Included in that overall total were 59 studentathletes that earned perfect 4.0 GPAs, and 208 of UNA's total 290 studentathletes earned a 3.0 GPA or higher.

The UNA beach volleyball team had the highest team GPA at 3.82, and was one of 13 Lion teams that had a 3.0 GPA or higher.

Beach volleyball was followed by women's cross country (3.61), softball (3.58), women's golf at 3.57, soccer (3.54). volleyball (3.53), men's golf (3.35), women's tennis (3.35), men's tennis (3.27), men's basketball (3.18), men's cross country (3.14), baseball (3.10) and women's basketball (3.09).

Tourism Hits Record Level

FLORENCE-The Florence-Lauderdale Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB) has received the results of the 2021 Alabama Tourism **Economic Impact Report** issued by the Alabama Tourism Department.

Lauderdale County had a record-breaking year with over \$280 million in travel-related expenditures. This is a 46.8% rate of growth over 2020, and a 13% increase, or \$31.7 million, over 2018 which was the highest prior year on record. Lauderdale County employs 3,368 full-time, part-time, and seasonal employees, and over 4,800 are in the tourism workforce for the twocounty (Shoals) area.

Governor Kay Ivey announced the results last week during a campaign

stop.
Travel-related expenditures are comprised of several categories including lodging facilities, eating and drinking establishments, general retail, entertainment, public transportation and auto transportation.

Rob Carnegie, CEO, with the Florence-Lauderdale Convention & Visitors Bureau said, "We are very pleased with the outcome of the report, which strongly indicates that travelers are motivated to visit The Shoals. We value and appreciate the dedication of our industry partners that work hard every day to serve our visitors.

It is estimated that 28.2 million people visited Alabama in 2021, spending \$19.6 billion. Over \$1.1 billion in state and local tax revenues were generated by travel and tourism activities. Without those taxes, each Alabama household would pay \$631



BOOSH! ONE OF THE MANY PERKS OF MY JOB IS GETTING TO MEET EXTRAORDINARY PEOPLE. Recently, I had the honor of meeting a man who was part of a forgotten part of our nation's history. Please allow me to introduce you to

my new favorite client, Mr. Fred Rodgers. Mr. Fred (AKA "Trouble' according to insiders at his church) needed a little help transitioning from an old

tablet to a new one that would handle his online banking stuff. I steered him towards a nice little tablet from a local store and helped him configure the thing. I got to

know Fred a little and he shared

MEMORIAL DAY AND SURVIVING

by "The Computer Skeptic"

a horrific story.

In 1969, Fred was enjoying a quiet morning deep down in the aircraft carrier USS Enterprise about 75 miles off the coast of Hawaii. Fred had departed San Francisco 17 days prior after marrying the love of his life, Shirley. This eighth incarnation of Enterprise was the world's first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier. She first set sail in 1961, and was taken out of service in 2012. It was our nation's longest serving combat vessel. Another Enterprise is being built but won't set sail until 2028. The starship Enterprise won't be

released for another 250 years.

Fred's job was to make sure the ship's engines ran while many of his shipmates were on the flight deck preparing for a readiness inspection. The readiness inspection required all the planes be fueled, outfitted with bombs and rockets, and generally ready for battle. Fred was in front of his locker when an enormous "Booosh!" (Fred's words) rattled the enormous ship. That was the start of 10 minutes of terror that Fred would never forget.

On the topmost deck of the carrier, a device called

a "Huffer" (a portable jet engine) was being used to start the engines of an aircraft. Unfortunately, the Huffer's exhaust was pointed at a rocket mounted on the belly of an F-4 Phantom jet. The rocket exploded which perforated the fuel tanks of the jet causing fire to quickly spread to more rockets. Those exploded, perforating the flight deck. which poured jet fuel into the level below that was filled with sailors.

The fires quickly reached a large bomb mounted on one of the jets which blew an 8-foot wide hole in the deck and ignited the fuel that had leaked into the lower level still filed with sailors. The fires then reached a rack containing 3 more large bombs which exploded and ignited a 6,000 gallon fuel tank on the top deck

which resulted in a massive fireball that ignited everything it touched. In all, a total of 18 explosions happened in less than 10 minutes.

The ship survived but the disaster claimed 27 lives, injured 314 sailors, and destroyed 15 aircraft. This past January 14 was the 53rd anniversary of this event and no one, including me, even knew it. So, please take a moment to remember the 27 we lost that day and the Freds of the world who survived history and still live with it every day.

The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) has released its annual Horrible Hundred Report for 2022. The report exposes some of the worst puppy breeders in the US from the over 10,000 breeding operations in the nation. These breeders imprison adult dogs in filthy conditions without adequate food, water, shelter and even medical care. The puppies produced from continuous breeding are shipped hundreds of miles to pet stores like Petland, where they are sold for thousands of dollars. Undercover investigations have confirmed that many of these animals are sick when

sold to unsuspecting buyers.

Many communities are taking action to help stop this abuse of man's best friend. Eleven states and over 400 municipalities have passed ordinances banning the sale of puppies in pet stores. In Alabama, 12 cities have passed such ordinances including Florence and Muscle Shoals. Several more cities are expected to join

Visit the actual site and insist on meeting the

parents of your puppy.







In compliance with the Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM), Source Water Assessment plans have been developed to help protect our water sources. The assessments include a susceptibility analysis, which classifies potential contaminants as high, moderate, or non-susceptible to contaminating the water source. The plans are available for review upon advance request.

Please help us make these efforts worthwhile by protecting our source water. Carefully follow instructions on pesticides and herbicides you use for your lawn and garden, and properly dispose of household chemicals, paints, and waste oil. We ask that all our customers help us protect our valuable water sources, which are the heart of our community, our way of life, and our children's futures.

INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD

Lead in drinking water is rarely found in source water but is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Your water system is responsible for providing high quality drinking water but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Use only water from the coldwater tap for drinking, cooking, and especially for making baby formula. Hot water is more likely to cause leaching of lead from plumbing materials. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. GENERAL INFORMATION

All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. MCL's, defined in a List of Definitions in this report, are set at very stringent levels. To understand the possible health effects described for many regulated constituents, a person would have to drink 2 liters of water every day at the

MCL level for a lifetime to have a one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect.

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and radioactive material, and it can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- · Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.
- Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally occurring or result from urban storm water run-off, industrial or domestic
- wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.

 Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, storm water run-off, and residential uses.
- Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff, and septic systems.

• Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the levels of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. People at risk should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. Based on a study conducted by ADEM with the approval of the EPA a statewide waiver for the monitoring of asbestos and dioxin was issued. Thus, monitoring for these contaminants was not required.





Courtroom Behavior

I have appeared in courts all over the southeast. I have argued cases before the Alabama Supreme Court and the 11th Circuit Court of Appeals. I've appeared in night courts in every small town in Northwest Alabama. I've been a small town City Court Judge. Invariably, every judge of every court prefers that people be represented by attorneys. Let's talk about why.

People representing themselves often do not understand the issue or issues that the court is to decide and can decide. People representing themselves rarely, if ever, know how to obtain testimony from the

other side by asking questions. People representing themselves can lose their temper and lose their case while making the judge angry all at the same time.

Judges want to do justice while following the law. If the person before them doesn't know and understand the law, they can't present the law. Judges are always limited to what issues they can decide.

For example, if a police officer writes a ticket for speeding, the issue is, did the driver exceed the speed limit at the time and place in question. It could very well be that the method by which the police officer obtained the speed of the vehicle in question was not properly done, but at the end of the day, if the speed limit is 55 and the person accused says they were going 56, they might as well have pled guilty. That is the issue before that court.

If a person is issued a speeding ticket and their defense is that they want to "tell on" the officer for being rude, that is not an issue before the court. The judge doesn't have the authority to fire the police officer and won't find you "not guilty" if you were in fact speeding because you think the officer was impolite.

The problem is that people representing themselves become frustrated when they don't understand what the issues are and why they can't tell their side of the story if that story doesn't have anything to do with the issues before the court.

If you have a legal issue that's important to you, talk to a lawyer about it before you step in the courtroom.

- On June 6, 1683, the Ashmolean, the world's first university museum, opens in Oxford, England. Today, the collection at the Ashmolean Museum of Art and Archaeology ranges in time from the earliest implements of man, made about 500,000 years ago, to 20th century works of art.
- On June 10, 1692, in Salem Village in the Massachusetts Bay Colony, Bridget Bishop, the first colonist to be tried in the Salem witch trials, is hanged after being found guilty of the practice of witchcraft. The witch trials, which resulted in the executions of 19 innocent women and men, ended in October.
- On June 9, 1893, the interior of Ford's Theatre collapses when a basement pier gives way, killing 23 people. The building --where President Lincoln was assassinated -- housed hundreds of government clerks.
- On June 7, 1942, the Battle of Midway -- one of the most decisive U.S. victories in its war against Japan -- comes to an end. The outnumbered U.S. Pacific Fleet destroyed four Japanese aircraft carriers

with the loss of only one of its own, the Yorktown.

• On June 8, 1968, James Earl Ray is arrested in London, England, and charged with the assassination of civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. In 1969, Ray pleaded guilty to King's murder. Three days later, he attempted to withdraw his

guilty plea, claiming he had been set up as a patsy in a larger conspiracy.

- On June 11, 1979, film actor John Wayne, born Marion Morrison, dies at age 72. The "John Wayne" name was created when the director of "The Big Trail" didn't think Marion was a good name for an actor playing a tough Western
- On June 12, 1982, a large crowd descends upon New York City's Central Park, demanding nuclear disarmament. Estimates placed the number of attendees at over a million.

Dear Athletic Support: My son yawns before big games. Is that weird? It is to me. I really don't like it at all. It's like he doesn't care about

what we're doing. We've been working on his athletic career since he was big enough to hold a ball, but now every

time we're in a champion-ship game or playing our biggest rival, he could care less. Maybe I'm pushing him too hard. I don't know. I just can't stand to see this new nonchalant attitude. I started noticing it back at the start of this past football season. He's finishing up his ninth-grade year. In our district, ninth grade is still junior high. So he's the big dog, finally on the starting team, and it still didn't seem to

matter to him. This lasted all the way through basketball and has carried over into his travel baseball, as well. If you could shed any light on why he might be acting this way, I would greatly appreciate it.

Dear Yawn: If I had to guess, I'd say your son is nervous.

Anxiety affects the heart and respiratory system. Getting nervous can feel like you're out of breath. The reason we yawn is to get more oxygen into the bloodstream. In short, a yawn is basically just one big breath.

So, it's not that your son doesn't care about athletics anymore — it's the exact opposite. As your son has gotten older and gotten into a more competitive league, he's started taking athletics more seriously.

This is good and bad. It's good because it shows he cares, which I'm hoping eases your mind. Your son cares so much he's having a physical response to his nerves. Which isn't the best thing for a young athlete.

This is why the new yawning episodes could also be a bad thing. You don't want your son to be so nervous it impacts his performance.

There's a fine line to walk when it comes to pregame focus. As a former coach. I can remember trying to gauge how my team would perform based on how they acted in the hours leading up to kickoff.

No matter how hard I tried, I never could get it right.


Some games my players would be stone faced before the game and play horribly. Other times, they'd be wild and free and play just as



Speaking The Ephesians 4:15

The Day Christ's Church Began

They that gladly received his word were baptized: "and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls" (Acts 2:41).

Medicare Minute

"Important Facts about Supplements"

If you are considering a Medicare Supplement, or Medigap policy, for the first time there are some important facts you should know. To begin with you have to be enrolled in Medicare Part A and Part B to sign up for a Medigap plan. If you choose to sign up for a Medigap plan, you then will pay the private insurance company a premium in addition to your Part B premium that you pay Medicare. Occasionally we will speak with someone who thinks the Part B premium paid to Medicare covers the cost of their Medigap plan. This is not the case. The Part B premium paid to Medicare covers the benefits, discussed in earlier articles, that Medicare allows you under Part B.

Another fact to keep in mind is a Medigap policy will only cover one person. This is also true of Medicare Advantage and prescription drug plans. If you spouse wants a Medicare plan of any type they will have to sign up themselves. However, some Medigap companies will give you a premium discount if you are married or live with someone over the age of 60. This can be a huge savings for you.

Medigap policies do not cover most prescription drugs. If you want prescription drug coverage you will need to purchase a stand-alone prescription drug plan from a private insurance company. Medigap policies are designed to supplement, or fill in the gaps of, Original Medicare. When a claim is filed with Medicare, Medicare will pay first and the Medigap policy will pay its part depending on the type of plan you have chosen. Therefore, because Original Medicare does not cover most prescription drugs, your Medigap policy will not have that coverage either.


