"My Heart Will Always Be Here"

Dr. Ann Buechel Haack **Retires on June 30th** By: Missy Koehler

Dr. Ann Buechel Haack will be leaving the Elkhart Lake- Glenbeulah School district at the end of June after being a part of the school for 51 years. "I was a student for 13 years and a staff member for 38 years" Buechel Haack said. It was the beginning of June that I had the opportunity to sit down with my former seventh grade teacher to talk with her about her journey with the district. Her office was decorated

with cards, drawings, wall hangings and gifts given to her throughout the years from students, as well as her, always present, dish of candy call-



ing out for a piece to be grabbed. It was a display of things you would find in an office of a proud parent. And that is what Buechel Haack likens herself to. "I always wanted oodles of my own kids, and really, I've ended up having thousands of kids over the years. I've always viewed that the kids of this district are my own kids and I'm most proud that all our kids feel like they have someone they can go to," she said. Twice she's had kids come live with her and her husband, Tim, because of difficult circumstances. "I really wanted each kid to find success and feel a part of our Resorter family," Buechel Haack said. And it also wasn't unusual for new teachers to board for free at her home. It was her open-door policy, not only in her office, but also her house that showcased her caring nature. Dr. Buechel Haack's journey started where it will be ending. She grew up in the big, white house on the corner of the four way stop in Elkhart Lake until her family moved a few houses over her freshman year. She moved back into the house after she got married and has lived there ever since. Her very first memory of school is when her neighbor, Randy "Smiley" Feldmann took her for Show and Tell. "He didn't take me with him, he took me AS his Show and Tell," she laughed. It was at that very moment she knew that she loved going to school and that she wanted to be a teacher. However, in her 1979 yearbook it was predicted that she would go on to be a great pediatrician and she did end up enrolling at UW-Madison as a Pre-med student. It was three weeks before she was to start when her mom, Joanie, pulled her aside and said "what are you doing? You've always wanted to be a teacher so why aren't you doing it?" A lesson learned from her mother was

that you know your passions and dreams better than anyone else, so follow them. Buechel Haack heeded the wisdom of her mom and then enrolled at UW-Oshkosh where she earned her undergraduate and graduate degrees and, years later, she did become a doctor. She earned her Doctorate in Educational Administration from Marian University.

Buechel Haack was inspired by her mother, Joanie, as well as countless teachers she's had and worked with along the way. One of those being Carlos Kreibich. Kreibich was Buechel Haack's seventh grade teacher and ended up being her coworker later in life when she took the teaching job that then principal, Neva Hodge, offered her. "When I first applied at Elkhart, I actually applied for the fourth-grade job, but Neva Hodge told me she had a job that she thought I would like even better teaching seventh grade with Mr. Kreibich." Buechel Haack said. Buechel Haack started teaching in the middle school with Kreibich in 1984 and then was a co-principal with Kreibich until his retirement in 2007. "Annie always had the kids say that "seventh grade is the best year of my life", well for me teaching seventh grade with Annie were the best years of my professional career." Kreibich said. He always knew that Buechel Haack had the characteristics to succeed. "She challenges students, teachers, staff, and herself to every day be better than the previous day. She brings the entire district's talents together like a conductor of a symphony and that brings a smile to my face." Kreibich said. Buechel Haack would go on to take over the district administrator role from Jerry Smith in 2008 with encouragement from Kreibich and others.

When asked what's she most proud of during her tenure she says it's the culture that's been created. "Our culture has really grown that I think anyone can ask what we are going to do in this district and the answer is we are going to do what's best for the kids." Buechel Haack said. She's also proud of the family feel that exists when you are a Resorter. "The family feel we've developed and that we are going to be there for each other. It's the Resorter family whether it is our kids, kid's family, or the community. It's really a partnership," she said. Many of Buechel Haack's community connections were fostered when she bartended for 30 years at Quit Qui Oc Golf Club in Elkhart Lake. "My Tuesday night league always knew the students had my phone number at Quit Qui Oc and that they'd have to wait while I helped someone with math homework on the phone. And sometimes it was their kid I was helping." Buechel Haack said. Although the school is where she spent her days and many nights, her volunteerism throughout the community is unmatched. The number of organizations she has touched in some way, shape or

form is too many to list. She's sat on many different boards including the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce board where she has been a board member for more than 16 years. Chamber board President Todd Smith has enjoyed working with Buechel Haack throughout the years. "I have always thought of Ann being a part of the fabric of the Elkhart Lake community" Smith said.

Buechel Haack said she'd be remiss if she didn't mention some important people in her life that made her journey a successful one. Her husband, Tim and her whole family have given her so much support. "Tim didn't sign up for any of this when we got married, I was a teacher and that's what I always planned to be, but surprise," she said. She also wants to give a huge thank you to the staff, school board, students, families, and the Elkhart Lake – Glenbeulah community.

And although Buechel Haack looks forward to her first snow day where she

can look out the window and just enjoy the beauty of it without having to worry about what decision should be made about closing school, the feelings Dr. Buechel Haack will have on her last day at school will be heartfelt. "I know it's time. I know it's time for somebody else to move the district forward and to continue to build. I've given all I can give, but I'm also going to be feeling like I'm leaving a big part of me behind. My heart will always be here." she said. Thank you Dr. Buechel Haack for your dedication to our school district, to our community and to our kids. Our school and community are better places because of you. And, yes, seventh grade was the best year of my life. Enjoy your well-deserved retirement!

June Mystery Photo Answer



The photo Is an early view of the en-trance to the Schwartz Hotel

On the left is the Siebkin's lake cottage.On the right is the main building and straight in is the Dining room. This is pre1929 because the pillars are not there. They stood on either side of the entrance. It is possible that it was called the

Lake House at that time. It became the Schwartz hotel around 1890. In 1946 it was purchased by Bill Geftman.

In 1951 Mr Geftman Hired My Father, Jimmy Karras, as the Chef. He remained as the chef and dining room manager every summer. for 37 years until 1988. He fed 2-300 people 3 meals a day. In the winter we returned to Miami FL. where he was a chef at the Royal Palm Hotel on Miami Beach In 1982 Mr. Geftman died and the

hotel was sold to Bob Brickman and the name changed to Barefoot Bay. It later became Victorian Village then the Shore Club. (If you have seen the movie Dirty Dancing, this was the Schwartz Hotel complete with a nightclub).

In 1956, as a 13 yo boy, I started Capt' Tom's Boat Rental with 4 row boats on the Schwartz beach. Some of the old timer Elkhart Lake people will remember. My Brother in Law, Jim Benson, and I ran it with our sons until 1988 when we turned it over to Doug Brown of Water Sports who continues to provide boating for the people of Elkhart Lake.

I met My wife of 58 years (then France

Benson of Elkhart Lake) in 1957 at the age of 14 years. We had a summer romance every summer until 1962 when I entered the Ú of W Madison. We married in 1964 at the Schwartz Hotel. Capt' Tom's Put me through college and Medical school.

After we retired Capt' Tom's in 1988,Jim Benson continued to operate the Tour boat "The Elkhart Queen" Until 2 years ago. Many Elkhart residents have taken his 1

hour tour around the lake.

So you can see that our family history is strongly tied to the Schwartz Hotel.

Welcome New Member | Meet New Owners

There is no doubt why words such as "unique" and "creative" are being used to describe both The Fig & The Pheasant and Moxie Cafe in downtown Plymouth-just take into consideration the owners of these two businesses.

Patrick and Ronna O'Toole spent 10

years living and working abroad and starting their family in places such as Norway, Dubai and Hong Kong, and they



have brought those experiences and others with them to these two local businesses.

Ronna is originally from the Chicago area and Patrick from San Francisco. They first met in Eureka, California. Patrick has always worked in the food and beverage industry and also wanted to travel, so they took their skills on something of a world tour for a decade.

Ronna said the time came when they wanted more of a home base and they always enjoyed America's Midwest. An opportunity in Lexington, Kentucky brought the family back to the States, and that was followed by Patrick becoming the executive chef and director of culinary at The Osthoff in Elkhart Lake. At the same time, Ronna said, "We began to look for a business for ourselves."

In 2019 the opportunity arose for the couple to purchase the former 52 Stafford in Plymouth, and in October of that year they became the owners of what is now known as The Fig & The Pheasant.

Despite becoming owners of the establishment just months before the COVID-19 pandemic hit, Ronna said, "We've had a lot of growth every year because we have our eyes open to possibilities."

One of those possibilities arose last year when the O'Tooles decided to open a second business just across Stafford Street from The Fig & The Pheasant. Moxie is a coffee house, cafe and caterer which-not surprisingly-is as eclectic as The Fig & The Pheasant.

While many area residents know The Fig & The Pheasant for its dining, some people might be surprised to learn it also is a 19-room hotel which is a National Registered Historic Hotel. Managed by Delanie Rogers, the guest rooms aim to "express the simple, understated elegance of a time when time itself moved more slowly," according to The Fig & The Pheasant's website. Ronna said a key reason why the business was able to weather the storm of the pandemic is because Plymouth area businesses and industries supported their local establishment by having visiting executives stay at the hotel. The Fig & The Pheasant works to return that sentiment, with Ronna saying, "It's important for us to be part of the community. We know our success depends on the people in the community."

In addition to the hotel which is part of the building constructed in 1892, The Fig & The Pheasant also serves multiple

other roles in the community—dining, bistro, pub, caterer and event host.

Ronna describes the establishment's cuisine with words such as upscale, seasonal, fresh and French-based. High Wages and High Employment Rates After Graduation

VINTAGE WEEKEND PARKING AND STREET CLOSURES JULY 15TH & 16TH

Vintage weekend takes place on Friday, July 15th & Saturday, July, 16th, 2022. As you know, the Village will have a very large crowd, especially Friday night. The Village once again will be implementing detours and road closures on July 15th & 16th, 2022 for the Vintage Concours. There are no changes this year. The Village will be posting no parking in the normal area by Siebkens Resort and then extending the no parking area further on S. Lake Street all the way to Rhine Street. One side of S. East Street will also be posted no parking. The Concours will again stretch all the way to the corner of S. Lake Street and Square Street.

The major road closings will be E. Rhine Street from Lincoln Street to the intersection of Gottfried and Pine Streets. All roads that intersect with E. Rhine Street will also be closed as to allow no traffic onto E. Rhine during the closure time. In addition, S. Lake and S. East Streets will be closed. All closures will start at 3:00 p.m. and last until approximately 9:00 p.m.

If you are a resident and need to enter the closure area that anytime from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. please contact the Village offices before July 13 to arrange for an access pass. This pass will let officers and those assisting with traffic know that you are allowed to enter the closed area to get to your residence or business. Please keep in mind that from 5:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. no vehicular traffic will be allowed in the closed area (all of S. Lake, Elm, and S. East Streets), even with an access pass, due to the concours occurring.

AMENDING TID #4 AND ANNEXATION

The Village Planning Commission has met, as well as the Joint Review Board to begin the process of amending TID #4. The Village will take up this matter at their second meeting in July. They will then pass their recommendation to the Joint Review Board which will meet at the end of July. The Village is also working on annexing 32 acres from the Town of Rhine. This land is adjacent to County Road A and the old County shed property. This annexation will be on the agenda for approval at the Village Board on July 5th. Manufacturing, Empower Acupuncture, and a new Tourism welcome sign. The Commission members give a lot of their time to work through the issues that come before them; the Village thanks them for this service.

VILLAGE-WIDE REVALUATION

The State of Wisconsin sets standards that all communities in the State must be valued at 100% of market value or be kept within 10% of that value. The Village has fallen below these standards. The last revaluation was done in 2008. The Village has contracted with Grota Appraisals to have all properties assessed at 100% of market value as of January 1, 2023. Grota will be sending letters out to all property owners in the coming month about the process. The Village has approved an exterior inspection process only. They will not be going inside of properties. Grota will begin their work this summer, but these values will not be in effect until the December 2023 tax bill. A badge with photo ID will be worn by assessment staff while in the field. If you have any questions, please contact Jessica at 920-876-2122.

BOATING REGULATIONS

1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 pm-10 am each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the 2nd Sunday of June and ending the 3rd Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

6. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 M.P.H. on the water.

BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE

The Beautification Committee volunteers have done a great job weeding the various bds around the Village. We recently mulched the garden beds. The Village has also hired two part-time employees for the summer to help with the upkeep of the garden beds and the lawn mowing. These employees (Darren Lindstrom & Kean O'Neil) have been working with the full-time public works crew (Pat, Tyler, & Steve) doing a great job in keeping the Village looking its best. We are always looking for more volunteers. Please consider spending about 15-20 hours a year helping us keep the gardens in great shape. We will continue working throughout the downtown area planting and upkeeping our gardens. Volunteers are residents of both the village and the Town of Rhine. Thanks for making lake that should be used for guests. Some of the other regulations include:

No person shall allow a dog to be on any public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

No person shall use or possess beverages containing alcohol on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

No person shall ignite nor maintain fires of any kind on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

No person shall have a pop-up tent, canopy, or table on the public beaches owned by the Village.

BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED

If you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Permits must be obtained prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

LEASH LAW

A reminder that the Village has a leash ordinance. Please keep your pets on leashes when walking the Village sidewalk & pedestrian walkway. Dogs are also generally not allowed in Village parks.

VILLAGE ORDINANCE 8.32 ANIMAL FECES

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!!

Laude System In Use

Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School has abandoned the traditional Valedictorian/Salutatorian designations for graduating seniors in favor of the Laude System.

Typically, the Laude System recognizes three levels of honor graduation: Cum Laude (with praise), Magna Cum Laude (with great honor) and Summa Cum Laude (with highest honor).

The laude score is based on a formula in which students are rewarded for taking classes with higher rigor. The program is based on a two tier system: tier 1 worth 1 point per semester awarded to transcripted and AP courses, and tier 2 worth .5 points per semester awarded to advanced standing and teacher selected courses.

Cum Laude - 7 to 10.5 points; Magna Cum Laude - 11 to 14.5; and Summa Cum Laude - Greater than 15 points.

A minimum GPA of 3.25/4.00 is needed in order for a student to be recognized in the laude system.
