



#### What Made "The Greatest Generation" Great? Part 1

If the generation of the Great Depression and WW II was great it was because so many people put into action an ethos based on collective action and unselfishness. This ethos had a lot in common with what Jesus preached in his parables and in his sermon on the mount. Many embraced this ethos because they were religious, but many embraced it because it just made sense. Regardless, it wasn't being Godly or respecting their parents that made that generation great. It was the things they did because of that unselfish ethos. It was what they accomplished not for their families alone, but for their neighbors- in the US and, during WW II, in Europe and South East Asia.

During that time regular folks fought for and won a better America for everyone. It wasn't perfect but it was a huge step forward. The ethos of the Great Depression was one of brotherhood and sharing. It promoted cooperation over greed, the greater good before profit, and human rights before punishment. This ethos helped create the prosperity of the 1950s and 1960s. An ethos that many minorities and young people attempted to apply to all races, economic levels and nationalities in the 1960s. An ethos that got lost in the backlash to the cultural revolution of the 1960s and that got lost in the roll back of Great Depression reforms beginning 40 years ago.

You see, during the 1920s most of the money being made by a booming economy flowed into the hands of people who already had everything they wanted and had way more money than they could ever spend. Very little of the profits were being shared with the workers, who would have gone out and bought things since they didn't have everything they wanted or needed. So the people who would spend that money didn't have it. Without money to spend there was no demand for products. Businesses began to make less so they cut peoples' hours or jobs and, in order to keep the profits, people's pay. This just made things worse because now the people who would have spent the money had even less than they did before. The cities were filled with homeless people travelling the country looking for jobs in order to support their families.

Like the rich businessmen who wouldn't reduce their profits, not everyone shared the unselfish ethos. Many wanderers found jobs as migrant farm workers. There were always long lines of people looking for work so employers didn't pay them much. People who lived around these farms often didn't like the fact that outsiders (who didn't always sound or look like them) were coming to their town to take jobs.

The selfish ethos also overtook countries in other parts of the world. One of the most advanced countries in the world elected a soldier who talked some about the actual causes of their economic problems and then said that it was really the fault of the minorities and left-wingers in the country. He promised to make the country great by building up their military and restricting the rights of minorities. This was Hitler's Germany. In Italy and Japan similar militaristic governments were elected. These types of governments were referred to as fascist. It was the fight against fascism that WW II was all about.

There were selfish forces working in America to. Big business got together to try to stop the government from using regulations and unions to help regular folks. They even hatched a plot to overthrow the President. In the south, where most blacks lived at this time, Jim Crow worked hard to deny them a piece of the pie. And when WW II broke out most of the Japanese-Americans living on the West coast were detained by order of the President in camps in the Mid-West because the military and the FBI didn't trust them. But the ethos that worked, the ethos that made a better America, was embraced by enough people to transform our nation. They

championed the common good and regular folks over the greedy

and selfish. In the 1930s the values of regular working-class folks

were often (not always, but often) about fairness and group...

action instead of scapegoating those below you on the ladder of success.

Maybe that's because they understood the true cause of their problems. Because in America we elected a disabled man who not only talked about the economic problems we faced, but put the blame where it belonged- on a system that benefited what he called "economic royalists" and not the people. This was President Franklin D. Roosevelt's "New Deal". It was so popular he was elected four times.

#### MAY IS LYME DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH

Lyme disease is a bacterial infection that can be spread to humans by the bite of an infected deer tick. Lyme disease cases peak in the summer months, especially during May, June, and July.


Lyme disease is very serious and can become crippling or debilitating if not properly diagnosed and treated with antibiotics. Typical symptoms include fever, headache, fatigue, and a characteristic skin rash called erythema migrans. If left untreated, infection can spread to joints, the heart, and the nervous system.

Anyone who plays or works outside is at an increased risk. Mowing lawns, picking up leaves, and other outdoor activities can expose the public to ticks. Ticks most commonly live in cool, moist environments, and can be found in gardens, around shrubs, and in tall, grassy, and wooded areas. Deer, birds, mice, and other animals can transport ticks into your yard.

There are several things you can do to protect yourself and your family from tick bites. Below are some basic tips to follow:

- Keep your lawn mowed and cut down brushy areas.
- · Avoid areas that may be infested such as, tall, grassy, moist areas.
- · Use protective measures:
  - o If you know you will be walking in tall grass, wear long sleeves and tuck your clothes in.
  - o Try to wear light colors so ticks are more visible. Ticks can be hard to see, as they may only be about the size of a pin-head.
- Use repellent that contains 20 percent or more DEET, picaridin, or IR3535 on exposed skin for protection that lasts several hours.
- Perform a tick check on yourself, your pets, and your children when finished with outside work or play. Serious risks from Lyme disease can be reduced if the tick is removed within 36 hours.
- If a tick is found, do not apply mineral oil, petroleum jelly, or heat. Use fine-tipped tweezers to remove the tick. Contact your doctor if there are concerns about incomplete tick removal or if a rash or flu-like symptoms develop.

By following these guidelines, you can help protect yourself and your family from Lyme disease. 
