# Memorial for Hamner

THE SHOALS – The Shoals Area Chamber Foundation recently announced the establishment of the **Stacey Hamner** Memorial Fund which benefits Women in Business by providing scholarships for students and micro-grants for female entrepreneurs.

Stacev Hamner, founder and owner of Reclaimed Spirit in downtown Florence, was a beloved artist. entrepreneur, and friend in the Shoals. Hamner unexpectedly passed away on December 15, 2021. Though there will always



schools. Burrell Normal was Founded in 1903 by the American Missionary Association of New York. It was built on Cherokee Street at the current location of Burrell-Slater Schools on purchased by Black and White citizens together. 





Editor:

I recently completed the online training course to become a poll worker for my precinct in Mobile County, AL, but then had to withdraw my application. I cannot participate in a process that is devised to be susceptible to vote tampering. Our elections are vulnerable, if not already compromised.

We have all become comfortable

using machines and computers. We trust them for all kinds of conveniences in our lives. Of course, we are really placing our trust in the manufacturers of the machines. Machines don't make mistakes and they don't have intent. But in the voting process, the means by which we protect our God-given rights, we should only be required to place our trust in persons from our own community, people that live in our voting precinct. The manufacturers of the machines we use to count our votes don't live in our precinct.

Whether or not anything nefarious is

happening in our elections, we should not be required to trust machines that are too complex for anyone who votes to understand how they work. They are just black boxes into which our votes disappear. What happens to our votes once they enter the machine, only the manufacturer knows. And we don't know the manufacturer.

We are literally handing our votes to a nameless stranger to count them. Machine counts might be a convenient way to verify hand counts after they are completed, but they should never be our primary method to count votes.

# **WHOSE FAULT IS AN ON-THE-JOB INJURY?**

I love our clients. I love what I do and sometimes, when I see the same question asked over and over, I try to answer that question

One common question is, "Do I get more money because I can prove my injury was the fault of my employer?"

The short answer is no. Now, Joel and I are two men with their

minds on money, so we always look for ways to get more money for our clients.

In those circumstances where we can find a non-employee or third-party at fault as in a traffic accident, or a defective product, such as a saw or forklift, we can get more money for an injury. The worker's comp statute by its very purpose limits what an employee can recover. It has no effect on nonemployee injuries or injuries caused by third parties.

However, worker's comp for an on-the-job injury is defined by our Legislature and what an injured worker receives does not depend at all on whose fault it was.


Worker's comp does not pay for loss of enjoyment of life. Think of playing with kids or sports or a good night's sleep - things we enjoy. Worker's comp pays no matter who's at fault, but it does not pay for enjoyment of life (hedonistic) damages.

If a driver runs a stop sign, they are responsible for medical bills, lost wages, pain and suffering and loss of enjoyment of life.

The law provides for those damages (and more) in fault-based cases. The law does not allow for those damages for injuries that occur on the job.

# **Medicare Minute**

# "Medicare Fraud"

As of October 2021, there were 64 million people enrolled in Medicare. A large majority of agents who assist Medicare beneficiaries are upstanding, ethical people. But Medicare is no different than any other industry. Where there is opportunity, there will be scam artists.

So, how are Medicare beneficiaries taken advantage of? Most scams happen over the phone. People who reach out to you by phone are known as telemarketers. Telemarketers are trained to get as much information out of you as they can, including your personal and Medicare information. They are also trained to talk fast and never take "no" for an answer. They may be offering walkers, wheelchairs, back braces, or Medicare Advantage Plans.

Here are some tips to help you avoid being scammed. First is never, never, NEVER give your Medicare or Social Security number out over the phone. If someone calls representing your insurance company, and they ask for your Medicare number, do not give it to them. If they are truly your insurance company, they will already have it.

The second thing to avoid is allowing anyone, except your doctor or other provider, to review your medical records or services. Third, never join a Medicare Advantage plan or Prescription Drug plan over the phone without checking with Medicare first. The commercials you see on television are designed to entice you to call an 800 number. Once you make that call the odds are you will be enrolled in a Medicare plan whether you wanted it or not.

The most important thing to remember is  $\bf Medicare~will$ never call you unless you have called Medicare and left a message. Also, Medicare will never visit you at your home. If you suspect someone has contacted you without your consent call 1-800-Medicare.





# **Annual Drinking Water Quality Report GREENHILL WATER & FIRE PROTECTION AUTHORITY** January - December 2021

We're pleased to present to you this year's Annual Quality Water Report. This report is designed to inform you about the quality water and services we deliver to you every day. Our constant goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources. We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Greenhill's water sources are two groundwater wells which draw from the Tuscumbia/Fort Payne Aquifer and purchased water from Florence Water & Sewer Department (50%). Florence water is supplied by surface water from the Tennessee River and the Cypress Creek. In addition, Florence Water Department pumps ground water from two wells in the Killen and Center Star areas in Lauderdale County, which is blended with the treated surface water sources. In the water provided to our customers (from Greenhill), Chlorine is added for disinfection purposes, Caustic Soda is added to raise pH levels of the water that will prevent it from being corrosive and Aqua Gold to produce a desirable water quality by raising the pH level to reduce corrosion and acidic conditions. In the water provided to our customers (from Florence), Chlorine is added for disinfection purposes, Fluoride for the prevention of tooth decay, lime to produce a desirable water quality by raising the pH level to reduce corrosion and acidic conditions, **Potassium Permanganate** to oxidize iron, and aid in taste and odor control, **Poly Aluminum Chloride** for turbidity removal and **Alum** for coagulation. Also Florence has added a new treatment process called the MIEX system as a simple solution for meeting U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) disinfection by-product (DBP) removal by employing a continuous ion exchange process. The Process removes dissolved organic carbon (DOC) allowing for improved drinking water quality and regulatory compliance. Greenhill Water & FPA and Florence Water & Sewer Department have implemented a Source Water Protection Plans. These plans provide more information such as potential sources of contaminations, which may affect our water source.

Ingestion of Cryptosporidium may cause cryptosporidiosis, an abdominal infection. Symptoms of infection include nausea, diarrhea and abdominal cramps.

Most healthy individuals can overcome the disease within a few weeks. However, immune-compromised individuals, infants and small children, and the elderly are at greater risk of developing life-threatening illness. We encourage immune-compromised individuals to consult their doctor regarding appropriate precautions to take to avoid infection. Cryptosporidium must be ingested to cause disease, and it may be spread through means other than drinking water. We currently monitor for Cryptosporidium and have had none detected

**INSTALLMENT**, we discussed the bewildering choices of video streaming services, price gouging from Netflix, and a few ways of lowering your monthly payout and blood pressure. I mentioned that there is an

alternative to all this that I believe is going to become more popular as time goes on. That

alternative is Plex. Plex is a "do it yourself" streaming Jim Fisher service that you can install on your home computer. Essentially, Plex is the entertainment "server" in the same way that Netflix or Amazon Prime serves videos. Plex comes in 2 parts: the media



# by "The Computer Skeptic" server software that is installed on your home computer, and a separate Plex app that you

install on your phone, tablet,

and smart TV. Plex has been around for decades. It was a great "open source" method of organizing and streaming your local collection of home videos that were typically "ripped" from DVDs or downloaded from the internet--kind of a Netflix before Netflix was cool. Now it has morphed into a full-blown personal streaming service.

Plex requires a dedicated computer in your home that is always powered on. That

computer could be in the form of a desktop, an old laptop, or a "network-attached storage" (NAS) device which is essentially a big hard drive running Plex. Once you install the software, it will find your local movie collection, if you have one. Then you will open the app on your phone or TV where you will be presented with a familiar grid-view of all your movies along with lots of free live TV channels, and even a few free streaming movies. As of this writing, there are about 86 different channels.

Although Plex is best for people with large repositories

of movie files stored on their computers, it's also for people who oppose some current pricewho oppose some current price-gouging tactics by popular video and music streaming services and are fighting back. Piracy is quite illegal and I certainly don't condone the practice. However, corporations are waging war on consumer pocketbooks. This has historically resulted in consumers fighting back in this manner. That happened a few years ago with music where "everyone" was downloading their favorite music from illegal sources. This eventually resulted in inexpensive music streaming services such as Pandora. It was a disruption of the music industry but a win for the consumer. The same thing is happening with streaming video services. Content pirates are drawn to Plex for customizations that allow easy access to pirated movies and TV

The last cool part of Plex is the ability to access your movie collection from anywhere. You can be on a business trip in Hong Kong, whip out your tablet or phone, and stream the stuff from your home Plex server to your phone. You can easily add family members and friends to your Plex account and share your entire collection with them. Keep in mind that each user will eat up some of your "upload" speed from your internet provider, so you will need a fast internet connection.
