



Frank Roberts long time photographer for the Depot Dispatch will be missed



Frank H. Roberts, 85, of Elkhart Lake, after a long and fulfilling life, passed away peacefully on Friday, January 7, 2022 at the Sharon S. Richardson Community Hospice Center in Sheboygan Falls surrounded by his loving family.

Frank was born in Kansas City, Missouri on February 18, 1936 a son to the late Frank R. and Wanda V. (Holt) Roberts. He attended schools and graduated from high school in Stanley, Kansas. Later in life he earned a Bachelors of Science degree in business from Elmhurst College, in Elmhurst, Illinois. He enlisted and proudly served in the U.S. Air Force. On May 5, 1956, he was united in marriage to Jean M. Cary at Centenary United Methodist Church in St. Louis, Missouri. Frank had a long and successful career as a salesman of business forms and equipment, data processing services, and computer staffing. Later in his career he was an entrepreneur, launching his own data processing and computer staffing company called, the SDM Corporation. His love of flying and planes led him to obtaining his pilot's license. He also was a recreational boater, especially enjoying Kentucky Lake with his family, and the coastal waters of Florida. He had a longtime love of music and performed in church choirs and barbershop choruses throughout his life. He had a life-long appreciation for photography and launched the Elkhart Lake Camera Club.

Frank was an ambitious volunteer. He was active with his sons in Little League Baseball and the Boy Scouts, where he served as a leader. While living in Florida he served on the Seven Rivers Presbyterian Church Disaster and Hurricane Response Team. He was also active with S.H.I.N.E., an organization committed to serving the health insurance and Medicare needs of elders. As a popular and outgoing member of the Elkhart Lake community, Frank was eager to lend a helping hand to his neighbors and community members.

Frank is survived by his wife of 65 years, Jean; his three sons, John R. (Christina) Roberts of Portland, ME, James L. (Mary) Roberts of Bartlett, IL and Stephen C. (Jennifer) Roberts of McKinney, TX; four grandsons, Dillon B., John C., James T. and Michael A. Roberts and a great grandson, Julian R. Manual. Along with his parents he was preceded in death by a brother, William G. Roberts.

Cremation took place and there will be a service and gathering of friends and family at a later date. Inurnment will be in Oak Grove Cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri.


"We are excited to welcome Dr. Engle-

Mr. Henschel expressed, "We are grateful to Dr. Buechel Haack for the many years of leadership and her commitment to assist in the transition."







Growth of Bible Study Groups Leads to New Church

When you hear the word "church" what comes to mind? Maybe it's a beautiful brick building with stained glass windows, a picturesque place you remember from your childhood, or the setting of an important life event such as your wedding or baptism. When most people think of church they usually think of a building. Did you know that there is a new church in Elkhart Lake that doesn't even have a building yet? The Well of Elkhart Lake is not your typical church. Instead of church being a place, The Well seeks to be a people. People of our community being Jesus for our community. They are passionate about connecting people to a deeper relationship with Jesus and serving the needs of our community. The Well is a church that officially launched this past October, but has no building yet and actually began with a middle school girls Bible study group four years ago. Garrett and Heather Mersberger and their three kids moved to a home just outside Kiel in 2014. After touring schools in the area they felt instantly drawn to sending their kids to the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Schools. They quickly fell in love with their new school and community. After living here a few years and growing much deeper in her own relationship with Christ, Heather began meeting weekly with new friend, Kaylee Holzwart,

to pray and read Scripture together. "God really used this time of gathering with one friend to deepen our relationship with Him as well as lead and direct our steps, both in our individual lives and in our community," Heather remembers.

In 2018, a few months after this weekly prayer partner gathering started, Heather and their oldest daughter, Haley, felt led to start a middle school girls Bible study group. About ten 8th grade girls attended that first Bible study gathering at the Mersberger home. A few months later Heather and Kaylee felt God asking them to start a Bible study group for women in their community. Fast forward to today, and there are now five different groups meeting every month — high school boys, high school girls, middle school girls, a women's group and most recently a men's group reaching nearly 100 people in the Elkhart Lake area.

"Our Abide Bible Study Groups have been such a beautiful picture of the unified church body Jesus talks about in John 17," reflects Heather. "These truly are community groups, it doesn't matter what church denomination you claim or if you don't claim one at all. We focus on what we have in common — the Truth of God's Word and our need for our Savior Jesus Christ. Our goal is simple, to read the Bible with others in our community and allow it to transform our daily lives. It's amazing to

experience this type of deep community as we explore Scripture and pray together."

As the Bible study groups started to grow, Garrett left his 20+ year career in the corporate world and soon heard God clearly call him into ministry during church one Sunday morning. He followed God's leading and began taking classes to become a pastor. In September 2021, Garrett was licensed as a Pastor with the Christian & Missionary Alliance (C&MA) denomination and in October, after much prayer and training, their family officially planted the first C&MA church in Elkhart Lake – The Well!

The mission of The Well is to be a spring of life in Elkhart Lake, committed to being the hands, feet and heart of Jesus for our community. The church has four core values to describe who they are are what they do:

- Seek Jesus and unity among believersServe our community generously
- •Save the lost and impact generations
- •Send disciples to multiply

The Well currently offers twice monthly community gatherings as well as five different Abide Bible study groups. While the Mersberger home was outgrown over a year ago, the church has no physical building yet. They have met in a variety of spaces, and the ELG schools have been generous in allowing the use of their facilities when space is available. Everyone is welcome to the gatherings and study groups, and they often have new people joining them each time they meet. Along with actively seeking the Lord together, The Well is working to build a vibrant faith community that practically serves its neighbors. So far this has included helping fund English language classes for Spanish-speaking parents of ELG students, as well as blessing the ELG school community in a variety of ways.

Dusting off their Bibles and investing in a close relationship with Jesus was life-transforming for Garrett, Heather and their family. They are thrilled to be walking this out with people in our own community.

"Our lives changed when we actually started reading the Bible and participating in a relationship with Jesus," says Garrett. "For a long time we tried to fill our thirst with other things, and we kept our faith in a box for Sunday morning. We have experienced that everything else just proves to offer temporary satisfaction. A deep relationship with Jesus is the only thing that truly satisfies, that gives life, hope, peace and joy no matter the circumstance we find ourselves in. Everything else just leaves us thirsty. A lot has happened in the past few years, and we cannot wait to see what God has in store for The Well and the Elkhart Lake community in the years ahead!"

This fourth concert of the SSO's 103rd season features conductor Ernesto Estigarribia, the third of four finalists for the next SSO Music Director.

"This program presents music of the most intense passion. We will start with Verdi's La Forza del Destino overture, which not only has beautiful and memorable melodies, but also is a fantastic demonstration of Verdi's dramatic genius. The Destiny motive, a musical representation of fate, looms around at all times no matter what the mood is.

Moncayo's Huapango is considered to be Mexico's unnoficial national anthem. I would go as far as saying that is an anthem for all of Latin America. It showcases folk music, traditionally played by Mariachi bands in an symphonic setting. It's a very tuneful and rhythmic piece that will get the audience very excited and dancing in their seats.

The center piece of the concert is Tchaikovsky's Fourth Symphony. Just like Verdi's Forza del Destino, Tchaikovsky explores the theme of fate. The music of Tchaikovsky is universally loved because of the composer's ability to create magical moods, exciting glaring brass moments, soulful string writing, and beautiful woodwind solos. His music speaks to the soul almost bypassing the ear" says Estigarribia.



Weill Center Celebrates 20 Year Anniversary

Weill Center Celebrates 20 Year Anniversary with Lineup Like Never Before

The Weill Center for the Performing Arts is a 1,150-seat live event venue located in the heart of Downtown Sheboygan. Each season the theater presents a variety of live events ranging from concerts and theatrical performances to comedy acts, movie nights, a family series and more. This season the theater celebrates the 20th Anniversary of its restoration and reopening with a lineup like never before.

The history of the theater dates to the 1920s; Radios were a common household amenity, people listened to jazz music and drank bootleg liquor in secret speakeasys, and most Americans enjoyed nights out at the movies. Across the nation, hundreds of theaters were built to meet consumer demand. Today, the Weill Center is one of these remaining historic venues.

After sitting vacant for years, a group of dedicated volunteers committed to restoring the theater to its original grandeur - a Spanish colonial revival architectural style "atmosphere" theater with a starry night sky ceiling. With a generous gift from the Stefanie H. Weill Charitable Foundation and support from hundreds of community corporations and individuals, the theater reopened its doors twenty years ago on October 13, 2001. The theater is currently listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

To celebrate its 20th Anniversary season the Weill Center announced a special lineup with a larger variety of acts than ever before. The season kicked off with a headline performance by Josh Turner, multi-platinum country star. To follow, the legendary Oak Ridge Boys brought their Elvira40 Tour to Sheboygan.

The fall was busy with at least one live event open to the public each weekend. Patrons enjoyed Wisconsin-based performances: an intimate folk performance by Dead Horses; the lively bluegrass tunes of The Honeygoats; a performance by Trapper Schoepp, who collaborated with Bob Dylan; contemporary dance performance by the talented troupe Dance Milwaukee; the high-energy vibes of The Coulee Boys; and Wisconsin-based filmmaker's premiere of Mags & Julie go on a Road Trip.

As the season progressed, the calendar was filled with dueling pianos, symphony performances, a Halloween party complete with DJ and showing of The Rocky Horror Picture Show, a tribute to Pink Floyd, The Bee Gees, The Beatles, the era of Yacht Rock, boy bands, and Elvis. Guests also took a step back in time and reminisced with The Drifters, The Platters, and Cornell Gunter's Coasters.

sented a Broadway performance for the first time in a decade. Audiences enjoyed the National Touring Production of An Officer and a Gentleman, based on the classic 80s movie starring Richard Gere. The production featured the Grammy Award-winning #1 hit single 'Up Where We Belong' and a catalogue of music that gave voice to a generation. It took more than 65 crew members several days to prepare for this production that was literally fit for New York!

And the shows continue to go on!

The Weill Center has a jam-packed schedule this month. Scott Bradlee's Postmodern Jukebox kicks off the month featuring some of the best talent from The Voice, American Idol and more, performing to his vintage arrangements of today's top 40 hits. Killer Queen, A Tribute to Queen will return to the Weill after a sold out performance in 2019. Patrons can also see Dolly Parton on the big screen with the movie showing of 9 to 5 as part of the Weill Center's Friday night movie series - a movie at least once a month.

The Weill Center Family Series also launches this spring. Patrons of all ages can enjoy The Underwater Bubble Show, a family-friendly cirque experience featuring acrobats, contortionists, and lots and lots of bubbles. Ben Folds' brother Chuck Folds will bring his "kindie-rock" band Big Bang Boom to the stage for a parent-friendly performance. The Weill will also present Rosie Revere, Engineer & Friends, a STEAM-focused live theatrical production of the classic books by Andrea Betty. Lastly, The Magic of Bill Blagg LIVE will feature illusions and more for patrons of all ages.

Throughout the years, the Weill Center has served as a destination for experience seekers, concertgoers, and theater enthusiasts. Looking forward to the next 20 years, the Weill Center is currently analyzing the reports from a recent feasibility study to better understand the entertainment needs of Sheboygan County, and how to best meet those needs through the potential development of its underutilized and undeveloped spaces located adjacent to the theater. The community will be kept involved through publications such as the Depot Dispatch.



April Election

The ballot is set for the April 5, 2022, election. This will include the local elections, as well as the Court of Appeals District 2. The following submitted papers to run for village offices.

If you need to register to vote you can do it in person at the Village offices between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm Monday-Friday or you can go online to https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/ and register and receive voting information including polling locations and sample ballots.

Absentee Voting for April 5th

If you would like to request an absentee ballot for the April 5th elections, you can go to https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/. Please allow at least a week for the ballot to go each way.

If you do not have access to the internet or cannot get the website to work, please call the Village offices (920-876-2122) and request an absentee request form. You will need to provide that form and a copy of your photo ID to our office. We anticipate the ballots going out in the mail around March 15th.

Stayed tuned for more information on absentee ballot drop boxes. There have been some rulings on the use of the drop boxes and we are trying to get clarity if we can use the box outside the Village office for absentee ballots.

In-person absentee voting for the April 5th election will begin 2 weeks before the election (March 22nd through April 1st.). We are open from 8 am to 4:00 pm on those days for inperson absentee voting.

Short-Term Rental Licensing Ordinance

Did you know that if you rent your house out for one night, the State of Wisconsin requires you to have a Tourist Rooming House Permit? More information on this process can be found on the State of Wisconsin DATCP website https://datcp. wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/TouristRoomingHouses.aspx. This means that if you are planning on renting your house you need to have the State's Tourist Rooming House Permit. Due to this requirement by the State and to help ensure properties that are being rented for short-term (less than a month) are meeting health and safety regulations, the Village Board approved an ordinance for licensing shortterm rentals. This ordinance requires all people who rent their property for more than 10 nights to be licensed by the Village. Building Permit Required

The Planning Commission would like to remind you that if you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Permits must be obtained prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out

We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

Let's Talk Trees!

Did you know that the Village of Elkhart Lake has a Tree Commission? The Commission is made up of one Village Board member and four citizen members. Current members are Pat Robison, Frank Thielmann, Anne Hatas, Steve Kapellen, and John Schott, Board Representative. Tree Commissioners work in conjunction with the DPW to maintain the health of the Village's trees. Dangerous, dead, or dying trees are removed, and the Commissioners decide where replacement trees will be planted. DPW also works to trim trees to ensure that there are no sight -line hazards along our streets and intersections.

The Tree Commission also organizes the Arbor Day Celebration each year. This celebration includes a short program led by the Tree Commission Chairperson, a tree-planting, and a poster contest for the 5th grade students at the school. This year Arbor Day will be held on April 29th.

One of the Commission's goals is to teach our residents how to care for the trees in our community, especially the dozens of new trees that have been and will be planted in the upcoming years.

If you would like more information on the activities of the Tree Commission, you can contact any one of the Commissioners or the Village Clerk's Office. You may also attend any of the Commission's meetings. The meetings are usually posted on the Village's website one week ahead of time.

Snow Removal Reminder

Please remember that we have many residents and visitors who walk our sidewalks on a daily basis. It is a property owner's responsibility to keep all sidewalks clear of snow and ice so that all may use the sidewalks without fear of slipping. Please check your sidewalks periodically for snow, slush, and ice. Property owners who own corner lots must be sure to clear out the entire width of the corner access to crosswalks. A small path through is not sufficient, especially for those using wheelchairs, power scooters, or strollers. Snow may not be pushed into the street.

According to section 10.03 of the Village of Elkhart Lake Code:

- The owner, occupant or person in charge of each and every building or structure or unoccupied lot in the Village fronting or abutting any street, shall clean or cause to be cleaned the sidewalk in front of or adjoining each such home, building or unoccupied lot as the case may be, of snow or ice to the width of such sidewalk within 14 hours of any snowfall, within any 24-hour period.
- No person, firm, company or corporation shall push, place, shovel or blow snow or ice into or across Village streets, alleys, or around or against water hydrants.
- As to (1) above, the Village may remove the snow or ice accumulated in violation of this section and charge the reasonable cost of the same against the owner of the property affected by placing it on the tax roll; or as to (1) above and as to (2) above, any person or persons found to be in violation of this section, upon conviction thereof, shall forfeit not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$50.00, together with costs of prosecution.

You will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the time prescribed in ordinance 10.03, the Village will clear your sidewalk and bill you.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

LTC Provide Tax Preparation Assistance

According to the Wisconsin Department of Revenue, COVID-19 placed great strains on the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program the past two years. During this time, accounting students at Lakeshore Technical College continued participating in the program as they have since 2005. Students will again offer tax preparation assistance to qualifying taxpayers.

There is no charge for having students prepare and file federal or state returns through the VITA program. Students cannot accept any type of compensation for their assistance, including tips or gifts. Students are supervised to ensure forms are completed accurately.

"We are determined to continue offering this vital program in a safe manner to our community members who need it," said Lakeshore Dean of Business, Technology, and Hospitality Douglas Hamm. "In addition to filling that need, VITA offers our students the opportunity to demonstrate their tax preparation and customer

LTC develops an appointment schedule for each tax season based on how many students are enrolled in its Applied Tax course. With 15 students enrolled at the time the schedule was developed, the service timeframe for this season was set for February 8 through April 5. All reservations were filled by late January.

Last year, students provided over 500 hours of community service while preparing 149 returns at LTC's Cleveland campus. Their efforts generated \$239,000 in federal and state refunds for clients. Students earned their IRS certification by successfully participating in the program.

Son joins dad in 10th year of Goodfellas

This fall it will be 10 years ago that Russ Horneck opened his own barber shop in Kiel by the name of Goodfellas Barbershop.

In staging a photo back then to accompany a Tri-County News story about his new business, Russ put his then 14-year-old son Justin in his barber chair. Ten years later, it is Justin who is standing with clippers in hand and providing all types of cuts and trims to customers of the shop located at 630 Fremont St. in Kiel.

The path to Justin working alongside his father at Goodfellas really started with Russ entering the profession. He had worked at Land O'Lakes for 15 years and then had been a stay-at-home dad for a few years when he decided to attend the beautician program at Gill-Tech Academy in Appleton. "When I went to school there were only beautician schools," he said. "There wasn't a barber school in the state at the time." Russ completed the program, got his state license and began his new career.

Meanwhile, Justin was in his high school years and admits to not really enjoying it. He did like hanging out with friends, working on cars and doing hands-on activities. When he was around 18, his dad taught him how to cut hair so that Justin could do some side cuts for friends at their homes. Asked if he was nervous the

first time he took scissors and clipper to a friend's head, Justin said he was not and added, "I kind of went right into it." He recalls the friend wanting "some Vanilla Ice racing stripes" on the side of his head.

Over the years, Russ had been renting a second chair at Goodfellas to beauticians. As fate would have it, the chair became open about the time Justin was deciding what career path to take. Another beautician was asking about the chair, but the decision was made—Russ would keep it open for Justin who would pursue his barber's training and license as well.

"Put through the ringer"

Justin went to school full time for eight months at a training academy in Green Bay. "You get put through the ringer," he said of the course. He recalls his first day on the floor having a 93-year-old customer who wanted a straight razor cut.

Just as his father did, Justin found his school to be geared more toward beauticians than for barbers which he called "a retiring breed." He said there were four men in the program compared to between

60 to 70 women.

Justin began working at Goodfellas immediately after graduation with a temporary license in hand. That was about two years ago, with the start of his career put on hold by the two-month COVID-19 shutdown of many businesses.

Since that time, the father-son team has been very busy. Russ said he handles the phones and fills up his schedule first since he is still paying the overhead, but there is more than enough customer demand to keep Justin busy. Barber training might be dying, but the customer demand for good, local barbers is not based on the traffic at Goodfellas. The Hornecks said they are not only getting customers from Kiel, Elkhart Lake and other surrounding communities but also from as far away as Fond du Lac and Manitowoc. With people moving into the area from out-of-state, they also said they have been cutting hair for people from Colorado and Texas.

Some customers request either Russ or Justin but most are fine with either one cutting their hair. Justin said he does a lot of cuts for younger customers, including many people with whom he graduated with from high school.

Asked if they are seeing any trends in men's hairstyles these days, Russ and Justin both chuckled and came up with the same answer—mullets. According to Cosmetify Hair Report, the mullet topped the list of most popular hairstyles of 2021. It was the most searched hairstyle in the past year with more than 15.5 million searches, a 142 percent increase over the previous year. Justin joked that he attributes the popularity of mullets here to the return of NASCAR racing to the area. On a more serious note, Justin also said undercuts are popular in which the hair is shorter on the

side of the head than on top.

Providing relief for each other

A great advantage of father and son working together is that the shop can stay open if one of them takes some vacation time or falls ill, the latter of which happened recently with Justin handling all customers for a week while Russ was out.

Russ and Justin also are considering some possible additions or changes to Goodfellas in the near future, including straight razor and hot towel treatments; Saturday hours; and the ability to do online scheduling.

Goodfellas is currently open from noon to 8 p.m. on Mondays; 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays; and 8:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Wednesdays.

During those open hours, area bicyclists and exercise enthusiasts also are welcome to come in and take advantage of a second business Russ operates in the Goodfellas building. In a separate room he has seven RealRyder exercise bikes facing a large screen and a projector which can show any of more than 30 videos of national park biking courses on the screen. Russ explained that RealRyder bicycles lean from side to side to provide a better core workout than a standard stationary bike. For \$15 per month, people can come in anytime Goodfellas is open and use the bikes. He also teaches classes for \$10 per session, with the ability to buy four classes and get one free.

Russ also is a seller of AdvoCare products to boost energy, sports performance, weight management and wellness.


