Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Prevention

Every year, hundreds of people die and thousands are injured from unsuspected exposure to an odorless, colorless gas-carbon monoxide (CO). Studies by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicate that, while people recognize CO gas is poisonous, they perceive CO as less dangerous than other household hazards. CO poisoning is most prevalent when furnaces are turned back on to fight cold winter temperatures, but also commonly occur after summer and winter storms and accompanying power outages, when people tend to rely on portable generators for electricity.

Here are some simple steps to protect yourselves and your family:


- ✓ Install battery-operated CO detectors near every sleeping area in your home.
- Check CO detectors regularly to be sure they are functioning properly.
- Have gas or oil furnaces inspected by a qualified professional every year.
- Never use a generator inside the home or garage, even if doors and windows are open.
- Only use generators and power washers outside, more than 20 feet away from the home, doors, and windows.
- Never use a charcoal grill inside the home.

Dear "Speak Out,"

In response to Mr. Powell's article of February 27th, I take issue with the author's statement which purported to quote me as saying, "Christians are very negative." Actually I said that "... Christians do tend to come across as negative, judgmental and narrow-minded..."

And after a careful re-read of Lauren's articles, no where did I read, "Jesus would be pro-abortion." However, those of us professing to be Christians do not have the right to compel others to obey Biblical standards, if they have not chosen to do so. It's a heart allegiance issue. If my neighbor was a Muslim, believed that all women should stay home, or be seen in public with a veil or head covering, and not converse with men in public, I would be incensed if I was expected to follow those rules. However, if my neighbor was successful in converting me to Islam, then my heart would be changed, and I would desire to follow those standards. I have a bigger issue with those claiming to be Christians who take the name, but don't show a compelling desire to follow Biblical standards.

The author also made reference to the story in John 8 of the woman caught in adultery. After those who condemned the woman dispersed, one by one after Jesus wrote in the dirt, he asked the woman, "Where are they? Has no one condemned you?" When she replied, "No one...", Jesus answered, "THEN NEITHER DO I CONDEMN YOU... go now and leave your life of sin." By resorting to compassion as his FIRST response, Jesus was opening the door to something better.

It is in John 4 that Jesus speaks with the Samaritan woman at the well. If Jesus had simply approached this woman and said, "Naughty, naughty, you shouldn't be in all these serial relationships – now clean up your act," would this woman have run back to town and excitedly told the townspeople that she had met the Messiah? I doubt it. Jesus appealed to her deeper need for a relationship with Him that could not be fulfilled in any other way.

I don't see Jesus as rating sins on a scale of 1-10. He doesn't say, "Oh, adultery is the worst, but it's less serious if you participate in gluttony or gossip." I Corinthians 6:9-11 sates, "... Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolators, nor adulterers, nor male prostitutes, nor homosexual offenders, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor slanderers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. And that is what some of you were. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ..." That includes ALL of us.

I like the Message translation which says, "Unjust people who don't care about God will not be joining in his kingdom. Those who use and abuse each other, use and abuse sex, use and abuse the earth and everything in it, don't qualify as citizens in God's kingdom. A number of you know from experience what I'm talking about, for not so long ago you were on that list. Since then, you've been cleaned up and given a fresh start by Jesus...."

The next issue of couples choosing to have or not have children is equally problematic. I don't think it's as simple as the author saying, "a person with many children will be happy and not against having children." That almost sounds like God doesn't bless those couple who for many reasons can't conceive. And I have seen families with many children whose lives result in chaos because parents don't know how to parent effectively. If only the adoption process could be simplified, made widely acceptable, and affordable so that the many couples who WANT children, but can't bear them, would be given the chance to raise these precious ones.
