- Be in a mutually monogamous relationship or have sex only with someone who only has sex with you. If you are 40 years of age or over, call the Cancer Services Program of the Finger Lakes Region for more information and/or to see if you qualify for a free cancer screening at 1-877-803-8070.

The Livingston County Center for Sexual Health and Wellness provides annual screenings such as Pap smears and pelvic exams at low or no cost for those who qualify. For more information or to schedule an appointment, please call 585-243-7540 today.




