

The founders were also opposed to a feudal "nobility": a hereditary group imposing their will on everyone else. Kind of like the big business overlords we have now. Madison believed that "the sense of the community ought, and actually will, in all free governments, ultimately prevail over the views of its rulers." Well guess we don't have a free government, it's been bought and paid for, because the rulers are not worried about what the larger community wants and needs.

The constitution isn't perfect and was never meant to be worshiped as unchanging, biblical truth. The founders themselves disagreed on many things. In fact, as a country we have changed the constitution many times. Slavery has been abolished. Nonpropertied men and then women and blacks were given the vote. The method of choosing the senate was changed. Etcetera.







On Monday, February 7, 2022, the Livingston County Ways and Means Committee passed a resolution in support of a recent letter from the Livingston County School Superintendents to the Governor asking for local control to be fully restored to school districts as related to public health regulations and mandates. The letter, signed by nine School Superintendents of districts serving Livingston County's K-12 population, was sent on February 2, 2022.




## **Historian's Office New Book Release**
