





Dear "Speak Out,"

I've come to expect Mr. Powell's words here week after week, as we all have. Most of the time I keep my reactions to myself, figuring it not worth the effort when providing a different point of view may well be a waste of my time. Even if that is the case now, I felt compelled to reply to Mr. Powell's opinions regarding the 'decline of the American family.'

Something complex like 'why is the family broken down' seems like a difficult question to answer, requiring research and credentials. But the answers are obvious if you open your eyes and look around.

Without characterizing all "young adults" as simply "not wish[ing] to join" the institution of marriage, it's fair to say that's true for some. Personally, I can't imagine planning a \$10K party (for, let's be real, other people), let alone a honeymoon, in this environment of distancing, closures, inflation, shortages and quarantines.

That—and we're nearing 900 thousand Americans dead from Covid...some of them were (or would have been) engaged. I can tell you with near certainty that one would have been.

The birth rate in the U.S. has declined for a very simple reason: it is no longer financially sustainable to raise children for millions of people. Are we really surprised in a nation without any childcare infrastructure, without universal healthcare, and with some of the worst maternal health outcomes in the developed world...that birth rates go down every year?

Those who would become young parents represent much of the population now saddled with criminal levels of student loan debt, and there is not one major city in the nation where minimum wage will cover the cost of rent for a two-bedroom apartment. Are we genuinely having confusion as to why large numbers of people choose to remain childless?

Support for abortion and other family planning services are at an all-time high because people need choice about when/if they become parents. Look no further than statistics on child abuse and neglect to understand what it means to bring children into an environment that is not prepared to take care of them the way they deserve.

(Also, if Mr. Powell genuinely cared at all, he'd have looked into actual statistics on who receives abortions, and he would learn that many people receive abortions because they already have children, and cannot afford/take care of more. I wonder if he'd choose for someone to carry a life-threatening pregnancy, despite the chance it could create a single-parent/no-parent household?).

When those who profess commitment to the idea of "preserving the family" show their hand by saying that, really, their main concern is the "replacement" of workers and a source of income for Social Security funds, it saves the rest of us the trouble of making the callous, cynical connection on our own. Except, the SS funds will run out because our leadership has failed to engage in little other than corporate bidding for the last fifty years, failing to invest in any genuine social infrastructure without a single thought as to who would be impacted by such shortsighted greed. No wonder so many people are feeling lonely and empty, in a landscape which worships consumption. But hey, a few congressmen and their corporate donors got really rich, so it's worth it, right?

But it makes sense that "young people" are now being blamed for killing the institution of family now as well. Because if the narrative wasn't focused on how ruinous these individuals are, then people may begin to question why an entire generation is now projected to have shorter lives, less overall savings, and in general a 'worse life' than the generation which raised them; why we have the worst outcomes for people giving birth in the developed world; why we're the only industrialized nation without universal healthcare, or paid parental leave, or decent childcare support.

Dear "Speak Out,"

This year marks the 49th anniversary of the infamous Monday, January 22, 1973, United States Supreme Court 7–2 decision in favor of Norma McCorvey ("Jane Roe") holding that women in the United States have a fundamental right to choose whether to have abortions without excessive governmental restriction.

This ruling struck down Texas's abortion ban as unconstitutional. For starters, a pre-born baby has a distinct DNA and a separate distinct body. So, abortion involves a body other than just the mothers, and her choice involves someone else. The baby is not given a choice.

There is no such thing as "Pro-Choice" because most abortion clinics do not suggest that the mother has any alternative to abortion and therefore "she does not have a choice".





Mount Morris Town Highway Superintendent MAILBOXES Snow Removal and Winter Driving

"Highway Superintendent reminds residents about snow plowing and winter driving issues"

It is important to be reminded of a few things in regards to snow removal and winter driving.

During and after snow removal events, highway agencies, in the course of plowing, receive emails or phone calls regarding damage to mailboxes, either from snow plows directly or from the force of snow being thrown by plows. If such damage is indeed caused by snow removal, it is not done intentionally. It is, however, an unfortunate consequence of snow removal.

As far as the particular agencies replacing damaged mailboxes, it must be pointed out that there is no statutory or legal authority requiring them to do so. In fact, under Section 319 of the New York State Highway Law, mailboxes are considered highway obstructions and are only "allowed" in the right-of-way as a convenience to the owner as it is understood they are required for mail delivery.

Additionally, an opinion issued by the Attorney General on February 28, 1966 stated, "When the necessity of keeping the highway open conflicts with an individual's reception of the mail, the latter must stand aside." Highway crews do their best to avoid mailboxes, but oftentimes visibility, oncoming traffic and heavy snow work against them.

The best method to protect your mailbox during the winter months is to ensure it is properly attached to the post that is in good condition and meets specifications and to keep the mailbox assembly simple to limit impact surface area for plowed snow.





In Combatting Labor Shortage, Livingston County Encourages Youth Employment

As local employers continue to struggle with the effects of ongoing labor shortages, the Livingston County Office of Workforce Development (LCOWD) and the Livingston County Youth Bureau (LCYB) are looking to promote a largely untapped resource: teenagers.

To help employers fill worker shortages, LCOWD and LCYB are creating a Youth Employment eBooklet. The booklet, intended specifically for younger job seekers, will help to guide interested young people toward positions and employers matching their qualifications and interests, said LCOWD and LCYB Deputy Director Mary Guldenschuh.

"The hardest hit industries during the state-wide shut down were food service and retail," said Guldenschuh. "These are perfect jobs for our local working age youth to enter the labor force. Jobs in these industries have a variety of tasks for teens to perform that comply with child labor laws. We hope that this eBooklet will draw more teens into the workforce and fill these vacancies."

LCOWD and LCYB are currently circulating a survey among local business owners to gauge their interest in hiring Livingston County youth. The eBooklet will include a list of all businesses open to hiring teenagers, making it a useful resource for job seekers under 18 years of age.
