

SPEAK OUT

April 17th is Easter Sunday this year.

On Thursday, April 10, 32 A. D., our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ celebrated the Passover with His disciples in the Upper Room in Jerusalem.

This would be the last meal which He would share with His disciples on this Earth. His disciples asked Jesus where they would spend the Passover. He sent two of His disciples to Jerusalem to a man carrying a pitcher of water and followed him into a house. They told the man of the house that the Master needed a place to celebrate the Passover. They were taken to a furnished upper room and there they prepared for the Passover.

That evening Jesus and His disciples came to this room. He told the twelve disciples that one of them would betray Him and they became very sorrowful. Jesus said that the man that dips his piece of bread into the serving dish would be that man. Jesus broke the loaf of bread and gave it to His disciples and said "Take, eat, this is

my body.'

Jesus then took the cup of wine, blessed it, and gave thanks to God His Father. He gave the cup to His disciples, and they drank from it. He said unto them, "... this is my blood of the new testament which is shed for many. Verily I say unto you, I will drink no more of the fruit of the vine, until that day that I drink it new in the kingdom of God.'

Because His disciples had heard a similar saying many times at wedding feasts, they knew that Jesus meant that one day He would celebrate the Marriage Feast of

the Lamb with them in Heaven.

And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. Jesus told His disciples to wait for Him as He went to pray to His Father. Judas brought the chief priests, scribes and elders who arrested Jesus. All His disciples fled. He was brought to the chief priests and the council who questioned Him.

They took Jesus to Pilate who could not find any crime had been committed and wished to free Him. But the people demanded that Jesus be crucified, so Pilate agreed and had his soldiers lead Him to a place called Golgatha where they crucified Him between two thieves.

Jesus cried out "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" and cried with a loud voice, "It is finished" and gave up His spirit. The veil of the temple was torn

in half from the top to the bottom.

Joseph of Arimathaea went in boldly unto Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus and his request was approved. They wrapped the body of Jesus in linen and laid him in a sepulchre which was hewn out of a rock and rolled a stone unto the door.

On March 29, 2022, Santa Cascio celebrated her 104th Birthday surrounded by family and friends. Santa was born in Polizzi Generosa, Sicily on March 29, 1918 to Gundolfo Valenza and Concetta Inguatta. As one of six children in her family, her brothers were Joseph and Salvatore and her sisters were Serafina, Mary who died at 103 & 1/2 and Giovana who just turned 100.

Upon completing school in the 4th grade, Santa became a seamstress and primarily made men's suits. In 1952 she married Joseph and in 1953 they came to live at 61 N. Main Street in Mount Morris.

Together they had 2 daughters, Josephine and Concetta. After Joseph passed away in 1984, Santa resided in the residence until 2007.

Throughout her life she worked in the Perry and Mount Morris Knitting Mill as well as Champion in Geneseo. Her husband Joseph worked at the State Hospital in Rochester.

Santa and her family were known for their baked goods.

They not only delivered breads, they even had a family stand in their front yard. They were also known for their delicious waffles at the local carnival. Most of all, they were known for their Saint Joseph Feasts. In fact, people used to come from Rochester to attend them. The

Santa loved to sew, knit, crochet and garden. She still knits today. While she lived briefly in Arizona and Florida with family, she returned to Mount Morris in 2019.

National Infant Immunization Week

National Infant Immunization Week (NIIW), which is from **April 24-30**, highlights the importance of protecting infants and children two years or less from vaccine-preventable diseases.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported a decline in vaccines given to children during the COVID-19 pandemic. It's important that families stay on track for children's routine checkups and recommended vaccinations. Well-child visits are often covered by most insurances and the following vaccines are given to children ages 0-23 months:

- Chickenpox
- Diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough (4 doses)
- Haemophiles influenzae, type B disease (4 doses)
- · Measles, mumps, and rubella
- Polio (3 doses)
- · Pneumococcal disease (4 doses)
- · Hepatitis A
- · Hepatitis B
- Influenza (annually)

Vaccines are safe. Before a vaccine is approved and given to children, it is tested extensively. Also, COVID-19 vaccines are available for children ages 5 and older. Information is expected soon for those under the age of 5 after more testing has been completed.




