This is our fifth consecutive year without a tax levy increase and this budget features a 1.01% tax levy cut.

Our enrollment has increased over the years and this has led to additional revenues, allowing us to expand our programs while also cutting the tax levy. This year's budget includes an additional teacher at the JRSR High, one at the elementary level and one within our special area department. Last year we added staff in our counseling and intervention departments.

Our extracurricular offerings continue to expand and next year there will be over thirty of these opportunities for our students. We are proud of our fledgling Odyssey of the Mind program that had six teams participate in the regional competition. Six of those teams advanced to the NYS Tournament in Syracuse and one team will be going to the "World Competition" in Ames, Iowa.

We have much to be proud of as our District has been recognized throughout the region and at the national level. As we move forward, we are committed to preserving the successes we have achieved, and to maintaining our upward momentum.

Questions and Answers

Q: What will the residents be voting on?

Proposition 1 – authorization of the budget

Proposition 2 – the Public Library Proposition

Q: What is the overall budget for 2022-2023 proposed in Proposition 1?

Proposition 1 asks residents to approve the district's budget of \$17,136,247. This is a budget increase of \$685,675 or 4.17% compared to the 2021-2022 budget while allowing for a tax levy DECREASE of -1.01% due to an increase in revenue.

Q: How does this budget compare to prior budgets?

The proposed 2022-2023 budget once again continues the trend of the last four years of NOT increasing taxes. The district is experiencing significant increases in Foundation Aid and increases in BOCES Aid due to strategic usage of services.

The 2022-2023 budget proposes staffing additions due to enrollment increases and scheduling needs. The district will be adding a 1.0 FTE Social Studies Teacher, a 1.0 FTE Phys Ed Teacher, and a 1.0 FTE Elementary School Teacher. Also, the district has added some Teacher Aides to support classroom instruction in both regular and special education.

Q: What is this year's tax cap?

The tax cap legislation that passed several years ago limits the local levy increase by a local tax growth factor and the lower of CPI or 2%. The proposed levy of \$4,109,011 (-1.01% decrease) for the 2022-2023 school year is under the cap by \$141,186.

Q: How are taxes decreasing if the budget is increasing?

Mount Morris CSD has been well positioned for several years to receive increases in State Aid due to historical underfunding of the Foundation Aid formula. Under the State Executive Budget's phase-in initiative to fully fund Foundation Aid over three years, the district is projected to get an increase of \$959,544 in 22-23. Also, as the phase-in initiative continues, the district is projected to continue to receive greater than average increases in Foundation Aid beyond this one budget cycle. Furthermore, through strategic use of BOCES services to provide student support and address technology needs, the district is getting an increase of over \$100,000 in BOCES Aid. Therefore, with the current and projected increases in aid, the district is able to shift its revenue reliance more towards State sources and lower the local share by decreasing the tax levy.

Q: How does a decrease in the tax levy affect my own property taxes?

The tax levy decrease means that the district will collect less in taxes during the 2022-2023 school year than the current year. There are several factors that affect the distribution of the tax levy per municipality and per property. For example, changes in total assessments, exemptions, or equalization rates by municipality.

(continued)

...The Board of Education will determine the tax rates using these factors once the assessment rolls are finalized by July 1st. However, it would be anticipated that most tax bills will go down.

Q: Are we still doing a Capital Outlay Project?

Yes. The Capital Outlay Program is an expense driven aid program that allows the district to make necessary facility improvements one year and receive the full state aid on the work the following year. In other words, once you are into the cycle of completing an annual Capital Outlay Project, the aid from the prior year project significantly covers the cost of the project in the current year. The 2022-2023 general fund budget includes \$100,000 as a transfer to the capital fund for a project to continue to address some or all of the following: building security enhancements, communication system enhancements, replacement of control systems in various areas throughout the building, HVAC and mechanical improvements, and potential upgrades to athletic facilities' electronic displays. The project and work will be completed upon submission of the scope to the State Education Department (SED) and receipt of the commissioner's approval. However, the project is almost 98% funded by aid generated from the 2021-2022 year. The net result is a cost to the community of about \$2.00 for every \$100 worth of work.

Q: When is the annual budget hearing & vote?

The hearing is the presentation of the budget and will be held on Wednesday, May 4, 2022, at 6 p.m. in the school auditorium. The vote is Tuesday, May 17, 2022, from 12:00 pm (noon) to 9 pm in the high school gym lobby.

Q: What happens if the budget is defeated?

The Board of Education can choose to:

- Put the same budget up for a second vote;
- Propose a different budget;
- Adopt a contingent budget without holding another vote.

If the Board of Education selects either of the first two options and the second budget vote fails, the Board of Education must adopt a contingent budget.

Q: What is a contingent (austerity) budget?

A contingent budget includes only expenses necessary to provide the minimum services legally required to operate and maintain school buildings and educational programs, preserve the property of the school district and ensure the health and safety of the students and staff. A contingent budget requires that there be no increase in the tax levy over the previous year.

Q: Why is there a separate proposition for the public library?

New York State Education Law requires a separate proposition for the public library. The school district is obligated by law to levy taxes for voter approved library funding on the school tax bill. The school district collects the money and turns it over to the library. Our library, located on Main Street, is seeking approval of a library tax levy of \$115,000.

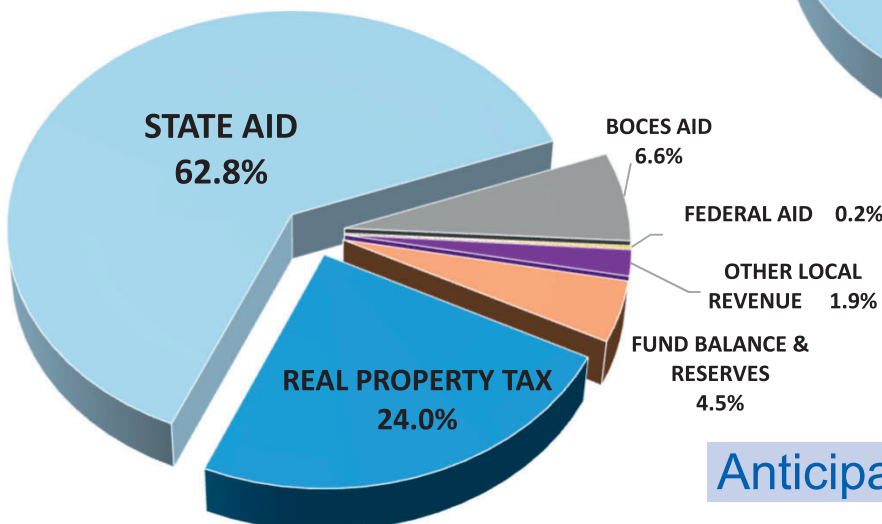

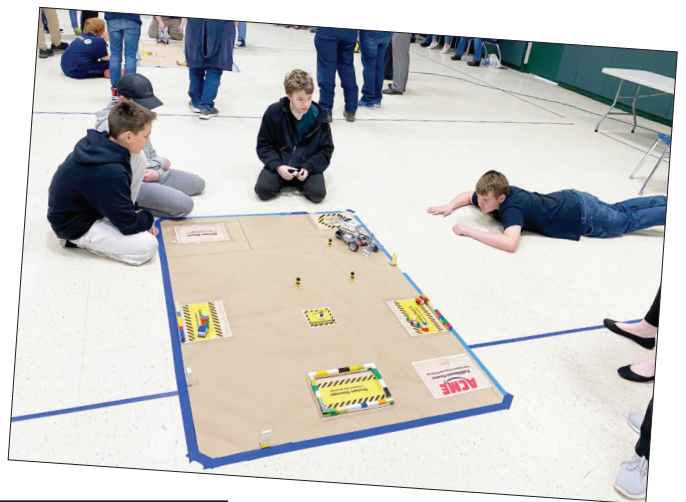


GVBOCES Lego Robotics Regional Challenge
