accused of shooting 59-year-old **William** Clare Mealback Jr. and dumping his body onto Avalon Ävenue in Muscle Shoals.

Martin had been released from prison after serving about three years of his sentence for manslaughter for killing his father.

The Nick Risner Act was sponsored by Rep. Phillip Pettus and prevents convicts who used a deadly weapon to kill someone from being released early under Alabama's "Good Time"

law.
"Sergeant Risner's killer should have never been released from prison in the first place," Ivey said. "While there is nothing that can be done to reverse this horrific tragedy, this legislation will go a long way in ensuring violent offenders remain off the streets."

Ivey previously met with members of the Risner family and offered her full support of this legislation as it moved through the process.



"These issues exist right here in our community, and at a level that many people can't comprehend," said One Place Executive Director Donna Beck. "We want to take every opportunity to try to get in front of such abuses to prevent them from ever happening."

from ever happening."

UNA will host "Squash the Silence," a community outreach from 5–7pm on Friday, April 22 at Rogers Hall on the UNA campus. The event includes a 1K walk to raise awareness of child abuse.

The last week of April is designated as National Crime Victims' Rights Week. One of the activities that week is a candlelight vigil at 7pm at Wilson Park on Tuesday, April 26 in memory of and to honor crime victims. It is hosted by VOCAL (Victims of Crime and Leniency).

One Place board member Carole Bevis said that while the organization's entire year is dedicated to education, the events in April and the "extra push" emphasizes the importance of educating the public.

Denim Day will be observed internationally on Wednesday, April 27.

Originally known as "Jeans for Justice," the Denim Day campaign originated in 1999 as part of a protest over an Italian Supreme Court decision. The court dismissed the charges against a 45-year-old rape suspect, instead blaming the victim of the attack. The court's position was that "because the victim was wearing very, very tight jeans, she had to help him remove them... but by removing the jeans... it was no longer a rape, but consensual sex."

Place One board President, Angie Hamilton, hopes businesses organizations across the Shoals will participate in the event, which serves as a fundraiser for One Place. Participants in the program wear jeans that day, donating \$1, or any amount set by their employers to do so.

The last event of the

month will be a Victim's Service Provider Resource Fair from 11am–2pm on April 30 at Wilson Park. The free public event is hosted by the Lauderdale County District Attorney's Office. Numerous local Victim Service Provider agencies will be participating in this event with free information and material available. There will also be activities for children.

"We are proud to partner with other victim service providers in our area to shine a light on the services we all provide," Hamilton added. "All services provided by One Place and the other agencies are free. No victim is alone. We encourage anyone needing help to reach out."

understand temptation you guys are facing. But there's a power in behavior modification on a short-term basis that supersedes the power of mathematics. Stick to the plan, and pay off the cars first.

When you're still on Baby Step 2, you need to stop all saving and investing, and attack your debts with a vengeance. You've got a lot of money wrapped up in cars, and even with all the great work you two have done I know it's probably still a little hard to see light at the end of the tunnel. Debts that large can be intimidating.

But I'm afraid you'll lose focus and intensity when it comes to getting out of debt if you worry about your emergency fund and setting aside for retirement too soon. I've seen that happen to lots of people,



and when it does it can end up taking several years to get rid of all that debt.

You guys have made great progress, and you're making good money. If you stay gazelle-intense about getting out of debt, those car payments can be history in about a year and a half. Think about how fast you can get that

emergency fund in place then, and how much money you'll have freed up to go into retirement.

Now is the time to roll up your sleeves, get mad about all that stupid debt and knock it out once and for all. You can do this,







Medicare Minute Durable Medical Equipment

Durable Medical Equipment are items such as walkers, wheelchairs, and hospital beds that are used in the home. Medicare will cover certain durable medical equipment only if your physician prescribes it. To be prescribed the durable medical equipment must be: durable, or reusable, used for a medical purpose, and primarily used at home. Durable medical equipment is covered under Medicare Part B.

Some examples of items that qualify as durable medical equipment are, but not limited to: Oxygen equipment and supplies, walkers, wheelchairs, hospital beds, infusion supplies, and patient lifts. Remember, these items should be used primarily at home. If you are residing in a nursing home or hospital, and that facility is providing you with Medicare covered care, it may not be considered your home. If you are staying in a skilled nursing facility, that facility will usually provide the durable medical equipment you need.

If you need durable medical equipment, make sure your doctor and durable medical equipment supplier are enrolled in Medicare. If you doctor or supplier is not enrolled, Medicare will not pay the claims they submit. Without any type of supplemental insurance, you typically will be responsible for 20% of the Medicare approved amount. Also, if you are on a Medicare Advantage Plan you may have copays or coinsurance.

One last thing. There are companies out there that will place outbound calls to Medicare beneficiaries offering to send you durable medical equipment or other items for free. A lady told us just last week this happened to her. The company offered to send her a knee brace at no cost. She didn't need the knee brace but they wanted to send it anyway. These companies will send you the item, then bill Medicare. Remember, nothing is free!! Someone is always paying.



Natural gas is made up of hydrocarbon gases, primarily methane, naturally occurring in rock formations deep below the earth's surface. The natural gas is withdrawn and transported to homes and businesses through an underground system of pipes.

Why use Natural Gas?

Natural gas is a fuel of choice because it is:

- 1. Efficient
- 2. Clean-burning (emits few pollutants)
- 3. Plentiful
- 4. Safe

Who uses Natural Gas?

- · Residential users use natural gas in their homes to fuel furnaces, pool/spa heaters, gas lights, stoves, generators and space heaters.
- Commercial users use natural gas in businesses such as restaurants, hotels,
- Industrial users use natural gas for heating processes and as a fuel for the generation of steam.
- · Electric utilities use natural gas to generate electricity.
- Natural gas pipeline companies use natural gas as a fuel to run compressor

Natural Gas Safety Precautions

Natural gas is colorless, odorless, lighter than air, and non-toxic. Breathing natural gas is not harmful as long as there is an adequate supply of fresh air to breathe along with it. Natural gas by itself will not burn, but with the proper mixture of gas and air combined with an ignition source, combustion can

An odorant that smells like rotten eggs is added to natural gas so that it can be detected. The odor is a warning that natural gas may be present and, if ignited, could result in personal injury or property damage.

If the smell of gas is present inside your home or business (no matter how faint or strong),

Do Not:

- 1. Smoke or strike a match.
- 2. Operate an electric switch or appliance control.
- 3. Pull any plugs from outlets.
- 4. Use a flashlight or lighter.
- 5. Use a telephone or cell phone in the building.

If you SMELL A FAINT ODOR of natural gas INSIDE YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, check to see if any appliances have been left on accidentally or if a pilot light has been extinguished, which would cause the odor (rotten eggs). If the odor persists, TAKE NO CHANCES, get out of the house immediately, and then call us from a nearby phone or neighbor.

If a STRONG OR PERSISTENT ODOR OF GAS is present IN YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, OR IF YOU HEAR A HISSING SOUND of escaping natural gas, follow this procedure:

- 1. Get everyone out of the building immediately.
- 2. Leave the door open.
- 3. Use a neighbor's phone or cellular phone outside the building to call us.
- 4. If you SMELL OR DETECT NATURAL GAS OUTSIDE, call us.

Leaks from natural gas pipelines are extremely rare, however it is important that you know how to recognize the signs of a leak if one were to occur in your area. A strong odor, hissing sound, or dirt blowing up from a hole are signs of a leak. Move away from and upwind of the suspected leak before calling us. Do not light matches, smoke, use a cell phone or attempt to start any motor vehicles in the area of a possible gas leak.

Call Before You Dig

Whether you are building a home, installing a sprinkler system, or just planting a tree, we want you to be safe. No matter the size of the project, before you dig, grade, or excavate, the law requires you to call for all underground utilities to be located. Please contact the One-Call Center for more information on this free service. (Alabama One Call 811) If you are digging and expose a gas pipeline, call us. Proper attention to pipe that has been exposed can prevent problems later.





Share The Road With Farm Vehicles

Driving on rural roads may leave a driver with feeling safe and relaxed but their perceptions may be unfounded. Many factors make country roads risky. One of the big problems? Drivers' inexperience sharing the road with large farm vehicles.

How to safely drive around farm vehicles

- Drive defensively, especially during planting and harvest seasons. Recognizing that you're in an agricultural environment and being alert will help you avoid dangerous situations as much as possible.
- Slow down. Farm vehicles often travel at slow speeds.

To reduce the risk of a collision, begin braking when you see the slow-moving vehicle emblem. Also stay a safe distance back around 50 feet.



· Pass carefully. Take the standard

precautions: Wait for a safe passing zone, watch for oncoming traffic, signal and return to the lane once the vehicle is in your rearview mirror. If the vehicle is extra-wide, wait to pass until the driver pulls over and signals that it's safe. Honk your horn beforehand in case the driver can't see you.

- Yield. Give a wide farm vehicle the right-of-way when it's traveling the opposite direction. Farm vehicles can't always pull over to the road's shoulder safely. If possible, pull onto the shoulder or into a turn-out to allow the farm vehicle to pass.
- Be patient. A driver may appear to be pulling to the right to let you pass when he or she is actually making a wide left-hand turn. Before speeding past, look for driveways, roads or fields where the vehicle might be entering. Also check for hand gestures or lights signaling the driver's intention to turn. Know the basics. Following the speed limit and wearing your safetybelt is just as important in the country as it is on city streets
- Take a second look. Before you pull into an intersection or make a move to pass, be sure your path is clear in all directions. Tall crops can create blind corners, and farm vehicles could enter the roadway from unmarked access drives on the fields.
- Follow the rules. In general, farm vehicle operators must follow the same rules of the road as car drivers when they are on the road. Farm vehicles will have the right of way in a situation if a car would have had the right of way.



Why Mislead on Headline?

Novelist T.S. Stribling once remarked sympathetically of one of his fictional characters, "He's as honest as the business will allow."

Stribling's insight came to mind recently when I read an article in the *Times of Israel*. The Times used the following headline in reporting the story:

"Archeologist claims to find oldest Hebrew text in Israel, including the name of God." (my italics)

The newly discovered item is a small, lead tablet or amulet from 3,200 (or more) years ago. It was found near an ancient alter site at Mount Ebal, near present-day Nablus. If authentic, it is one of the most important archeological discoveries in Israel's history. Its age alone makes it remarkable. The fact that it carries a message in a proto-alphabetic Hebrew script

makes it breathtaking. To give you a Biblical timeline, it dates to around the time of the Exodus.

However, in spite of the *Times*' assertion, the word "God" doesn't appear in the text as the name of our Heavenly Father. In fact, I doubt that the word "God" appears in the text at all!!

appears in the text at all!!

What the archeologist unearthed was the name "Yahweh" in an abbreviated spelling. Again, if the amulet is authentic, it records the name of Yahweh in use in Israel 3,200 years ago.

So why the misleading headline in the *Times* of Israel? Shouldn't the headline have read, "... including the name of Yahweh," in order to be forthright and accurate? Partly the problem lies with Biblical archeologists who are imprecise and compromising with the media and the general public

However, the *Times* undoubtedly knew what the text said. Faced with the religious establishment's ruthless constraints on the truth, the *Times* took the usual cowardly way out. It

took a remarkable historical discovery, and substituted the common word "God" for the sacred name of Yahweh that appears in the text. Such a misguided process has been going on for centuries. In Stribling's words, the Times was as honest as the business would allow. Little wonder so few people seem to understand the Bible.
