A bright, attractive space, Common Goods thrift store, opened December 2, 2021 as a new addition to Crosby's main street.

"The idea to expand into Crosby came from a board member who was intrigued by this great storefront, and it grew from there," said Danell Eggert, manager of the Baxter and Crosby stores. There is also a Common Goods in Crosslake.

"The Baxter Store is indus-

trial, the Crosslake store is boutique-y and I'd describe this one as light and airy. The landlord completely remodeled the space."

For longtime Rangers, the location is the old Skogmos Department Store at 27 Main Street in Crosby. The store is open for shopping Tuesdays through Saturdays 9 to 5 and donations are accepted Tuesday through Saturday from 10-4.

"Donate any items that are nice enough to give to a loved one - clean and in good working order," Eggert advised.

The Crosby staff is hoping to get more items for the

men's section such as tools and sporting goods. They also will take furniture, household decor and goods, clothing

"We have had positive feedback from shoppers. They are excited that we are here and we are excited to be here," enthused Eggert.

Bridges of Hope of Brainerd is the parent organization of the Common Goods stores. The store sales provide about 40 percent of the non-profit's

households who are in crisis, either directly or steering them to other resources. They serve all of Crow Wing County along with the Aitkin, Pillager and Pine River school districts.

Their Operation Sandwich program provides food to low-income students when there are school breaks and during the summer. There is a concern that students who partake of free and reduced lunches won't have adequate nutrition when schools are closed.

The new Warming Shelter also opened on December 2.

# Crosby council approves street projects and accepts police chief resignation

At the Monday, Jan. 24 City of Crosby Council meeting, the council reviewed the plans presented by City Engineer Phil Martin. They approved moving forward on two road improvement projects for 2022 — one on First Street SW and another on Fourth Street NE.

The First Street SW project will extend from the Holiday gas station, past Graphics Packaging towards the city maintenance garage. A sidewalk with curb and gutter is proposed from Third Avenue to Sixth Avenue SW. In addition, replacement of the lift station, water main and cast iron sewer pipes, which are estimated to be over 50 years old will be part of the project. The estimated total for this project with sidewalk is \$3,244,900 or without sidewalk is \$3,195,200.

The Fourth Street NE project will replace the clay pipes under the road on one block between Second and Third Avenues. The estimated total for this project with a 28 feet wide road is \$328,700 or a 35 feet wide road is \$335,800.

The city will pursue a grant or low-interest funding for the project. However, property

owners will be assessed at 25 percent of the cost for road and sidewalk improvements, which would be approximately \$58 per foot.

A public hearing on the projects is scheduled Monday, Feb. 28 at 6 p.m.

Mayor Diane Cash requested two corrections in the January 10 minutes. Both were having to do with to the public hearing on the proposed alley vacation. Later in the meeting council unanimously voted to deny the petition to vacate alley in Block 2, Keating's Addition to Crosby.

In the public comment portion of the meeting, Councilman Chris Ryan apologized to Mayor Cash for comments he wrote in a letter to the editor published in the Crosby-Ironton Courier that contained inaccurate information and accusations. He had accused Cash of favoring a contractor used by the city, because her son worked there. Rather it was Cash's son-in-law and he was hired after the contract was approved.

Mayor Cash asked the council if they wanted to make it a policy to remove snow from the sidewalks on First Street North and South as well as Second Avenue up to Eighth Street after the primary snow removal was done. The council unanimously approved the

City Administrator Matthew Hill said that Police Chief Andrew Rooney submitted his resignation to City Administrator on Wednesday, Jan. 19. Chief Rooney's last day will be September 16, 2022. The resignation was unanimously approved with regrets.

The council unanimously approved a new hire Administrative Assistant Samantha Wodarz pending a background check. The position was available as Administrative Assistant, Stephanie Winegarner wil become Utility Billing Clerk, as René Lind retired.

The purchase of a new Zamboni from Becker Arena Products for the John Spalj Arena at the Hallett Center of Crosby was approved by the council. They did the required fundraising and have \$50,000, which requires matching funds. The Northern Lakes Youth Hockey Association will provide the \$50,000 match and will be responsible for securing sponsorship and the ultimate appearance of the "wrap" on the Zamboni.

The Council unanimously approved the purchase and installation of the Third Street lift station control panel by WW Goetsch at the estimated cost \$26,257.00, not including the labor.

The new owner at 102 West Main Street, Doug Arndt, would like to make improvements to the property. He has worked with the city on a prior project, Rafferty's and Crosby Lofts, and asks that the city supports his future application for funding to assist in the cost of remodeling of the building. Arndt said they plan to close on the property on February 1, 2022 and do something virtually identical as the Rafferty's Lofts project to the upstairs. The downstairs will have either one or two tenants. A stairway splits the retail space. Arndt said they are looking for tenants. He plans to have it open late in the third quarter 2022 conditional on securing funding. The council unanimously approved authorizing the City of Crosby to make application to accept funds from the Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation Board grant program.

Council unanimously approved Rachel Severson and Linda Peeples as the members of the Planning and Zoning Committee for the next twoyears and thanked Darren Andrews for his service to the community.

Planning and Zoning Committee voted unanimously to approve Jacob Zoesch application to subdivide a 2.54 acre parcel into five residential lots. The plat was revised to include a 35 ft. alley and is located between Spalj Street and Sixth Street NE. and provide a park dedication fee in the amount of \$4,576.

The council approved the preliminary plat as presented with a three to two vote. Councilmen Paul Heglund and Ryan voted "opposed," because they felt the park dedication fee should be waived.

Councilman Heglund said he noticed in the Crosby-Ironton Courier that Councilman Jim Traylor was quoted saying that the council worked for

"We do not work for the mayor, Jim," said Heglund.

Councilman Traylor replied, "Is everything in the Courier gospel?"

Heglund responded well it should be if someone reads it. Traylor then said the mayor makes appointments and you're basically doing what the mayor wants you to do. Heglund then said the mayor runs the meeting and is the tie breaker that's all.

After talking about two trucks that are currently out of commission for snow hauling, Cash suggested to workout details at the committee level instead of at the council meetings. Councilman Heglund disagreed and said he prefers to discuss openly at the council meetings.

Councilman Traylor accepted the committee appointment to the refuse committee. While Councilman Heglund gave up his refuse committee appointment.

The next council meeting will be on Monday, Feb. 14.




