




## Did GOP Mapmakers Try To Eliminate Strength Of Black Vote

**W**hen First District Congressman G. K. Butterfield announced his unexpected retirement from Congress last week, he blamed it, in part, on a "racially gerrymandered" voting map that will "disadvantage African-American communities all across the First Congressional District." In short, instead of redrawing Butterfield's district according to the mandates of the 1965 Voting Rights Act to ensure that Black voters in so-called minority-majority districts are able to elect representatives who look like them, Republican lawmakers boasted how they did not use race as a factor at all in redrawing the voting districts, thus, in Rep. Butterfield's case, making his district more Republican than Democratic and, ultimately, more White than Black.

I am disappointed, terribly disappointed, with the Republican majority legislature for again gerrymandering our state's congressional districts and putting their party politics over the

best interests of North Carolinians," Butterfield, one of two African-American North Carolina representatives, continued.

If Democrats indeed can prove that Rep. Butterfield's First District was redrawn more in favor of yielding a Republican voting district, that would violate North Carolina law against partisan redistricting. If racial gerrymandering can be proven, that would also violate federal law.

North Carolina's other Black Democrat in Congress, Rep. Alma Adams (D-NC-12) called the new congressional map "illegal."

A quick analysis of the voting maps Republicans recently produced show that both congressionally and in the State legislature, several Black Democratic lawmakers will be eliminated like Butterfield if the maps are allowed to stand. According to WRAL-TV, for example, "of the 12 Black senators in the State Senate, all of whom are Democrats, four are likely, or certain, to lose their seats in the 2022 elections" to a Republican because of the new maps. "In the State House," the WRAL-TV report continued, "... five of the 24 Black members are at risk or

certain to lose their seats next year."

But Republicans, who are once again tasked with redistricting North Carolina's 14 Congressional seats, 120 legislative and 50 state Senate districts for the next ten years, claim that they're doing nothing wrong, and in fact, are following the dictates of the U.S. Supreme Court, which allows for partisan redistricting, and warned the GOP previously about misusing race to "stack and pack" black voters in several minority-majority districts purely to make it easier to defeat white Democrats.

The High Court never said race cannot be a factor in redistricting, just not the major driving factor in redrawing voting lines.

So it's no surprise that Democratic analysts see the new Republican maps as lessening Democratic voting strength throughout the State, and, in lessening Democratic voting strength, they also dilute Black voting strength and representation, since the majority of African-American voters are Democrats.

Two lawsuits have already been filed against the Republican voting maps.

## FSU Made A NC Promise School In New \$25-B Budget

**F**or all of the headlines the new \$25.9 billion state budget is making, perhaps the most unnoticed is its impact on one of the UNC System HBCU's for the future.

In the new budget recently passed by the Republican-led NC General Assembly and signed by Democratic Gov. Roy Cooper is the designation of Fayetteville State University as a NC Promise school. The designation now reduces tuition at FSU to just \$500.00 per semester.

Previous NC Promise schools include Elizabeth City State University (ECSU), UNC-Pembroke (UNCP) and Western Carolina University (WCU).

According to its website, the NC Promise Tuition Plan, created by North Carolina lawmakers in 2016, has "...increased educational access, reduced student debt, and grown the State's econ-

omy."

Even though the plan now involves two of the UNC System's historically Black Colleges and Universities (Elizabeth City State University and Fayetteville State University), it reaches out to native American, Latino American and low income White students as well.

In March 2019, the James G. Martin Center for Academic Renewal published an article entitled, "NC Promise's Costs and Benefits: An Early Analysis." Beyond tuition savings, other benefits have come about from NC Promise. UNCP's enrollment increased by nearly 900 new students, and it also improved standardized testing scores, and freshman retention went up by five percent. Whether this increase in student academic quality can be sustained or repeated at other schools remains to be seen, but it should be noted by policymakers in evaluating NC Promise's success.

The article also noted that questions

remained regarding NC Promise's on-time graduation rate, which averages in-system at six years for students who start at NC Promise schools.

"ECSU had an abysmal graduation rate of 43.4 percent in 2017, in addition to poor performance in a variety of other academic and student financial measures. UNCP, too, struggled with a 48.5 percent graduation rate. WCU fared better with a 64.4 percent graduation rate, still below the system average of 68.8 percent."

The article surmised, "Pushing students to underwhelming regional campuses is a risky move if the State's goal is to educate them for post graduate success."

In an unrelated aspect of the new budget, it provides \$650,000 towards the construction of the North Carolina Freedom Park, the African-American sculpture park being planned for between the State Legislative Building and Governor's Mansion in Raleigh.



#### When it comes to the protection of voting rights, moral apathy is winning the fight

**W**hen speaking before an audience in 1963, James Baldwin could not have stated it any better by saying, "I'm terrified at the moral apathy, the death of the heart, which is happening in my country". His words express the feelings and emotions many of us of all races have today as we watch our fellow Americans show little concern or motivation to do what is morally right in regards to protecting the voting rights of people of color. There is no heart, no conscience or shame in passing laws intended to give Republicans the ability to outright reject election results not in their favor. A recent warning written by a United Nations expert highlights the human rights consequences to our changing nation. He describes the United States as being near "tyranny" against the voting rights of minorities nationwide. To have the United States, leader of the free world, evolving into a nation under cruel and oppressive rule is a fairly strong but precise assessment.

Fernand de Varennes was appointed United Nations Special Rapporteur on Minority Issues by the Human Rights Council. He based his remarks on the current state of U.S. society and democracy by traveling the country to "assess the human rights situation of persons belonging to national or ethnic, religious and linguistic minorities." As a representative of the United Nations, he met with over 100 officials at the federal, state and territorial levels. In his initial assessment, de Varennes stated, "My final report will provide more details and analysis in this regard, but what is already eminently clear is that there seems to be growing feeling that the United States is becoming a darker, nastier, and more divided society – and that the patchwork of constitutional and civil rights in the country are not sufficiently protecting those most in need of protection such as minorities and Indigenous peoples, amongst others." When sharing another U.N. expert's observations from 2017, de Varennes noted that "four years later, the pace of what my colleague described as the undermining of democracy has expanded explosively." Fernand de Varennes and his colleague are not members of the "liberal press" or "fake news". They are the equivalent to being unbiased referees in a basketball game. They are rightfully blowing the whistle while calling the fouls they see. As international watchdogs, they are calling fouls against the oppression and moral apathy they are witnessing in America. But the United Nations is not alone.

The Stockholm-based International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance recently added the United States to an annual list of "backsliding" democracies for the very first time. The think tank's secretary general Kevin Casas-Zamora, said "the visible deterioration of democracy in the United States, as seen in the increasing tendency to contest credible election results, the efforts to suppress participation and the runaway polarization....is one of the most concerning developments." The international community is sounding the alarm because they still care about democracy the way we as a nation did in the past. Citizens in California see the urgency.

A coalition of sixty-nine progressive grassroots groups sent a letter to Sen. Dianne Feinstein urging her to support the Freedom to Vote Act and the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act in addition to expressing her willingness to "abolish or create an exception to the filibuster" in order to have the bills pass through the Senate. The groups went as far as to demand the senator's resignation if she is unwilling to take the steps necessary toward protecting our democracy. While it is not expected for conservative groups to make the same type of demand to their Republican senators, it should be a different story for white evangelicals despite being a major part of the Republican political base. The international community views the subject of voter suppression within the United States not through a political lens but through a moral lens. Both progressives and conservatives voters should be able to do the same.

These international organizations are seeing people being oppressed and they are speaking out as we all should. As Christians, I see white evangelicals as being the moral compass and the conscience of the nation. Because of their Biblical commands, I see them finding the cruelty behind voter suppression as unacceptable. I see them contacting their elected representatives and expressing an urgency in preserving democracy at all costs. All of this is not real. Unfortunately, there is a widening gap between the way things should be and reality. Reality is disappointing. Even at the expense of saving American democracy, a large number of white evangelicals forsake their Biblical teachings for political gains.

**R**ev. Jesse Jackson and Rev. Al Sharpton were doing the right thing when attending the Amaud Arbery trial. They demonstrated the solidarity that the Black community has with each other when one of us appears to be lynched. Lynching has reverberations. Each of us, every Black person, is repulsed and dismayed when we learn that armed white men, using the pretense of "citizen's arrest," can kill any of us. What is a citizen's arrest, anyway? Is it simply a license to kill?

Kevin Gough, the attorney "defending" William "Roddie" Bryant, the man who both took the video of the massacre and participated in it, asked the judge, each day, to bar Rev. Jesse Jackson from the courtroom. How absurd! He says Rev. Jackson's presence might influence the nearly all-white jury, and I suspect his objections might lay the groundwork for an appeal now that the devilish white men have been found guilty of murder.

Gough's racism and ignorance have been a constant presence in this trial. He said he didn't want more Black pastors in the courtroom after Rev. Sharpton sat with the Arbery family. He asked the stupid question, "How many pastors

does the Arbery family have?" He had the nerve, though out of the jury's hearing, to ask if Georgia Senator Raphael Warnock, also a pastor, will be next in the courtroom. What if he was?

What Gough does not understand are the many ways that

racism connects Black people. In the b o o k *Lynching and Spectacle* (University of North Carolina Press, 2009), Amy Louise Wood writes,

"The news of lynching shook (the author Richard) Wright to his core. Despite, or even because of, its relative rarity, lynching held a singular psychological force, generating a level of fear and horror that overwhelmed all other forms of violence. Even one lynching reverberated, traveling with sinister force, down city streets, and through rural farms, across roads and rivers." Any of us could be followed and shot on any given day.

We have no shield. We can be unarmed and running. In bed and sleeping (ask Breonna Taylor), or simply walking down the street. And white folks see a threat because

racism is baked in the cake we call America. When we watch the massacre of Amaud Arbery, we see ourselves, our sons, our daughters, our mothers. That connects us. That's why more than one hundred pastors rallied with Rev. Sharpton outside the Brunswick courthouse in solidarity. I want Revs. Jackson, Sharpton, William Barber, Freddy Haynes, and so many others rally at every massacre. Cause it's personal. How dare this high-handed man, the offense attorney, question anybody's religion, pastoral relationships, community connections, or anything else?

Gough will go down in the racist's hall of fame, but he is not the only one. All these "stand your ground" laws are an absurd attempt to allow white people to shoot Black people with impunity. Southern state legislatures empower white people to embrace their racism with firearms, whether they are police officers or ordinary citizens. It is frightening to think that we live in a world where white fear, real or imagined, justifies a Black massacre.

On the witness stand, one of the murderers admitted that Arnaud did not say a word to him, did not do a darn thing but try to get away from him.

He shot him anyway! So some random white person follows a

Black man and attacks him because he is "scared." He should have kept his scared self in his house and called the police. But no, he was a white man with privilege, power, and a weapon. Why should he call law enforcement when he could enforce the law himself?

So how many pastors does the Arbery family have? As many as they want. Black folks around the nation and the world prayed for a just result in this trial. We also prayed for a judicial ruling that the massacre of Black people is unacceptable. We are continuing to pray for an examination of this nonsense called "citizen's arrest." And we are praying for our leaders, our pastors, our brothers to keep the faith and keep representing.

Kevin Gough does not "get" the Black community, and he doesn't have to. But what he needs to know, when he thundered about Black pastors, is that all of us, Black people, are connected. How many pastors do I have? As many as will claim me. Hundreds of Black pastors claimed the Arbery family because they relate to their pain. Whether you are a pastor or not, you should claim them, too.

### How many pastors can we have?

**I**n the civil rights movement we were constantly reminded to keep our eyes on the prize. What's the prize? Equality of opportunity and results, which requires equity in every facet of our lives — education, housing, home ownership, job training, employment, political access and especially in the criminal justice system.

Our criminal justice system still needs dramatic reform. Blacks make up more than 40 percent of the prison population, but only 13 percent of the nation's population.

The geographic numerator changes — north or south — but the denominator remains the same — an unjust criminal justice system nationwide. Three current incidents illustrate: Jelani Day in Peru, Illinois; Jacob Blake in Kenosha, Wisconsin; and Amaud Arbery in Brunswick, Georgia. Jelani Day, a 25-year-old Black medical student at Illinois State University, was a "bright light" in his family; he and his sister were competing to become doctors. He disappeared on Aug. 24. The family and a professor reported him missing on Aug. 25.

His car was found two days later in a wooded area near where his body was later discovered in Peru, Illinois, miles from where he was last seen. LaSalle County law enforcement officials discovered his body on Sept. 4 "floating near the south bank of the Illinois River approximately a quarter-of-a-mile east of the Illinois Route 251 Bridge." The parents

continue to be critical of the investigation because little focus was initially put on his disappearance. It occurred in the context of the vanished and subsequent death of Gabby Petito, which was receiving national coverage.

There are inconsistencies, a high degree of incompetence and a lack of collaboration between various law enforcement agencies surrounding the case. There is still no closure

about what happened to Jelani Day. Racial dimensions in trials Rusten Sheskey, accompanied by two other white police officers responding to a domestic complaint by the fiancee of Jacob Blake — a Black man — shot Blake seven times in the back, with his children looking on in the back seat. Blake, they say, refused to obey the officers, so they opened his car door and reached inside.

Blake was left partially paralyzed by the incident. Racial violence followed in Kenosha. Officer Sheskey was not charged with a crime. As disturbances continued, a white 17-year-old Kyle Rittenhouse decided to take the law into his own hands. He left home in Antioch, Illinois, with his mother driving him to Kenosha with a loaded military-style semiautomatic rifle (illegal for a person his age) "to assist the police in protecting businesses." He killed two

protesters and wounded another, but walked freely past police officers and military vehicles even as onlookers shouted that he had just shot several people.

The next day, Rittenhouse was arrested and has now been found not guilty on five felonies and a misdemeanor. A white judge, Bruce Schroeder, who has a history of controversial behavior from the bench, seemed unfair as he told the prosecution they could not refer to the victims of the shooting as victims, but that the defense could refer to them as rioters and looters, if they had such evidence. One juror was removed for making a racial joke about Jacob Blake.

The judge also attacked the press in court as unfair in its coverage, and the trial has seemed unfair from the start. Ahmaud Aubrey, an unarmed Black jogger, was shot and killed by three white vigilantes who were not even arrested until more than a month later after a video of the shooting went viral. Ultimately, the jury had 11 white jurors and only one Black juror in a city that's 25 percent Black. Defense attorneys used preemptive challenges to remove multiple potential Black jurors, who were asked questions like what they thought of Black Lives Matter and whether there were racial problems between the Black community and the police.

Their answers were then used to remove them from the jury. Additionally, the defense seemed to be trying to put Mr. Aubrey on trial by showing

pictures of him looking around in buildings under construction, claiming there had been recent robberies in the community, and the defendants were only trying to make a citizen's arrest and hold him until the police came — like they were protecting the community.


Fortunately, the predominantly white jury did not fall for the defense's argument. All three white vigilantes — Travis McMichael; his father, Gregory McMichael, and a neighbor, William "Roddie" Bryan, were found guilty of multiple charges of felony murder.

But, the simplest way to demonstrate the racial dimension of all three incidents — and one could add the events of January 6 at the U.S. Capitol — is to reverse the racial roles of everyone. Imagine the actual victims as white and the alleged perpetrators as Black.

What these cases show is a pattern — a lineage of Trayvon Martin, Eric Garner, George Floyd, Michael Brown, the Charleston nine — that we cannot accept as normal. Would we see these incidents in the same way if they were reversed? Obviously not. Even in the murder of Aubrey — despite the guilty verdicts — the delayed arrests, the jury selection, among other aspects of the case remain questionable.

The only solution is to engage in mass action and mass voting that will allow the truth to come out that will lead to dramatic reform in our criminal justice system.

## President Biden sounds warning on Omicron Variant

President Joe Biden cautioned Americans not to panic as omicron, the latest COVID-19 variant, threatens to further stall recovery from the nearly two-year-old pandemic.

The President called the variant a cause for concern but not panic.

"We have the best vaccine in the world. The best medicines, the best scientists, and we're learning more every single day," President Biden asserted. "And we'll fight this variant with scientific and knowledgeable actions and speed. Not chaos and confusion."

President Biden continued: "Look, we're going to fight and beat this new variant as well."

The White House earlier announced that the U.S. would restrict travel from South Africa, Zimbabwe, Namibia, Botswana, Lesotho, Eswatini, Malawi, and Mozambique. New York Gov. Kathy Hochul has already declared a state of emergency, announcing that while the omicron variant hadn't arrived, she expects it would soon.

"We continue to see warning signs of spikes this upcoming winter, and while the new omi-

cron variant has yet to be detected in New York State, it's coming," Hochul insisted.

Officials at the World Health Organization (WHO) said the Omicron coronavirus variant on Monday carried a "very high risk of infection surges."

The WHO reportedly advised its 194 member nations that any infection surge could have severe consequences but said no deaths had yet been linked to the new variant.

"Omicron has an unprecedented number of spike mutations, some of which are concerning for their potential impact on the trajectory of the pandemic," the organization noted in a news release.

"The overall global risk related to the new variant of concern Omicron is assessed as very high," WHO officials stated.

South African officials reportedly first detected the new variant a week ago in Botswana, with cases confirmed in Germany, Japan, Canada, and Belgium.

The Biden administration remains hopeful while still embracing the likelihood of omicron in the United States.

"While we have said that travel restrictions can slow

the speed of omicron, it cannot prevent it," President Biden stated. "Here's what it does: it gives us time. It gives us time to take more action. To move quicker, to make

sure people understand, you have to get the vaccine. You have to get the shot. You have to get the booster."
