

## **Sweet Basil**

## Changes made, more coming at Plymouth restaurant

Sweet Basil Restaurant in Plymouth has made a few changes over the past year with more on the way, yet it will not change one thing—its commitment to providing great food and service.

"We pride ourselves on the best ingredients," said General Manager Andrew Fischer. "All our chefs cook with passion, and we have an amazing staff."

The biggest change at Sweet Basil during 2021 was the change of ownership. Jill Swanson and Curt Semph are the new co-owners of the restaurant. Fischer said they retained the entire staff through the transition. "We wanted to keep the legacy of Sweet Basil alive," he said.

The interior of the restaurant was freshened up including new blinds. Also in 2021, Sweet Basil began to make greater use of its large outdoor patio area. It began using that area in 2020 as a way to provide greater social distancing because of the pandemic, but the restaurant enhanced the patio area in the past year with additional tables, lighting and heaters. "It is such a good space that nobody knows about," Fischer said. He said he is looking forward to reopening the patio as soon as the weather allows. Live music is going to be offered on Thursdays which will further boost the use of the patio area.

Going back to the legacy of Sweet Basil, Fischer said it is all about "amazing food and amazing service. It comes down to that."

The restaurant uses locally sourced food as much as possible in an effort to provide the best quality while keeping prices in check and trying to get around some of the supply chain issues currently facing the country. "It's definitely still a struggle," Fischer said.

One thing Sweet Basil has not had to worry about which other restaurants have is its labor force as the roughly 15-person crew is experienced and works very well together, Fischer said. "We run this as a team," he said. "Our kitchen staff works as a team. We run it as a unit."

An example of that is the fact that Fischer also does some bartending, cooking and serving in addition to being the general Elkhart Lake Chamber **NEW MEMBER**

manager. He has been at Sweet Basil since June 2020 but had years of other restaurant experience prior to coming to the restaurant located at 645 Walton Dr., the non-through street which extends north from Walmart in Plymouth.

The Sweet Basil team has a plan to make the restaurant a greater destination in the months ahead. Its winter hours are currently Mondays through Thursdays from 5 to 8:30 p.m. and Fridays and Saturdays from 5 to 9 p.m., but it will be expanding those hours to serve later when spring and summer arrive. Fischer pointed out that being open Mondays is an advantage as many casual upscale restaurants are not.

Fischer also said Sweet Basil is discussing the possibility of being open for lunch in the near future. It offers bar specials, burgers and sandwiches in addition to its well-known entrees.

Many people know Sweet Basil for its "modern Italian" offerings including Calamari and Bruschetta as appetizers and featured entrees including Tuscan Meatloaf, Fussilli Bolognese, Chicken Parmesan and Rigatoni; however, Fischer said perhaps the most popular menu items are the "best ribeye around" and the Seared Scallops served over seasonal risotto. Sweet Basil's menu changes seasonally at the very least, he added.

Sweet Basil can host wedding receptions of up to 140 people as well as all types of smaller functions. They also are able to do tailored catering. "We're very good at catering to people's needs," Fischer said.

The spacious bar room at Sweet Basil offers local beers on tap and a wide variety of other drinks, most notably its muddled Old Fashioned.

Reservations are encouraged by calling (920) 892-7572.

"We just want people to know we're here," Fischer said. "We do what we do very well. We just want people to know







## Stardust Limousine celebrates 30th year

Mike Hartmann has pieced together a long career as the owner of Stardust Limousine, LLC—not unlike the way his very first limousine was pieced together.

"It's better than a real job," Hartmann said with a smile recently as he looked back on the 30 years he has owned the business which continues to go strong.

He also smiled as he talked about how his very first limousine was a used Lincoln Town Car which he and his former partner took to a shop to get cut in half and then stretched into a limousine. "I don't know if he was really approved to do that," Hartmann said of the shop, but the limousine indeed worked and got the business off the ground.

Hartmann was serving in the U.S. Army Reserves along with another man who came up with the idea that the two of them should go into the limousine business. Hartmann said he had never been in a limousine, but he was willing to give the business a try.

The Manitowoc Company was one of Stardust Limousine's good customers in its early years as they would transport executives to Milwaukee's airport and back. Hartmann commented that today most companies do not use limousines for that reason as employees might question the company's spending habits.

Hartmann said he drove more than his partner whose full-time job was less flexible than Hartmann's. Hartmann said he drove through Kiel a few times in the limousine. "You could see people snapping their necks to see what was going on," he said as people in small, rural cities were not used to seeing stretch limousines cruising through their communities.

Business grew quickly and within a couple years the men had three limousines in operation and were already employing additional drivers. After about four years Hartmann bought out his partner's share in the business and continued on his own.

Today, Stardust Limousine has five vehicles but only one of those is a stretch limousine as different types of vehicles are needed for different types of jobs. Stardust also has a stretch SUV, a sedan, a regular Suburban and a limo bus.

Hartmann acquired his first limo bus in 1999 and it was one of the first of its kind in the entire area. He said he paid more for the bus than he did for his house. The bus was in California when he purchased it and he went out there and drove it back to his rural Kiel home.

Hartmann said he would take the limo bus to wedding shows to try to convince brides-to-be to rent the bus for their special day. He said the women did not seem real interested until he coaxed them to take a look inside, at which point they were sold on the idea.

about 10 part-time drivers. Hartmann said he prides his business on doing things the right way with proper insurance and licensing for all vehicles and drivers—something not every limousine "business" does, he said.

Hartmann jokes about this being "better than a real job" but he has all the challenges other businesses face, especially dealing with the pandemic over the past two years as it has changed weddings and cancelled many events. "COVID has really changed everything," he said. "People don't book in advance like they use to. People used to book a year in advance—now I might get two weeks in advance."

Stardust Limousine was steadily growing until COVID hit and Hartmann said he hopes that will resume when the pandemic is over. The business provides limo services for weddings, airport runs, sporting events and concerts, community events, birthdays, couples nights out, and more.

"It's been an adventure for 30 years," Hartmann said, recalling several interesting stories. One time he was away from home for 48 hours straight going from one driving job to the next. He also would take Green Bay Packers on various trips, including one time driving a young quarterback by the name of Brett Favre.



## Glacial Lakes volunteers collect prairie seeds

On a balmy Saturday in September, Glacial Lakes Conservancy (GLC) volunteers ascended Grasshopper Hill to take part in the first annual prairie seed collection.

Since taking ownership of the property in 2017, GLC staff and volunteers have been working diligently to control invasive, non-native species such as buckthorn and spotted knapweed at Grasshopper Hill. In cleared open areas atop Grasshopper Hill, prairie species were introduced. Native species such as little bluestem, purple coneflower and cup plant are well adapted to this dry prairie habitat and provide increased diversity to pollinators and other wildlife in this previously grazed habitat.

Four years after they were first planted by volunteers on Grasshopper Hill, these native prairie species are thriving, and their seed can be harvested. While many of these species spread via wind and wildlife dispersal, seed collection will allow GLC ecologists to expand the prairie restoration to more distant open areas within the preserve. After the seed is collected, it will be dried, processed and ultimately spread onto bare soils during the dormant season. Through this annual tradition, GLC hopes to continue the cycle and facilitate future restoration on Grasshopper Hill.

It is important to note that seed collection requires specific timing and methodology, as each species has its own requirements. Only a very small percentage of seed was harvested to allow for natural reproduction in these early stages of restoration. Seed collection should not be attempted without proper guidance. 

## Fresh Meals On Wheels sees change of CEO

Fresh Meals On Wheels of Sheboygan County, Inc. (FMOW) and its Board of Directors have announced Allison Thompson as CEO of FMOW as of Friday, Dec. 17.

On Dec. 17, 2021, Alex and I will deliver once again and I am looking forward to spending time in the car with my kiddo,

rehashing some of the past years. This will be my final delivery as a Meals On Wheels employee—in fact, it will be my last day on the job at your Meals On Wheels. I am off to the land of retirement, which I expect to be a very busy place indeed, filled with family and friends, art, travel, water and critters.

I happily leave the extremely talented, smart and experienced Allison Thompson to take the reins. Allison has proven her ability to keep the doors open at Meals On Wheels and I know her steadiness will serve the organization well. Her superpower is kindness—she has the ability to show true kindness even under duress, a real blessing, especially during the pandemic.

A lot has changed at MOW—the location and most importantly the food (FOOD food as our clients call it); but the quality of the people remains the same. The folks involved here are outstanding. I recall one client informing me that our volunteers must be "church people." I asked why he thought that and he let me know that there was no other reason that he could think of for people to be so good to him. Ah. Whatever the case, the distilled goodness of our volunteer corps continues to be the vehicle that keeps the meals rolling around here.

"Our college has been graduating nurses, medical assistants, pharmacy technicians and other healthcare workers throughout the pandemic and we welcome all those who want to obtain the education needed to fill these essential roles," said LTC Dean of Health and Human Services Michelle Zautner.

"Coffee Shop Chat," set for Thursday, Jan. 20, offers the chance to ask faculty and staff about LTC's healthcare career programs as well as how to pay for college, the application process, what it is like to be an LTC student, and other topics. The event takes place noon to 3 p.m. at Jenn's Java, 1124 Washington St., Manitowoc. One free beverage or food item will be provided for each participant. No registration is needed.

A healthcare open house featuring a community blood drive is set for Monday, Feb. 14 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at LTC's Cleveland campus. College representatives will be available to answer questions about healthcare programs, how to pay for college, the application process, what it is like to be an LTC student and other topics. Those interested may also take a tour. Appointments for donating blood are required by calling 877-232-4376 or visiting the college's website at gotoltc.edu/ blood-drive. LTC is partnering with Versiti Blood Center of Wisconsin. A blood donation is not required to participate in the open house.

Those interested in pursuing a nursing career have two new options for obtain-

ing a Bachelor's Degree locally either 100 percent or partially. According to Zautner, "These new options can work wonderfully for anyone wanting to stay close to home while learning. They provide opportunities for upcoming high school graduates, adults balancing work and/or family with college, even adults wanting to finish the nursing degree they started years ago but


needed to pause for any reason."

The first option allows LTC Nursing-Associate Degree graduates to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing at any of six University of Wisconsin System campuses signed on to the new agreement, including Green Bay, Milwaukee and Oshkosh. Students would earn their Nursing-Associate Degree at LTC and then complete their higher-level coursework at one of the university campuses.

The second option, called "2+2+1 Nursing Pathway," allows students to earn a Bachelor's Degree in nursing 100 percent locally. Students start by earning an Associate of Arts and Sciences degree at UW-GB's Manitowoc or Sheboygan campus, which typically takes two years. The next step is earning an Associate Degree in Nursing at LTC's Cleveland campus, which also typically takes two years. The final step is taking advanced coursework online through UW-GB, which takes one year.

A significant advantage of these new options for students is that after graduating from LTC's nursing program, students can take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX). Upon passing, they can work as a registered nurse and gain valuable direct patient care experience while completing their Bachelor's Degree. In addition, they can potentially have all or part of their remaining tuition covered by their healthcare employer.

## Tax collection in village continues

Tax bills were mailed Dec. 9.

Property taxes may be paid at the Village Offices at 40 Pine St. from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays. We will be accepting payment until Jan. 31; after that date payments will need to be sent to Sheboygan County. If the village office is closed, payments can be dropped in the drop box located to the left of the doors at the Pine Street entrance. You also can drop your payment off at National Exchange Bank & Trust or Cleveland State Bank in Elkhart Lake. If you have any questions, please call the clerk's office at 876-2122.

The first installment of taxes is due by Jan. 31, 2022. If you want to mail in your tax payment, please mail it to P.O. Box 143, Elkhart Lake, WI 53020. Receipts will not be mailed, unless a self-addressed stamped envelope is included.

#### **Dog licenses**

Please stop in at the Village Hall to license your dog by March 31. You need to provide a proof of rabies vaccination and pay the fee (\$7 per spayed or neutered dog and \$14 per dog if not spayed or neutered). A late charge will be assessed to all dogs not licensed by March 31.

#### **Election information**

There will not be a primary election in February. The ballot is set for the April 5 election. This will include the local elections. The following submitted papers to run for village offices:


#### Absentee voting for April 5

lic Works/Water Department fixing a leaking valve over by Point Elkhart. Throughout the year our Public Works crew works on projects, not just in the nice weather. If you notice any bubbling water near a valve, please contact the Village Hall or the Street Department, as this could be a leak. The Public Works crew did a fabulous job getting this project done before the new year.

#### **Village Future Design Committee**

The Village Future Design Committee has begun meeting again. This committee is working on a facility study for all village-owned buildings. All village departments have put together needs/wants listings. These lists have been provided to Jos. Schmitt & Sons Construction and an architect who will now work on a space assessment. This project will continue over the coming months, but when finished should provide a plan to the Village Board for the next 10 to 20 years.

#### **Village Ordinance-Animal Feces**

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!

#### Village COVID Policy

Because of the increase in COVID cases countywide, the village is requiring that masks be worn in the village offices and village-owned buildings. If you are coming to Village Hall, please bring a mask with you. After speaking with Sheboygan County, the Village Board has adopted the CDC guidelines for quarantining and isolation for its employees.

#### Winter rules began Nov. 15

Winter parking regulations went into effect on Nov. 15. As a reminder, here is the ordinance.

New in 2019! Parking is allowed overnight in the North East Street parking lot overnight until 6 a.m. At that time your vehicle must be moved.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m., and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 a.m. until 9 a.m. commencing the 15th day of November and ending on the first day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient, and you will be in violation.


