Florence Gets Planning Award

FLORENCE - The Office of Planning and Community Development for the City of Florence recently received the prestigious **Audrey Nelson** Community Development Achievement Award through the National Community Development Association (NCDA) in Washington, D.C. The honor was for the creation and implementation of Florence First, an economic program created to provide financial relief from the impacts of the COVID-19

pandemic to small businesses. Florence First provided relief to 69 small businesses

across nine industries for fixed expenses resulting in reduced job loss and business clósures.

"Florence First is an extraordinary example of how federal funding administered through local governments can increase economic stability and boost economic recovery to mitigate the impact of crises on communities,' said Melissa H. Bailey, Planning Director and program creator.



and we expect another sellout crowd for 2022, said Lions Athletic Club vice president Dan Penny.

Considered one of the all-around post players in basketball history, Walton played collegiately for coach John Wooden and the **UCLA** Bruins, winning three consecutive

national college player of the year awards (1972-1974), while leading UCLA to NCAA championships in 1972 and 1973. That run included an 88-game winning streak.
After being selected

Walton

After being selected as the first overall pick in the 1974 NBA draft, Walton led the Portland Trail Blazers to an NBA championship in 1977, earning the NBA Finals Most Valuable Player Award that season. He was named 1978 NBA Valuable Player Most and later won another NBA title with the Boston Celtics in 1986. Walton was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1993. He was named to the NBA's 50th and 75th anniversary teams.

Walton's professional career began to be hampered significantly by multiple foot injuries numerous requiring

surgeries. He sat out the 1978–79 season and was then signed by the San Diego Clippers, for whom he played four injury-

plagued seasons. His career was rehabilitated during two seasons with the Boston Celtics at the end of his career as backup center behind Robert Parish. Walton

earned the NBA Sixth Man of the Year Award in the 1985–86 season, winning his second championship that same season.

After retiring from the NBA, Walton embarked on a second career as a sportscaster, working both as a studio analyst and color commentator, mostly for ESPN, with stints for several other networks and teams. He earned an Emmy Award in 1991.

Walton is a noted fan of the Grateful Dead, as a self-"Deadhead", described often and mentions them in his broadcasts. He has hosted several podcasts and satellite radio programs featuring the music of the Grateful Dead.







Ott will discuss that remarkable Haitian story hidden for half a century during a special book signing and fundraiser for Liberte' Ministries at Pickett Place in Florence on Tuesday, February 6:30pm.

Saturday's name was Kwanbe Ansong (born on Saturday, Seventh

Born Child). In hopes of avoiding being given a slave nickname, he chose an easy term, Saturday, and it stuck.

"I started finding out about my history at an early age when my Aunt Nadine talked with me in South Carolina," Ott recalled. "From the time I was a boy, I would pick up bits and pieces."

The Haitian war of independence began in flames on August 22, 1791. On that night known as the "Night of Fire" over 100,000 slaves rose up against their hated French overlords, burning every plantation, and executing every French man, woman, and child they could find. Saturday dared save the lives of the master's two young white children, smuggled them to safety and fostered them over a period of 40 years.

Delivered through a series of letters, Ott accurately describes the history and social landscape of Saturday's time, telling the true version of his life, not just the true what plantation masters and their families wanted even demanded hearing.


Despite being a slave, Saturday was not only literate, but was widely read and spoke seven languages. Two were African (Ewe and Yoruba). two were Afro American Atro 22 Creole and Gullah). (Haitian Lowcountry And three were European (English, Spanish). French,

Even as he unfolds his life's story, Saturday recognized the danger of releasing it during his lifetime, even to his "boys." Thus, it was not until Saturday's death in 1850 that Philip Chartrand, the older of the children, learned the true story of Saturday and the Witch Woman.

"I have written two books about Haiti, the first

was about the revolution that was published in 1973."

Ott earned his Ph.D. in Caribbean History from the University of Tennessee long before that publication. The Haitian Revolution 1791-1804 still stands as one of the paramount books on that subject. Ott retired from the University of North Alabama in 2010 to write the story of Saturday and the Witch Women (Alicia Wahl)

"I inherited a lot of my mother's belongings when she passed away in 2003 including materials about Saturday and other relatives," Ott said.

Saturday was grandmother Catherine's, personal attendant when she lived there.

About Liberte' **Ministries**

Liberte Ministries (Liberty in French) began work in Haiti in 2010.

The ministry is overseen by Petersville Church of Christ in Florence and a board of directors.

"We have a 4-year School of Biblical Studies, two elementary schools with 580 students, a program vocational for women, and ` orphanage. Harry's Home orphanage provides a great environment for the children we serve and they are the recipients of any funds raised at this event, said Arvy Dupuy, one of the Liberte' volunteers here in Florence.

"We are a 501c3 in the US and have no paid staff here or leased offices. Everyone is a volunteer, meaning 100% of funds raised go directly to services in Haiti." Members of the local team visit Haiti several times a year to ensure that things are going as planned and the children are safe. We have a variety of Haitian staff that overlap to insure the safety, security, and well-being of the children we serve as well.

"Dr. Ott has graciously offered to pay for the books from his publisher, so that 100% of the proceeds from this event go to the children," Dupuy added.



Medicare Minute

"Medicare Part B"

Before we begin talking about Medicare Part B I would like to clear up something that was in last week's article concerning Medicare Part A. As I stated in the article Part A has a deductible of \$1,556 per benefit period. I also stated that if you paid into Medicare for 40 quarters that Part A was free to you. I was referring to the fact that you would not have to pay a premium to Medicare for Part A, not that it would exclude you from paying the deductible.

Medicare Part B is the part of Medicare that is billed when you receive services as an outpatient by a Medicare approved provider, such as your primary care physician (PCP) or specialist. Although a visit to your doctor is the primary way that you will use Medicare Part B, it also covers many other services. We will discuss the other services in next week's article.

If you are turning 65 in 2022, Medicare Part B will have a premium of \$170.10/mo. Because there is a premium attached to Medicare Part B this coverage is optional. This means you are not required to enroll in Medicare Part B. There are two important things to remember about Part B being optional. First, if you opt out of Part B you will have no coverage under Medicare for your outpatient services. Second, if you decide at a later date to enroll in Part B there can be a late enrollment penalty applied that will last as long as you live and have Part B. There are exceptions to the late enrollment penalty that we will discuss in future articles.

She made an urgent "zip your mouth" motion to him as she was gathering up her keys and purse. She very briefly explained to him that she had to transfer some money or she was going to be arrested. Before my friend could even take a sip of coffee, she was running out the door. He tried to stop her to ask what the heck was going on but it was too late: She had already taken the bait and left her husband standing in his underwear in

the driveway. Her husband tried calling to let her know it was a scam to no avail.

Sally retrieved \$900 from the ATM and proceeded to a shabby convenience store in Seven Points, Florence. She pulled into the parking lot and that's when the terror thankfully released her and rationality took over again. Sally relayed to me that it was at this point that "This is a scam" entered her mind. She sat there for a moment mulling over the consequences of simply driving off and finally did just that - drove off.

I suspect the scammer would have met her, introduced himself, taken her \$900 cash, and promised that the warrant would be removed from her record.

However, the scammer very well could have actually 'arrested" her and Very Bad Things could have happened.

In case you don't know, caller ID can be faked. The sheriff or police will never phone you to request money in exchange for un-filing an arrest warrant; they will simply show up at your home or office, unannounced, and arrest you. So if you receive a call like this, call the police and let them handle it.

According to Lee Murkey, a local film critic who will introduce one of the movies at The Ritz, Poitier's importance to film and to African American history cannot be overstated.

'Sidney Poitier's talent was immeasurably great. However, it was the marriage of this talent and his love, care, and support of the civil rights movement that makes him an indispensable figure in both the realm of cinema and African American culture," said Murkey.

The first film in the series, Stir Crazy, will be shown on Thursday, February 17. This film stars comedy legends Richard

Pryor and Gene Wilder and represents Poitier's career as a director of comedy films. Arts and culture critic Vicki Basley Goldston will introduce the film.

In the Heat of the Night will be the second film on Friday, February 18. The film stars Poitier and Rod Steiger and tells the story of a Black detective from Philadelphia who helps with a murder investigation in small-town Mississippi. Film critic Lee Murkey will provide an introduction and lead a Q&A, exploring the history

of Black policing in cinema. The final film in the series will be Raisin in the Sun on Saturday, February 19. In the film, Poitier reprises the role he originated in the Broadway production of the play by Lorraine Hansberry.

There will introduction and Q&A by Dr. Karla Zelaya, Assistant Professor of English at the University of North Alabama. She will discuss both Hansberry's play and how the performance fits into Poitier's career.

"Poitier carried with him a distinct dignity, a luminescent glow that was far too bright to be dimmed by the limitations imposed by the era in which he worked," said Murkey.





Dear Athletic Support: A bunch of my son's friends live in our neighborhood. They're all in middle school.

They play all the sports. Our house is centrally located with a big lot in the back, and an extra-wide driveway. So, yeah, all these boys are over at our house all the time. I love it. I love that I get to watch my son interact with his friends.

I like knowing right where he is and what he's doing. Mostly these boys just play sports. Football and baseball in the big lot, basketball in the driveway. There is one downside to all this, though. My wife and I are the only parents there to watch them. The boys play nice most of the time, except when they're playing football. One boy always ends up tackling all the others. He's a big kid. Rough too. I'm never really sure what to say to him. I mean, I'm not his parent, but it is my house. How in the world am I supposed to discipline somebody else's kid, or should I even discipline him at all?

- The Cool House

Dear Cool House:

The last thing you want is for one of the kids to get hurt on your watch. If you let this big kid keep playing rough, that's what will happen.

The first thing you need to do is try talking to the big boy in private. Pull him aside before the other boys notice. Nobody likes being called out in front of their peers, middle school boys hate it even more.

When you talk to him, be clear about what you expect. Tell



him the rules of your house. Also, warn him what will happen if he breaks those rules. You would be well within

your rights as a parent to keep this boy from coming to your house if he continues playing

too rough.

There's a good chance his parents will call after your talk. Nobody likes it when their kid gets parented by another parent. So, this conversation might set off all sorts of alarms

for the big boy's parents. Tell them you have to take the other kid's safety into consideration. Tell them how you gave him the private warning and told him explicitly what the consequences would be.

If the parents still don't like it — or the big professional quarterback and boy keeps showing up you have every right to notify the proper authorities. In the end, it's your house and you should do what you can to protect it.



JURY CHARGES

We were going to trial this week on a car wreck case but did not have enough jurors from which to choose a jury of 12. Alabama law provides that in a civil case there must be at least 24 people from which to choose. This group of people is called the venire. Just so you know, a jury of 12 is a petit jury and they decide civil and criminal cases in Alabama while it takes 18 jurors to form a grand jury which decides whether or not there is sufficient probable cause to bind someone over for a criminal trial.

One of the interesting things that lawyers do for a jury trial is

provide the court with jury charges for the judge to read to the jury. The judge is in charge of the law and the jury is there to decide the facts of the case. Ultimately, the judge decides what law to give the jury that would apply in a particular case. If the lawyers believe the judge is in error, they may say so on the record and if things don't turn out well based on that ill advised charge, a reversal in the appellate court is possible.

When I started in the late '80s, the lawyers would gather paragraphs of law or quotations from the Alabama Supreme Court that they thought applied (and were helpful to their case) and urge the judge to read those to the jury as the law of the case. This led to errors

The Alabama Supreme Court created a committee of judges, plaintiff lawyers, and defense lawyers who volunteer their time to produce instructions which accurately reflect the decisions and statutes of the courts and legislature of Alabama. These are known as the Alabama Pattern Jury Instructions. These are statements of the law that are approved by the Alabama Supreme Court.

The goal is that the jury clearly understand the issues, the law, how it decides facts, and how it uses the law to reach a verdict. The trial judge's responsibility is to communicate these things to the jury. The best practice for lawyers is to find the jury instructions that apply and put them in the case file before they really begin working



Yes, you read the above correctly. For probably the first time ever, I (partially) agree with Schumer on something.

half he got wrong: He wanted the rules change to apply to only one piece of legislation: The Democratic Party's "voting rights" bill.

The part he got right was suggesting a reversion of Senate rules to require the old-fashioned "talking filibuster."

Until 1987 the filibuster required effort. To delay the body's vote on a bill with majority support, a Senator in the minority had to take the floor for debate and refuse to give it up.

So long as the Senator kept talking (standing, without leaning on the podium), it took a supermajority vote (at one time, 67 votes, now 60) to end debate. But if the minority left the debate floor vacant for even a moment, the majority could proceed to a vote on the bill.

These days, all a minority Senator has to do to stop a bill from coming to a vote is object, and if his or her party can marshal 40 or more votes against "cloture," it can leave the bill in limbo eternal by pretending the matter is still "under

I'm firmly on record as

opinion, the less the Senate gets done," the better off most Americans are. I'd support a constitutional amendment requiring a unanimous, or at least high super-majority vote, to pass any bill. It should be hard to subject 330 million Americans to legislative dictates.


However, I'm also in favor of requiring politicians to debate the bills they propose or oppose instead of just blocking consideration of those bills.

Senators spend millions getting elected to, and are paid \$174,000 per year to serve in, what Edmund Burke called a deliberative assembly. They should have to deliberate secure victory or impose defeat.

The "talking filibuster" should be restored as a permanent Senate rule instead of offered up as a one-off workaround.




IS IT A LOAN, OR IS IT A GIFT?

Dear Dave,

We have \$15,000 in credit card debt. My husband works very hard, but only makes about \$25,000 a year. We're also living in a very old trailer right now, and I stay at home with our newborn. My dad told us he is willing to pay off our debt if we agree to get financial counseling together, and show that we are serious about doing better with our finances. What should we do?

Dear Harper, I wouldn't accept the



money from your dad if it's going to be a loan. If you really want to ruin family events, have debt to your parents. It twists you up inside. And it'll be especially hard on your husband. No matter what anyone else says, the borrower is *always* slave to the lender.

If it's going to be a gift, meaning there's no expectation of repayment, that's a different story. Still, I think your dad has a great idea in making the debt payoff contingent on you two going to some kind of financial selling author, counseling, and making a proactive effort to change things, get out of debt and save money—for your child's future and for yours. I'd probably do the same thing.

It doesn't sound like

you're being crazy with your money, but it's tough to provide for a family on that kind of income. You and your husband need to sit down together, develop a monthly budget and a realistic five-year plan to improve his earning potential. Make it a date night. Hold hands, do something inexpensive you both enjoy, and let him know he can be anything he wants to be. Then, help him decide exactly what and where he wants to be in five years. What does he want to be making, and what feasible steps can he take educationally or in terms of job training to get there?

If you want to go to work at some point when your baby is a little older, that's fine. I completely understand the desire to be at home with a brand new baby. But hard work alone just isn't enough these days. You've got to boost your brain power and value in the marketplace, too. God bless you guys!
