**Medicare** Minute "Medicare Supplements"

Medicare supplements, also known as Medigap policies, are designed to help cover some or all of the deductibles, copays and coinsurance that Original Medicare does not cover. Medigap policies are sold through private insurance companies.

In Alabama these insurance companies can sell you only "standardized" policy identified by a letter, such as Plan G. The most common supplemental plans in Alabama are Plans A, B, F, G and N. The term "standardized" means that Medicare requires all plans with a particular letter to have the same basic benefits regardless of the company selling it. For example, a Plan G with one company has to have the exact basic benefits as Plan G with every other company selling it.

Two things to keep in mind when shopping for a Medigap policy. First is the premium. Different insurance companies can charge different premiums for the exact same policy. This means you could pay more for your Medigap policy from one company than you would from other companies offering the same basic benefits. It's a good idea to check with someone who can show you the premiums from several companies to be sure you're getting the best premium for you coverage.

The second thing to keep in mind is the type of Medigap policy you are looking at. Some companies offer a Medicare SELECT policy. SELECT policies may require you to use a defined network of providers to receive full coverage, meaning you may not have full coverage from a provider even though the provider accepts Medicare. A standard Medigap policy will allow you to go to any provider that accepts Medicare. If you are not sure about the type of Medigap policy you are looking at, or its premium, you can contact or come by our office for help.





school band, and picking up guitar and bass guitar by age 17, Hood fell into the music business unintentionally as he became a success.

By 1967 David had played bass or trombone on several early Muscle Shoals hits including James and Bobby Purify's "I'm Your Puppet," Percy Sledge's "Warm and Tender Love," and Etta James' "Tell Mama." During this time, he connected with Roger Hawkins, Jimmy Johnson, and Barry Beckett to form the Muscle Shoals Rhythm Section. The rhythm section continued to rack up a string of hits at FAME Studios until 1969 when they felt it was time to go out on their own.

David, Roger, Jimmy, and Barry purchased a studio in Sheffield at 3614 Jackson Highway, which they remodeled and they remodeled and renamed Muscle Shoals Sound Studios. David's defining bass lick in the Staple Singers' "I'll Take You There" was the first in a series of hit songs the Phother Spatian mended Rhythm Section recorded. The group notably worked with R.B. Greaves, Aretha Franklin, Lulu, Wilson Pickett, Bobby Womack, Mel and Tim, Paul Simon, Traffic, Millie Jackson, Bob Seger, Willie Nelson, Delbert McClinton, Rod Stewart, Jimmy Buffett, Joe Cocker, Dr. Hook, the Oak Ridge Boys, John Prine, and Glen Frey, and appeared on more than

which in some ways makes it an exclusive sport. This is another topic that deserves its own column, but I will mention it here.


There are many families who simply cannot afford to play travel league ball. As a result, many young sluggers are denied the chance to craft the skills necessary to play baseball at a higher level.

#### **Lessons From The TITANIC!**

I have always been intrigued by the tragedy of the sinking of the astonishing ship, Titanic, in 1912. Hundreds perished that night. It was a marvelous vessel in that day. Latest and greatest. Luxurious and plush. Many traveled to Southampton just to be able to be on the maiden voyage to New York. Many of the most wealthy people alive were on that infamous voyage. Structurally, 3,000,000 rivets held it together. Bulkheads, 1" steel plates, powerful boilers, huge propellers and a mere sixteen lifeboats.

What can we learn SPIRITUALLY from this historic tragedy? Consider:

- **1. Over-confidence and arrogance.** Many believed the Titanic was *"unsinkable."* They were traveling at a high speed with a goal of setting a record of travel.
- 2. They failed to heed the warnings. Nearby ships warned them (at least six times) of icebergs in the area, but they ignored the warnings. They had a greater motivating goal.
- 3. They refused to admit they were in danger. Even after striking the iceberg, many refused to get into a lifeboat in the dark and cold night. They believed that they were not in danger.
- 4. Wealth was worthless. The Astors and Guterheims were powerful, wealthy businessmen, but their millions of dollars could not save them that tragic night. The rich perished alongside the poorest of the poor.
- 5. Do we recognize the "icebergs" in our lives that have the power to destroy us? An iceberg is normally protruding above the water line only 10% of its' size. That means about 90% of its size is invisible (below water). The weight of the iceberg was approximately 20 times the weight of the ship Titanic (46,000 tons).
- 6. The end is coming to all one day. Our life on earth is temporary and brief (James 4:17)

Will we be guilty of making similar mistakes? Will we, like those on the Titanic, perish because we failed to heed the clear warnings of the Bible? Do we seriously believe that we are in danger of losing our soul?

But I don't think the scripture calls Christians to be offensive. Robert Schuller used to point out that Jesus never called a sinner "a sinner." It was the self-righteous religious people he called sinners. He was always tender with broken people.

And the Apostle Paul was clear in 1 Corinthians 10: "Give none offence, neither to the Jews, nor to the Gentiles, nor to the church of God: even as I please all men in all things, not seeking mine own profit, but the profit of many, that they may be saved."

Paul said he strove to be a loving vessel of God's truth. As is often said, people must get past Christians before thev can get to God. And we

must be sure we're not stumbling blocks through angry tirades or offering judgments that belong only to the Great Judge of the Universe.

### Democracy Argument **Doesn't Work**

#### Editor:

In the wake of a leaked draft Supreme Court opinion which, if it represents a final vote, would overturn Roe v. Wade, pro-choice would overturn advocates are marshaling their best -- and worst arguments against removing that ruling's protections for abortion.

As always, I'll refrain from sharing my own opinions on abortion as such. I'm not interested in convincing anyone of anything because I'm not firmly convinced myself.

The worst argument I'm hearing right now is that overturning Roe would be 'undemocratic.'

"Overturning Roe v. Wade Shows the Right Has Nothing but Contempt for Democracy," Ben Beckett writes at Jacobin. "If the decision stands, it will be a high-water mark for the Right's project undemocratic of rule ... As the draft decision the shows, Supreme Court is arguably the most powerful weapon the Right has for ruling without and against the people.

Really? The problem isn't

a matter of fundamental individual rights versus state power, but rather of 'democracy?"

Let's take a look at the three underlying cases: In Roe v. Wade (1973)

the Supreme Court overturned Articles 1191-1194 and 1196 of Texas's Penal Code. Those articles and that code were passed by a democratically elected state legislature. The Court overturned "democracy" in favor of what it held was a constitutionally protected individual right.

In Planned Parenthood v. Casey (1992), the Court its further expanded interpretation of those constitutional protections versus Pennsylvania's Abortion Control Act of 1982, once again ruling against a democratically elected state legislature and in favor of a right to abortion.

In the current case, Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Association, the Court will rule regarding Mississippi's Gestational Age Act<sup>1</sup>-- which, you guessed it, was duly passed by a democratically elected state legislature.

If the draft opinion becomes an actual ruling, state legislatures will once again make decisions on abortion law.

That's the exact opposite of "undemocratic." It's full-blown democracy, tip-toeing through the abortion tulips with bells

on and playing a ukulele. Those who claim a constitutional right to abortion might want to reconsider their fetishistic (and in this case, simply incorrect) appeals "democracy." Th to There's something to be said for protection of individual rights against the whims of majorities -- and not only on this issue.



If he can work with others, Brooks just may be the experience and stabilizing influence we need. "That is a BIG IF," you say?

## **Pre-Existing Injuries And** Worker's Comp

**ATTORNEY** 

Sometimes employers like to argue that an injured employee had a pre-existing condition - as if that matters. Sometimes injured employees do have a pre-existing condition. It makes absolutely no difference in a worker's compensation case as long as the employee was doing their job in a normal fashion before to the accident.

I was talking with an insurance adjuster earlier today who started

to make that argument when I explained to him that the Court would likely not hear evidence about a pre-existing condition because the law is quite clear on this point.

Where litigants and judges find difficulty in on the job injury cases are in those circumstances when there is a subsequent accident to the same part of the body at a new employer. In those cases, the Court does have to determine whether or not the second injury is a new injury, an aggravation of a prior injury or a recurrence of an old injury. A recurrence occurs when the second injury "does not contribute even slightly to the causation of the disability." If the second injury is an aggravation of the first injury, the employer at the time of the aggravating injury will be liable. In the case of a recurrence, the first employer will be liable.

One of the good things about worker's compensation is that even though the doctors in Alabama are chosen and paid by the employer (he who pays the piper calls the tune) most doctors will agree that an aggravation or exacerbation of a pre-existing condition occurred if new, worse, or different symptoms appear at or about the time of the injury. Remember though, that on average, discs that herniate don't really herniate immediately, maybe only 2% of the time. The vast majority of herniations manifest themselves over a period of weeks.

If you are in a worker's compensation case and your employer is telling you that you had a pre-existing condition, but you know it was made worse by the accident, you have a case.




Dear Brad,
