

20 Days Left for Absentee

MONTGOMERY -The absentee voting period for the May 24 Primary Election began on March 30.

As of April 27, there are 20 days left to apply for an absentee ballot by mail. Voters will have an additional two days to apply for an absentee ballot by hand.

Absentee ballot applications can be downloaded online or requested by visiting or calling the local Absentee Election Manager's office. Voters may also contact the Secretary of State's Elections Division at 334-242-7210 to request an absentee ballot application.

İmportant absentee voting deadlines for the 2022 primary are listed below:

May 17: The last day that absentee ballot applications can be returned by mail. May 19: The last day

that absentee ballot applications can be returned by hand.

May 23: The last day to return absentee ballots by hand to the Absentee Election Manager.

May 24: Absentee ballots must be returned by mail to the Absentee Election Manager no later than noon. Voters who are eligible

to vote pursuant to the Uniformed and Overseas Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) will have until May 24 to postmark an absentee ballot.







How to Find Educational Trips for Retirees Who Love to Learn

Dear Savvy Senior,

My wife and I planning to travel much more frequently in retirement and are very interested in educational trips and adventures. Can you recommend any groups or firms that specialize in this type of travel geared towards retirees? Love to Learn

Dear Love.

Educational travel, which combines travel with in-depth learning opportunities has become a very popular way of travel among retirees. Here are a few good places to turn to find these types of trips in the U.S. and abroad. **Tour Organizations**

One of the best places to start is with Road Scholar (RoadScholar.org), which invented the idea of educational travel for older adults in the mid 1970s. The Boston-based organization offers 5,500 learning adventures in all 50 states and 150 countries.

You can search for learning adventures by location, interest, activity level and price. Road Scholar also offers "Choose Your Pace" senior travel tours that allow participants to adjust their level of challenge on a daily basis. And for skip-gen vacations, they offer tours designed specifically for grandparents traveling with their grandkids.

Another excellent option is Smithsonian Journeys (SmithsonianJourneys.org), a nonprofit travel group affiliated with the Smithsonian Museum. They lead 350 educational trips a year on every continent that are led by experts from a variety of fields - academia, the diplomatic corps, scientists and curators, among others.

If you're seeking more adventure, you may want to consider ElderTreks (www.ElderTreks.com), which offers 50-plus travelers small-group adventures by both land and sea in more than 100 countries. Their trips center on adventure, culture and nature, letting you get up close and personal with the locals.

Academic Travel

Another good source for educational trips is colleges and universities. Some of my favorites include Cornell University's Adult University (//SCE.Cornell.edu/travel), which offers a half-dozen educational trips and courses in the U.S. and abroad, each lasting a few days to a week or more. And Stanford Travel/Study (Alumni.Stanford.edu) that offers educational travel journeys to more than 80 countries each year.

Most college/university trips are led by faculty who share their expertise, along with regional experts and local guides, and you don't need to be an alumnus to participate.

Also check out the Traveling Professor (Traveling Professor. com), a small-group touring company led by Steve Solosky, formerly a professor at the State University of New York. They offer a dozen or so tours abroad each year and take between 8 and 16 people.

Cruising Options

If you enjoy cruising, consider Grand Circle Travel (GCT.com), which offers educational travel aboard small ships, and Naturalist Journeys (NaturalistJourneys.com), which specializes in nature and birding tours.

American Cruise Lines (AmericanCruiseLines.com) also offers more than 35 river and coastal itineraries in the Northeast, Southeast, Pacific Northwest and along the Mississippi River. And it has themed cruises (Lewis and Clark, Mark Twain, Civil War, etc.) for people with specific historical, literary or other interests.

And Viking River Cruises (VikingRiverCruises.com), which is geared to older travelers, focuses on European art, history and culture. Each cruise makes one to two port stops a day as the ship winds its way up or down Europe's most famous rivers like the Rhine, Seine, Danube and Douro. A free sightseeing tour is included at all stops, and special-interest excursions are available for additional fees. Viking offers tours in the United States too.



for 30 years, retiring as a Colonel and having held the role of the Army's chief economist.

Prominent America First figures are backing him. He's endorsed by the House Freedom Fund, General Michael Flynn, and Congressman Jim Jordan.

Casey Wardynski is a proven leader, a Trumpappointed fighter, and the only true conservative choice to represent north Alabama in Congress. Here's what he had to say at a recent forum:

I'm Casey Wardynski. I'm running for Congress. I'd like to say the people in Washington are friendly and decent folks. When we think of them, we think they're people with bad ideas. When they think of us, they think we're bad people. They call us deplorables, they call us dregs. President Trump listened to that under the last administration

We took graduation rates from 66 to 88 percent, we hired the best teachers and we put them where the toughest work was, we built the number one cyber security program in the United States - the only school system recognized as a cyber center of excellence in our country, formed a partnership with the United States Army Cyber Command, to build a workforce here that could become a bedrock for

growth and what would become a Cyber Academy in Huntsville to support the Southeast and our state.

After that work, I went on to lead a small high-tech event technology company that supported the NFL, MLB, Army, Navy, and a bunch of other outfits. It hadn't grown much, but after two years as CEO we grew the revenues, we grew the earnings, and sold that thing for three times revenue.

while in that role, President Trump's team called from the White House and asked me to join them in Washington. They knew what I had done in the Army and they wanted somebody tough to take over the manpower program in the Department of the Army. After 17 months of background checks, confirmation hearings, in January of 2019 I entered the Pentagon and joined President Trump's team. It was tough work. We got the people to build the wall, that was the tough part which they thought would take two years. If you've ever dealt with the government getting a job established, you'd know that. We created hiring priorities, got the workforce in place, and built the wall. We took on Critical Race Theory at West Point...got it out of there. I went up to talk to the Dean. She explained they had academic freedom and a year later we had a new Dean that I picked.

Tough work can be done in Washington. President Trump trusted me to help him. I'm asking you to trust me to go represent your interests in Congress. Thank you.

are largely blessed with knowledgeable and rational teachers. It is coming, though.

There are much more subtle ways that progressives can go after our youth without our permission or approval.

Many of the teachers don't even realize objectives of a process called Social Emotional Learning (SEL) which has been adopted to at least a degree in all 50 states for pre-K and in 18 states so far for K-12. SEL starts early and involves the actions and trends of your child through social media and data mining. It's just like how

advertisers online and on social media follow you, know your interests, where you are, where you have visited. However, social engineers have a much more sinister plan than advertisers trying to put you in a new pair of shoes.

The objective is to direct or redirect children through data mining. Depending on their likes,

Clarification of Letter

Editor's Note: A letter in last week's issue regarding House Bill 496 (Where's Our 25% Raise?) had some inaccurate information.

Although the bill appeared to read that way, it WOULD NOT have provided a raise for Lauderdale County Commission Chair, Danny Pettus. It only corrects an error made by county commissioners across the state decades ago that was associated with The Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1990. That bill incorrectly granted some county department heads a salary increase every time county employees received a raise. Three decades later the State Board of Examiners started noticing the errors.

The proposed bill actually would have avoided the relinquishing of previous salary and setting the new rate beginning next term. The bill did not receive 100% local support, so it failed.

Pettus now has an additional \$476 deducted every pay period from this point forward. So, the ordeal amounts to a pay *cut, not a pay increase.*





Fast forward to the present day and The Man is putting it right back to me. I'm a victim of "stream creep." It started with streaming YouTube TV. I've

> So I'm going to fight back. I'll probably cancel Netflix and I'm not alone. Their stock tanked on the news of the price increase. Netflix lost 200,000 subscribers this year when it had expected to gain over 2 million. Oops! But what to do about all the others? The number of online streaming sources is exploding. What to do as our choices become even more confusing and expensive?

One method of fighting back involves taking advantage of

free trials or subscribing to a service then immediately canceling. Most services don't pro-rate a payment so subscribing then immediately cancelling will give you a whole month of access to binge a series, then you can move on to some other service. If you find yourself re-subscribing to the same service over and over, then maybe you should keep that one. Personally, I watch Hulu maybe once every couple of months. Why am I still paying for that? Cycling through free trials and subscribing in one-month increments can be cumbersome as some services don't make it super easy to cancel. One thing that makes this a little easier is the "Channels" marketplace from Amazon Prime. This service allows you to subscribe or cancel with a single click (or three) on the remote. You'll

simply need to remember to cancel the services as you cycle through them.

There is another inexpensive DIY solution that I think will become more prevalent as consumers become more overwhelmed. We will talk about that in my next exciting installment. Until then, remember that sunsets off the back porch are still free--until The Man figures out a way to charge for that, too.





HOW TO AVOID COMMON BANK FEES

I went to Regions Bank downtown Florence to cash a check for reimbursement of expenses and I was charged \$12.50 because I am not a Regions Bank customer. I thought that was unreasonable and still do. We have to write our clients checks for gas and other necessities that they need to get to doctor's appointments or buy medication, and if our bank charged our clients \$12.50 per check, we'd use a different bank.

There are ways to avoid common bank fees. To be fair, a lot of banks and credit unions do charge to cash non-customer checks, but some don't. Our bank doesn't as long as the check is drawn on that bank. CitiBank

does not charge to cash their customers' checks. Most banks charge a monthly service fee. You can avoid that by keeping a balance over the amount required to avoid those fees or you can choose a bank or credit union that simply doesn't charge monthly fees. By banking with a company that doesn't charge monthly fees, you don't have to worry about whether or not you're meeting the requirements each month.

Avoid overdraft fees by choosing a bank or credit union that doesn't charge overdraft protection fees. There are plenty of institutions with free overdraft protection services.

Forbes Advisor recommends SoFi Bank and they have no monthly maintenance fee and few other fees, competitive interest rates, early direct deposit, no-fee overdraft protection, and automatic savings features. On the negative side, they don't have physical locations. I will say that we have wonderful banking relationships with First Metro Bank, Bank Independent, and Progress Bank that are beneficial to us and our clients. I do not think online banking would work for a business such as ours. A good banker can be really helpful.

If you do decide to change institutions, do it properly. First, find a new bank or credit union. Review and transfer automatic payments and recurring transactions. Transfer the money from your old bank to your new bank. Close the account and request a written letter that states that your accounts are closed just in case you have to settle any discrepancies in the future. If you didn't already move your money, you will receive the balances in your accounts in the form of a check. By the way, if you're receiving a paper copy of your monthly statement in the mail, you're probably being charged for that too.

Take a minute and review the charges you incur with your bank and make good financial decisions.





attractions, opinions, and educational successes, be will data taken, analyzed and re-channeled to individuals as needed they eventually understand society, life, and obligations as they are supposed to.

Data is about equity, equity is about socialism, and socialism is about controlling what your children see, how they think, and how they react. It's a small but vital part of a larger plan of control.

Creators "envision a world where data will be used to drive systematic change, economic mobility, and student success. If student success and upward mobility were the primary goals, student success would be listed first. But it is not.

SEL uses data-mining to manage affairs to produce equitable outcomes. They are not looking for leaders, stars, achievers, and those who ask why. They are looking to create a lot of followers, conformers, and

It's just not fair to those who cannot achieve.







In part, this is because we bring good people to the task of leadership. None of this is to say that our future on the global stage is assured. Politicians who embrace the extremes, battles over school curriculum, a less welcoming approach immigration—all are troublesome. 



Medicare Minute Medicare vs Medicaid

It seems like potential cuts to Medicaid are all over the news lately. People who confuse Medicare and Medicaid are obviously concerned. This is easy to do because they both can be related to a person's health insurance. Although they coordinate in many ways, they are two distinctive programs.

Medicare is a federal health insurance program. There are three ways to qualify for Medicare. The first way is to be 65 years of age or older. The second way is to have been on Social Security disability for at least 24 months. The third way to qualify for Medicare is be any age and have either end-stage renal disease or ALS. Medicare is not income based as far as qualifying. As long as you meet one of the three requirements above you will qualify for Medicare. Your income, however, can affect the amount you pay for your Part B premium.

Medicaid is a state health insurance program. Medicaid is income and resource based, meaning you will qualify or not according to how much money you make and/or how much money you have saved. In 2022 if you made less than \$1,153 as an individual or \$1,546 as a couple you could qualify for Medicaid. Whereas Medicare has deductibles and coinsurance, Medicaid will take care of most of your healthcare cost. A person on Medicaid can also get a break on how much they pay on their prescription drugs.

Medicare and Medicaid will coordinate in a couple of ways. In some counties in north Alabama there is a Medicare plan that will coordinate with Medicaid. To qualify for this plan you must be on Medicare and Medicaid. This is referred to as "dual eligible". Also, if you make more than the Medicaid limits but are under \$1,698 as an individual or \$2,288 as a couple you may qualify for "extra help". This would help you on your prescription drug cost.
