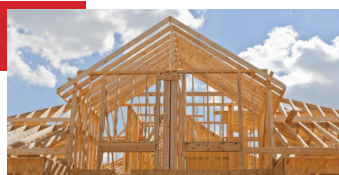

SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

This week we continue the topic entitled: **"Nine Shocking Signs of the Decline of the Traditional American Family"**.

In May 2021, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention released a report which revealed that the United States birth rate fell 4% last year, the largest single-year decrease in nearly 50 years. The rate dropped for mothers of every major race and ethnicity, and in nearly every age group, falling to the lowest point since federal health officials started tracking it more than a century ago, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's report.

While the remainder of the world's countries are exploding in population, America is gradually slowing down our birth rate and someday we will be a minority in the world when it comes to population.

#6 According to one recent survey, a record high 44 percent of childless adults in the United States under the age of 50 say that it is "likely" that they will never have any children at all. Child-free United States adults are increasingly likely to say parenthood is not in the cards for them, a new report says.

With the assistance of abortion and contraception, the birth rate will continue to decline in the future. Asked the question, "Thinking about the future, how likely is it that you will have children someday?" 44% of adults younger than 50 without children answered either "not too likely" or "not at all likely", according to a Pew Research Center survey conducted last October and released recently. That proportion is up from 37% in a similar 2018 survey.

#7 After decades of dropping numbers, birth rates have now fallen beneath replacement level in every single state in the United States. It takes approximately 2.1 children per woman just to be at replacement level, and not one state in the United States is currently at that level or above.

#8 Support for Roe v. Wade just continues to go up. In fact, a brand-new Fox News survey found that support for Roe v. Wade is now at the highest level that they have ever measured. Two-thirds of voters questioned in a Fox News national poll conducted in September 2021 wanted to keep in place Roe v. Wade, which legalized abortion nationwide in 1973. The 65% opposed to overturning the abortion ruling was a record in Fox News polling, up from 61% a year ago, and narrowly eclipsing the previous high of 64% in June 2019.

Only one man and one woman can produce offspring and become a viable family. What we do not understand, or do not wish to admit, is that eventually the Social Security Administration will go out of business because we have aborted over 60 million children who would be paying into the Social Security Trust Fund. Many Americans will not receive Social Security benefits in the future because these children and grandchildren will not be supporting the fund.

#9 Due to the staggering decline of the traditional family, Americans are now lonelier than they have ever been before. One survey noted that 60 percent of respondents admitted that they are lonely. That is a stunning figure, and it just shows how much our emotional health has deteriorated. More than three in five Americans say that they are lonely, with more and more people reporting feeling like they are left out, poorly understood and lacking visitors. This is very, very sad!

New Focus of National Birth Defects Prevention Month (January)

"With every pregnancy, a woman starts out with a 3% chance of having a baby with a birth defect" (Center for Disease Control & Prevention; CDC). The National Birth Defects Prevention (NBDPN) Month campaign theme is, "Healthy Communities, Healthy Babies". The NBDPN is a volunteer-based organization that addresses the issues of birth defects surveillance, research, and prevention. January is the time to focus on both individual prevention of birth defects and a new awareness of systemic barriers affecting preventative care.

Additionally, the CDC hopes to raise awareness of the health of people living with birth defects across the lifespan and the impact on individuals, parents and families. The goal is to spark conversations and action in communities to identify, build and provide more resources for successful pregnancies and support for those living with birth defects.

Infant disorders and birth defects are common, costly, and critical conditions that can cause lifelong health challenges. Birth defects are structural changes that can affect almost any part of the body, such as the heart, brain, or foot. As medical care and treatment have improved, babies and children with birth defects are living longer and healthier lives. Most are now living into adulthood.

Not all birth defects can be prevented. However, it is encouraged that all prospective parents and pregnant people make healthy choices and adopt healthier habits to help lower their risk of having a baby born with a birth defect including these five tips recommended by NBDPN:

Tip 1: Take 400 micrograms (mcg) of folic acid every day.

Tip 2: Visit with your healthcare provider.

Tip 3: Become up-to-date with vaccines

Tip 4: Care for your body and mind before and during pregnancy to set you & your baby up for success.

Tip 5: Boost your health by avoiding harmful substances during pregnancy, such as alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. There is hope for a healthier future.

For more information about free or low-cost health care for adults and teens including pregnancy testing, birth control, counseling and referrals, contact the Center for Sexual Health and Wellness at 585-243-7540.
