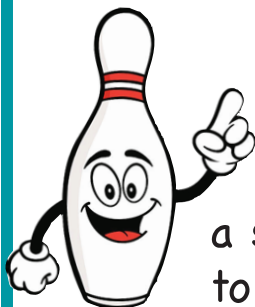



Dear "Speak Out,"

Some thoughts regarding the government that the founders created. The United States has both a republic (representation) and a democracy (rule by the people). Like most elites, the founders believed common people couldn't truly be trusted. But the fact the founders preferred a republic, defined as representative democracy as opposed to direct democracy, in no way means they thought the minority should rule over the majority. When the founders referred to "democracy" they were referring to direct democracy. They were afraid direct democracy caused what James Madison called "factionalism"- a selfish group, unconcerned about the needs of others, imposing negative consequences on everyone else. To avoid this, they designed a system where, in order to get things done, a majority needed to be created from many different factions. They felt this protected minority rights and voices because you could only get a majority of factions to agree to things that embodied, as Madison put it, "justice and the common good".

The founders were also opposed to a feudal "nobility": a hereditary group imposing their will on everyone else. Kind of like the big business overlords we have now. Madison believed that "the sense of the community ought, and actually will, in all free governments, ultimately prevail over the views of its rulers." Well I guess we don't have a free government, it's been bought and paid for, because the rulers are not worried about what the larger community wants and needs.

The constitution isn't perfect and was never meant to be worshiped as unchanging, biblical truth. The founders themselves disagreed on many things. In fact, as a country we have changed the constitution many times. Slavery has been abolished. Non-property men and then women and blacks were given the vote. The method of choosing the senate was changed. Etcetera.

Personally, I believe the common people themselves should decide on the individual issues that will affect them. I think it's time to try direct democracy in America.

In two short articles in April 1736 of the "Pennsylvania Gazette", the elder statesman, Benjamin Franklin, wrote regarding "Good Government" that the "superstructure of the government is too heavy presumably because it had too many public servants in its employ and thus imposed heavy taxes to fund them, then it would weaken the foundation of the building and perhaps lead to its ultimate collapse."

We are seeing this today as politicians and most Americans wish for a large government to take care of us in our socialistic society.

Benjamin Franklin's concerns of an ultimate collapse of our country are rapidly approaching as we will soon not be able to continue to fund this gigantic bureaucracy any longer!

Thomas Jefferson wrote on the topic of resistance to government in a letter to Abigail Adams on Thursday, February 22, 1787 "The spirit of resistance to government is so valuable on certain occasions that I wish it to be always kept alive. It will often be exercised when wrong, but better so than not to be exercised at all."

This is so very true in modern day America when "Big Brother," through "big government," is attempting to invade the lives of all Americans to control our lives more fully!
