the Forks of Cypress. One of the first construction projects, after the home was completed, was a standard horse racing track.

At the time, English horses were superior so Jackson imported several horses from England to improve American The most race horses. famous of these horses was Glencoe, a chestnut stallion that, according to encyclopediaofalabama. Jackson purchased from King George IV and imported in 1836. Glencoe quickly established name for himself on both the race track and as a great sire. Horse owners from all over the country brought their mares to Florence to be mated with Glencoe. He sired 481 foals and was so successful that by the mid 20th century virtually no thoroughbred in the world could be found who did not descend from Glencoe

of the Forks of Cypress.

Jackson died in 1840 and in 1843 Glencoe and some of the other wellknown horses at Forks of Cypress were moved to a farm in Nashville, TN. In 1848, prior to the start of the Civil War, they were moved to Kentucky. This took a toll on the horseracing industry in north Alabama and it never recovered.

So, as you watch this ear's "Run for the year's Řoses", just remember that our area played a very important role in the development of the thoroughbred horse in America and all over the world.







TEACH THEM, DON'T ENABLE THEM



environmental resource for all. I also want to focus on the work people are doing along the river to make that happen."

Iohnson and MSNHA are working with the Tennessee RiverLine, an initiative led by the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, and Tennessee Valley Authority, well as community partners the across region to develop a continuous system of paddling, hiking, and experiences biking along the Tennessee River from its origin in Knoxville, Tennessee, to its confluence with the Ohio River in Paducah, Kentucky. The initiative seeks to catalyze economic development, promote public health, improve equitable access to river spaces and experiences, and inspire resource stewardship.

The Shoals was one of the Tennessee RiverLine's 2019 pilot communities, and a member of the RiverTowns Tennessee Program's inaugural cohort in 2021.

"As a proponent of the Tennessee RiverLine, I'm excited to start this 37-day journey, during which I will be

privileged to experience the riverscape's natural beauty. And, perhaps even more importantly, I'm excited to meet people of Tennessee River communities who share the same passion for the river as me and interact with other Tennessee RiverTowns and paddlers along the way."

Medicare Minute

"Medicare Dental and Vision"

One of the most common questions we are asked is "Does Medicare cover dental and vision?" We are asked this question so often because of a couple of reasons. Typically, while we are on employer coverage, we have the option to take out dental and vision plans as supplemental insurance. Of course, we want to know if these options are available under Medicare. Another reason we are asked this question is because of all the television ads about Medicare. Joe Namath is telling us we are missing dental and vision benefits and we want to know why. So, this week we are going to dive into how Medicare treats dental and vision care.

Original Medicare does not cover routine dental or vision care. Therefore, if you have Original Medicare only, or Original Medicare and a Medicare supplement, you will not be covered for routine dental or vision care. Routine dental would include exams, cleanings, x-rays, fillings, caps, etc. Some oral surgeries may be covered. Routine vision would include exams, x-rays, glasses, and contacts. Cataract surgery, however, should be covered under Original Medicare.

If you are enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan, there is a good chance you have dental and vision coverage as part of your plan. A typical Medicare Advantage plan will have a maximum benefit ranging from \$1,000 to \$2,500 per year. Usually there is no copay for exams and cleanings. Most plans will include coverage for fillings and extractions. The one thing not covered by Medicare Advantage plans are implants.

Regardless of whether you are on Original Medicare, or you have Medicare Advantage, if you want additional dental or vision coverage you would need to enroll in a stand-alone plan. Most major insurance companies offer these.



LYFT, UBER AND OTHER RIDE SHARE APPS

If a person is hurt by an Uber driver or a Lyft driver remember that there are things to do to increase your recovery.

There are two ways where a person can be injured by an Uber driver. First, another motorist on the road can get hit by a person who is driving for Uber at the time of the accident. The other way a person can be hurt by a ride share driver is as a passenger. If a ride share driver causes an accident, the passenger has the right to sue the driver and Uber or Lyft. In those cases, there's plenty of coverage and there's lots of

information to obtain.

There are three different periods of coverage for Uber and Lyft drivers. The first is when they are waiting for a match and in those cases their coverage is supposedly limited, however there probably are layers of coverage and both companies have assets, so I wouldn't take someone's word for a limitation of coverage. The second period is when a ride share driver has accepted a match and is on the way to pick up a passenger and the third period is when the passenger is actually in the car.

We know that there is a \$1,000,000 in coverage in periods two and three.

Remember that Uber and Lyft will video tape inside the car and quite often outside of the car. There is GPS data available. You can always request warnings, complaints and citations about the driver to show that the ride share should have known that this driver was not an appropriate hire. There are ratings and comments that are publicly available about the driver. Your ride share companies typically require arbitration agreement to be in the contract that you agree to in order to use the service. Different states enforce that arbitration provision differently.

If a person is in a ride share that is hit by another driver who is at fault, the at fault driver is the primary coverage.
