Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Prevention

Every year, hundreds of people die and thousands are injured from unsuspected exposure to an odorless, colorless gas-carbon monoxide (CO). Studies by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicate that, while people recognize CO gas is poisonous, they perceive CO as less dangerous than other household hazards. CO poisoning is most prevalent when furnaces are turned back on to fight cold winter temperatures, but also commonly occur after summer and winter storms and accompanying power outages, when people tend to rely on portable generators for electricity.

Here are some simple steps to protect yourselves and your family:

- ✓ Install battery-operated CO detectors near every sleeping area in your home.
- Check CO detectors regularly to be sure they are functioning properly.
- ✓ Have gas or oil furnaces inspected by a qualified professional every year.
- ✓ Never use a generator inside the home or garage, even if doors and windows are open.
- Only use generators and power washers outside, more than 20 feet away from the home, doors, and windows.
- ✓ Never use a charcoal grill inside the home.







SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out",

This week's article is entitled "The Preservation of American Government". I thought it timely to provide an article in a positive manner of the contingency plans which are currently in place to preserve the government of our country in the event of a nuclear war. There are four locations which would become command centers in the event of a nuclear disaster.

The Presidential Emergency Operations Center is a bunker under the White House in Washington, D. C; The Mount Weather Emergency Operations Center is in Bluemont, Virginia; The Raven Rock Mountain Complex is a military installation near Blue Ridge Summit, Pennsylvania. It is called the "Underground Pentagon" where the top military leaders would be evacuated; The Cheyenne Mountain Complex is located near Colorado Springs, Colorado, and is the home of NORAD.

A Boeing E4 Advanced Command Post, also called "Air Force One When It Matters", would be used along with Air Force One to maintain a command center in the sky. It could be refueled in the air by tankers and remain airborne as long as supplies of food and water remain.

The Declaration of Independence, United States Constitution and Bill of Rights would be evacuated from Washington, D. C., to the Mount Weather Emergency Operations Center. Irreplaceable artifacts and paintings would be evacuated from Washington, D. C.

The DEFCON System has five levels of status: 1 – 2 – 3 – 4 – 5. Our country is usually at Level 5 which is called "FADEOUT" and is our lowest state of readiness. DEFCON 4 is called "DOUBLE TAKE" and is an increased intelligence watch with strengthened security measures. DEFCON 3 is called "ROUND HOUSE" and is increased readiness above that required for normal readiness and the United States Air Forces would be placed on alert to be ready to mobilize within fifteen minutes. DEFCON 2 is called "FAST PACE" in which the United States Air Forces are ready to deploy and engage in less than six hours. DEFCON 1 is called "COCKED PISTOL" and is maximum readiness with immediate response and is the status in which nuclear war is imminent or has already begun.

Let us pray that we never approach this status. COG-CON are readiness levels, roughly analogous to the DEFCON alert state system, tracking the readiness of the government in the event of an emergency. Continuity of Government, COG by definition, is the provision of the full range of governmental services of the three branches of government: judicial, legislative, and executive at all levels: federal, state, and local. COGCON 4 is normal peacetime operations. COGCON 3 is a state of heightened readiness with some government officials required to notify a Watch Office as to their location. During the United States "State of the Union" address, the COGCON is raised to this level and a cabinet member is the "Designated Survivor". COGCON 2 calls for a deployment to a relocation facility with four hours-notice. COGCON 1 calls for the United States government to be relocated to secure, fully staffed bunkers such as the Mount Weather Emergency Operations Center.

Lord willing, I will submit an article again next week and I look forward to any and all your comments.

PROJECT LOCATION

NY-408 / 63 at the I-390 Interchange (Exit 7) in the Town of Groveland, Livingston County. (see attached location map)

PROJECT NEED

The existing concrete pavement on NY-408 / 63 and the I-390 SB on / off ramps has failed due to heavy truck loads. In addition, a deteriorated drainage culvert under NY-63, just north of NY-408 needs to be replaced to maintain the integrity of the highway.

PROJECT OBJECTIVE

Restore the pavement using cost effective pavement treatments with a service life of 50 years. Replace the existing culvert and provide a service life of 70 years.

PROPOSED WORK

- Replace the existing concrete pavement with new 10" thick concrete pavement in the same location
- Resurface the existing asphalt pavement at the NY-408 / 63 intersection
- Replace the existing box culvert on NY-63 located approximately 400 feet north of the NY-408 / 63 intersection with a new concrete box culvert

ESTIMATED COST

Approximately \$4.6 million

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE AND TRAFFIC IMPACTS




