
Dear Ann,



the last year studying the Alabama jail system and what can be done improve both to its operations and outcomes.

"The program this year grew out of the NAACP meeting where candidates for local offices were invited to speak," said Dr. Jeff Choron, instructor Northwest Shoals Community College.

The motto of the national Race Amity Day is "E Pluribus Unum" the motto of the United States. It means 'From Many One'.

"The history of the United States has been an attempt to understand and apply that idea," said Dr. Jacquie Osborne, a local advocate of Race Amity Day. "The present need to eliminate racism from our society is just one more

out strongly in favor of implementing a full-scale school choice program in Alabama.

Guest Commentary - Justin Bogie

If you don't follow state government closely, all you would have learned about Kay Ivey over the past few months is that she

supported Donald Trump, pities Joe Biden, and always carries a handgun with her. Apparently, that's enough to win a gubernatorial election in Alabama if you're an

incumbent. only real accomplishment that during she mentioned her primary campaign was Alabama having the lowest unemployment rate

in state history. Alabama's economy was able to quickly bounce back from the COVID-19 pandemic because of fewer business restrictions than other states.

What didn't Gov. Ivey talk about in her acceptance speech and throughout the campaign?

She failed to mention that she oversaw the biggest expansion of state government in Alabama's history, faster California or New York, since 2019. She didn't talk about the fact that Alabama took more taxes from citizens than ever in 2021. She presented no plans to take less money from you in the future.

She offered no policy agenda to move Alabama's schools from the bottom of national rankings.

Ivey didn't tout the \$.10 gas tax increase that she spearheaded in 2019, nor did she pledge to provide citizens with relief from record gas prices that now average \$4.30 per gallon. In fact, she said she opposed freezing any portion of the

While touting Alabama's low unemployment rate, she failed to mention that mandates from state government put many employers out of business, some temporarily some permanently.

If given free rein, another four years of Gov. Ivey will likely mean more taxes from you to pay bigger government for fewer and individual freedoms that Alabamians hold so dear. Given that her biggest regret from the recent legislative session was that gambling legislation did not pass, it also means that Alabama's gambling debate will rage once again.

The good news is that although Kay Ivey will almost certainly remain governor, there will be many new faces in the Legislature. Alabama In the Alabama Senate, five incumbents didn't seek reelection. Seven Republicans faced primary challengers, and as of Wednesday morning, one of those incumbents was trailing, though the outcome likely won't be

known for several days. There will be even more turnover in the House of Representatives where there were 21 open seats and nearly two dozen

primary challengers. As Wednesday, seven rumbents had lost incumbents their reelection bids, and three more faced runoff elections. Of the six Republican incumbents that lost on Tuesday, four were ranked in the bottom third of the Alabama Policy Institute's 2022 Policy Maker Scorecard.

For the Republican incumbents who lost or still face a runoff, maybe it is because their constituents realized that the conservative principles that they campaigned on four years ago did not align with their actions in Montgomery.

the Republican primary winners stick to their campaign pledges, it will mean a more conservative legislature than what Alabamians saw over the past four years. We should expect the record expansion of state spending to slow. There should be real tax relief in sight for Alabamians as so many states around the country have already done. Parents and students should finally have more choice over where they can go to school and receive an education that best suits their individual needs.

It should also mean an end to the near-total control that Gov. Ivev has wielded over the legislature for the past five years.

However, that's only if the primary winners stick to their promises. It is up to us to make sure they do.

Adaptive Clothing Takes the Stress Out of Dressing

Dear Savvy Senior, What kinds of clothing options are available to mobility challenged seniors who have a difficult time dressing?

Looking for Mom

The chore of dressing and undressing in traditional clothing can be difficult, time-consuming and even painful for millions of people with certain health and mobility problems. Fortunately, there's a wide variety special clothing, known as "adaptive clothing," that can help with most dressing challenges. Here's what you should know

What is Adaptive Clothing?

Adaptive clothing is specially designed garments for people with mobility issues, disabilities and cognitive challenges who have a difficult time getting dressed. This type of clothing incorporates discreated the statement of t incorporates discreet design features to make dressing and undressing easier, while still having the outward appearance of typical clothing.

Depending on your mom's needs, here are some of the many different types of adaptive clothing options that could

For self-dressing seniors who suffer from Parkinson's or other disabilities that affect dexterity, there are pants, shirts, dresses and outerwear made with Velcro or magnetic closures instead of buttons and zippers, which are much easier to fasten and unfasten. But be aware that magnetic closures are not suitable for those who have pacemakers.

For those who are disabled or who have limited range of

motion and need assistance dressing, there are adaptive pants with zippers or snaps on both sides of the pants that are easier to pull on. And a wide range of rear closure shirts, tops and dresses with Velcro or snap fasteners in the back for those who can't raise their arms over their head.

For wheelchair users there are higher back and elastic waistband pants that don't slip down, as well as pants with fabric overlaps at the seat to allow for easier toileting access.

For people with tactile sensitivity, there are garments you can purchase that have soft and stretchy fabrics without tags and are sewn with flat seams to help preventing chafing.

And for seniors with Alzheimer's disease there are one-piece jumpsuits that have a back-zipper access to prevent the wearer from disrobing inappropriately.

Where to Shop?

Because each person's dressing needs and style is so specific, finding appropriate adaptive clothing can be difficult.

Recently, mainstream clothing stores like JCPenney (jcpenney.com), Target (target.com) and Tommy Hilfiger (usa. tommy.com) have started offering a line of adaptive clothing for adults that combines fashion and functionality, but their instore options are limited. To get a bigger selection, visit the store's website and type in "adaptive clothing" in their search engine.

You can also find a large selection at online stores that specialize in adaptive clothing like Buck & Buck (buckandbuck. com) and Silverts (silverts.com). Both of these companies have been selling adaptive clothing for decades and offer a wide variety of garments to accommodate almost any need, condition or style, for independent self-dressers and for those who need help.

Some other adaptive clothing sites you should visit include Joe & Bella (joeandbella.com), Ovidis (ovidis.com), and IZ Adaptive (izadaptive.com), which sells clothing primarily designed for wheelchair users.

And, if your mom is in need of adaptive footwear, Velcro fastening shoes (instead of shoelaces) have long been a popular option and can be found in most local shoe stores.

Some other new lines of adaptive shoes that may interest her include Kiziks (kizik.com) and Zeba (zebashoes.com), which make fashionable sneakers and comfortable walking shoes that just slip on, hands-free, along with Billy Footwear (billyfootwear.com) and Friendly Shoes (friendlyshoes.com), which makes uniquely designed zip-on shoes




currently doing."





RULES OF THE **ROAD FOR BOATS**

Boats, like vehicles, have rules that govern their operation as well as regulations that require specific safety equipment on each vessel.

There are rules for boats that are different than that of cars. An example is Alabama statute §33-5-25 which imposes a legal duty on the operator of any boat involved in an accident to render to render assistance as necessary to save others affected by the accident from the danger caused by the accident and to give his or her name and the identification of their boat to any person injured.

The operator of an automobile is not under a legal duty to render aid to someone injured in an accident. Obviously, moral obligations exist and should never be ignored. There are Good Samaritan laws that shield people from liability who attempt to render aid but if you don't know first aid you may cause more harm than good. That's different than saving someone in the water because the very "first aid" may be that of getting them where first aid may be performed safely.

Other than sailboats, rowboats or canoes, a boater's safety course and a test are required to be certified to operate a boat. The boat has to be registered in the name of the person who owns the boat. The rules and regulations for the safe operation of a boat deal with right of way among other issues. Drivers of automobiles have red lights, green lights, stop signs and markings on the road to indicate the right of way.

In a boat, the right of way changes based on the type of boat being operated and the type of boat that is either yielding or has the right of way. Commercial barges have the right of way. They can't stop in half a mile. Sailboats typically have the right of way because they are limited in the direction they can travel given the wind conditions existing at the time. Power boats in overtaking or passing other power boats have rules that dictate the correct side to pass or overtake as well as certain horn signals which can or must be given.

As someone who loves boating, the best advice that I can give is to keep a proper look out. That's a duty imposed by law but it's also common sense when you are on the water.
