



Dear "Speak Out",

The title of this week's article is "The Next Country Which Russia Will Invade".

As Russian President Vladimir Putin continues his invasion of Ukraine, he has even more ambitions to expand Russia to the empire which it was during the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

As most people focus their attention on a possible invasion by Russia of NATO, Putin's focus is on the Republic of Moldova which was once part of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and is not part of NATO just as Ukraine is not. He will not engage with NATO or the United States unless provoked. His goal is to reestablish the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics as it existed prior to 1991.

On Thursday, March 3rd the Republic of Moldova applied for admission to the European Union in which their President Maia Sandu stated it was a vote for "freedom". One day after Moldova applied for European Union membership, Transnistrian leaders issued a statement making clear they had no interest in following Moldova in this venture. They demanded that there would be "two independent states – Moldova and Transnistria".

Moldova already has an estimated 1,500 Russian troops within its internationally recognized borders. Those troops, which Russia describes as peacekeepers, are based in an area known as Transnistria, a breakaway enclave that functions in practice as an independent nation, where Moldovan authorities admit they have no control.

Transnistria was born out of a brief early 1990s war amid the Soviet collapse. Moldova wanted independence and to outlaw Russian as the official language while Transnistria wanted to maintain Soviet ties. The Republic of Moldova is progressively becoming a strong democracy. Russian President Vladimir Putin will not sit back and allow

Russian President Vladimir Putin will not sit back and allow Moldova to become a member of the European Union. Russian troops have destroyed the port cities of Odessa and Mariupol which are only 30 miles from Moldova's border. Belarus would attack from the north-east while Russia continues its aggression from the east and south.


On Tuesday, March 1, 2022, while addressing his security council, Belarus's authoritarian leader, Alexander Lukashenko, displayed a battle map that showed an arrow indicating an imminent invasion of Moldova from southern Ukraine. The battle map divided Ukraine into four sections for conquest. Lukashenko is an ally of Putin and is believed to be readying his military for an invasion of Ukraine. Just as Vladimir Volfovich Zhirinovsky stated in his speech to the Russia state DUMA on Monday, December 27, 2021, providing the exact time and date which Russia would invade Ukraine, we and our elected officials in Washington should pay attention to Lukashenko's speech. I do not know just how more explicit these leaders need to be for us to wake up.

Vladimir Zhirinovsky mentioned on Monday, December 27th that in 2022 "...Russia once again becomes a great power." Russia would have to again be the U. S. S. R. Putin will attempt to reestablish the U. S. S. R. with Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Belarus, Georgia, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Turkmen, Uzbek, Tajik, Kirghiz and Kazakh. Lord willing, I will submit an article again next week.
