




LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Once a librarian, always a librarian. Such is the case with research director RD, who on this very day notes that today is Thesaurus Day! -- probably because it is the birth date of Peter Mark Roget, the London-born (1779 -> 1869) lexicographer and inventor, most famous for his Thesaurus of Synonyms. That brings a Gershwin tune to mind. (You may have to ignore the spelling.) The song, 'S Wonderful, 'S Marvelous, was written by George and Ira Gershwin for the 1927 Broadway musical, Funny Face.. Of the nearly 500 versions of the song, perhaps the most famous was recorded by Ella Fitzgerald, in 1959. Other best-selling recordings included those by The Dave Brubeck Trio (nine years earlier!), The Lionel Hampton Quartet (1954), and Andre Previn (1998).

Ray Dolby (1933 -2013) was born in Oregon on January 18, 1933, and became a sound expert and inventor of the Dolby Noise Limiting System. That, sez RD, calls for Simon and Garfunklel's, The Sound of Silence, which was a Paul Simon composition, recorded with Art Garfunkel in 1964. It became a Number One hit on the BillBoard chart for Columbia. And, it was later featured in the 1967 motion picture, The Sounds of Silence, before being added to the National Recording Registry in the Library of Congress...

Edward Kennedy 'Duke' Ellington performed at Carnegie hall for the first time on Sunday, January, 23, 1943. His playlist included many of his signature songs, including Mood Indigo, 'Rockin' in Rhythm, and Don't Get Around Much Anymore, the melody Ellington wrote in 1940, with the original title, Never No Lament. The song became an even bigger hit in 1942 when Bob Russell added lyrics, and suggested the new title. Now you know the rest of the story...

In a late addition to this week's column, RD also reminded us that powerhouse entertainer Ronnie Spector passed away last week, she was 78. What RD was really reminding us of was a Friday afternoon in the early 1960s, when WINS-10-10-New York, DJ Murray 'The K' Kaufman brought The Ronettes to a certain Old Professor's Long Island high school for a dance party in the high school Gym -something Murray noted to be "A Swinging Soiree!" He conducted his daily WINS show with that enthusiasm, too. It's what made him the "5th Beatle" when the Fab Four landed in New York!



Dickinson County SnowHawks to Host Okoboji 100 Cross Country Snowmobile Races

The Okoboji 100 is back! Cor PowerSports, the NASCAR of snowmobile racing, which headquarters out of Somerset, Wis-

consin, is coming to East Lake Okoboji for the second consecutive year on January 22-23. Now in its 11th year, Cor Powersports hosts a series of cross-country snowmobile races across the Mid-



west. The Dickinson County SnowHawks, the local snowmobile club in Dickinson County, was instrumental a year ago in bringing the circuit here for the initial Okoboji 100. Now in 2022, the club will be the presenting sponsor for this year's Okoboji 100.

Jantina Carney, who does the publicity for the SnowHawks, says, "We are so excited to have the Okoboji 100 back for its second year. We want this to be an annual event and hope it continues to grow." Cor PowerSports race director Todd Myers was pleased with how things went last year.

The recent snowfall last Friday was incredibly important for the Okoboji 100. Carney says with a smile, "The snow couldn't have come at a better time. We're calling it a million-dollar snow!"

Without the snow, the conditions on the ice were truly glare ice. With the winding course and the number of turns, organizers would have had to transport hay bales to the ice to provide protection on the curves. "Now, with the recent snow, and the fact that we're not supposed to have unusually warm days, the snow should be around for a while. It certainly makes things easier, and we will be able to have a plowed course." The course will be a plowed lake Lemans-style course.

The hub of the activity - As with last year, the 2022 Okoboji 100 will find Parks Marina as the hub of all the activity. The pit parking will take place at the Parks Marina parking lot. The staging, the start and finish will take place on the ice in front of Parks Marina and the awards will be given out at Snappers. Both Saturday and Sunday will be full-day competitions with the weekend's events ending around 4 p.m. on Sunday.

The course is a 9 to 10-mile circuit that starts out in front of Parks Marina and runs the main part of the lake to the Narrows and back to the main lake with the longest straightaway at ¾ of a mile. Two racers will go at a time with 10 second intervals. Each snowmobile has a transponder on it to record the time, etc. There will be seven rounds each day with 19 different classes ranging from pro divisions in both men and women, junior levels beginning with age 10, masters over 50 and even a vintage class. The Pro Open Final and the Pro Factory 600 Final will be the longest of the races at 10 laps. Well over 100 racers are on the Cor PowerSports circuit, along with local racers entering the Okoboji 100.

Spectators can expect to see racers from across the country, professionals representing the major snowmobile manufacturers (Arctic Cat, Polaris, Ski-Doo and Yamaha), along with local riders giving the course a shot.

For the fans - The races are an exciting venue and if people want to view the races, obviously the most action will take place on the ice in front of Parks Marina.

Carnay says, "There will be a viewing area on the ice in front of Parks Marina. The upper area at Snappers is a great viewing area. Plus, with the race going as far west as the Waterfront and Bridges Bay, there will be plenty of areas to see the action. To keep spectators safe, the course will be well marked, and there will be several spotters out there in colored vests."

Carney adds that the atmosphere is one of excitement and anticipation. "The leading manufacturers in the snowmobile industry will be on hand with their trailers. We encourage people to walk through the pit area and get a close look at the sleds. For food, the Barefoot Bar and Snappers will both be open, and Okoboji Spudz will be serving donuts."

Horns Down

This won't be a much of a detailed breakdown of #15 Iowa State's big 79-70 win over #21 Texas in rocking Hilton Coliseum on Saturday as we were running our big youth tournament with 38 teams in Milford, so my watching of the game was definitely a bit spotty. This was a huge win for the Cyclones, as they are winding down a stretch of six straight games against Top 25 teams, and they were coming off a heart-breaking 62-61 loss on Tuesday night at Phog Allen Fieldhouse against #9 Kansas, in which ISU had a great look at the buzzer to win the game.

From what I did see and read about the win over the Longhorns, this was a total team effort and one of ISU's best offensive performances of the season. Minnesota transfer Gabe Kalscheur. who had struggled with his outside shooting for most of the season, hit four 3-pointers on Tuesday against the Jayhawks, and continued his strong week with a 22-point night, including going 6/12 from 3-point range. Izaiah Brockington has been the go-to-guy all season for ISU, but he struggled on Saturday going just 3/7 from the field while scoring eight points, but other Cyclones stepped up with freshman phenom PG Tyrese Hunter adding 13 points to go along with eight assists and just two turnovers, and Aljaz Kunc and Robert Jones each chipped in with eight points off the bench. For the game the Cyclones shot 57% from the field and 44% from 3-point land, which are both very impressive numbers. More importantly, they only turned the ball over 12 times against a long and athletic Texas team that thrives on scoring off live-ball turnovers. ISU also won two very important battles that help determine who will win games, points in the paint (30-22) and points off turnovers (23-12).

This was a game that Iowa State had to have, as they were sitting at 1-3 in the Big 12 with a tough road game at #19 Texas Tech on Tuesday. The Cyclones leaned on what has propelled them to their impressive 14-3 season, their stifling defense. Any team that can hold Kansas to just 62 points in Phog Allen Fieldhouse can definitely guard, and this unit has thrived on being disruptive all season long. If their offense can continue to improve, this unlikely season of Cyclone Magic can definitely continue, and this team will have the potential to make some noise during March Madness!

The year 2021 has come to a close and 2022 began with the January 8 fiasco at the capitol and a variant of COVID-19 more readily catchable. All 50 states were infected in a period of 24 days.

Wokeism (corporate elite telling us what we think and act) is in full swing. Milford K of C Crowns Youth Free Throw Champions



Where is the Truth?

I am consistently amazed at how little news coverage has been given to the 500 major city riots that occurred during the 2020 summer. Almost no one has been prosecuted, despite there being 23 people murdered and a Billion dollars in property damage caused by fires set by the rioters. In contrast, one political party wants to make a major and continuing news story about a single riot that occurred one January afternoon more than a year ago. It must be that this political party has nothing better to talk about.

The only person killed on this afternoon riot was one of the unarmed protesters. There were no police officers killed. Last summer there were 150 government buildings damaged, In January one government building was damaged. The sad news is that we will probably have this minor event hyped for the next year - at least until the November elections.

Why all this hype about one afternoon in January? It seems the political party in question is scared to death that Citizen Donald Trump might be elected President in November of 2024. If Trump is as bad as they say he is there shouldn't be much to worry about. The exaggerated hype we are going to hear for the next nine months about the evil of Donald Trump tells us there is more to the story than has been presented so far.




