A Centennial Farm Program

MONTGOMERY-The

(ADAI) is
now accepting

annual Century
& Heritage (C&H)

Farm and Bicentennial Farm programs. ADAI created these programs to help recognize and celebrate family farms that have significantly impacted Alabama history and agriculture.

A Century Farm is one that has been in the same family continuously for at least 100 years and currently has agricultural activities on the farm. The farm must include at least 40 acres of land and be owned by the applicant or nominee. Over 700 farms across the state have been recognized by the C & H Farm program for their longtime contributions to Alabama agriculture.

ADAI is also accepting applications for the Bicentennial Farm program. The Bicentennial Farm program recognizes farms that have been owned and operated by the same family for 200 years or more. The farm must be at least 40 acres in size, owned by an Alabama

resident and have current agricultural activities. To date, 17 farms have been recognized by this program.

If your farm meets the qualifications for the 2022 C & H Farm program or Bicentennial Farm program, contact Amy Belcher at 334-240-7126 or by email amy.belcher@ agi.alabama.gov to receive an application. A copy of both applications are available on the ADAI's website at https://agi.alabama. gov/centuryheritage-bicentennialfarms/ along with sample applications to use as a guide. All applicants must complete the appropriate Ownership Registration Form and return it to ADAI by Friday, August

on social networking and gaming sites often post personal information including their deepest desires, likes and dislikes, real-time moods, pictures, videos, addresses, and phone numbers - for anyone to see.

Ťhaťs why iťs important to use privacy settings on all social media and gaming platforms as well as their mobile devices.

Depending on the platform, these settings help control privacy-related issues such as:

 Account privacy (who can see your child's

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profile, posts, photos and videos)

- Who is able to view contact information
- The ability to view your child's "friends" list
- Who can 'tag' or mention your child
- The audience your child chooses to share information with
- Who your child can communicate with (ex. can only communicate with friends)
- Activity status (when turned off, latest 'active' status is hidden)

Teach your children to block anyone they don't know in the physical world as its impossible to detect a disguised predator. If you feel you and/or someone you know are in danger, contact law enforcement immediately.

Remember, privacy settings only work if they are set to begin with, so please do not see the set of please do not overlook this critical step!

on our 2nd and 4th Amendment rights is a moving locomotive looking for a busy intersection.


This same government freely uses the words "anti-government," "extremist," "right wing," and "terrorist" interchangeably. THAT should be a concern.

Is Skin Cancer Hereditary?

Dear Savvy Senior,

Is skin cancer hereditary? My 63-year-old brother died of melanoma last year, and I'm wondering if I'm at higher risk. Younger Sister

Dear Younger,

While long-term sun exposure and sunburns are the biggest risk factors for melanoma - the deadliest form of skin cancer having a sibling or parent with melanoma does indeed increase your risk, according to the Skin Cancer Foundation.

Each year, around 100,000 Americans are diagnosed with melanoma, and about 7,500 people will die from it. While anyone can get it, those most often diagnosed are Caucasians, age 50 and older. And those with the highest risk are people with red or blond hair, blue or green eyes, fair skin, freckles, moles, a family history of skin cancer and those who had blistering sunburns in their youth.

Skin Exams

The best way you can guard against melanoma and other skin cancers (basal and squamous cell carcinomas) is to protect yourself from the sun, and if you're over age 50, get a full-body skin exam done by a dermatologist every year, especially if you're high risk.

Self-examinations done every month or so is also a smart way to detect early problems. Using mirrors, check the front and backside of your entire body, including the tops and undersides of your arms and hands, between your toes and the soles of your feet, your neck, scalp and buttocks.

Be on the lookout for new growths, moles that have changed, or sores that don't heal, and follow the ABCDE rule when examining suspicious moles.

- Asymmetry: One half of a mole doesn't match the other.
- Border: The border is blurred or ragged.
- Color: The mole has uneven colors, often shades of brown, tan or black, with patches of pink, red, white or blue.
- Diameter: The lesion is new or at least a quarter inch in
- Evolving: The mole is changing in size, shape or color.

For more self-examination tips and actual pictures of what to look for, see SpotSkinCancer.org or use a skin cancer detection app like Miiskin.com, MoleMapper.org or SkinVision.com.

In the spring and summer, there are also a variety of places that offer free skin cancer screenings, like the American Academy of Dermatology (spotskincancer.org) and the American Society for Dermatologic Surgery (//asds.net/ skincancerscreening.aspx), which offer screenings done by volunteer dermatologists across the U.S.

Sun Protection

Even though you can't change your skin or family history, there are some proven strategies that can help you protect yourself.

For starters, when you go outside put-on broad-spectrum SPF 30, water-resistant sunscreen on both sunny and cloudy days. If you don't like the rub-on lotions, try the continuous spray-on sunscreens which are easier to apply and re-apply and less messy. Also, seek the shade when rays are most intense between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

You can also protect your skin by wearing a wide-brimmed hat, and long sleeves and pants when possible. The best clothing options are tightly woven fabrics that help prevent the sun's rays from reaching your skin, or you can wash in an invisible shield sun protection into your clothes with SunGuard laundry additive (see *sunguarduv.com*). You can even buy a variety of lightweight clothing and hats that offer maximum UV protection in their fabric. Coolibar.com and SunPrecautions. *com* are two good sites that offer these products.

Treatments

If caught early, melanoma is nearly 100 percent curable. But if it's not, the cancer can advance and spread to other parts of the body where it becomes hard to treat and can be fatal. Standard early treatment for melanoma is surgical removal. In advanced cases, however, immunotherapies and targeted therapies have shown positive results, or chemotherapy and radiation may be used.

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

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I have to take an FCE. What is it and why do I have to take it? Charles - Sheffield, AL

FCE stands for Functional Capacity Evaluation. They are physical tests that measure a person's functional capacity in a way that is used and understood by people who do vocational analysis.

The Social Security Administrations uses vocational experts to determine what jobs in the national economy a person could do if they have certain physical limitations due to an accident, injury or illness.

All jobs have some mental and physical requirements. Jobs are classified into four main categories of physical demand beginning with sedentary which is 10 pounds or less and then light, 20 pounds,

medium, 50 pounds and heavy which requires lifting 100 pounds or more.

 $T\bar{h}is$ does not address the skill level or educational requirements of a job.

În workers compensation, if a worker through injury can not perform the physical demands of their job or if there is a question about that, a doctor will order an FCE. An FCE will measure the ability to lift, carry, bend, squat, stoop, and kneel. The FCE will address reaching overhead. It will address pushing and pulling with the arms as well as balance. The FCE is the measure a person's physical functional capacity over an 8-hour work-day and 40-hour week.

Because FCEs are almost always ordered by the employer, the examiner who tests the injured worker is almost always conservative and the person administering the test looks for inconsistent effort. There are a number of tests that look for symptom exaggeration. There are scales that provide a reliability profile. They check the heart rate and the grip strength from hand to hand. At least half of the test is dedicated to proving that the injured worker did not give their best effort.

I always tell my clients to give good effort but not so much that they could not come back and repeat the test the next day. A lot of people could pull a loved one out of a burning building, but few people could do the work of being a fireman. This test is looking for consistency over a 40-hour week.

A vocational specialist will take into consideration the age, education, training and experience of an injured worker and use their functional capacity evaluation to determine the amount of loss they have sustained. This loss is often stated in terms of reduced wages and a loss of the number of jobs available to a worker with impaired physical function.

Buckle up, drive safely, and as always, your

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

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Do I have to sign up for Medicare Part B when I turn 65 if I'm still employed? This is one of the questions we get asked the most. In most cases the answer to this is "no". When you turn 65, if you are still working and on your employer's health insurance plan you probably will not need Medicare Part B. I say probably because most employer plans do not file on Medicare if you have a claim. Because you have to pay a premium for Part B, Medicare does not require a person to sign up for Part B as long as you are on your employer's plan. Also, because the rules can be different for companies with less than 20 employees, the safest thing to do is check with the benefits coordinator at your place of employment for guidance or give us a call at our office.

I am on Medicare and Social Security Disability. I'm turning 65 soon. What are my options? Once you reach the age of 65 you have many more options than before. As you know if you go on Medicare and you are under the age of 65 your options for health plans are limited. When you turn 65 you will have another open enrollment period to sign up for any plan you wish to get. In other words, just because you are already on Medicare does not prohibit you from having all the options a person not on Medicare and turning 65 would have.

Other changes have an impersonal element such as texting and emailing.

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

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THE TEXT MESSAGE MAY START WITH AN INNOCUOUS, "HEY, GEORGE. We're gathering up a team for 18 holes. You in"? Or it may be a bit more suggestive such as, "I was thinking we could watch a movie and my

hand might just fall onto your lap, tee-hee" Sometimes it may appear as a Tinder (online dating app) proposal such as, "Hey, we matched on Tinder. How are you?"



Or you may receive a text saying, simply, "Hello." Most of us would simply respond, "Wrong number" or, "Who is this?" If you were to do that, the scammer will attempt to

carry on a conversation with you. "She" may send you a sexy picture or ask you general questions designed to build a relationship with you and gain your trust.

Sometimes these very attractive, talkative scammers (who, in actuality, are probably large, hairy guys from another country) will try to get you to join an online dating app, appeal to your lonesomeness, gain your trust, then "borrow" thousands of dollars from you. Sometimes they will send you a dirty picture and ask you to do the same. If you were to do

that, they might threaten to send your dirty picture to all your friends unless you send them some money.

These scammers sometimes can lure you in because they have some inside information about you that makes them appear to be more legitimate. This is probably the result of data breaches or even legitimate online directories such as Whitepages.com that list your name, address, and phone number, income, and children's names

Regardless of the scenario, a random text from a stranger

should immediately invoke extreme skepticism. I do not recommend you engage with them. Replying can often put you on a "live number" list that will result in being inundated with these messages.

My wife has been getting a few phishing texts that read something like, "Your credit card has been charged \$1800 for a new iPad. Please click the following link to dispute the charge on Amazon" followed by a link to some website. If you were to click on the link, it will ask you to sign into your Amazon account. If you were silly enough to do that, you'd be giving up your sign-in information to scammers who will then ACTUALLY try to order an expensive iPad from your account. The link can also contain a virus or other

malicious code so please don't click on it.

The bottom line is that scammers know that emails are often filtered and many of us have wisened-up to email scams. Text messages, on the other hand, are a little more personal which makes them appear a little more legitimate which makes them most effective for scammers. The fix is to simply ignore the text or, better yet, "long press" on the text message and block that number. Be careful out there.

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

WHO is Still in Left Field

World The Health Organization is a laughing stock, a token arm of the Chinese government that got very little right about the COVID-19 virus. That has been on full display for two years. Now it is pontificating about yet another virus.

Monkeypox has been endemic in west and central Africa for decades. However, cases have been



primarily associated with animals and spillover animals, from rather human-to-human transmission.

The US had one of the past outbreaks outside African countries 2003. Cases were linked to contact with animals carrying the virus. While it is still unclear how monkeypox entered humans in the current outbreak, the virus has been spreading through close, intimate contact -- a change from earlier episodes.

Monkeypox reportedly not a sexually transmitted disease, but one spread by skin-to-skin contact with someone who has monkeypox sores, as well as by direct contact with materials that have touched body fluids or

sores, including clothing.
The WHO director directorgeneral, Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, said there have been more than 1,600 confirmed cases worldwide and 72 deaths.

There have been 65 confirmed monkeypox cases in the US and no deaths as of June 13, according to the CDC. recent outbreak in Chicago was linked to the

International Mr. Leather conference, a BDSM event May 26-30.

More than international scientists wrote an open letter last week stating there was an "urgent need for a nondiscriminatory and non-stigmatizing" name for monkeypox. They argued that news reports referring to the virus as an "African" virus were discriminatory, stigmatizing, and racist.

WHO's The organizational guidelines apparently recommend against using geographic regions and animal names describe diseasecausing pathogens.

Okay, so which is it? -Is it the association with monkeys that makes the name racist or the association with Africa?

This seems like another stretch of wokeness just to earn some positive press coverage.
