The popular SoCal-based chain is currently building one of its newest restaurants at Almaden Plaza, on the former Chevys Fresh Mex site along Almaden Expressway.

New Almaden Quicksilver County Park Association celebrates 39 years

Special to the Times tall began on February 1, 1983, when fifty enthusiastic people . met at the Forbes Mill Museum in Los Gatos.

Their goal - to explore the possibility of establishing a formal organization to help promote the protection and enhancement of the historical, recreational, and natural resources of Almaden Quicksilver County Park. The result was the founding of the New Almaden Quicksilver County Park Association (NAQCPA).

New Almaden resident Kitty Monahan was elected President, and a Board of Directors and Officers were chosen to lead the incorporation of the non-profit park association. Kitty has led the Association all the years of its existence and her time, effort and dedication cannot be overstated.

The early years were both challenging and gratifying. With limited financial resources, NAQCPA played a significant role in improving the maintenance of the park trail system, increased public awareness of important historical, recreational, and natural resources within the park, and participated in public hearings to determine future County Parks' acquisitions and development priorities.

The New Almaden Mine was the first formally claimed mercury mine in North America. It began operations in 1845, four years before the California Gold Rush, and remained in continuous operation for 130 years. Mercury, aka Quicksilver, was instrumental in



Keep those masks on, Santa Clara County says, for at least a few more weeks

anta Clara County public health officials said the county will keep in place its local indoor masking requirements when California lifts indoor masking requirements Feb.16.

The reason the county wants to keep the current mask mandates in place is that the numbers of new cases and hospitalization rates remain high in the county. The county has the ability to enforce public health rules that are stricter than the state.

For those traveling to any of the other Bay Area counties, they will find that indoor mask mandates are gone, regardless of vaccination status.

Santa Clara County "will continue to base decisions on whether



and when to lift indoor masking requirements on the risks posed by COVID-19, using clearly defined metrics related to vaccination, hospitalizations, and COVID-19 case rates," according to last week's public health statement.

The county said it "anticipates that it will be able to lift indoor masking requirements in a matter of weeks, as case rates continue to decline."

Bicyclist succumbed to his injuries in accident on Almaden Expressway

an Jose Police officers responded to the intersection of Almaden Expressway and Foxworthy Avenue for a traffic collision involving a vehicle and a bicyclist on Feb. 10 at 8:26 p.m.

A 2013 BMW sedan occupied by an adult male driver and an adult female passenger was traveling southbound on Almaden Expressway in the number two lane approaching the intersection with Foxworthy Avenue.

The BMW struck an adult male bicyclist that was riding westbound across the intersection in the marked crosswalk. Based on video evidence and witness statements it was determined that the BMW had a green light at the intersection.

The bicyclist was transported to a local hospital with life threatening injuries. Short-

ly after arriving the victim succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced deceased.

The driver of the BMW remained at the scene and cooperated with the investigation. There are no indications of drug or alcohol influence.


This is the 12th fatal collision, and 13th victim of 2022.





Longtime San Jose political staffer enters District 1 supervisor race

former political staffer and case manager is entering the race for Santa
Clara County Board of Supervisors
District 1.

Denelle Fedor said she intends to campaign for the seat during the June primary and has filed some preliminary paperwork. Incumbent Supervisor Mike Wasserman terms out at the end of this year.

Fedor, a district resident who has run for office in the past as a budget hawk, said she decided to enter the race after multiple people asked if she would.

"People want something different," Fedor said. "They know if they continue to elect the same people over and over again they'll get the same results."

Fedor is currently a case manager at LifeSTEPS, a federally-funded nonprofit in San Jose that provides affordable and supportive housing assistance to residents. She ran and lost in the 2012 election for the District 10 San Jose City Council seat.

Fedor has served in various political roles in San Jose over the last two decades, including as chief of staff for then Councilmember Pierluigi Oliverio, and as an aide to former Councilmembers Pat Dando and Ken Yeager. She also served as a staff member for Councilmember Johnny Khamis.

In 2014, Fedor filed a lawsuit against the city and Oliverio, accusing him of sexual harassment and calling her vulgar names. Oliverio denied the allegations. Fedor later dropped Oliverio from the suit and the case settled for \$10,000, according to media reports.

Fedor is concerned about the plight of unhoused residents in the county and said she wants to find ways to shelter people currently living near freeways and in parks. She's also concerned about conditions in the Santa Clara County jails and wants to improve

health care access for inmates.

Fedor, who describes herself as analytical, said the Board of Supervisors did a good job handling the COVID-19 pandemic, but she is concerned some of the county's actions have been unnecessarily punitive. She pointed to the forced closure of some small businesses at the beginning of the outbreak, and also the county's fines against Calvary Church, which has refused to obey health orders.

"It continues to be this ongoing and unfortunate battle between county counsel and the church," Fedor said. "I don't think it's a good use of taxpayer money."

Fedor is a latecomer to the race, which already has several candidates, including former San Jose Councilmember Johnny Khamis, Santa Clara County Board of Education member Claudia Rossi, Morgan Hill Mayor Rich Constantine and San Jose Councilmember Sylvia Arenas. Los Gatos Mayor Rob Rennie dropped out of the race after the Board of Supervisors approved new political boundaries that drew him out of the district. Fedor worked for Khamis after failing to secure the District 10 council seat in 2012.

Fedor doesn't have any endorsements at the moment, and said she will not accept money from any political action committees. She noted many political campaigns have been won by people who secured less funding than their opponents.

Sonia Marchana, an occupational therapistat Kaiser Permanente, told San José Spotlight Fedor is objective, levelheaded and not afraid to look at issues differently to find reasonable solutions.

"I was in awe of Denelle's leadership and managerial skills when she was the event manager for the annual Fourth of July event at Almaden Lake Park for five years," Marchana said. "She organized every part of the event—including the security plan for over 40 security officers—for an event that attracted over 20,000 people."

Immersive Experience Technology

ave you ever stumbled into a conversation where everyone is speaking around this "techie" word – and even after you've broken in, it is difficult to understand the unfamiliar jargon and acronyms? Well, there's no need to sweat it. Let me teach you the meaning of some commonly used tech words:

Immersive Experience Technology

It is the integration of virtual content with

the physical environment in a way that allows the user to engage naturally with the blended reality. Immersive technology is a class of tools designed to create immersive experiences that include digital elements that feel real to the user. The following are the basic types of immersive technology.

360-degree video/photos: Images and videos with 360 degrees of freedom that can be viewed in a headset or on a smartphone.

Computer-generated (CG) Virtual Reality (VR): An artificial interactive environment that is displayed primarily through a dedicated headset or headset plus smartphone.

Augment Reality (AR): A virtual environment that is superimposed on the real world using a form of transparent glasses or the cam-

era app on a smartphone.

Holography: the creation of a 3D image in space that can be explored from all angles.

Telepresence: A form of robotic remote control in which a human operator has a sense of being in another location. The user could, for example, guide the robot through a party or an office, stopping and chatting with people throughout the environment.

Digital twin: A virtual replication of some real-world object that connects to the object for information so that it can display its status

Facebook, Google, Microsoft, and Apple all held major events last year in which they delivered or revealed a road map for bringing more immersive capabilities to developers and content publishers. These players are vigorously working to vertically integrate a stack of immersive hardware and software that is functionally proprietary to each player

AR and VR require input from user movement, sensors, and historical data. When combined with other technology like conversational platforms, immersive technology can be used to create extremely personalized products, services, and experiences for customers.

Doubles is a 'Team Game'

ere are a few questions which can help you figure out:

What kind of partner are you?

What type of player should you partner up

with to become a winning combination?

Take a small survey to see if you are a good teammate.

*Signals are an important way to be on the same page as your partner.

*Are you a good communicator?

*Are you the leader or the implementer?

*Do you like to talk between points to your partner or keep to yourself?

*Do you like to have help with decisions in challenging moments in a match?

*Are you the steady player on the team or the aggressive hitter?

*Which type of player do you like to team up with, a sitter or a hitter?

Doubles is a game of chemistry between two players.

Sometimes the chemistry lasts for seasons and other times it is short lived. Knowing what kind of player you are and what kind of partner you like to play with is the start to building a successful team.

Styles of Play

Often players who are of similar styles do not make good partners. Two steady players may frustrate another team by seldom making an unforced error but they lack the ability to put shots away to close out points. Two aggressive players may look amazing with smashing put away shots but they do not neutralize well and if one player is off that day the partner cannot keep the point alive long enough to allow them to get their game back before the end of the match.

Communication Skills

Do you like to talk to your partner as the match is developing? Are you the strong silent type who just wants to "get on with it"? Having a partner who likes to talk between every point can be very annoying and distracting to someone who doesn't like to talk. When the match gets tight do you prefer to not talk and just play within yourself?

How much do you like to talk between points and what you choose to talk about during the between point times is important as well. Some teams are strictly business, others are simply cheerleaders with "come on" and enthusiasm is the main focus and some teams are strictly analytical, analyzing strategy about what just happened and how to approach the next point. As in any relationship, communication style is a key indicator of a successful team.

Signal

Both players need to know what is going to happen before a point starts. Just like in basketball, football and baseball, all the players must know what the other players are going to do - what is the game plan for the next play.

Signals are very important for a team sport. Signals can be verbal communication with your partner about where you are going to serve, poach, return or attack a particular player. Signals can also be hand signals between the server and net player with fingers indicating where to serve, if the net player is going to poach or fake.

Many teams communicate verbally but also use the hand signals to confirm the strategy and to make the opponents "think" about what the other team is going to do to "get in their head". In any case, talk to your partner; create a plan of action as the serving team or the receiving team so you can perform as a team.

Skill Set

Each player brings a particular skill set to the team. Some are aggressive, some are great neutralizers, lobbers or drop shot players and some are great with strategy. Some players are great servers, some are great at the net or return of servers.

Analyze what skills you bring to the team and what your partner brings to help you decide what type of game your team should play. Decide if you are playing unusual players if you have the skill sets to adapt to the other teams style effectively.

Practice

- Practice against a variety of opponents in practice, not just against your friends. In real matches you will face a wide variety of teams and you need to know how your team matches up and adjusts to their unusual styles.
- Practice a lot of UDF's or Unusual Doubles Formations. This can be an effective strategy against a variety of opponents to either adjust to their style of play or to throw off their game or match momentum with an unusual formation. The formations are many and you need to be comfortable using them so as not to throw off your own game. The most common UDF's are Australian formation, I formation, both back but come up with all kinds of formations that let you capitalize on your teams' strengths or neutralizes your opponents' strengths.
- Practice playing tie breakers vs sets. Most matches are decided either by set or match tie breakers. The pressure is different in tie breakers.
- Also, you want to feel more comfortable than your opponents when the set or match is dependent upon the tie breaker.
- Practice playing using only 1 serve. Instead of going big on the first serve and just getting the second serve in, you will be forced to develop a "between those two" serves that should improve your first serve percentage and reduce weak second serves.

Just like in other team sports, communication, styles of play and enjoyment make for successful teams. So, put a little effort into selecting a partner then work together to become successful.

Libertarians endorse new initiative to overturn Prop. 19, the 'death' tax on California property owners

Santa Clara County party re-elects two national chairs to local leadership

he Libertarian Party (LP) of Santa Clara County (SCC) has endorsed the Repeal the Death Tax Act, a new initiative to restore the Proposition 58 protection for California property owners that was abolished in 2020 when a slim majority of voters passed Proposition 19.

The endorsement took place on Jan. 29

at the LPSCC's annual meeting, during which members reaffirmed their choice of two former chairmen of the national Libertarian Party and the Libertarian National Committee (LNC) for local leadership roles:

- LPSCC Vice Chair Mark Hinkle served as national chair from 2010 to 2012. He is a small-business owner and president of Silicon Valley Taxpayers Association.
- LPSCC Fundraising Committee Chair Mary Gingell served as national chairman from 1991 to 1993. She retired in 2020 from her role as Director of Development Events and Services at Stanford's Hoover Institution, a public policy think tank.

Hinkle explained that the new ballot initiative the party has endorsed would restore parents' ability to leave property to their children without triggering reassessments and prohibitive upsurges in property taxes.

"California's nickname is 'the golden state,' but now it seems that's only true for the politicians in Sacramento," Hinkle said. "They figure that by chiseling away at our cherished Prop. 13, they can mine homes,

farms, and ranches for even more treasure to fund their rampant, Big Government expenditures. Instead, it should be families who get to shout 'Eureka' this November, if enough voters will join Libertarians in supporting our neighbors' freedom to keep their parents' and grandparents' property in the family."

Joe Dehn, re-elected as LPSCC chair, is the Libertarian candidate for U.S. Congress, District 17. Dehn is campaigning on a platform of drastically cutting the size of the federal government and taxes; ending U.S.

military involvement in other countries' disputes; and ending domestic "wars," such as the war on drugs, the war on guns, and the war on immigrants.

LPSCC central committee members also re-elected Treasurer Alan Kaiser and Activities Committee Chair Bob Goodwyn. They elected Michael Melo as secretary; Brian Holtz, an elected direc-

tor of Purissima Hills (Los Altos Hills) Water District, as chair of the campaigns committee; Cody Drummond as membership chair; Robert Gomez as newsletter chair; and Elizabeth C. Brierly as publicity chair.

The party's executive committee had previously adopted a position opposing San Jose City's so-called gun-harm-reduction fee and liability insurance mandate, to be imposed on legal gun owners. Following the city council's Jan. 25 majority vote in favor of enacting the ordinance, several organizations are considering legal action against the city on either tax law or second amendment grounds, or both. The council is scheduled to take a final vote on the matter on Tuesday.



the processing of gold and silver and the New Almaden Mine contributed significantly to California's economic development.

NAQCPA has continued to keep the mining glory days alive by hosting an annual Pioneer Day celebration to honor past workers of the New Almaden Mine. Mining descendants gather each year to share stories passed down from family members who lived and worked in the New Almaden Mining Community. Sadly, the pandemic did not allow the 2020 and 2021 events, but the Association is hoping for a great 2022 event this

 $One \, of \, NAQCPA's \, crowning \, achievements \,$ has been its work to assist the county with acquiring and operating the New Almaden mining interpretive center. The center started as the privately owned New Almaden Mercury Mining Museum, operated by the late Constance Perham from 1949 until the early 1980s.

The Association helped the County acquire grants to restore and operate the museum until the County could build a new interpretive center in the former mine manager's residence, called the Casa Grande. The Casa Grande first opened to visitors in 1998. Including its original founding by Constance Perham, the New Almaden mercury mining interpretive center is the oldest such center operating in the world.

NAQCPA is the oldest park association in Santa Clara County. The Association and County Parks can claim many proud achievements, including interpretive signage throughout the park, and the creation of an outdoor mining museum near the main entrance to Almaden Quicksilver County Park. For many years, a pile of vintage mining equipment lay in a dissembled heap where the New Almaden Reduction Works once produced millions of dollars of mercury. In 2010, a dedicated group of NAQC-PA volunteers carefully planned and built an outdoor museum, assembling the equipment to show how the various pieces worked to extract cinnabar ore that -when heatedproduced mercury.

NAQCPA maintains a weekly volunteer park maintenance team, participates in the Mining Museum docent program, helps organize and catalog the center's historical archives, and participates in annual County Parks events such as Play Like a Miner Day, Living History Days, and Holiday Boutiques. NAQCPA produces a quarterly newsletter for its members, providing news and historic stories from the past.

Coppy Charles Bardakos

March 10, 1928 - Jan. 19, 2022 **Resident of Almaden Valley**

oppy Charles Bardakos was the first born son to ■ Greek immigrant parents Charles (Kyriokos) and Bessie (Vasiliki) Bardakos in Petaluma, CA in 1928.

He grew up working with his father at the market/produce business that his father and a friend started. He'd take the bus there after (grade) school and then work with his father until

closing. Then HE would drive home (on backroads) because his father would be so tired. As a young boy he watched the Golden Gate Bridge being built and his young imagination ran wild when he'd see shadows of prisoners in Alcatraz. When he was 14, his family moved to Vallejo, CA, and his father opened a deli.

He attended and graduated from Vallejo Senior High School while working at his father's deli on the weekends and after school. After high school, he attended College of the Pacific until he and friends decided to join the Army, where he honorably served in post-war Japan. He then used the GI Bill to help pay for college and eventually graduated from Sacramento State.

After college, a San Francisco employment agency placed him at Buick Motor Division. He started in the mailroom and worked his way up to car sales, but was eventually laid off. While looking for another job, he ran into a friend that was working for Crocker Bank. His friend introduced him to the Assistant Manager, who turned out to be an old friend from high school. He was hired and his banking legacy began. He

worked for Crocker Bank for 30+ years and retired from Wells Fargo as a Vice President (after Wells Fargo acquired Crocker Bank) where he built many relationships and helped many locals finance their businesses over the years.

He is preceded in death by the one and only love of his life, his wife Bobbi, and his parents, his sister Marie Labrinos, and brother Larry. He is survived by his

children Greg of San Jose, Garry (Sue) of Pleasanton, Nancy of Los Gatos and his beloved granddaughters, Nicole and Alyssa (aka: his "girlfriends").

He met his beloved Bobbi (Magnani) while commuting from Vallejo to San Francisco. The commuter bus stopped in Crockett, and it was love at first sight. Their relationship grew and they were married in Reno on Nov. 10, 1956. Their family began to grow with the birth of first son Greg. Garry and Nancy followed. They eventually settled in Valleio. In 1971, he moved his wife and three kids from Vallejo to Almaden Valley, where he would spend the rest of his life.

San José Mayor and Councilmembers donate blood and address national blood shortage's local impacts

ayor Sam Liccardo and Councilmembers Sergio Jimenez, David Cohen, and Magdalena Carrasco, joined the American Red Cross Silicon Valley Chapter at their San José headquarters to donate blood to bring attention to the worst national shortage in a decade last week.

The lawmakers also encouraged residents to sign up to donate blood at their local Red Cross, or host a drive.

Mayor Liccardo and Councilmember Carrasco also presented a Proclamation to the American Red Cross in honor of National Blood Donor Month during Tuesday's City Council meeting.

"We are facing the worst blood supply crisis in the last decade, and our hospitals are still dealing with traumatic injuries, or patients that critically need support with blood donations—on top of our continued fight against COVID-19," said San José Mayor Sam Liccardo. "I am honored to donate blood today with my colleagues, and ask that anyone able, to do the same."

Over the course of the pandemic, blood donation centers have seen steep drops in both the number of volunteers available to assist with collection and in the number of donors seen before COVID-19. The national shortage of blood is impacting the blood supply in San José and nearby South Bay cities and risks longer wait times for patients waiting for blood transfusions and those who have ongoing needs for donated blood.

"We are witnessing a historic blood short-

age, exacerbated by the countless challenges that COVID-19 has taken on our healthcare institutions and providers," said Councilmember Magdalena Carrasco (D5). "Now more than ever, it's crucial that we educate our communities, especially our young adults who are the group least likely to donate, on the importance of donating blood!"

American Red Cross of Silicon Valley is the local chapter of the Red Cross responsible for the collection of donated blood from volunteers in the community. Serving over 1.9 million people in Santa Clara County, the Red Cross helped 222 families in 116 emergency responses and collected 17,392 units of lifesaving blood through 483 local blood drives from July 2020 through June 2021. The Red Cross, as a whole, collects about 40% of the nation's blood supply.

"Thank you to Mayor Liccardo for rolling up a sleeve and donating blood – it is a simple thing to do but can make a big difference in the lives of others," said Ken Toren, CEO for the Silicon Valley Chapter of the American Red Cross. "The Red Cross is facing its worst shortage in more than a decade. If you are eligible, please make an appointment to give blood in the days and weeks ahead to ensure no patient is forced to wait for critical care."



The reasoning, says Congressman **Mark Takano** (D-Riverside), is that the pandemic has highlighted the fact that most people spend more time at work and less time with

"After a nearly two-year-long pandemic that forced millions of people to explore remote work options, it's safe to say that we can't – and shouldn't – simply go back to normal, because normal wasn't working," said Takano, who introduced the legislation last month.

Takano says people were spending more time at work, less time with loved ones, their health and well-being was worsening, and all the while, their pay has remained stagnant.

The legislation would reduce the standard work week from 40 hours to 32 hours by

lowering the maximum hour's threshold for overtime compensation for non-exempt employees under the Fair Labor Standards Act.

Productivity and service remained the same or improved across the majority of trial 4-day work places in several countries, according to recent released reports. The report revealed that the wellbeing of workers "dramatically increased across a range of indicators, from perceived stress and burnout, to health and work-life balance."

Takano's legislation is currently awaiting a vote.




