

Dear "Speak Out,"

I write to clarify a few points from my prior writings, for some who seem to have misunderstood.

I want to clarify that "the birth rate" is not the same thing as "the number of births." Rates, rather than a total number, capture the percentage of those having children out of the total number of people at that time. What seemed a cheeky "gotcha" is merely a misread of what I said regarding the declining birth rate in the U.S. which has, as I stated, declined for the past few years. In fact, 2020 marked the sixth consecutive year of declining birth rates in the U.S. Anyway...

A passing judgment about someone (you assume is) using public assistance but has a "new car" is hardly a valid argument against family planning. Indeed, snide aspersions about the economic choices of poor or working class people matter not at all in deciding whether or not everyone deserves quality healthcare and the ability to decide whether or not they are a parent, and the only real accomplishment of such statements is to announce (loudly) to all around you how prejudiced you are.

I was confused by the line "as a Planned Parenthood official decrying a bogus decline in population [?] while at the same time claiming a need for their services." Beyond a false premise, whether or not a clinic offering contraception/STI testing and treatment is needed is near-completely separate from whether or not the number of babies born goes up or down. Tossing in a statement about a problematic founder of an organization (whom the organization has spoken out against for a number of years) is either a last attempt to grasp an argument, or utter devolvement.

Finally, I appreciate the kind words offered by Carolyn Pollock and others throughout this exchange. We would do well to follow her advice: listen with compassion and open hearts, and seek to be part of the solution.

I have noticed that many Democrats and Republicans alike repeatedly refer to the form of government of the United States of America as a "democracy". We are a "republic" and not a "democracy!"

Article IV Section 4 of our wonderful United States Constitution reads "The United States shall guarantee to every State in this Union a Republican Form of Government, and shall protect each of them against Invasion; and on Application of the Legislature, or of the Executive (when the Legislature cannot be convened) against domestic Violence."

Thomas Jefferson wrote in a letter to Edward Carrington on Tuesday, January 16, 1787, regarding democracies "Among the latter, under pretence of governing they have divided their nations into two classes, wolves and sheep."

Alexander Hamilton said on Tuesday, June 26, 1787, "Real liberty is not found in the extremes of democracy, but in moderate governments. If we incline too much to democracy we shall soon shoot into a monarchy, or some other form of a dictatorship."

On Monday, September 17, 1787, delegates were leaving Independence Hall in Philadelphia after the last session of the Second Constitutional Congress. They had just completed the final draft of our wonderful United States Constitution. As they exited, the elder statesman, Benjamin Franklin, was asked "What kind of government do we have?" He replied, "A Republic, if you can keep it."

Alexander Hamilton in a speech to Congress on Saturday, June 21, 1788, said "It has been observed by an honorable gentleman, that a pure democracy, if it were practicable, would be the most perfect government. Experience has proved, that no position in politics is more false than this. The ancient democracies, in which the people themselves deliberated, never possessed one feature of good government. Their very character was tyranny; their figure deformity."

President George Washington, in his first Presidential Inaugural Address on Thursday, April 30, 1789, said "The preservation of the sacred fire of liberty and the destiny of the republican model of government are justly considered, perhaps, as deeply, as finally staked on the experiment entrusted to the hands of the American people."

Thomas Jefferson wrote in a letter to William Hunter in 1790 "The republican is the only form of government which is not eternally at open or secret war with the rights of mankind." Thomas Jefferson also lamented that "a democracy is nothing more than mob rule, where 51 percent of the people may take away the rights of the other 49".

This is happening in the United States Congress as those in the majority seek to take away the rights of the minority. What Thomas Jefferson said a couple of hundred years ago remains true!

James Madison argued that democracies "have ever been spectacles of turbulence and contention; have ever been incompatible with personal security or the rights of property; and have in general been as short in their lives as they have been violent in their deaths".

Unfortunately, we are progressively changing into a "democracy" as one faction seeks to dominate opposing views and we see division and strife within our country as violence continues to undermine our fundamental principles.

Lord willing, I will continue with this topic next week.

As you may know, the Morris Ridge Solar project is being planned in your area.

During the pre-construction site investigation process, additional geotechnical work is taking place in the coming weeks at select locations within the project area indicated on this map.

This will involve activities such as drilling pilot holes in the ground and driving piles into the ground, leaving them in place for a few days or weeks, and pulling them out. This



work is being conducted to complete the design for the solar panel foundations, which will vary based on ground characteristics and depth to bedrock.

More information will be shared with the community as construction plans are finalized.



The Mount Morris fire district is pleased to announce that we have taken possession of a brand-new 2021 Fout Bros 3000-gallon tanker.


This tanker will be the replacement for our current 1993 Spartan 1500-gallon tanker.

February is National Children's Dental Health Month

The American Dental Association designates February as National Children's Dental Health Month (NCDHM). The month-long observance promotes the benefits of good oral health to children, their caregivers, teachers and many others.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), cavities are one of the most common chronic diseases of childhood in the United States. Untreated cavities can cause pain and infections that may lead to problems with eating, speaking, playing, and learning.

The good news is that cavities are preventable. Fluoride varnish can prevent about one-third (33%) of cavities in the primary (baby) teeth. Children living in communities with fluoridated tap water have fewer cavities than children whose water is not fluoridated. Similarly, children who brush daily with fluoride toothpaste will have fewer cavities.

Here are some tips on what caregivers can do to prevent cavities:

For babies

- Wipe gums twice a day with a soft, clean cloth in the morning after the first feeding and right before bed to wipe away bacteria and sugars that can cause cavities.
- When teeth come in, start brushing twice a day with a soft, small-bristled toothbrush and plain water.
- Visit the dentist by your baby's first birthday to spot signs of problems early.
- Talk to your dentist or doctor about putting fluoride varnish on your child's teeth as soon as the first tooth appears.
- For children younger than 2, consult first with your doctor or dentist regarding the use of fluoride toothpaste.

<u>For children</u>

- Brush their teeth twice a day with fluoride toothpaste.
- · Drink tap water that contains fluoride.
- Ask your child's dentist to apply dental sealants when appropriate.
- If your child is younger than 6, watch them brush.
- Make sure they use a pea-sized amount of toothpaste and always spit it out rather than swallow.
- Help your child brush until they have good brushing skills.
