It is especially harmful to children. If lead gets into a child's body, it can cause a lower IQ, hearing loss, growth problems, behavioral problems and brain & nervous system damage.

Health care providers are required to test every child for lead at age one and at age two.

Only a blood test for lead can determine if a child has lead poisoning.

SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

The title of this week's article is "What Would Jesus Say".

In early February two contributors to the "Speak Out" submitted differing views on what Jesus Christ would say about today's problems if He were here today.

One contributor voiced her opinion that Jesus would be pro-abortion and would understand why couples would not get married and not have any children.

The other contributor voiced that Christians are very negative and that we do not know what Jesus would say about today's issues in America.

I differ with both contributors because Jesus Christ is the Second Person of the Godhead and therefore has already expressed Himself very distinctly in His Word the Bible. God the Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Godhead and inspired all the writers of the entire Bible.

Because God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit are One God, they fully agree with Each Other.

So, you are probably asking just what the God of the Bible says about modern day issues in America. Let's begin with the issue of adultery which is accepted as a norm in America today.

This verse also pertains to the topic of abortion because unborn children are a reward to us and not an unwanted fetus as some refer to them.

My next topic is financial debt. Again, in the Old Testament Book of Deuteronomy Chapter 28 verses 12 and 13 God the Holy Spirit told us that we are to lend and not to borrow: "thou shalt lend unto many nations, and thou shalt not borrow. And the Lord shall make thee the head, and not the tail".

Next week's article will, Lord willing, include other topics in which Jesus told us what he believed. I look forward to reading any comments and views you may wish to submit.

Livingston County Releases State Legislative Agenda Plan Advocates for Broadband Funding, End to Sales Tax Diversions

At today's Board of Supervisors Meeting, Livingston County adopted its 2022 New York State Legislative Agenda. The plan outlines the County's top priorities, provides a guide for the County's legislative advocates and State delegation, and highlights key issues of importance to the local community.

The County's State Legislative Agenda highlights 11 priority areas, including: Light Up Livingston, the County's rural broadband initiative; public infrastructure and transportation funding; equitable veteran services funding; increased public and mental health resources for pandemic preparedness; reimbursement of federally funded Medicaid savings withheld by the state; support for GrowLivCo's innovative Community Revitalization Initiative; recommendations on gaming concerns; enhanced flexibility of County-Wide Shared Services Initiative; threats to public safety; an end to local sales tax diversions by the state; and addresses persistent threats to Conesus Lake water quality and recreation.

"The State Legislative Agenda is an important document in that it gives a voice to the needs of Livingston County and its people," said Livingston County Board of Supervisors Chairman, David LeFeber. "With it, we've laid out our guiding principles, prioritized several issues for which we'd like to see specific legislative action, and clearly stated ongoing general issues for the policy-makers and state government leaders in Albany."

"Local government is well suited to support, serve, and respond to the needs of individuals and our community," explained Livingston County Administrator Ian M. Coyle. "Still, we often need state legislative policy and action to support our county government efforts. With this document we succinctly and professionally lay out our main county concerns and where we believe state legislative efforts can best address them."

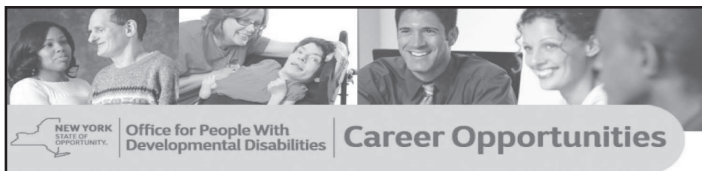

State Shared Services Initiative Awards Matching Funds to Livingston County

County Administrator Ian Coyle recently announced that New York State has awarded Livingston County more than \$400,000 in matching funds as part of the County-Wide Shared Services Initiative (CWSSI). After agreed-upon distribution to municipalities and other local governments, the County will receive a disbursement of over \$250,000.

In 2017, New York State introduced the CWSSI, which requires counties to convene local municipalities to develop and approve plans that lower the cost of local government by finding efficiencies and shared services. The CWSSI offers to match each county's savings from their first year with additional funding.

"This award is a demonstration of Livingston County's commitment to running an efficient, resident-focused government at all levels - Town, Village and County," said Coyle. "I am glad that the State of New York recognizes the County's efforts to reduce taxpayer-funded redundancies. I thank the Board of Supervisors, Village Mayors and all County and municipal government officials for their commitment to intergovernmental collaboration and cost avoidance."

The \$400,000 in savings came from implementation of many projects in the County's 2021 Shared Services Plan. The initiatives include a Dialysis Extension Clinic partnership with Wyoming County at the Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation and Livingston County's participation in a Prescription Drug Cooperative with the Capital Region BOCES.

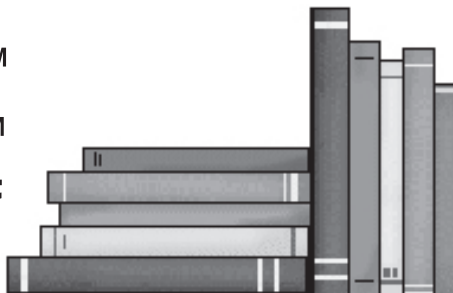
