



Dear "Speakout",

Flag Day! Tuesday, June 14, 2022, is Flag Day this year.

Considered essential to the American Revolution, Betsy Ross is credited with sewing the first United States flag.

The "Star Spangled Banner" was a poem written by Francis Scott Key on Wednesday, September 14, 1814, during the defense of Fort Mc Henry. Our flag's nickname is often referred to as "Old Glory" and was bestowed on our flag by a young sea captain named William Driver on Wednesday, March 17, 1824, which he proudly proclaimed "Old Glory" when he received a flag as a birthday present from his mother and a group of local young ladies.

Between 1777 and 1960 Congress passed several acts that changed the shape, design, and arrangement of our

flag to reflect the admission of each new state.

Today our flag consists of 13 horizontal stripes, seven red alternating with six white. The stripes represent the original thirteen colonies, and the white stars represent the 50 states of the Union. The colors of the flag are symbolic as red symbolizes hardiness and valor, white symbolizes purity and innocence, and blue represents vigilance, perseverance, and justice.

The Union is the blue background in the top left corner of our flag and is called the "upper hoist", which is the position of honor upon which the 50 stars of the Union are sewn or

appliqued.

Our flag is usually displayed from sunrise to sunset and should be raised briskly and lowered ceremoniously. Our flag should be displayed daily and, on all holidays, weather permitting, on or near the main administration buildings of all public institutions. It should also be displayed in or near every polling place on election days and in or near every schoolhouse during school days.

When our flag is raised or lowered as part of a ceremony, and as it passes by in parade or review, everyone, except those in uniform, should face the flag with their right hand over their heart. Our flag should never be dipped toward any person or object, nor should our flag ever touch

anything beneath it such as the ground.

When being marched, our American flag is to the marcher's right and observer's left. When displayed with a speaker's platform, "Old Glory" must be above and behind the speaker, and if mounted on a staff, it should be on the speaker's right.

The words to "Old Glory" are "I stand for peace, honor, truth and justice. I stand for freedom. I am confident; I am arrogant; I am proud. When I am flown with my fellow banners, my head is a little higher, my colors a little truer."

Properly disposing of an American flag is a very important duty of all Americans. When an organization such as the American Legion or Veterans of Foreign Wars retires a flag, they first Call the group to attention. A salute is ordered, and the entire group is lead in the "Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag". The leader of the color guard orders the flag retired. The flag is then slowly and ceremoniously lowered and respectfully folded in the customary triangle. The flag is then burned and disposed of with honor.

The next time you see our flag on display, please give her the due respect which she deserves. I would very much enjoy any comments which you may have. Lord willing, I will submit an article next week.

Dear "Speakout",

This letter is in response to Mr. Powell's June 5 letter on the subject of mass shootings.

In a society where this trauma is normal, it stands to reason that the trajectory which brought us here is vast and complex -- meaning, the solution will not fit on a bumper sticker or meme. Certainly it is worth asking if one is entitled to all the firepower one can afford as soon as they can see over the store counter, but we never will and oughtn't try to remove firearms from the working people.

We live in a nation that was born from the idea that white Christian men are entitled to all they can take, by any means necessary (our county was settled in part by the men who helped annihilate the Seneca villages here). Our identity, before it was conspicuous consumption, was -- and still is -- Violence.

We have money for war, but not healthcare. We can fund drone strikes, but not schools. We pour military equipment into municipal police departments, but cut budgets for social services and support services. This isn't about prayer; this is about priorities. With priorities like this, are we at all surprised that mass violence is normal?

We didn't get here overnight, or in one generation, or even ten. This isn't about the ten commandments or same sex marriage (like it or not, not everyone in the US is a Christian...). This is about all of us and what we have collectively decided to prioritize.

The silver lining there is that our priorities can change. Money for food, not bombs. Call therapists, not cops. Promote healthcare, not violence. This doesn't have to be normal any more.






