


Bedford County and its towns

Bedford County's landscape will invite you; its wildlife enchant you, and its people welcome you. Economically diverse and committed to better tomorrows, Bedford County has been evolving since its establishment in 1807 when the governor split Rutherford County into two counties, at residents' request. Rich in history, education, agriculture,

and tourism, everything you need is nearby. The Nashville and St. Louis Railway carried the county into a new era, establishing depot towns to attract trade, tourism, and traditions. Continuing the momentum, the county has become home to a new distillery, festivals, small businesses, and residents seeking a more gentle way of life.



Shelbyville

Named for Major General Isaac Shelby of the Revolutionary War, Shelbyville is at the heart of good living. Float or fish the Duck River, tour Nearest Green Distillery, or take in a horse show. Better yet, make Shelbyville your home! Enjoy small-town life where family, community, and forward thinking connect.



Wartrace

Foundational to Bedford County's walking horse industry, the breed's first celebration was held in 1939 on the town's square. Historical homes and buildings testify to the town's heritage. Approximately 140 of them are on the National Register of Historic Places. Life at a slower pace, and interstate access offers the best of both worlds.

Bell Buckle

Once the largest livestock shipping depot between Nashville & Chattanooga, Bell Buckle's early days were characterized by economics and education. According to tennesseency-clopedia.net, Bell Buckle is one of the most visited railroad towns in Tennessee. The Webb Art and Craft Festival, and shops and restaurants on its square draw year-round crowds.



Normandy

Incorporated in 1858, Normandy is a town shaped in its formative years by the Nashville & Chattanooga railroad expansion in Bedford County. The 1976 completion of Normandy Dam, and the opening of the fish hatchery transformed Normandy from a railroad town to a favorite stop for recreational camping, fishing, and watersports.

Unionville

Founded in approximately 1827 and home to more than 2,100 residents, Unionville is a tight-knit community where everyone knows your name. The birthplace of Tennessee's Governor Jim Nance McCord, Unionville's name resulted from uniting two different post offices into one. Its schools, appropriately named Community, further unite the small town.

Tests for Driver's License and/ or permits are given at the driver's license station. 200 Dover Street, Suite 108, Shelbyville (Located rear of building) every Monday - Friday from 8:30 a.m. - 5 p.m. All testing is finished by 3:30 p.m. You must furnish the car for taking the test. You can obtain a manual to study before you take the test by going by the driver's license station. Applicants must show proof of US citizenship, proof of any name change, two proofs of TN residency with name (NO P.O. BOXES), and proof of social security number. *No road tests performed in bad weather.

Pet Laws

The ordinance regarding pet laws within the city limits of Shelbyville states that all dogs must be confined or controlled by a leash, and all pets should be given rabies shots and must wear tags indicating they have had these shots. If, for any reason, an animal needs to be picked up off the street. one can call the Animal Control Office number, (931) 684-6552. Rabies clinics are sponsored by Middle Tennessee Spay & Neuter Clinic during the fall of each year and are announced in the newspaper and on the local radio stations. Rabies shots are given by any of the veterinarians in the city throughout the year.

If you have moved to this area from outside of the state, you need to apply for a title and a Tennessee license plate. You should make the purchase as soon as possible. These licenses may be obtained from the County Court Clerk's Office,

Room 104, in the Bedford County Courthouse Annex on the square. The office is open Monday - Friday 8 a.m. - 4 p.m., and Saturday from 8 a.m. to noon. Registration and proof of insurance must be in the glove box of the vehicle at all times.

Voting Laws

Newcomers to the city and County may register to vote after living in the state of Tennessee as soon as they become residents. Tennessee is the only state that has no durational requirement for becoming a resident. The Election Commissioner's Office is located in the basement of the Bedford County Annex. Anyone who is 18 years of age or who will be 18 on the day of the next election, can register to vote. The books for voter registration are closed 30 days before an election. The hours of the Election Commission Office are 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Any registered voter can vote early.





Fawn Weaver is using whiskey to better the lives of BIPOC.

A

picture may be worth a thousand words, but Fawn Weaver and her team are blazing a trail inspired by a man of whom no photographs exist. As told in a 2016 article by Clay Risen, published in the New York Times, Nearest Green's story captured Weaver's attention. It launched a brand determined to build a new future for an overlooked minority of distillers.

The article revealed the underexposed fact that Green, a slave who was later emancipated, taught the craft of distillery to Jack Daniel, the world-renowned whiskey distiller. A surprising explanation appeared after speaking to people in the Lynchburg community and with Green's descendants. The friendship of a slave and a young white orphan was not a surprise or unthinkable within the Moore County community.

A 2017 article at tennessean.com states, "What Weaver began to discover was that Lynchburg, at the time of Jack Daniel and Nearest Green, was perhaps a more progressive place than most — surrounded by the South's racial tension, but in some ways, less susceptible to it."

Weaver's interest led to countless hours of research and interviews and to the original farm of preacher/distiller Dan Call, where Nearest worked while training Jack in what has become known as The Lincoln County Process. Weaver and her husband purchased the old 313-acre Call farm, where the original Jack Daniel's Distillery was located. The two-room dogtrot cabin—where Green lived during the Civil War—and the Greek Revival home—where Call and Daniel once lived—have



been rebuilt by the same construction team that restored Daniel's original office and other historic buildings around Lynchburg. The original spring, where the water for early bottles of Old No. 7 flowed, can still be seen pouring gallons of water out 24 hours a day.

This immersion in Green's story led Weaver to have the histories of Jack Daniel's whiskey and the spirits world updated to include the story of the first known black master distiller. And that, she knew, would be only the beginning of how Green's story could change the world.

Weaver asked Green's descendants how they felt he could best be honored. "With his name on his own bottle," a descendant replied.

And from there, Green's legacy and influence have evolved under Weaver's leadership.

Weaver created the Nearest Green Foundation to preserve and honor the history of the distiller. The Foundation erected a permanent memorial for Green at Lynchburg's Highview Cemetery and created a scholarship fund for Green's descendants.

Of this, Uncle Nearest Premium Whiskey was born and has become the fastest-growing whiskey brand in U.S. history.

The portfolio is the Most-Awarded American Whiskey or Bourbon of 2019, 2020, and 2021, with nearly 380 awards and accolades since the brand's 2017 launch, including 46 Best in Class honors. Uncle Nearest is currently available in all 50 states and 12 countries and is sold in more than 25,000 stores, bars, hotels, and restaurants.

Although the whiskey production was original-

ly sourced using the Uncle Nearest process, Uncle Nearest is now bottling their own 100% distilled, aged whiskey through a partner facility. The whiskey will eventually be distilled at the Uncle Nearest headquarters at Shelbyville's former Sand Creek Farm on U.S. Highway 231 North. According to its website, "Every bit of our 323-acre, four-phase, \$50 million build-out is a master class in storytelling and history-making."

Tours of the Uncle Nearest facility are now conducted on weekends, and the distillery has become a significant stop on the Tennessee Whiskey Trail. Visitors will find a welcome center, the world's first non-alcoholic speakeasy, barbecue restaurant, tasting room, and more. Tours can be booked online at unclenearest.com.

Looking ahead and expanding the influence

of Green, Weaver's vision has grown to include securing the future of entrepreneurship for those historically overlooked.

The Uncle Nearest leadership team is 100% female in an industry that males have historically led. An article in the May 2021 issue of American Whiskey called roll: CEO & founder, Fawn Weaver; Kate Jerkens, chief business officer; Sherrie Moore, director of whiskey operations; Nearest's great, great-granddaughter, Victoria Eady Butler, master blender; and Lucia Creed, marketing vice president.

After reviewing Uncle Nearest's employment applicants, Weaver noticed the scarcity of applications from people of color with any spirits experience. Recognizing the need for access to training, Weaver and Jack Daniel's united and formed the Nearest & Jack Advancement Initiative and instituted a distilling school in cooperation with Motlow State Community College.

This fund provides a leadership acceleration program that offers apprenticeships to black industry members, allowing them to train under the country's top distillers. It includes a business incubation program that will give black-owned spirits brands access to funding, branding, capital, marketing firms, and distribution networks.

In addition, to foster diversity and advance black, indigenous people, and people of color leadership in the American whiskey space, Weaver has created the Uncle Nearest Venture Fund. The \$50 million investment fund's first priority is black-owned spirit brands. The fund will also consider any brand founded or led by a woman or person of color, according to the June 2, 2021 story in Black Enterprise.

In a 2021 New York Times story, Weaver said, "I am looking for the brands that have the ability to be the next Uncle Nearest. What that means to me is they are not building to flip; they're not building to sell. They're building to create generational wealth."

Now a Shelbyville resident, Weaver pours promise and opportunity into the community and the world at large. Considering the amount of ground covered by Weaver since beginning the journey in 2017, the sky's the limit!

That's how we make sure that his legacy is not only cemented, but it continues on beyond us to the next generation."

Narket and Diner in Bell Buckle. Purdom began working at the country diner right out of high school. He continued to work there while he put himself through college and later Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) school. Purdom's original intention for working at the diner was solely a financial decision. He wanted to create a bit of cash flow for himself. However, when Ryan got a shot at holding the tongs himself, he wound up falling in love with the craft of preparing mouth-watering meals. More specifically, Purdom grew a knack for smoking meats to perfection.

After completing school, Purdom went to work full-time in Rutherford County as an EMT. However, he still had a desire to cook. Therefore, his next step towards honing his craft was participating in barbecue competitions. Purdom won all kinds of awards, including a first-place title at Murfreesboro's BBQ Festival. Although Purdom was having a lot of fun competing, it became costly! Between the entry fees and the cost of meat, Purdom shared that he lost about \$300 to \$500 at each competition. He started cooking in bulk and selling what he made to help pay for the competitions. Orders started coming in so frequently and steadily that Purdom upgraded his setup to a food truck complete with two smoker trailers. Thus, Purdom's BBQ was officially born. Purdom shared that he and his wife Karen's short-term goal for the barbecue business is to find a permanent location for their truck. A long-term dream would be purchasing multiple trucks to create a fleet and opening up a brick-and-mortar location. Ryan expressed, "I don't know if we'll ever get there, but I never knew we'd get to where we are now.'

Most recently, the couple has been hired to serve their barbecue at many different events including more than 20 weddings this year alone. They are proud of the growth of their business and have no plans to slow down anytime soon.

When Danielle found herself finishing up her time at Belmont University, she realized how much she had come to love Tennessee.





Improving the Industrial Park

The Shelbyville-Bedford Partnership is tasked with economic and community development

The Shelbyville-Bedford Partnership is tasked with economic and community development. A component of the economic development mission includes industrial recruitment for the Shelbyville and Bedford Industrial Park. Shelbyville and Bedford County jointly support an industrial park in the county's northwest corner. The park's general oversight and operations fall under a five-member appointed board of directors composed of city and county representatives.

Successful industrial recruitment requires the completion of site improvements known to foster growth

within an industrial park. The Shelbyville-Bedford Partnership and 231 Board work together to facilitate the best circumstances for success in the park. The list of stakeholders interested in the success of the park at the state and local level include; the City of Shelbyville, County of Bedford, Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA), Tennessee Department of Econom-

ic and Community Development (TDECD), Middle Tennessee Industrial Development Authority (MTI-DA), South Central Development District (SCDD), Shelbyville-Bedford Partnership (SBP) and others. The Bedford County Fire Department, Tax Assessor's Office, Register of Deeds, and Bedford County Trustee's Office are also on the list offering appropriate support.

Site Development Grants from TDECD with a matching portion from the city and county helped the site's marketability this spring and summer. The Partnership saw the need for funding to continue cleaning up and enhancing the industrial park property, recognizing that clearing the site makes for better visibility for line of sight viewing during

prospect visits. Funding this spring paid for vegetation and fence row clearing, road viewing extensions, and the start of a building foundation, known as a pad. A pad is a precursor to a speculative building. Most successful communities in our geographic area already have speculative buildings. One of the communities widely regarded as successful is on its seventh speculative building.

When a company shows interest in an industrial park, the visitors are commonly referred to as prospects. Site visits are an opportunity for the community to present its best possible case for the prospective visitors to lo-

cate here. The community focus during a site visit is to show that all the expected improvements have been invested in the park. Funds from federal, state, and local stakeholders allow for improvements to the park to show well and function well in the end.

Nothing guarantees success in recruitment, but there is a checklist of items for best prac-

tices to reach success. The 231 Board of Directors and the Partnership are focused on achieving items on the best practices list with the guidance of our stakeholders.

The immediate plan is to continue to engage our stake-holders and partners to build a competitive and winning industrial park. Job growth within a community is key to economic success. Good paying jobs attract people with the ability to give back to the community and contribute to future success. The state of Tennessee and specifically Middle Tennessee, is growing economically and through the population exponentially. The intent is to manage the growth to produce a better Bedford in quality of life and place for our citizens and visitors alike.





Webb's Outerlimits and Wilderness Instruction and Leadership Development programs combine the classroom with the outdoors. Students develop leadership skills and confidence as they lead trips in Tennessee and beyond. Rock climbing, caving, backpacking, kayaking, and rafting are just some of the activities students can master.

A global education is built into the curriculum to continue graduating active citizens of the world. Students from 23 countries and 15 states provide a unique and diverse community. Each class, activity, and meal is an

opportunity for students to connect and expand their viewpoint.

The flexible curriculum and small class sizes challenge students, allowing them to exceed their expectations. A 7:1 student-to-teacher ratio, and average class size of 12, encourages students to engage in their classes, sharing opinions and information with teachers and classmates.

Students can develop new passions in Webb's fine arts program that offers two theatre productions each year as well as a choir, string orchestra, piano and guitar classes and numerous opportunities for the visual arts, including photography, pottery and AP art courses. New and redesigned facilities are continuing to enhance Webb's campus and support its goals.

This is your hospital

Vanderbilt brings specialized healthcare home.

V anderbilt Bedford Hospital continues its commitment to investing in the Shelbyville and Bedford County community. In the nearly two years since Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC) acquired Shelbyville Tennova Hospital, the quality of healthcare available to area residents has grown almost as fast as the population. And the use of the hospital and its partner providers has exceeded Bedford County's population of 50,237 people.

Bill Rich, president of the hospital, said, "Last year, there were just over 97,000 patient encounters, whether it was coming into our emergency room, going to any of our clinics, having surgery, physical therapy, wound care, being admitted to our hospital – any clinical encounter anyone had in Bedford County. I think that shows we're here to make sure we have the services that the community needs, and I think it also shows the community wants us here."

VUMC's investment began with its acquisition of the hospital and continues today and into the future.

"The first year was about stabilization, getting through the transition from Tennova to [VUMC]. Then it was about gap analysis and what the needs of this community are, so we can develop plans to address those needs," Rich continued.

A big part of those plans included updating the hospital's equipment as well as its medical record system. The new system, E-Star, connects all of VUMC's facilities and partners with live, up-to-date information.

Rich said, "E-Star is a big piece of how we continue to grow and fulfill our mission of serving Bedford Countians."

Information from visits to a VUMC primary care provider is linked with tests at VUMC facilities, anywhere they are located. A visit to the emergency room resulting in hospital admittance, becomes part of the chart. All tests and information-to-date are available to anyone in the Vanderbilt network that is treating the patient.

"As long as it's within the Vanderbilt Health system, it is here for all of our providers so we can



coordinate and take better care of our patients. Even at the main campus in Nashville, providers can look at your entire medical history and see everything. That's a wonderful real-time example of care coordination. Even the patient can access their medical history," Rich said.

Another way VUMC is meeting needs is through the emergency room. Beginning July 1, all emergency room physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants will be Vanderbilt-employed personnel, not those provided by staffing companies. If admitted for further care, the dedicated hospitalist will also be a Vanderbilt employee.

Rich said, "We've replaced everything in our lab with state-of-the-art, top-of-the-line lab equipment. Also, we have a new 3D mammography for enhanced imaging and new beds and mattresses in patient rooms. We've also been able to recruit six new providers in nine months which is great for our community."

"It's a wonderful feeling when your local community supports you because we know patients have choices. We want you to own your hospital, be proud of your hospital, and we want the whole community to see it that way," said Rich.


ach year, a particular local business owner makes a loud ruckus throughout the town of Shelbyville. No really! Patrick Bedford of Lynchburg Outdoors hosts a motorcycle race that quite literally brings the sound of rumbling motorcycle enthusiasts to Shelbyville each year! The Celebration of Speed race day has become an annual event held at Shelbyville, Tennessee's world-famous Walking Horse Complex.

The races at this event are either flat racing or speedway racing. This type of racing differs from motocross, as the speedway is flat and goes around in a circle. The competition is open to both amateur and professional racers of all ages. It is safe to say that the appeal to this sport has no bounds when it comes to age, as the youngest class of riders is a shocking 6 and under age group. Then, the older class of riders is a 50+ age group. Racing, unlike so many other sports, is a sport that you can enjoy for a



lifetime. Falling in love with racing at a young age is actually what inspired event organizer Bedford to rally the troops for the first race over five years ago. After five years of Celebration of Speed, the event has significantly gained traction. It has become more sophisticated year after year. Both racers and spectators travel as far as Poland to watch and race.

Bedford, the owner of a 6,000 square foot motorcycle shop (Lynchburg




Outdoors) in Lynchburg, Tennessee, has been riding for over 50 years. Bedford first hopped on a motorcycle at a mere 6 years old. He has been riding ever since. His passion for the throttle fueled him to open a motorcycle shop, publish an online motorcycle magazine, form a racing community, offer riding instruction classes (Learn To Ride Academy), and founded Celebration of Speed.

This year's event was held on February 26, 2022, at the Calsonic Arena in Shelbyville. Event gates opened to the public at 1 p.m. The main events began at 5:45 p.m. and lasted to about 9 p.m. There were 38 races in total. For those who missed the event in person, CinePros, a film production company out of Huntsville, Alabama, filmed the

event. The video has been made available on the Celebration of Speed Facebook page. The Celebration of Speed event and the livestream video were made available through the financial support of all of the race sponsors and advertisers.


Things to do Poker Run






