Northern pike zone regulations

For those who will be fishing for northern pike, familiarize yourself with northern pike regulations and be prepared to measure the fish. Minnesota has three northern pike zones that apply to inland waters and reflect the differing characteristics of pike populations across the state:

North-central: Limit of 10 northern pike; anglers must release all fish 22 to 26 inches, with only two fish longer than 26 inches allowed in possession.

Northeast: Limit of two northern pike; anglers must release all fish 30 to 40 inches, with only one fish over 40 inches allowed in possession.

South: Limit of two northern pike; minimum size 24 inches.

Throughout the state, special regulations that cover individual lakes, rivers and streams remain in effect and take precedence over the zone regulations. The northern pike zone regulations do not apply to border waters.



READER RIBBETS Rep. Dale Lueck legislative update

Recently, I had the opportunity to meet with officials from the US Department of Energy (DOE), Talon Metals, and Rio Tinto to learn about a DOE sponsored research project. The project will consider if carbon dioxide (CO2) can be permanently stored as a mineral in a portion of a geological formation within the Tamarack Project, in Aitkin County.

This project is a real eye opener of what may be possible in our own back yard. CO2 storage deep in the earth at Tamarack could be a game changer in our nation's ability to effectively mitigate the increased release of CO2 into the atmosphere. CO2 is one of several greenhouse gases that prominently factor into global climate change.

A team led by Douglas Wicks, DOE's Director for Advanced Research Projects Agency – Energy, and Todd Malan, Talon's Chief External Affairs Officer and Head of Climate Strategy met with local community officials in the City of Tamarack outlining the project. That was followed with meetings in Saint Paul briefing legislators and state agency personnel on the project.

Incidental to exploration for copper and nickel minerals at the Tamarack Project a unique porous geological formation was also discovered. The formation may be ideally suited for permanent carbon sequestration. DOE is providing \$2.2 million and Rio Tinto adding \$4 million to the 3-year project. Talon Metals is providing direct support as the mineral lease holder for the geological formation in question.

The project will study the feasibility of permanently storing CO2 as a carbonate mineral in a huge geological formation deep within Talon's current copper-nickel rich mineral lease holdings at Tamarack.

While having the benefit of Bachelor of Science Degree,

chemistry was not my strong suit. In very basic terms, CO2 will react with certain types of geological formations, the result can be permanent stable storage of CO2 as a carbonate mineral.

The concept has been proven and is in operation on an industrial scale at a Carbfix carbon dioxide injection site in Iceland. Similar CO2 storage may be possible in a portion of the Tamarack Project site.

The 3-year study is intended to answer that question. The research team includes Rio Tinto's technical staff, experts at Carbfix, DOE's Pacific Northwest National Laboratory, Columbia University, and Advantek Waste Management Services. Talon Metals is contributing knowledge of the Tamarack ore body and access to the project for the scientific fieldwork.

Along with nickel mining to supply our future need for electric vehicle batteries, this could be another very positive thing

Fix the Homestead Exclusion now

Earlier this week Crow Wing County had their "Local Board of Appeal" to discuss the valuation for your real estate taxes. If you didn't attend you will not be allowed to dispute the value of your property until 2023.

Many residents are seeing 30-60% increases to their values. This is concerning for several reasons:

1.) Is this a temporary bubble that will soon burst with inflation and high gas prices? Is this the nightmare of 2008 all over again?

2.) What does this mean to the lower valued home when their Homestead Exclusion also disappears?

The Homestead Exclusion is based on a formula created in 2011 and considered a home valued at \$76,000 to be a standard entry level home. With inflation, that entry home has now become over \$110,000. All of the benefits in the original formula are diminished by that \$34,000 increase.

The county is also required to assess at value that are 90-105% of the sales from the previous year. The State Legislature sets these rules and they need to be changed. Let them know that this outdated Homestead Exclusion and valuation formula are NOT working!

The county can't fix this problem! Contact your state reps for their support in fixing this problem THIS YEAR! Tell them to change statute 273.13 for inflation that has happened since 2011.

Tell then to change the Board of Equalizations requirement that says 90-105% of one years sales to something more effective like a two year average instead of a one year.

Tell your state representatives they are responsible for fixing the property tax system!

The Homestead Exclusion was designed to protect the lower middle class but inflation has destroyed the formula. FIX IT NOW!
