



In an unprecedented move last week, Clay County Fair CEO Jeremy Parsons used the Spencer Chamber of Commerce's Thursday night Business After Hours to announce all the Grandstand entertainment for the 2022 Clay County Fair, sponsored by Spencer Municipal Utilities. Parsons said he was announcing the schedule for all nine nights "to give our enthusiastic fairgoers more time to plan their entire Fair visit. Plus, it gives us all something to look forward to while we still 'enjoy' winter." The Fair will run from September 10th to September 18th, with event tickets expected to go on sale "in

the weeks ahead," Parsons said. Russell Dickerson, with special guest Adam Sanders, will be the opening entertainment on Saturday, September 10th . Dickerson is a multi-platinum Nashville-based singer, songwriter, and multi-instrumentalist. In 2017, his goldcertified full-length debut, Yours, bowed at Number 5 on



the *Billboard Top Country Albums Chart*. The album yielded three consecutive #1 smashes, including the double-platinum, *Yours*, the platinum *Blue Tacoma*, and *Every Little Thing*.


Nominations followed at the Academy of Country Music Awards, CMT Music Awards, and iHeartRadio Music Awards. This year he has already released his second full-length album, *Southern Symphony*, led by the singles *Love You Like I Used To, Home Sweet*, and *Never* Gets Old

CeCe Winans, with special guest Riley Clemmons will perform on Sunday night, September 11th. The best-selling and most-awarded female Gospel artist of all time, Winans has influenced a generation of Gospel and secular vocalists over the course of her astonishing career. Her mantel today holds a staggering 12 Grammy Awards, 20 Dove Awards and 7 Stellar Awards. She has sold in excess of 5 million albums in the U.S., topping the Gospel charts repeatedly while crossing over with smashes like Count on Me, her duet with Whitney Houston from the multi-platinum *Waiting to Exhale* soundtrack, which sold 2 million copies, and cracked the Top 10 on the Pop, R&B, and Adult Contemporary charts. Clemons is one of Contemporary Christian music's newest stars. Her first single, Broken *Prayers*, took flight in 2017 and racked up 30 million-plus streams. In support of her 2018 self-titled debut album, she hit the road for the first time with Tauren Wells and grew into a powerhouse presence on stage. Her second album, Godsend, was released in 2020 with her fastest growing single to date, Keep on Hoping, which has quickly climbed the Billboard and radio airplay charts.

The only Monday night of the Fair, September 12th, will see The Leroy Van Dyke Country Gold Tour featuring Leroy Van Dyke, Jimmy Fortune, T.G. Sheppard, T. Graham Brown, The Malpass Brothers and Mandy Barnett. This evening will feature renowned classic country music performers who have topped the charts. They'll all perform the celebrated Nashville sound that took their music around the world including hits like *Auctioneer, Walk on By, Elizabeth, My Only Love, I Loved 'Em Every One,* and more. Joining them will be several Public Television favorites.

The racing season begins on Tuesday, the 13th, when The Lucas Oil American Sprint Car Series returns after a successful debut in 2021, and will be joined again by the Tri-State Late Models, IMCA Blue Ribbon Showdown - Wednesday, September 14th, with Hot Laps at 7:00. The 2022 racing season at the Clay County Fair Speedway winds down with an IMCA showdown that includes Hobby Stocks, Sports Mods, Modifieds, Stock Cars and Sports Compacts.

*Vanilla Ice* and special guest *The Ying Yang Twins* are set for Thursday, September 15th. The iconic Robert Van Winkle, aka Vanilla Ice, exploded on the Rap/Pop music scene in 1990, selling 10 million albums in four months and topping the Billboard charts with the Top single, *Ice Baby*, and the Number 1 album. With worldwide album sales of more than 15 million, *Vanilla Ice* has won two *MTV* Awards, a People's Choice Award, and was nominated for a Grammy. He has toured consistently throughout his career since 1990 performing all



### Hawks Soaring, Cyclones Crashing

It's the dog days of February for college basketball teams where conference play can begin to be a grind as teams battle for post season positioning. This past week saw our two in-state Power 5 teams take two different paths as Iowa went 3-0 with three convincing wins while Iowa State went 0-2 with a crushing home loss on Saturday to Kansas State. Both teams entered the week in good shape regarding the NCAA Tournament, while the Hawks bolstered their NCAA chances, the Cyclones chances took a major hit and it's now desperation time for ISU.

Iowa now sits at 17-7 with an impressive 7-6 B1G Conference record. Iowa saw its offense explode in their last two wins, scoring 110 points in their 110-87 win at Maryland behind Jordan Bohannon's school-record 10 three-pointers, and then put up 98 in a 23-point win over Fred Hoiberg's hapless Huskers on Sunday behind a career-high 37 points from Keegan Murray. Iowa's offense has been elite for most of the season and it appears recently their defense has picked up a level, which has made the Hawks a very dangerous team. Iowa has put themselves in a position where three more wins probably gets them in the tournament, and if they can keep playing with the confidence they showed last week, that should not be an issue. Their schedule does get tougher this week with games at home vs Michigan and then at Ohio State, but one has to like Iowa's chances at this point of the season.

Iowa State was picked last in the Big 12, and after their disappointing 75-69 overtime loss at home to Kansas State on Saturday, in which the Cyclones blew a 15-point second half lead, last place is exactly where the Cyclones are at 3-9 in Big 12 play. The Cyclones undefeated non-conference season is the only reason the Cyclones are still in contention for the NCAA Tournament as they do still sit 16-9 overall. Most experts think that ISU needs to finish 7-11 in the Big 12, and with that loss at home to 13-11 Kansas State, those chances to get four more wins just became that much harder. I try to remind myself of the low expectations and how bad ISU was the last two seasons when getting frustrated with their recent losses. The bottom line is this team is very limited with nine scholarship players and not a lot of offensive fire-power. For the Cyclones to win games in the Big 12 they have to be nearly perfect with their effort and execution, and recently that has not happened as too many live-ball turnovers have led to easy baskets for their opponents that ISU just can't overcome. While not giving up completely on ISU's NCAA Tournament hopes, they are dimming by the moment and I'm not very confident they can find four more wins.

# A Change to the State's Elderly Credit Program

Last session the Iowa legislature expanded property tax assistance to those Iowans who are 70 or older as of December 31, 2021 with a 2021 household income less than 250% of the federal poverty level. "Property tax credits were established by the state legislature many years ago to help low-income elderly property owners, totally disabled property owners and low income mobile home owners pay their property tax bills," says Dickinson County Treasurer Kris Rowley.

"Those eligible under the new law can sign up to create a property tax freeze based on the amounts paid next September 2022 and March 2023. Any increase in property taxes from this established base amount will be paid through a property tax credit going forward. Eligible individuals must file a claim with the county treasurer's office before June 1, 2022, to establish the base for future property tax credits under this new law. If you have already submitted an Elderly and Disabled tax claim for this year, it will be considered for both programs and your baseline will be established if you are 70 or older and meet the income guidelines."

The claim forms are available through the county treasurer's office or on the county's website at https://dickinsoncountyiowa.gov/treasurer on the treasurer page. Eligibility for the Elderly, Disabled and Mobile Home tax credit programs are as follows:

65 or older as of December 31, 2021 with a total household income of less than \$24,354.00. 18 or older and totally disabled as of December 31, 2021, with a total household income of less than \$24,354.00.

23 or older with a total household income of less than \$24,354.00 as of December 31, 2021 for mobile/manufactured/modular home tax credits.

70 or older with total household incomes below 250% of the federal poverty levels.

The treasurer's office may require proof of income and/or proof of disability.

"Essentially the Iowa legislature created a property tax freeze for claimants who are 70 and older who qualify," says Rowley. "A claimant aged 70 or older must file a claim for the credit each year with the county treasurer's office in order to receive the maximum benefits of the new credit calculation for each year forward. In future years, the eligible claimant will receive either the original Elderly Tax Credit or the difference between the actual property taxes due in a future year less the actual property taxes due during the first year the claimant filed a claim establishing the base year – whichever is greater. The federal poverty level schedule changes each year."

To establish the tax freeze that will become available with the September 2022/March 2023 property taxes, a claimant must have been 70 or older by December 31, 2021 with a maximum household income in 2021 of less than 250% of the federal poverty levels listed per below by number of persons in the family/household.

Agricultural producers and landowners can sign up soon for the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP), a cornerstone conservation program offered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and a key tool in the Biden-Harris Administration effort to address climate change and achieve other natural resource benefits. The General CRP signup will run from January 31 to March 11, and the Grassland CRP signup will run from April 4 to May 13.

"We highly encourage farmers, ranchers and private landowners to consider the enrollment options available through CRP," said Iowa Farm Service Agency (FSA) State Director Matt Russell. "Last year, we rolled out a better, bolder program, and we highly encourage you to consider its higher payment rates and other incentives. Producers and landowners enrolled 4.6 million acres into CRP signups in 2021, including 2.5 million acres in the largest Grassland CRP signup in history. There are currently 22.1 million acres enrolled, and FSA is aiming to reach the 25.5-million-acre



General CRP helps producers and landowners establish long-term, resource-conserving plant species, such as approved grasses or trees, to control soil erosion, improve water quality and enhance wildlife habitat on cropland.

Meanwhile, Grassland CRP is a working lands program, helping landowners and operators protect grassland, including rangeland and pastureland and certain other lands, while maintaining the areas as working grazing lands. Protecting grasslands contributes positively to the economy of many regions, provides biodiversity of plant and animal populations and provides important carbon sequestration benefits to deliver lasting climate outcomes.

Alongside these programs, producers and landowners can enroll acres in Continuous CRP under the ongoing sign up, which includes projects available through the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) and State Acres for Wildlife Enhancement (SAFE).

### **Climate Benefits**

Last year, FSA enacted a Climate-Smart Practice Incentive for CRP General and Continuous signups, to better target CRP on addressing climate change. This incentive aims to increase carbon sequestration and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. CRP's climate-smart practices include establishment of trees and permanent grasses, development of wildlife habitat and wetland restoration. The Climate-Smart Practice Incentive is annual, and the amount is based on the benefits of each practice type.

Additionally, in order to better target the program toward climate outcomes, USDA invested \$10 million last year in the CRP Monitoring, Assessment and Evaluation (MAE) program to measure and monitor the soil carbon and climate resilience impacts of conservation practices over the life of new CRP contracts. This will enable the agency to further refine the program and practices to provide producers tools for increased climate resilience.

### More Information on CRP

Landowners and producers interested in CRP should contact their local USDA Service Center to learn more or to apply for the program -- for General CRP before the March 11 deadline, and for Grassland CRP before the May 13 deadline. Service Center staff continue to work with agricultural producers via phone, email, and other digital tools. Due to the pandemic, some USDA Service Centers are open to limited visitors. Additionally, fact sheets and other resources are available at fsa.usda.gov/crp.

Signed into law in 1985, CRP is one of the largest voluntary private-lands conservation programs in the United States. It was originally intended to primarily control soil erosion and potentially stabilize commodity prices by taking marginal lands out of production. The program has evolved over the years, providing many conservation and economic benefits.




