



## **BACON CHEESEBURGER TATER TOT BAKE**

# 12 servings Ingredients

- 2 pounds ground beef
- 1 large onion, chopped and divided
- 1 can (15 ounces) tomato sauce
- 1 tablespoon ground mustard
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 package (8 ounces) Velveeta
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 12 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled
- 1 package (32 ounces) frozen Tater Tots
- 1 cup grape tomatoes, chopped
- 1/3 cup sliced dill pickles

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°. In a large skillet over medium heat, cook beef and 1 cup onion, crumbling meat, until beef is no longer pink and onion is tender, 6-8 minutes; crumble meat; drain. Stir in tomato sauce, Velveeta, mustard and Worcestershire sauce until cheese is melted, 4-6 minutes.
- 2. Transfer to a greased 13x9-in. or 3-1/2-qt. baking dish. Sprinkle with cheddar cheese and bacon. Top with Tater Tots. Bake, uncovered, 35-40 minutes or until bubbly. Top with tomatoes, pickles and remaining onion.

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#### **OVEN-BAKED SHRIMP & GRITS**

# 6 servings Ingredients

- 1 carton (32 ounces) chicken broth
- 1 cup quick-cooking grits
- 1 can (10 ounces) diced tomatoes and green chiles, drained
- 1 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese, divided
- Freshly ground pepper
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 medium green pepper, chopped
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 pound uncooked shrimp (31-40 per pound), peeled and deveined
- 2 garlic cloves, minced

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a 13x9-in. or 2-1/2-qt. baking dish, combine broth and grits. Bake, uncovered, until liquid is absorbed and grits are tender, 30-35 minutes.
- 2. Stir in tomatoes, Monterey Jack cheese and 1/2 cup cheddar cheese. Bake, uncovered, until heated through, about 10 minutes. Sprinkle with pepper and remaining cheese; let stand 5 minutes.
- 3. In a large skillet, heat butter over medium-high heat; saute green pepper and onion until tender, 6-8 minutes. Add shrimp and garlic; cook and stir until shrimp turn pink, 2-3 minutes. Spoon over grits.

#### **SLOPPY JOE VEGGIE CASSEROLE**

# 8 servings Ingredients

- 2-1/2 cups uncooked penne pasta
- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 package (16 ounces) frozen mixed vegetables
- 1-1/2 cups water
- 1 can (15 ounces) tomato sauce
- 1 can (6 ounces) tomato paste
- 1 envelope sloppy joe mix
- 1 tablespoon dried parsley flakes





- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- 2 cups 2% cottage cheese
- 1-1/2 cups shredded Colby-Monterey Jack cheese, divided

#### **Directions**

- 1. Cook pasta according to package directions.
- 2. Meanwhile, cook beef and onion in a large skillet over medium heat until meat is no longer pink, breaking it into crumbles; drain. Add the vegetables, water, tomato sauce, tomato paste, sloppy joe mix, parsley and oregano. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, 7-9 minutes or until vegetables are crisptender. Drain pasta; stir into beef mixture.
- 3. Spoon half the mixture into a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. Top with cottage cheese, 3/4 cup Colby-Monterey Jack cheese and the remaining pasta mixture.
- 4. Cover and bake at 350° for 25 minutes. Uncover; sprinkle with remaining 3/4 cup Colby-Monterey Jack cheese. Bake until bubbly and cheese is melted, 5-10 minutes longer.

## **MASHED CAULIFLOWER AU GRATIN**

# 12 Servings Ingredients

- 2 large heads cauliflower, broken into florets
- 1-1/2 cups shredded Parmesan cheese
- 1 cup shredded Colby-Monterey Jack cheese
- 6 tablespoons butter, cubed
- 3/4 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1/2 teaspoon Montreal steak seasoning TOPPING:
- 1 cup Italian-style panko bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup butter, melted

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Place cauliflower in a stockpot; add water to cover. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, until very tender, 10-12 minutes. Drain; transfer to a large bowl. Mash cauliflower; stir in cheeses, cubed butter and seasonings. Transfer to a greased 3-qt. or 13x9-in. baking dish.
- 2. In a small bowl, mix bread crumbs with melted butter until evenly coated; sprinkle over cauliflower mixture. Bake, uncovered, until heated through and topping is golden brown, 40-50 minutes.



# WHITE CHEDDAR SCALLOPED POTATOES

# 10 Servings Ingredients

1/4 cup butter

- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon dried parsley flakes
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 3 cups 2% milk
- 1 can (10-3/4 ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
- 1 cup sour cream
- 8 cups thinly sliced peeled potatoes
- 3-1/2 cups cubed fully cooked ham
- 2 cups shredded sharp white cheddar cheese

### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°. In a large saucepan, heat butter over medium-high heat. Add onion; cook and stir until tender. Stir in flour and seasonings until blended; gradually whisk in milk. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly; cook and stir 2 minutes or until thickened. Stir in soup. Remove from heat; stir in sour cream.
- 2. In a greased 13x9-in. baking dish, layer half of each of the following: potatoes, ham, cheese and sauce. Repeat layers.
- 3. Bake, covered, 30 minutes. Bake, uncovered, 40-50 minutes longer or until potatoes are tender.




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# Pocket Taser

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



Recently I have been reading through "Lessons from the Upper Room", by Sinclair Ferguson with a friend. It is a book about the days Jesus spent with his disciples in the upper room before his crucifixion. The author spends

As we read the 13th chapter of John's gospel we are allowed to see inside the upper room. At this point Judas has already agree to betray Jesus but he still shows up to their meeting. John also let's us know that Jesus is aware of Judas' plan. What follows next would be unheard of in today's society and honestly probably was in Jesus' society too. We see Jesus still washes Judas' feet. Think about that for a moment, the betrayed still chose to wash the betrayers feet. Luke 19:9-10 records Jesus conversation with Zacchaeus, "And Jesus said to him, ... Today salvation has come to this house. since he also is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." So here we are in the Upper Room and Jesus is still seeking, he is still pursuing one who has been with him for roughly three years. An individual that has spent quality time with the Savior. In the moment Jesus could have dismissed Judas from the group but instead He chose to serve him. #### **STATEWIDE AMENDMENT 1**

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, authorizing the issuance and sale of general obligation bonds of the State of Alabama of up to \$85,000,000 for the purposes of the improvement, renovation, equipping, acquistion, provision, construction, and maintenance of Alabama state parks under the jurisdiction of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, and public historical sites and public historical parks under the jurisdiction of the Alabama Historical Commission. (Proposed by ACT 2021-326)

O NO

This amendment will authorize the State of Alabama to borrow money to improve, renovate, equip, acquire, provide, construct and maintain state parks, public historical sites and state historical parks.

#### Of this amount:

- 1. \$80 Million shall be used to improve, renovate, equip, acquire, provide, construct and maintain state parks under the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.
- 2. \$5 Million shall be used to improve, renovate, equip, acquire, provide, construct and maintain public historical sites and public historical parks under the Alabama Historical Commission. The Alabama Historical Commission cannot use any part of the borrowed money at the Confederate Memorial Park in Marbury, Alabama.

Any additional funds will be given to the Alabama Forestry Commission for it to improve, renovate, acquire, provide, construct, equipand maintain state forests.

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
