

Livingston County and the Genesee Valley Conservancy have announced that pre-applications will be accepted from landowners interested in being considered for the Purchase of Development Rights (PDR) program or other state and federal farmland protection initiatives that may become available in the future. The PDR program is competitive, and it reimburses farmers up to 87.5% of the value of the development rights on their land. The Mount Morris Shopper feels that everyone has a right to be heard (or read, in this case) so we are offering this page each week (space permitting) for our readers to share their ideas, views, feelings or whatever. Realizing that everyone cannot AFFORD to pay for this privilege, the Mount Morris Shopper is offering this page as a FREE Public Service for articles or letters sent in for publication. All letters submitted must be signed with the name, address and phone number of the author. Please make letters as brief as possible.

Dear "Speak Out,"

It's interesting when the people who are supposedly fighting against overreach of the state or federal government leap to the need for legislation when it's an effort to control someone else. No more or less ironic than using the Founding Fathers (a collection of slaveowners) as a call to freedom, I suppose.

Using words like "pro-death," "mother" and "baby/child" when talking about abortion are done on purpose – to cause shame, guilt and feelings of loathing toward those who have abortions. All of this vitriol, despite the fact that an average of 1 in 5 women has had an abortion. Ipso facto, someone you know – and love – has had an abortion. Someone I know and love has had an abortion.

This hateful rhetoric is one of the many reasons why so many people do not tell others when they have an abortion. But the other reason we don't hear from those in our lives who have abortions is because...it's none of our business.

We won't hear from thousands I mentioned last week who are already parents, and who cannot afford to take care of more children – because they owe us nothing.

We won't hear about the thousands of pregnancies that are life-threatening, and would-be parents (or, again, already parents) whose own lives, bodies and livelihoods (think about what it means to be bedridden or hospitalized for months in a nation with for-profit healthcare) are in physical danger when carrying a pregnancy — because they owe us nothing.

We won't hear from the thousands of loved ones who survive the devastating loss of an intended pregnancy that, despite their hopes and efforts, presented a life-or-death situation – because they owe us nothing.

We won't hear about the thousands of pregnancies caused by nonconsensual experiences every year, from the survivors as young as ten years old and who deserve healing and support (not to carry their rapist's child) – because they owe us nothing.

And we won't hear from the thousands who decide to terminate a pregnancy for the simple reason that they are not yet ready, for reasons large and small, to be a parent—or (gasp) do not want to be a parent. Their reasons, like everyone's who I have mentioned, are valid and they, like everyone else, owe us nothing.

It may comfort readers to know that abortion rates in the U.S. have steadily been going down year after year - - demonstrating how effective family planning services are. It may be a surprise to know that millions of people in the U.S. do not identify as a "true Christian" or a Christian at all, and have every right to their beliefs and happiness too.

But if we are to entertain what Jesus might want for the children and families of the U.S., I'll say that the Jesus I learned about wouldn't be a fan of health insurance companies, or drone strikes, or capital punishment, or for-profit medicine at all. Jesus might want to know why the U.S. has some of the worst maternal health outcomes in the industrialized world. Jesus might want to know why some random men are so vehemently intent on controlling whether or not someone has a baby, and not whether or not alive children have safe shelter, food and support.

This is true, however — Mississippi's law will call the entire structure of Roe into question if it's upheld. If this occurs, though, it will not stop abortion. It will only limit access to safe abortion. What I am saying is...more people will die. Sounds pro-life, right?

This week's article is entitled "The Decline of Our American Economy and the Weakening of Our Defenses".

In 1973, the "National Council for United States – China Trade", later renamed the "United States – China Business Council" (USCBC), led the first American business delegation to China since the founding of the People's Republic of China in 1949.

This eventually led to the People's Republic of China being granted "Most Favored Nation Status". American companies began to move their plants to China and other countries soon after. Greed for increased profits was more important than patriotism. A low paid work force was seen to increase profits.

Since this trend began decades ago, many of our cities, such as Detroit, have become ghost towns of poverty with empty factories.

The Senate voted to give the People's Republic of China permanent "Most Favored Nation Status" on Tuesday, September 19, 2000. This vote paved the way for China's entrance into the World Trade Organization.

During the first few months of the Iraq War, a country overseas which manufactured computer chips for our Patriot missiles refused to export these chips to America because they disagreed with our invasion of Iraq. It was several months before America could build a plant in our country to manufacture these essential military components.

This should have awakened America to the serious problem in which we now exist. I have written many letters to our president, senators and congressman expressing my concern regarding this dangerous situation in which we currently exist and suggesting legislation mandating American companies with plant overseas return within five years or suffer economic sanctions.

I have also suggested that we assist new companies in building their factories in America to replace our dependance upon these overseas companies if they refuse to comply.

In 2014 the People's Republic of China finally surpassed America as the number one economic country in the world. My main concern is that the present supply chain crisis is an indication that we are in extreme danger.
