ayout changes for Farmers Market

The Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce is kicking off the Farmers and Artisans market on Saturday, May 28 in downtown Elkhart Lake.


The market will run for 20 weeks from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays. This year's market will have a different layout than in years past. The Chamber was notified that Rhine Street (the main street through town) will no longer be able to be closed for the market. Instead, Square Street (the street that runs behind the Depot) will be closed for the vendors who were normally

on Rhine Street. The set-up for the rest of the market will remain the same.

The entire market will be to the south of Rhine Street. Customers will need to cross Rhine Street via designated crosswalks.

The Elkhart Lake Police Department will be placing event signage on Rhine Street so vehicles know to slow down for an event ahead.

The Chamber, again, looks forward to hosting an array of vendors and having locals and visitors enjoy this long-standing

Renewal energy grant awarded to Lakeshore

Lakeshore Technical College has been selected as a recipient of the Expanding Advanced Renewable Energy Technician Education in a Technical College grant funded by the National Science Founda-

The \$336,650 grant is the first awarded directly to the college by the NSF and will support education focused on the production and storage of renewable energy.

The grant will support collaboration between Lakeshore's Wind Energy Technology Instructor Justin Barret and renewal energy business leaders to identify current and future educational needs among employers in the college's district. Funding will also be used for curriculum adjustments required based on industry feedback, and delivery of the curriculum. Lastly, the grant will fund the purchase and installation of a rooftop mount and purchase of ground solar equipment. The grant will be awarded over a three-year period.

"This grant will help us continue preparing students learning in our state-ofthe-art wind, solar and nuclear energy labs for careers in the growing renewable energy industry," said Lakeshore President Dr. Paul Carlsen. "Being selected for this competitive funding is a direct result of our college's commitment to a culture of innovation and transforming the lives of individuals throughout the communities that support us."






This is one of the Super Mileage vehicles on the track making a specified number of laps. The winner is judged by how quickly the laps were achieved and how much fuel was consumed in the process.




releasing his new, profoundly multimedia and wildly explicit comedy special, direct to his fans at steveo.com. It's called "Gnarly," for good reason.







Gessert's celebrates century in EL

Gessert's Ice Cream & Confectionery at 99 S Lake St. is celebrating its 100 anniversary in June.

Holding a title as one of the oldest ice cream parlors in the United States, owners Ryan and Michelle Moeller continue the family-owned business in downtown Elkhart Lake.

What began with the Gessert family selling ice cream to lakeside residents has become a fixture in the community as a place for ice cream, old-fashioned candy, handmade fudge, and a fun step back in time for people to enjoy.

"We are excited to continue the business," Ryan said.

Prepared for the season, the Moellers are ready to continue serving the area with the sweet treats and drinks for which the ice cream parlor is known.

When the husband and wife team bought Gessert's from Harry Gessert's daughter Yvonne Gessert Landgraf, renovations were made to bring the historic building up to code. Through the renovations and updates made to the ice cream parlor, the husband and wife team did what they could to preserve and utilize what was present in the established building.

Moeller's appreciation and respect for the ice cream parlor's history is evident with the presence of Gessert's days gone by. One piece in particular - held in a display case - is an old menu showing dinner plates and other foods that were served at a point of time when the parlor was open year-round.

Upon entering the parlor a picture of Harry Gessert from 1922 can be found

close to the front counter.

Gessert's parlor walls are decorated with photos of the Gessert Girls in their uniforms, memorabilia for various candies, drinks and ice cream for customers to enjoy while indulging in the parlor's offered sweets and beverages.

Alongside the pictures and memorabilia throughout the parlor, there is also a museum room in the back. From a front counter that was once used in the ice cream parlor, old gambling machines and vintage posters for Road America, items from the parlor's and community's past are there for patrons to see.

"Our customers enjoy the history that is here," Ryan said.

As the Moeller family continues the business, customers continue to return and build memories within the familyfriendly ice cream parlor walls ranging from couples on their first date to returning customers that remember coming to Gessert's as young children.



Basketmaking workshop slated at Plymouth Arts

The Plymouth Arts Center invites people to register for a special one-day "free" Birchbark Basketmaking Workshop conducted by artist Pat Kruse.

Kruse is a birchbark and quill artist who lives on the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe Reservation. He is a member of the Red Cliff Band of Ojibwe in Wisconsin and a descendent of Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe in Minnesota. The basketmaking workshop is made possible through grants received from the Arts Midwest Gig Grant Fund, the Kohler Foundation and the Krier Foundation. In-person instruction will be offered in the PAC classroom on Tuesday, June 14 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. The grant funds also allow two PAC partner organizations to live stream this innovative online program to 24 of their "homebound" participants. 
The Birchbark Basket Workshop will expose community members to Indigenous Ojibwe culture and the vanishing techniques associated with birchbark methods and quill basketry. The three-hour workshop will provide a hands-on opportunity for participants to create traditional birchbark baskets.

Working with birchbark for over 30 years, Kruse said he knew at an early age he wanted to be a birchbark artist. Coming from a family of birchbarkers, his mother is his greatest influence. Known for remaking old-style Ojibwe birchbark and quill basketry, he creates picturesques and other birchbark art. Kruse teaches birchbark basket workshops with students ranging from grade school children to elders.

In 2015, Kruse was selected for the Native Artist-In-Residence at Minnesota Historical Society, St. Paul, Minnesota. In 2016 he was selected for the Native Arts and Cultures Foundation Fellowship, Vancouver, Washington, and in 2018 was selected for the Native Arts and Cultures Foundation Mentor Artist Fellowship, Vancouver, for a one-year mentoring of

an apprentice.

Some awards he received include "Favorite Artist" and "1st Place Birchbark Basket" in 2016 at Woodland Indian Art Show & Market, Oneida; "1st Place-Wood/ Stone Workings," "1st Place, 2-Dimensional Art" and "Best of Show!" in 2018 at Woodland Indian Art Show & Market, Sevenwinds Casino, Hayward.

Kruse's birchbark art is in museum collections—National Museum of the American Indian-Smithsonian, Washington, D.C.; Science Museum of Minnesota, St. Paul, Minnesota; and Minnesota Historical Society, St. Paul, Minnesota, to name a few.



Lakeland, Fox Valley have 2 new agreements

Longtime partners Fox Valley Technical College and Lakeland University have entered into two new agreements that will solidify their decades-long relationship and bring the two institutions together under one roof.

Lakeland will relocate its Fox Cities Center to Fox Valley Technical College's Appleton campus. The transition will occur this summer in time for classes this fall.

Lakeland and FVTC have also signed an agreement that creates a pathway for students who earn an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree in Liberal Arts at FVTC to transfer to Lakeland with junior standing and apply all their credits toward a Lakeland Bachelor's Degree.

The pathway agreement was signed Wednesday, May 18 by FVTC President Chris Matheny, Ph.D., and Lakeland Vice President for Academic Affairs Joshua Kutney, D.B.A., at FVTC's Appleton campus.

Lakeland's space at FVTC, located just inside Entrance 15, will also include an office presence and access to several other classrooms during the spring, fall and summer semesters.

Over the past 2.5 years, a total of 633 students have taken classes through Lakeland's Fox Cities Center at its current location, 2320 Industrial Dr. in Neenah. That total includes 227 students who graduated from FVTC.

"Fox Valley Technical College is our top transfer partner, which is one of many reasons why this move makes sense," said Borgen, noting that Lakeland has offered classes in the Fox Cities since 1982. "For many of our students, they'll be able to continue on the pathway to a Bachelor's Degree at a campus that already feels like home."

Matheny pointed out that the shared space agreement is a natural extension of articulation agreements already in place between the two colleges.

"Having a trusted partner like Lakeland on our campus provides the opportunity for a student to start here and then seamlessly transition to a Bachelor's Degree and beyond in a place they know and are comfortable with," Matheny said.

"FVTC students will be able to connect with and explore baccalaureate degree completion options without leaving our Appleton campus. They will have convenient access to both their FVTC advisors and future Lakeland faculty and staff who can help coordinate the educational journey that best fits that student and their

career interests."

FVTC received approval from the UW Board of Regents on April 7 to offer the two-year liberal arts associate of science (A.S.) and associate of arts (A.A.) degrees. Final approval by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) to offer the degrees is pending.

With HLC's approval, ideally granted yet this year, these degrees will allow students to easily transfer to Lakeland with junior standing and apply all their credits toward a Lakeland Bachelor's Degree. This HLC-pending option is an extension of numerous 2+2 articulation agreements already in place with Lakeland.

"FVTC and Lakeland have a long history of providing innovative educational opportunities to students in our region," Matheny said. "Our graduates have long been welcomed with open arms at Lakeland; so much so, we decided to explore how to make it even easier for our graduates to continue their education.

"For many years, FVTC and Lakeland have shared a vision for a more educated New North region and a passion for creating easier access for students to achieve their educational goals. We are happy to further our partnership by welcoming them to our campus and creating a home for both Lakeland and FVTC students right here."


Borgen said the HLC-pending associate degrees position FVTC to further enhance the educational options provided to the community, including pathways that allow students to earn credit for workplace learning through Lakeland's award-winning Cooperative Education program.

"It's exciting to see private and public institutions working together for a common good—helping our students achieve their educational goals while aligning with regional workforce development needs," Borgen said. "This new level of access benefits students and their families, local schools and Wisconsin communities."



Beach Pass Information

The Village is reminding people that the Village beach is for residents of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Joint School District only, per Village Ordinance. The police will be monitoring beach use more frequently. The prices of the passes is \$5 for residents and \$40 for school district residents, which are good for an even and odd year (this is the first year of the beach pass). These passes are now available. The price of replacement passes is \$25 for Village residents and \$50 for school district residents. Rental properties are to have their guests use Fireman's Park. This is the public access to the lake that should be used for guests. Some of the other regula-

- No person shall allow a dog to be on any public beaches owned or leased by the Village.
- No person shall use or possess beverages containing alcohol on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.
- No person shall ignite nor maintain fires of any kind on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.
- No person shall have a pop-up tent, canopy, or table on the public beaches owned by the Village.

TID Amendment

The Planning Commission will be holding a public hearing on a TID boundary amendment on June 8th, 2022. TID #4 boundaries will be amended, to encompass the area of 604 S Lincoln Street. The Village continues to work with General Capital and partners on bringing multifamily residential housing to the Village. This TID amendment will go through the Village Board and the Joint Review Board over the coming months.

Village-wide Revaluation

The State of Wisconsin sets standards that all communities in the State must be valued at 100% of market value or be kept within 10% of that value. The Village has fallen below these standards. The last

revaluation was done in 2008. The Village has contracted with Grota Appraisals to have all properties assessed at 100% of market value as of January 1, 2023. Grota will be sending letters out to all property owners in the coming month about the process. The Village has approved an exterior inspection process only. They will not be going inside of properties. Grota will begin their work this summer, but these values will not be in effect until the December 2023 tax bill. A badge with photo ID will be worn by assessment staff while in the field. If you have any questions, please contact Jessica at 920-876-2122.

Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.



\$1 million donated to new LTC center
