Resilient individuals adopt active approaches to adversity and actually view stress in a positive way. This, of course leads to improved and sustained levels of high performance, something I see every day from the team. Resilient people are also more committed to their work. If one thing has been proven true during this time of extreme craziness, it is that healthcare workers are certainly committed to their work. We often laugh and say "healthcare is not for sissies". This is not for the weak of heart. While most of us in healthcare has seen our share of traumatic events, nothing could have prepared us for the last 24 months. Fortunately, healthcare workers are adept at adapting to stressful, life and death situations, and have been called to draw upon those experiences to help navigate the Covid pandemic. We constantly changed our work flow as we tried different strategies to combat the virus. This ability to ent strategies to combat the virus. This ability to adapt to change is the first step in developing resiliency. Another important step is to face and accept reality. Know your enemy and make a plan to fight it, even if you have to change that plan frequently. Being able to improvise and develop workarounds is also necessary.

Am I proud? You bet I am. When I think about my team and what we have endured, I am grateful to live in a community that has been so supportive. The drinks and snacks, cards of encouragement and prayers have kept us going during this most difficult time. I am so very proud to work with this group every day. Our community is blessed to have our small community hospital always ready to serve...right here, close to home.





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

Full of grins and mischief, and in the flower of his youth, little Robbie and trouble were old friends but he always told the truth.



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

CHICKEN DIVAN 10 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup plus 1 tablespoon butter, divided
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1-1/2 cups half-and-half cream
- 1/2 cup cooking sherry or water
- 2 cans (10-3/4 ounces each) condensed cream of chicken soup, undiluted
- 2 packages (10 ounces each) frozen cut or chopped broccoli, thawed
- 1 cup cooked rice
- 3 to 4 cups cubed cooked chicken
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 cup soft bread crumbs
- Minced fresh parsley, optional

Directions

- 1. In a small saucepan, melt 1/4 cup butter. Add flour, stirring until blended. Stir in the cream and cooking sherry or water; cook and stir until thickened and bubbly. Cook and stir 2 more minutes. Blend in soup until smooth; remove from the heat and set aside.
- 2. Place broccoli in an ungreased 13x9-in. baking dish. Cover with rice and then half of the sauce. Top with chicken. Stir shredded cheese into remaining sauce; pour over the chicken.





3. Melt the remaining butter and toss with bread crumbs. Sprinkle over the casserole. Bake, uncovered, at 350° for 35-45 minutes or until heated through. If desired, sprinkle with parsley before serving.

RANCH PASTA 8 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 2-1/2 cups uncooked bow tie pasta
- 2 cups (8 ounces) shredded Italian cheese blend
- 1-1/4 cups grated Parmesan cheese, divided
- 1 cup (8 ounces) sour cream
- 1 cup ranch salad dressing
- 1 package (10 ounces) frozen chopped spinach, thawed and squeezed dry or 2 cups chopped fresh spinach
- 2 slices day-old French bread (1/2 inch thick)
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon zest
- 1 teaspoon dried parsley flakes
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic salt

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Cook pasta according to package directions.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix Italian cheese blend, 1 cup Parmesan cheese, sour cream and salad dressing. Drain pasta; add to cheese mixture. Fold in spinach. Transfer to a greased 13x9-in. baking dish.
- 3. Tear French bread into pieces; place in a food processor. Cover and pulse until crumbs form. Toss bread crumbs with oil, lemon zest, parsley, garlic salt and remaining 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese. Sprinkle over pasta mixture.
- 4. Bake, covered, 25 minutes. Uncover; bake until golden brown and bubbly, 5-10 minutes.

CHICKEN PARMESAN STUFFED SHELLS

12 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 1 package (12 ounces) uncooked jumbo pasta shells
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- FILLING:
- 1 pound boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1/2-inch cubes



- 1-1/2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- 1 teaspoon salt, divided
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper, divided
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1/3 cup seasoned bread crumbs
- 3 cups part-skim ricotta cheese
- 1 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/2 cup 2% milk
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh Italian parsley
- ASSEMBLY:
- 4 cups meatless pasta sauce
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 8 ounces fresh mozzarella cheese, thinly sliced and halved

Directions


- 1. Preheat oven to 375°. Cook shells according to package directions for al dente; drain. Toss with oil; spread in an even layer on a baking sheet.
- 2. For filling, toss chicken with Italian seasoning, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat; saute chicken just until lightly browned, about 2 minutes. Reduce heat to medium; stir in butter until melted. Stir in bread crumbs; cook until crumbs are slightly toasted, 2-3 minutes, stirring occasionally. Cool slightly.
- 3. In a large bowl, mix cheeses, milk, parsley and the remaining salt and pepper. Fold in chicken.
- 4. Spread 2 cups pasta sauce into a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. Fill each shell with 2-1/2 tablespoons cheese mixture; place over sauce. Top with remaining sauce and cheeses (dish will be full).
- 5. Cover with greased foil; bake 30 minutes. Uncover; bake until heated through, 10-15 minutes.

FOLD-OVER TORTILLA BAKE

6 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2 cans (14-1/2 ounces each) stewed tomatoes
- 1 cup enchilada sauce
- 1 to 2 teaspoons ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 12 flour or corn tortillas (6 inches)
- 6 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1 can (4 ounces) chopped green chiles, drained
- 1 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese



Directions

- 1. In a large skillet, cook ground beef and onion until beef is no longer pink, breaking it into crumbles; drain. Stir in the tomatoes, enchilada sauce and seasonings. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, covered, for 5 minutes. Pour half the meat sauce into a 13x9-in. baking dish. Set aside.
- 2. Wrap the stack of tortillas in foil; warm at 350° for 8-10 minutes. Spread each warm tortilla with cream cheese and top with chiles. Fold tortillas in half. Arrange folded tortillas over meat sauce; pour remaining sauce over top.
- 3. Cover and bake at 350° for 15 minutes. Sprinkle with cheese; bake until cheese is melted, about 5 minutes longer. If desired, top with cilantro.

HAM,BROCCOLI AND ORZO CASSEROLE 8 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 4 cups chicken stock
- 2 cups uncooked orzo pasta
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups 2% milk
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese, divided
- 1-1/2 cups cubed fully cooked ham
- 2 cups chopped fresh broccoli
- 2 cups chopped fresh kale
- 1 cup french-fried onions

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a large saucepan, bring stock to a boil; stir in orzo. Cook, uncovered, until orzo is al dente and broth is absorbed, 8-10 minutes .
- 2. Meanwhile, in a large saucepan, heat butter over medium heat. Stir in flour until blended; cook and stir until lightly browned, 4-5 minutes. Gradually whisk in milk, salt and pepper. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly; cook and stir until thickened, 1-2 minutes. Stir in 1-1/2 cups cheese; cook until cheese is melted.
- 3. Add orzo, ham, broccoli and kale. Transfer to a greased 13x9-in. baking dish; sprinkle with onions and remaining cheese. Bake, uncovered, until bubbly, 20-25 minutes.

Claybank Master Gardeners April 2022 Greeting Gardeners,

Lower Alabama weather can go from winter frosts to summer heat almost overnight, not to mention raging downpours followed by drought conditions, just when we're setting out new seeds and/or plants. How to cope? Greg Lolley, one of our very knowledgeable Master Gardeners, recommends spraying the leaves of stressed plants with compost tea. Plants readily absorb this "liquid gold" and you will see results in just a few days. Matured compost (from kitchen vegetable scraps and disease-free yard trimmings) is full of nutrients which help your plants overcome many stress factors. This is a free and easily applied solution to stressed plants. If your compost piles are not yet matured enough from heat and moisture (when the compost has turned into very clean smelling black soil) try using a small scoopful from a bag of Black Kow compost mixed into a watering can of water or strained into a spray bottle.

What to plant in April? The AL Extension's **SOW app** suggests asparagus, cantaloupe, celery, corn, cucumbers, eggplant, kohlrabi, lima beans, okra, peppers, radishes, snap beans, southern peas, summer squash, sweet potatoes, tomatoes, turnips, watermelons, and winter squash.

Also look for **herbs** you can use in cooking. Using even a small amount of dried herbs adds great flavor, and can cut the need for salt, fat and sugar. Herbs also contain many healthful nutrients and provide disease fighting phytochemicals. Basil, rosemary, thyme, parsley and cilantro are a few basic ones that grow easily from seed or transplants. Parsley and cilantro prefer cooler months but can last longer if kept in partial shade. Basils (purple, Thai, sweet, Genovese, and other varieties) are heat lovers. Rosemary, sage and thyme are perennial (they don't die out in winter and/or come back year after year) are great with egg dishes, fish, meats, pasta, rice and potatoes. Lemon verbena, bee balm, tulsi (also known as holy basil because of its medicinal qualities) and lemongrass are lovely in hot and iced tea.


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TIMES HAVE CHANGED
