

to earn their bachelor's degree in nursing is now available to lakeshore area residents who want to learn 100% locally. The "2+2+1 Nursing Pathway" allows students to learn at Lakeshore Technical College's Cleveland campus and the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay campuses in Sheboygan and Manitowoc.


"This new option is especially convenient for anyone wanting to learn while staying close to home and saving money. It provides opportunity for upcoming high school graduates and adults balancing work and/or family with college," said LTC Dean of Health and Human Services Michelle Zautner.

Registered nurses with associate degrees typically focus on direct patient care. RNs who have the desire to take on leadership and management roles are typically expected to have at least a bachelor's degree. A bachelor's degree is also the next step in education for those wanting to become nurse educators or advanced practice

A new option for individuals wanting nurses. 

FD putting out fires for 125 years

Elkhart Lake Fire Department is celebrating 125 years of service this year. "We are very proud that our organization has survived this many years considering that we are made up totally of volunteers."

The Fire Department was formed Oct. 10, 1897 as the Elkhart Lake Hook and Ladder Company and appointed Otto LaBubbe as the Fire Chief. LaBubbe resigned in December of 1897 and Arthur Hein was appointed as Fire Chief. The first Fire House was located on N. East Street. A private shed housed the fire equipment until 1903 when they were able to purchase an old schoolhouse to remodel as a Fire Station. In 1931, the Fire Department purchased lakefront property for the park which is still used today for events. One of the first fire trucks is proudly displayed in the current Fire Station alongside the new fire trucks of today. The bell hanging out front of the Fire Station is the original bell that was used to alert people of a fire.

Many things have changed sine the early years of the Fire Station. The ladders on the fire trucks in the early history of the fire department were wooden and are now called "Widow-Makers". Today's ladders are made of heavy-duty steel and long enough to reach the roof of the Osthoff. An interesting fact that was pointed out by Ronald Nielsen, Secretary/Treasurer, is that fire trucks differ among the communities. Each fire truck is created per specifications of that community. Fire trucks cost millions of dollars and are custom-made. Fire Fighters train many hours to learn where everything is located on a fire truck. A lot of equipment is stored on a fire truck including hoses, airpacks, couplings for hoses jaws of life and much more and every possible space is used to house these.

31 members in department

Currently there are 31 volunteers in the Elkhart Lake Fire Department. In the 1980's there was a limit of 40 volunteers and there was a waiting list. Today it is harder to recruit volunteers with the amount of hours of training, meetings, fire calls and community events that they attend. "We are very fortunate to have such dedicated volunteers who serve our community" commented Chief Robert Schmidt. A volunteer Fire Fighter trains at least 60 hours before they can do any essential services. They one business meeting a month and then two or three sessions of training a month. They put in long hours on ladder training, Incident care response and airpack training. "This is a very dangerous profession and we need to make sure all of our volunteers are welltrained. In our 125 years, we have lost one Fire Fighter, Ed Weber, in a grass fire in 2003." Fire Fighters are also trained on how to handle the electrical cars when there is an accident. The electrical charge of the batteries could cause electrocution if not handled properly. Electrical cars change how a Fire Fighter uses the jaws of life on a vehicle.

The Fire Departments are part of MA-BAS: Mutual Aid Box Alarm System. MABAS offers a state-wide mutual aid response for fire, EMS and specialized incident operational teams. A fire department might get a call to send out just a water truck or a pumper. Fire departments train with other departments to learn where to park their equipment so that they are not in the way of others and to protect their equipment.

The Elkhart Lake Fire Department is taking a higher profile within the community this year. The department has already held two fundraising events. One





on New Year's Day and a St. Patrick's Day fundraising event orchestrated by Route 67 and worked by the volunteer Fire Fighters. Both events were financially successful. Route 67 is a major sponsor for the Fire Department. During these fundraising events, the Fire Fighters run basket raffles, a money wheel and a 50/50 raffle. There are four more fundraising events scheduled this year and six events in the community. April 3rd the Fire Department is holding an Open House and Pancake Breakfast from 8:00AM to Noon. It is open to the community and families. The public will be able to tour the Fire Station and see the equipment. July 1st and 3rd will be a big fundraiser event with the annual parade and picnic. In September, there will be a tailgate, brat fry and football game with the High School boy's basketball team and then in December there will be events with the High School girl's basketball team. The six community events will include the Easter Egg Hunt with the Elkhart Lions Club. The Memorial Day Celebration on Memorial Day. The Town of Rhine Memorial Day Parade. In July the Fire Fighters will have a presence at races and events at Road America. In August Downtown Night in Elkhart Lake. Oct. 15 will be the large Anniversary Celebration with a community event at the Fire Station. In December Santa will again be riding on the back of a fire truck and parading through Elkhart Lake. "We take pride in what we do for the community when it comes to helping out with community events," Fire Chief Robert Schmidt commented. Chief Schmidt has been the

fire chief since 2021.



Lions Club surpasses big milestone

One million dollars is a lot of money especially when it is raised one root beer float, one hamburger and one game of bingo at a time.

That is how the Elkhart Lake Lions Club has done it over its 50-year history, but the Lions have indeed done it.

Through hard work by a lot of people over the years—and some very detailed record keeping—the club realized at the beginning of December that it had surpassed the \$1 million mark in the amount of donations it has made over the years.

"I think of all the different organizations that are involved (in the Elkhart Lake area) and I think the Lions have done the most," said Tom Wiese, a member of the club for the last 42 years.

Helping in a variety of areas

Asked which beneficiaries of Lions Club funds stand out as he drives through the community, Wiese mentioned some big ones—the community's schools, its Athletic Park, the Veterans Memorial and

A more detailed summary of the club's donations since 1971 show some obviously impressive numbers in multiple areas. The club has broken down the over \$1 million it has donated into four major areas:

Under the heading of Community, the single largest beneficiary of Lions Club dollars has been the village's Athletic Park with \$111,552. With top-notch baseball and softball fields and tennis and basketball courts, a park the quality of this one is rarely found in a village the size of Elkhart Lake and even many larger communities.

The same can be said of the village's Fire Department, which has been the beneficiary of \$74,051 from the Elkhart Lake Lions Club over the last half century.

Impressive Veterans Memorial

The village also has an impressive Veterans Memorial, once again thanks in large part to the club and the \$93,770 it has donated over the years. The memorial was dedicated in 2007.

Lions Park has received \$46,246 from the club over the years to provide play opportunities for small children and families. The list of community donations goes on and on to include parades/fireworks (\$14,633), Boy Scouts/Girl Scouts (\$11,219), concerts (\$7,900), medical causes (\$33,393) and a myriad of uses under the "community other" heading (\$69,535).

But the Athletic Park is not the single largest beneficiary of Elkhart Lake Lions Club funds. That distinction goes to the club's efforts to help individuals with Cerebral Palsy, a cause which has received \$127,510 over the years.

In the school area, scholarships tops the list with \$43,368, followed by buildings and grounds with \$36,573 and exchange students with \$20,276. Once again, a long list of individual donations undoubtedly falls under the "school other" category and the \$45,267 the club has donated there.

The Elkhart Lake Lions Club has truly helped people all over the world through its donations to Lions International (\$52,874), but also many statewide programs ranging from Mission to Mexico to Disaster Relief to the State Eye Bank.

How the money has been raised

So how has the club raised all that money with which it has been so generous? Again, it simply has been a combination of a lot of hard work by a lot of members and others, along with some fundraising activities which have worked very well for

Compared to some of the club's longtime members, Bill Carlander is a relative newcomer with about three years of service. But Carlander summed up the club's efforts well when he said, "There is a seemingly endless list of members whose efforts have made them inseparable from the success the club has realized over the last 50 years."

Some of those members have passed away but they have left a legacy in more ways than one. The late Don Smoot was a founding member of the club. Carlander said the late Al Suemnicht "appeared to embody much of what Lionism stands for by his tireless and selfless work as witnessed by his five children's similar tireless efforts and their dedication to the club." Two of Suemnicht's children—Randy and Kathy—are members of the club.

Dozens of other members have helped as well. Al Zemlica, the club's current secretary, has been instrumental in running the Road America food stands over for the past 30 years. Carlander said, "He's not one for the limelight but much of the club's massive success at RA has been due to his efforts and determination."

Club members said they have been blessed by having Road America in their backyard—a venue which draws tens of thousands of racing fans to the community every year and which also offers clubs such as the Elkhart Lake Lions the opportunity to raise a lot of money.

Remembering the bingo days

Longtime member Jim Schumacher has been a key part of the corn stand run by the club at Road America for many years, but the fundraiser both he and Wiese mentioned first was twice-a-month bingo run by the Lions from 1983 to 2001.

Bingo was held at Anchor Lanes on Wednesday nights and Schumacher said, "The place was full. It was scary in the beginning—all those women in there and if you made a mistake, the hall was silent."

Wiese was busy operating Quit Qui Oc Golf Course back in the bingo years but said, "I never wanted to miss that (bingo). Not only was it a fundraiser, it was a fun thing to do. It was a club activity that brought the guys together. We were all younger then." Wiese pointed out that Lions clubs are not just about serving their communities but also providing social opportunities for members, and bingo helped that happen. "That was part of the whole mission—it was a morale builder,"

In 1992 the club began operating a root beer float stand at Road America and did that until 2004. Schumacher recalled one Road America fan who would ride up to the stand every morning on his motorbike to get his root beer float.

There have been multiple beneficiaries of Lions Club funds over the years, including getting the Veterans Memorial built and dedicated.

Following the root beer float days came a small stand which the club built near the Paddock Shop to serve brats, burgers, chicken breasts, beans and beverages. When the club got a much larger stand on the hill near Turn 5, they switched to doing corn and continue to do so to this day. They used to use an in-ground charcoal pit to roast the corn but have since switched to propane burners.

Schumacher said he actually enjoys working at the stand more when it is busy. "It's more fun when the people are purchasing something," he said. He added that it was fun this past year when an Elvis impersonator came up to the booth at the NASCAR race to purchase some corn.

Carlander commended the many volunteers who have assisted the Lions at the track and elsewhere over the years.

Schumacher said the Lions can run the stand with about four or five people, but

the key is having those people for all the days and shifts needed. Like most service clubs these days, the average age of members of the Elkhart Lake Lions Club is getting up there. More members—especially younger ones-are needed as the club embarks on raising its next million dollars to help local causes. Wiese said, "Everyone's busy today, but community service is a way to find out what's going on in your community and trying to make it better. Do something to get involved in your community."



Glacial Lakes volunteer shares story of helping

Volunteer, Martha Schott shares her story. Way back in the 1950s, my sister, brothers, and neighbor friends loved to pack a picnic lunch and head up the steep, winding path to the very top of Grasshopper Hill where you could see for miles. It was a favorite destination for many kids who grew up in the Elkhart Lake area, a kids' paradise with rocks, snakes and grasshoppers, a place where many had their first real encounter with wild natural beauty. For me it was my favorite place on earth, a place I hoped would be there for my kids and their kids to enjoy.

After GLC came along and saved my favorite place on earth, making it a 25-acre public preserve in 2012, I stepped up my volunteer involvement with GLC. I wanted to be a part of preserving more acres of wild habitat.

The other big factor in my commitment to GLC was Mary Piehl, a former Executive Director of GLC who passed away from cancer in 2019. Mary was a student in my classes at Lakeland University where I taught communications courses and advised the student media for many years. She served as the business manager of the student newspaper and I came to appreci-

ate her tireless work ethic and indomitable spirit. Mary reached out to me when she took on the role of Executive Director at GLC and asked me to do layout and design work (I had taught a course in InDesign for many years). Of course I said yes! I designed various handouts and I proof read the Landscapes newsletter. Now, working with the awesome staff and volunteers on the Outreach Committee, I do the layout and design for the newsletter, invitations, and whatever might be needed.

And that brings me to the third big reason I volunteer for GLC: the people. It is so satisfying to be doing good work - helping to save natural areas in the five county region - with people who are so encouraging, so supportive, so knowledgeable and so committed. I am truly honored to be working with these people. I have learned so much participating in GLC nature walks, clean up days, and presentations from people who are experts. I invite others to join us, to find a role in this organization to apply your interests and talents. You will have fun, feel appreciated, and know the satisfaction which comes from being in "the forever business" of land preservation.



LTC awarded grant

Lakeshore Technical College received approval this week from the Wisconsin Technical College System board for \$1.43 million in competitive grant funding, the highest amount among all 16 colleges in the Wisconsin Technical College System. This is an increase of \$127,894 over last fiscal year.

The funding was awarded to support key areas including a new cybersecurity program launching in fall, culinary and nursing career pathways, and the radiography, welding, and mechanical design programs.

"The success we are seeing in competitive grant funding will support students preparing for in-demand, high-paying careers that employers in our district are looking for," said LTC President Dr.

Paul Carlsen. "Receiving this amount is a significant accomplishment for us and our district, especially considering we are the third smallest college in terms of fulltime student enrollment within the state's technical college system."

LTC was also awarded: \$416,095 in allocation grants that fund student success, nontraditional occupations, and professional growth efforts; and \$274,788 in second-year allocations for Adult Education and Family Literacy Act funding that supports programs helping adults acquire basic such as reading, writing, math, English language proficiency, and problem solving.



Lakeshore Tech named Military Friendly school

For the 13th consecutive year, Lakeshore Technical College earned the Military Friendly® School designation. Institutions earning the designation were evaluated using public data sources and responses from a proprietary survey. LTC also processes state level Retraining Grant Applications for veterans who are dislocated



workers, National Guard Tuition Grant Applications, and VetEd Reimbursement Grants. Those eligible for the Federal GI Bill can benefit from tuition assistance, housing allowance, and additional stipends to cover education costs.

Registration for new and returning veterans begins April 4 for summer and fall terms. Alumni, returning, and new program students can begin registering April 5. Registration will be open to everyone on April 14.





EL-G celebrates Read Across America





New art show opening in Gallery 110 North


The public is invited to join us for a brand-new art show opening in Gallery 110 North, Friday, April 1 from 5 to 7 p.m.



The urban forest is a vital part of village life. It provides environmental, economic, aesthetic, and health benefits.

The Village of Elkhart Lake is a 22-year Tree City based on these qualifications: maintaining a Tree Commission, having a community tree ordinance, spending \$2.00 per capita on our urban forest, and celebrating Arbor Day with our 5th graders. Pat Robison, Frank Thielman, Anne Hatas, Steve Kapellen, and John Schott are our tree commissioners with Katrina Weir, Village Deputy Clerk, as the community liaison. The commission is responsible for stewardship of the village park and parkway trees working with our public works department to coordinate tree planting, removal, replacement and maintenance. Other projects include: providing information to the community about the impact of the urban forest, long term planning, and the 5th grade arbor day artwork and tree planting events.

The Commission is focusing on some new projects for 2022 to keep the commu-

nity informed about the value of our urban forest and their part in protecting trees, providing homeowners with tree species choices whenever possible, and testing new planting and maintenance methods to increase the longevity of urban trees.

Hydrant Flushing & Sewer Cleaning Tentative Schedule

Hydrant flushing will be done April 11th and 12th, weather permitting. If the weather does not allow for flushing then, it will be done on April 18th and 19th. We will also be cleaning a portion of our sewer lines in April.

The Elkhart Lake Fire Department will be holding its annual breakfast at the firehouse event. It will be held on Sunday, April 3, 2022 from 8 am until 12 pm. It will be all you can eat scrambled eggs, pancakes, french toast, sausage, toast, coffee, milk, and orange juice. The cost will be \$12.00 for adults and \$6 for children 8 and under. Building Permit Required

If you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Permits must be obtained prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

Household Hazardous Waste

Sheboygan County has established three (potentially four) periodic collection sites for disposing of hazardous wastes. The majority of the program is funded with County tax dollars, so be prepared to show proof of residency. When those funds are depleted, the sites will be closed until funds are again available. The fees are: \$15 - Vehicles with hazardous waste only, \$40 - Vehicles with household size electronics only (for each 6 items), and \$40 - Vehicles with both hazardous waste and household size electronics (for each 6 electronic items). The first date is set for April 9th at the Highway Department on County J and Highway 67 from 8 am until 11 am. Dog Licenses

Please stop in at the Village Hall to license your dog by March 31st. You need to provide a proof of rabies vaccination and pay the fee (\$7.00 per spayed or neutered dog and \$14.00 per dog if not spayed or neutered). A late charge will be assessed to all dogs not licensed by March 31st.

Water Conservation & Water

There are many ways a person can con-

serve water. You turn off the faucet while brushing your teeth, you take shorter showers, you can replace your old toilet with a new 1.28 gallon/flush model, you can check for leaks in your toilets or faucets, or only do laundry when you have a full load, etc. These are all good ways to conserve water, but there are ways you can conserve water and use water efficiently

Some things you can do outdoors include:

- Making lawn watering optional. Some people choose to forgo watering established lawns and allow their lawns to go dormant during hot periods in the summer.
- Decrease your lawn area. Assess your lawn and decide if you can convert lawn into garden beds.
- Use native plants. Plants and shrubs native to Wisconsin come in beautiful varieties. Correctly matched to soil and light needs, once established, native plants will survive wet weather and drought condi-
- Redirect and disconnect downspouts. In this case, redirecting your downspouts into your lawn or a garden, allows for some of that rainwater to infiltrate into the soil and eventually reach the water table. This practice keeps your water local and on your property as much as possible. This does not work for all situations such as if the downspout is keeping water out of your basement, but often the water can be redirected to flow into your lawn or garden with no detriment to your yard and a benefit to water supplies.
- Plant a rain garden. A rain garden is a specialized garden that uses water typically captured from a roof, and allows the rain to slowly infiltrate into the ground, contributing to groundwater supplies and reducing stormwater runoff.
- Create rain barrels. Installing a rain barrel connected to a downspout is a great way to create an additional water source. Rain barrel water can be used for outdoor and indoor non-edible plants. These barrels usually hold 50 gallons and fill quickly in a rainstorm.

People do not realize how a small leak can be costly. Below is an image that shows that a faucet dripping only 30 drops per minutes can mean that 54 gallons are lost a month. If you have a leaking toilet that is leaking at ¼ gallon per minute, it can use 10,800 gallons per month and can cost over \$125 in water and sewer charges in one month in the Village of Elkhart Lake. If you suspect your toilet is running or



University gets grant

Lakeland University has received a for four years (up to three years for transfer \$250,000 grant from the Kohler Trust for the Arts and Education to fund several ongoing, student-centered programs.

The grant will support the Kohler Teaching Scholars program, the Lakeland Promise Program, LU's free student shuttle and expansion of counseling services for students.

"We are grateful to the Kohler Trust for the Arts and Education for their ongoing funding and partnership with us," said Lakeland President Beth Borgen. "Working together, we are creating the next generation of leaders and contributing citizens in our region."

Kohler Teaching Scholars: \$65,000 will help fund recruitment of the next cohort of Kohler Teaching Scholars. This program provides scholarship support that, coupled with Lakeland's Cooperative Education program, creates a unique, competitive pathway to home-grow more Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) teachers for the Sheboygan Area School District.

Funds will be used to award \$5,000 annual scholarships to three incoming firstyear students. This scholarship award is in addition to any other institutional scholarships and grants available to the students.

Remaining funds from the inaugural cohort will continue to be used to provide scholarships for students interested in dual-credit education courses in high school, as well as continued discussion with SASD to consider four-year education degrees for their BIPOC paraprofessionals through LU's Kellett School.

Lakeland Promise Program: \$100,000 will support this program, which provides qualified Wisconsin students an opportunity to attend Lakeland tuition/fees free

students). The program currently supports 67 students with high financial need.

"This initiative aligns directly with our commitment to accessibility and affordability for students from all socioeconomic backgrounds," Borgen said. "In order to positively impact the college attainment achievement gap in our nation, we must work to break the social mobility cycle and higher education achievement cycle often experienced by first-generation college students. The Lakeland Promise, aligned with our Co-Op program, is designed to

Cooperative Education transportation: \$50,000 will support transportation expenses for Lakeland students to participate in off-campus Co-Op employment. Many Lakeland students do not have a vehicle on campus and therefore rely on LU's campus shuttle to get to work. The Lakeland shuttle service provides an average of nearly 7,000 rides each year, and approximately 70% of those rides are work-related.

Expanded counseling services: \$35,000 will help fund expenses necessary to provide enhanced counseling support to Lakeland students impacted by the pandemic.

Lakeland University acquiring Jake's Café

Lakeland University is expanding into downtown Sheboygan to provide more access to its award-winning Cooperative Education program, recruit the next generation of entrepreneurially minded students and position the institution as a significant resource and partner for the region.

Thanks to the generosity of some wellknown local innovators, the university is acquiring Jake's Café at 529 Ontario Ave., and renaming it Jake's, A Lakeland

Jake's, a Lakeland Community, will serve as a collaborative "Communiversity" (community university) that combines Lakeland's Cooperative Education program with university intellectual resources to create an environment for learning and practice. It will also serve as a resource for community leaders seeking innovative solutions to real-world problems. In addition to expanded programing, Jake's will continue to host creative communities

"Jake's, a Lakeland Community, will attract new students who are tomorrow's entrepreneurs and create new ways for Lakeland to serve as a broader resource to help elevate our community. Whether a student wants to run a small business or has the next big idea, Jake's will provide a unique laboratory for learning," said Lakeland President Beth Borgen.

Donations help it happen

Funding for the transition to Jake's, a Lakeland Community, has been donated by Herbert V. Kohler, Jr. on behalf of Kohler Co. and by Richard and Kristin (Jacobson) Bemis.

"Our innovation at Lakeland is fueled and inspired by these entrepreneurs who have helped position Sheboygan County nationally and globally," Borgen said. "We admire the legacies of Herbert V. Kohler, Jr., Richard Bemis and Frank and Tryg Jacobson, and we are proud to work together on these shared visions and passions for building our communities."

Hub for Experiential Learning

Jake's will become a hub for experiential learning. Launch: Lakeland Student-Run Businesses, a venture that allows students to develop and run all aspects of businesses, along with Launch's Develop U, which tailors professional development series for employers, will be a part of Jake's business plan.

"Our students will play key roles in developing the strategic business plan for Jake's, while earning credit and invaluable experience," Borgen said. "Current and prospective students can come to us with an idea, and then hone that idea and their knowledge with mentoring from Lakeland faculty, successful alumni and local entrepreneurs. They will ultimately graduate with a business plan and receive start-up financing."

Lakeland's shuttle will provide free transportation for students on the main campus who need easy access to Lakeland's downtown Sheboygan location.

Jake's, a Lakeland Community, will remain the home office of the existing roster of entrepreneurs and business owners. Borgen said Lakeland is considering innovative ways to leverage the full commercial kitchen, café space and other unique benefits of the venue.

Discussions to foster collaborative programming with other community organizations are ongoing. One of the goals for Jake's is to create a space to unify community efforts and encourage entre-

preneurship and innovation for learners at all stages in their careers.

"The mindset for a growing number of incoming students is focused on entrepreneurship," said Britanni Meinnert, associate vice president of Lakeland's Cooperative Education program. "Between our Co-Op program, this new location and the roles that our students will play in its development, Lakeland has developed unique ways to engage students and help them become tomorrow's leaders."

Proceeds generated from the operations of Jake's will support continued expansion of Lakeland's Cooperative Education program, Launch: Lakeland Student-Run Businesses and student scholarships.

Donated funds will also be used to create an endowed chair at Lakeland, the Herbert V. Kohler, Jr. Chair for Business & Entrepreneurship. The person in this new role will be located at Jake's and work directly with students and local business leaders to develop a long-term plan for the space that includes experiential learning at all levels, while integrating broader community planning and innovation.

"This new chair and the tenants of Jake's will become integrated in the mentorship and development of our young talent," said Paul Pickhardt, dean of Lakeland's Schilcutt School of Business, Science & Technology. "This approach benefits our students but also local businesses and the overall development of Sheboygan."

Lakeland will explore ways to share its main campus academic, research and fine arts programming at Jake's. The university will also explore adding an emphasis in entrepreneurship in its Schilcutt School of Business, Science & Technology. Jake's will also become a space for LU students and faculty to study and work, while easily accessing Sheboygan community life and amenities.

History of Jake's Café

Jake's is named for Frank "Jake" Jacobson, who founded Jacobson Advertising and moved the business to the Ontario Avenue location in 1962. Jacobson's son, Tryg, joined the family business, and in 1983 joined coworker Jon Rost to form Jacobson Rost. The renowned agency acquired adjacent buildings and expanded into the existing 20,000 sq. ft. campus.


When Tryg and his wife, Ann Marie, sold the business, they retained the Sheboygan property. In honor of his parents, Jake and Elizabeth "Betty" Jacobson, they founded Jake's Cafe, a place designed to attract and nurture a community of creative people from all walks of life.


