# Impact of a Coyotes arena-entertainment district could reach all the way to $S$. Tempe

Tempe's decision to move forward with the Arizona Coyotes on a proposed $\$ 1.7$ billion arena-entertainment district development, east of Priest Drive and south of the Salt River, could have repercussions all the way to South Tempe, the area's two resident City Council members say.

South Tempe's Doreen Garlid was one of two dissenting votes while Jennifer Adams voted with the majority in the 5-2 decision to proceed with negotiations after an 8 -hour meeting June 2 in which 100 people spoke and 220 written statements were read.

The vote to proceed does not ensure that the project will receive final approval from Tempe and be built, both Garlid and Adams emphasized, but it opens the door for more dialogue and negotiation while the team's developer and the city strive to reach an agreemet that could result in a contract.

Adams pointed out that while she voted yes, "This was simply a process vote."
"It was not a vote for the project itself," Adams said. "Our rules prevent city staff and city representatives (including City Council) from talking or negotia-

ting any and all aspects of a development without a formal vote to move forward. My vote was to simply bring all the issues surrounding this potential development into the open so we can start a public dialogue about its possible effects on our Tempe communities and businesses. I am looking forward to hearing more from our residents as it now starts to play out in the public arena."

While the Coyotes say they will pay for the project on 46 city-owned acres that would include a 16,000 seat arena to be the team's long-term home, 200room hotel, retail shops, restaurants and 1,680 residential units, there would be ancillary infrastructure expenses absorbed by the city.

The biggest sticking point for Garlid, she said, is a request by the National Hockey League team for a 30-
year property-tax abatement.
"I look at it as people who use the arena or events on that property will be driving on our streets, with our police officers directing traffic, and using city infrastructure and resources, and we're giving out those services without taking any money back in," Garlid said. "With the tax abatement, we'd end up not putting money into our General Fund to go back into paying for these things. That affects all of our residents, including South Tempe. I have a 4 -month-old grandson. He'd be 30 when the tax abatement ends. For me, I look at it in those simple terms.
"If we're putting out money and the city is not getting money back in, something else will have to give in

the city budget, and that can impact South Tempe."

The flip side would be an influx of jobs and sales-tax money from the development that could be astronomical for the city if Coyotes' projections are accurate. They say that over the first 30 years, the development would bring Tempe $\$ 13$ billion in economic impact, $\$ 215$ million in sales tax and 7,000 new jobs.

Garlid and Adams vowed to remain open minded as negotiations move forward and more information is gleaned by the city.

During the June 2 marathon meeting, there was strong support for the project from the large crowd, many tired of driving cross-Valley to Glendale to watch hockey.

There also were concerns expressed by many about the financial condition of the Coyotes. Team owner Alex

Meruelo said he would put up $\$ 40$ million in non-refundable earnest money to start remediation of the site a former landfill - and pledged \$2.1 billion in real estate as collateral for the bonds.

Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport officials, while not opposing the project, said they are uneasy about it, especially the residential portion, because of noise. The project would be roughly 10,000 feet east of the airport's runways.

A sports book is proposed as part of the development, which could negatively impact nearby Native America tribes that have similar amenities.

Barb Harris, a neighborhood advisory commission member, lives essentially across the street from the site and is uneasy about traffic volume.
"This specific area just isn't viable for the amount of traffic it could generate," Harris said.
"Right now, events at Tempe Town Lake cause quite a lot of traffic backups
along Rio Salado, and those are just a fraction of what a hockey game may produce. I can't even image 16,00020,000 at a game or concert. Where are they going to go if it's so backed up they can't get off the freeway at Priest?
"The thousands of us living within a half a mile of this development will be cursed with traffic jams and noise. I have faith in our City Council and staff that they will do all they can to investigate and give us all more answers."

Chandler's continuing commitment to public safety reflected in 2022-23 budget

The Chandler Police Department has great strides to improve in recent years amid very trying times. And we've got the data to back it. Over the past decade, the crime rate has dropped 37 percent per 1,000 people and response times for Priority 1 calls are the lowest they've been in that time frame. This is a testament to the incredible men and women who dedicate themselves to keeping Chandler safe.

But there's still much more to do.

Policing is constantly evolving, and that's even more true in today's world. My City Council colleagues and I are taking the necessary steps to make sure these successes continue. Our police officers need the right tools to respond in any situation.

Here are a few examples of how we're making this happen:

Today, we have more officers on the street than ever before. Last year, the Council approved funding to add 17 new officers and 15 over-hire officers in Fiscal Year 2021-22. The 2022-23 budget continuous funding for those over-hire positions, which are used to supplement staffing and to prepare for retirements.

The new budget also addresses a societal issue that continues to grow at an alarming rate: mental health. It fully funds a new, five-person behavioralhealth unit that will be dedicated to be-
havioral-health calls. These officers will receive special training so they are better equipped to respond to and deescalate these types of calls. Additionally, the budget funds a mental-health expert who will be embedded within the 911 dispatchers in our Communications Center.

Municipalities across the country are struggling to attract and retain qualified candidates. Unfortunately, we face the same challenges. But we're doing things much differently than other cities. Here's how:

In July 2021, we became the first Police Department in the Valley to offer hiring incentives, up to $\$ 5,000$. Since the program's inception, we've hired 44 qualified people. Now we're expanding that program to recruit nationally. Lateral officers who come to Chandler can receive up to $\$ 10,000$ in hiring bonuses and relocation assistance. A robust national marketing campaign has already begun.

The great news is we can do all of this for our Police Department while continuing to be a fiscally responsible city. In fact, the 2022-23 budget allots a $\$ 50$ million payment to help pay down Chandler's long-term financial obligation to the Public Safety Personnel Retirement System, which is our first responders' pension system. Once we pay off this debt, the city is projected to save $\$ 9$ million annually.

As we continue to navigate a changing world, I'm confident the Chandler Police Department is ready to take on any challenge. I thank each and every one of them for their commitment to our community.

## Tempe Diablos reward grads' achievements

The Tempe Diablos have awarded 27 scholarships to seniors at high schools in the city who plan to attend Arizona State University or a Maricopa County Community College.

For more than 20 years, the Diablos have been involved in promoting excellence among Tempe's top students, dating to three prominent Diablos who had a vision to establish a scholarship program with the belief that many of them would stay in Tempe and become its future leaders.

## YOUTH RESILIENCY WORKSHOPS



Every Wednesday in June and July 2022 from 1:00 p.m. -3:00 p.m. at the Innovation Center there will be a workshop focusing on toxic stress, coping skills, and resiliency. Building confidence, minimizing anxiety and depression, and developing protective factors against substance use.

## Small but mighty Aztec boys squad 5th in state track

C
orona del Sol High had only six athletes qualify for the Division 1 Boys Track and Field Championships at Mesa Community College, yet the Aztecs took home fifth in the state with 47 points.

Five of the six athletes qualified in more than one event and most of them saved their best performances of the season for last to elevate the Aztecs in the team standings.

Brett Wynn, a senior, was state champion in the high jump with a personal-best 6 feet, 8 inches, two inches higher than second-place finisher Anthony Meng of Chaparral, as Wynn placed in the top five in three events. Wynn also took fourth in the long jump with a leap of 22-3.5. Finally, he set a personal best in the triple jump at 45-6.5, for fifth place.

Jalen Walker, a senior, was state runner up in the shot put, heaving the 12 -pound ball a personal best 53
feet, 7 inches. He also placed 15th in the discus at 137-11.

David Staab, a senior, took fourth-place in the discus with a personal-record throw of 155-6. He placed ninth in the shot put at 46-8.

Alexander Lutz, a junior who qualified in both hurdles races, placed second in the 300-meter hurdles with a personal-record time of 38.94 seconds. Lutz was fifth in preliminaries in the 110 -meter hurdles but his false start in the finals disqualified him in that race.

Tyler Tisinger, a junior, had personal bests in three events. He clocked 1 minute, 53.76 seconds in the 800 meters, good for fifth place. He then placed 11th place in the 3,200 in $9: 33.62$. His $4: 25.27$ in the 1,600 was good for 13th place.

Senior Callum Rohrer ran a personal best 1:58.27 to take 11th in the 800.

Senior Jaden Shepherd qualified for the 100 and 200 meters. After winning the 100 in 11.08 seconds at the Desert Vista Last Chance Meet, he ran a personal best 10.89 in prelims at state to reach the final, where his 11.08 was good for eighth place.

Sheperd doubled in the 200, placing seventh in 22.30 , just off his fastest time this season of 22.29 on March 25 at the Red Mountain Rampage.

Senior Diego Diaz qualified to run in the 800 meters at state but did not advance out of the prelims. He ran a personal best 1:58.93 at the Desert Vista Last Chance Meet.

The Marcos de Niza boys track and field team placed 11th in the D3 state meet at Mesa Community College.

Jamaal Young, a junior, led the Padres' five qualifiers in two individual races and two relay events. Young was state runner up at 200 meters in 22.19 seconds, his personal best.
