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

ZUCCHINI & SAUSAGE

6 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 1 pound bulk pork sausage
- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 3 medium zucchini, thinly sliced
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) stewed tomatoes, cut up
- 1 package (8.8 ounces) ready-to-serve long grain rice
- 1 teaspoon prepared mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese

Directions

- 1. In a large skillet, cook sausage over medium heat 5-7 minutes or until no longer pink, breaking it into crumbles. Drain and remove sausage from pan.
- 2. In same pan, heat oil over medium heat. Add zucchini and onion; cook and stir 5-7 minutes or until tender. Stir in sausage, tomatoes, rice, mustard, garlic salt and pepper. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, 5 minutes to allow flavors to blend.
- 3. Remove from heat; sprinkle with cheese. Let stand, covered, 5 minutes or until cheese is melted.



Skillet Dinners

RAVIOLI WITH SNAP PEAS & MUSHROOMS

8 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 1 package (20 ounces) refrigerated cheese ravioli
- 1 pound fresh sugar snap peas, trimmed
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1/2 pound sliced fresh mushrooms
- 3 shallots, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 cups fat-free evaporated milk
- 8 fresh sage leaves, thinly sliced or 2 teaspoons rubbed sage
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon zest
- 1 teaspoon lemon-pepper seasoning
- 1/4 teaspoon white pepper
- 1/4 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup hazelnuts, coarsely chopped and toasted

Directions

- 1. In a large saucepan, cook ravioli according to package directions, adding snap peas during the last 3 minutes of cooking; drain.
- 2. Meanwhile, in a large skillet, heat butter over mediumhigh heat. Add mushrooms, shallots and garlic; cook and stir until mushrooms are tender. Stir in milk, sage, lemon zest, lemon pepper and white pepper; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, until sauce is slightly thickened, about 2 minutes.
- 3. Add ravioli and snap peas to sauce; heat through. Sprinkle with cheese and hazelnuts.

CASHEW CHICKEN WITH NOODLES 4 SERVINGS Ingredients

- 8 ounces uncooked thick rice noodles
- 1/4 cup reduced-sodium soy sauce
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
 - 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 pound boneless skinless chicken breasts, cubed
- 1 tablespoon peanut oil

I made some gumbo with only okra and sausage. It wasn't bad and it wasn't good: I would say it's just meaty okra.

- 1 tablespoon sesame oil
- 6 green onions, cut into 2-inch pieces
- 1 cup unsalted cashews
- 2 tablespoons sweet chili
 Sauce
- Toasted sesame seeds, optional

Directions

- 1. Cook rice noodles according to package directions.
- 2. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine the soy sauce, cornstarch and garlic. Add chicken. In a large cast-iron or other heavy skillet, saute chicken mixture in peanut and sesame oils until no longer pink. Add onions; cook 1 minute longer.
- 3. Drain noodles; stir into skillet. Add cashews and chili sauce and heat through. If desired, top with toasted sesame seeds.


ASPARAGUS 'N' SHRIMP WITH ANGEL HAIR 4 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 3 ounces uncooked angel hair pasta
- 1/2 pound uncooked shrimp (16-20 per pound), peeled and deveined
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- 2 tablespoons olive oil, divided
- 8 fresh asparagus spears, trimmed and cut into
 2-inch pieces
- 1/2 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1/4 cup chopped seeded tomato, peeled
- 4 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 teaspoons chopped green onion
- 1/2 cup white wine or chicken broth
- 1-1/2 teaspoons minced fresh basil
- 1-1/2 teaspoons minced fresh oregano
- 1-1/2 teaspoons minced fresh parsley
- 1-1/2 teaspoons minced fresh thyme
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- Lemon wedges

Directions

- 1. Cook pasta according to package directions. Meanwhile, sprinkle shrimp with salt and pepper flakes. In a large skillet or wok, heat 1 tablespoon oil over medium-high heat. Add shrimp; stir-fry until pink, 2-3 minutes. Remove; keep warm.
- 2. In same skillet, stir-fry the next 5 ingredients in remaining oil until vegetables are crisp-tender, about 5 minutes. Add wine and seasonings. Return shrimp to pan.



ITALIAN TURKEY 8 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 1 package (12 ounces) egg noodles
 - 2 tablespoons canola oil
- 3/4 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 celery rib, chopped
- 1 small green pepper, chopped
- 2 cups cubed cooked turkey
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) diced tomatoes, drained
- 1 can (10-3/4 ounces) condensed tomato soup, undiluted
- 1 tablespoon Italian seasoning
- 1 tablespoon minced fresh parsley
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese, optional

Directions

- 1. Cook noodles according to package directions.

 Meanwhile, in a large skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add mushrooms, onion, celery and green pepper; cook and stir until tender. Stir in turkey, tomatoes, soup and seasonings; heat through.
- 2. Drain noodles; add to turkey mixture and toss to combine. If desired, sprinkle with cheese and let stand, covered, until cheese is melted.

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
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MISSIONAL Pastor Josh and Kayla Sims


March 2022 Greeting Gardeners,

**March may come "in like a lion and out like a lamb", but after the coldest February

many of us remember in several years, we welcome the month spring officially begins (March 20th) and our yards will

start their annual show of

shock and wilting.



**Here in the Wiregrass area rain can alternate from downpours to drought in a couple of days thanks to the hot sunshine and winds of the season, so the best way to help the soil maintain moisture is MULCH, from your pine straw, composted leaves, or grass clippings. A light covering of mulch is better than a heavy layer, allowing air to get to the roots, and yet providing cooling shade.

**A word (or two) about roses: DO NOT use their leaves for any type of mulch, as they can re-infect the soil with rose viruses like black spot. Put all rose trimmings and leaves in the garbage can. An alternate to chemical applications that works on some of my roses is a good spray of 30% milk or buttermilk mixed with water to control black spot. Pull off and discard leaves that have spots, then thoroughly spray the remaining leaves and stems. Powdered skim milk mixed into the soil around tomatoes, melons and cucumbers can also protect from powdery mildew. You can also disinfect pruning clippers with alcohol or milk between cutting back rose bushes, or even after each cut to be really careful.

What to plant in March? The SOW app says, beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, collards, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce, mustard, onions, sweet peas, radishes, spinach, Swiss chard, turnips and white potatoes.

So than, love is an action (verb) word that demonstrates what it is. Words alone are not enough to express what love is. The proof is in what we do.


Many of us call 1 Corinthians chapter 13, "The Love Chapter".
