



Electric Trikes Provide Older Riders Fun, Fitness and Safety

Dear Savvy Senior,

What can you tell me about electric trikes for semi-seniors? I used to cycle a lot in my younger years but have some balance problems and don't trust myself on a two-wheeler anymore. I've read that electric powered trikes are a good option for older riders but could use some help choosing one.

Unsteady Eddie

Dear Eddie,

Electric powered adult tricycles – also known as e-trikes – are a great cycling option for older adults with balance or stamina issues because they're safe and super fun to ride, and easy on an aging body. Here's what you should know, along with some tips to help you shop for one.

Safer Cycling

If you're interested in cycling, but worry about falling or injuring yourself, e-trikes are a great choice because of the three-wheeled stability they provide. With a trike you can ride as slow as you want without ever losing your balance, which is very reassuring for most older riders.

E-trikes also come with a small electric powered motor to enhance the riding experience, so when you saddle up and apply the throttle the motor will give you a boost when pedaling, or it will do all the work for you. This makes it much easier to whiz up hills and ride into headwinds without gassing yourself or taxing your knee joints.

In addition, most adult e-trikes are also made with a low "step through" design making mounting and dismounting easier; they typically come with big tires that ensure a smooth ride; have ergonomic handlebars that are easy to reach and grip; and offer oversize seats (some even have backrests) for comfort and support.

There are many different types of adult e-trikes to choose from with prices ranging anywhere from around \$2,000 up to \$7,000. To shop for one, contact some bike shops in your area to see what they offer, or you may need to order one online.

When shopping for an e-trike, pay special attention to the motor, which determines how fast it will go, and the battery, which determines how far it will go between charges.

Most e-trikes can reach speeds of anywhere between 15 and 28 miles per hour, and typically go somewhere between 20 and 55 miles on a single charge, depending on how much pedaling you do. Battery charge times will vary too, ranging anywhere from 3 to 8 hours.

How to Choose

To help you figure out the right kind of e-trike for you, ask yourself how and where you plan to ride it. If you're primarily interested in a leisurely ride around the neighborhood for pleasure, fitness or running errands, an upright cruiser e-trike that has a rear cargo basket would be a nice choice.


Some popular options in this category include: Addmotor's M-340 Electric Fat Trike and M-360 Semi-Recumbent Trike (both \$3,000, addmotor.com); Emojo Caddy Pro (\$2,900, emojobike.com); Sixthreezero EVRYjourney 250W Tricycle (\$2,200, sixthreezero.com); EWheels EW-29 (\$2,000, ewheelsdealers.com); and Buzz Cerana T (\$1,700, buzzbicycles.com).

Or, if you're looking to take longer road rides a recumbent e-trike may be a better option. These are aerodynamic, low-to-the-ground stretched-out frame trikes that allow you to recline with your legs positioned in front of you. Catrike (catrike.com) and TerraTrikes (terratrike.com) are two of the biggest U.S. companies that make recumbent tadpole-style trikes (the two wheels are in front) and they both offer electric assist options at prices ranging from \$5,000 to \$,7000.



The Hebrew writer penned the following, "Let us lay aside every weight and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us; looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith" (Hebrews 12:1-2).

The fruit that sin produces is not pleasant. Hear the warning found in 2 Peter 2:21-22. Sin is a spiritual sickness, but Jesus is the Great Physician and He is the cure for that illness.


DAD ALREADY MADE THE DECISION



Do you still wish? It's great to wish and set goals. My life does not depend on getting a pool room. I



the \$2 trillion CARES Act. Some people did raise the potential for fraud. We were told that there was no time to put in place measures sufficient to prevent it. However, the CARES Act did create an oversight mechanism called the Pandemic Response Accountability Committee. committee had a difficult task due to the enormous size of the relief bill, a hardship compounded by the fact that the program had to become functional before it could even start looking into the spending. Dollars were pouring forth fast from Washington, and the committee was basically behind from the start.

Then Congress added another two relief bills totaling around \$3 trillion and including extensions some programs implemented în the CARES Act. It's now clear that an enormous amount of the eventual \$5 trillion was spent "improperly," that some downright fraudulent.

For instance, according to the Labor Department, at least \$163 billion of the \$873 billion in unemployment insurance benefits was spent in error, and little of this sum was recovered. Making matters worse is that a significant share of the \$163 billion was claimed by organized fraudsters and scammers in the United States and countries like China and Russia.

The inconvenient truth behind all this fraud and waste is that these government programs never should have been designed as they were. For example, while the federal government justifiably boosted state unemployment benefits the beginning of pandemic, it was irresponsible to enhance the benefits by \$600 a week. As a result, 76% of the individuals who received such benefits were making more by not working than by working. It was also irresponsible to extend the program long after the economy reopened and resumed growing.

The same is true of the overly generous three rounds of \$1,200, \$600 and \$1,400 individual payments to people who either already received the enhanced unemployment benefits or who never lost their jobs. Most recipients of these funds didn't need them. In fact, only 15% of people who received the first round of checks said they had spent it or planned to spend it. And there were other benefits on top of these checks.

The end result was that, according to Marc Goldwein at the Committee for a Responsible Federal COVID-19 Budget, benefits were so generous that a family of five could have received \$25,000 independently of parents' employment This status. spending fraudulent is now helping to fuel inflation.

Then you have the money dispensed corporations. In one way or another, that spending made up a huge share of the COVID-19 relief. Indeed, whether through the airline bailouts or Payroll Protection gram, shareholders the Program, collected trillions dollars in government handouts they didn't need. Most of the PPP funding, for example, went to companies whose workers were never at risk of losing their jobs since they were well-suited to work from home.

Finally, billions of dollars went to state and local governments, including for schools that stayed closed, even though many of these governments' revenue growth equaled or exceeded pre-pandemic levels.

Of course, there was but the some fraud, malfeasance happened only because the programs were created in the first place and designed to go to everyone regardless of need. This reckless "design" is the true "design" scandal.

Will Congress ever learn its lesson? I assume not, as it's easier to complain about fraudsters to acknowledge that the real scam is the entire process—a process starts on Capitol Hill.

TO STAY POSITIVE

Medicare Minute

"Signing up for Medicare Part 1"

The most common way to qualify for Medicare is when you are turning 65. You will have a specific time period, set by Medicare, to enroll in Part A and Part B Medicare. This is known as the Initial Enrollment Period (IEP).

If you are qualifying for Medicare by turning 65 you will have a 7 month window to enroll in Medicare. This window is based off of the month you turn 65. It starts 3 months prior to the month you turn 65 and extends 3 months past the month you turn 65. For example, if you are turning 65 in September your IEP begins in June and extends all the way through the month of December. If you are eligible, you may not have to pay a premium for Part A, but Part B will have a premium.

For those electing to sign up for Part B after their IEP a late-enrollment penalty may be assessed. This penalty can last as long as you have Part B and there may be a gap in your health coverage. However, one exception to this rule is being employed and having coverage through your company's group health plan. If this applies to you check with your benefit coordinator, Medicare or contact our office.

In most cases, if you are already drawing your Social Security or Railroad Retirement Board benefits you should automatically be signed up for Part A and Part B. If you are not drawing your Social Security or RRB benefits and want to sign up for Medicare you can do so by signing up online at ssa.gov, visit your local Social Security office or give our office a call and we can help direct you.





FAST DEBT RELIEF OPTIONS -THINK AGAIN

If get-rich-quick schemes worked no one would have debt issues. This also applies to Get Out of Debt schemes. People often find themselves even deeper in debt after attempting to follow any of the risky strategies described here. These rarely work out and rather than helping, can worsen problems and make it even tougher to dig yourself out of debt.







AUBURN, AL – Spiders eyes. If you can get close re beneficial to the enough, you can determine are beneficial to the environment. Fear of these insects is common, but-believe it or notmost spiders cannot hurt humans. However, the brown recluse spider is a dangerous exception.

IDENTIFICATION

The recluse spiders, commonly known as fiddle-back or violin spiders, belong to a variety of spiders in the genus Loxosceles. The most common and most famous species in the United States is the brown recluse spider, Loxosceles reclusa. These arachnids carry this name because of the violin-shaped marking on the dorsal surface of the cephalothorax (i.e., fused head and thorax).

Not every spider that is brown is a recluse. They are identified by their Alabama number and pattern of Extension

which species of spider you are observing. The brown recluse has six eyes arranged in three pairs in a semicircular pattern. Sac spiders and funnel weaver (ĥobo) spiders have eight eyes arranged in two rows of four.

HABITAT

The brown recluse spider is typically located throughout Alabama but is more commonly found in the state's northern half. Preferred habitats are dry areas such as caves, rocks and log piles. However, these spiders can also be prone to moving into your home.

"Brown recluses are attracted to homes not because they are after you, but because they are after your home's insects," said Cooperative System



The venom from the recluse is a potent cytotoxin that can cause necrotic lesions that could take months to heal. Observe the bite area for a flat or sunken bluish patch

Thorough inspection with a bright flashlight to reveal the location and level of infestation is the first step in effective management. Inspection should focus on likely spider habitats. Indoors, look for spiders, egg sacs and shed spider skins in undisturbed storage areas. These places include closets, crevices behind furniture and beds, behind hanging pictures, clothing, shoes and especially storage containers and boxes.

MONITORING

Sticky spider traps and flat glue boards are excellent non-chemical ways to aid visual inspection. Professional pest control services can also use flushing agents as a monitoring tool to locate breeding areas.

EXCLUSION

Deny the spiders access access to the house.

Chemicals. Pesticides labeled for spider control are often required for serious brown recluse infestations. Enlisting the services of a professional pest control operator is an option to be seriously considered seriously considered when chemicals are to be applied.

These arachnids have adapted to living indoors by residing in areas without air conditioning basements. They remain active in temperatures ranging from 45-110 °F.

BEHAVIOR AND LIFE EXPECTANCY

The brown recluse earns its name because of its shy nature. During the daytime, they will remain hidden, reclusive locations that are typically in dark areas. At night, the spider will wander for prey. They are often found when moving from their retreat because of hunger, pesticide applications, overcrowding or disturbances.

This spider also dislikes conflict. When threatened, they usually flee but are still able to inflict a bite in defense. Brown recluse fangs are tiny, so they are not able to pierce clothing. Humans are usually bitten by one while putting on shoes, rolling onto them while sleeping and moving items that the spider uses as a home.

Unlike most spiders, brown recluses do not construct webs to catch prey. Instead, they build

Stay Safe on Water Skis and Jet Skis

Few things are as exhilarating as summertime water sports. But whether you're operating a personal watercraft (PWC) or being towed behind one, make safety your number one priority with these suggestions.

All-Around Safety Rules For Water Sports

- Participate in a water or boater safety course.
- Wear a Coast Guard-approved life jacket.
- Always let someone know where you're going before you head out
- · Boat only during fair weather.
- Don't participate in high-speed sports in low-light or after

Water Skiing Safety

- Inspect your equipment.
- If you aren't familiar with the body of water, ask someone who is about areas to avoid.
- Avoid skiing in shallow water or on small or busy lakes.
- Review hand signals. Typically, an extended
- right or left hand indicates the direction to turn, a thumbs up or down directs drivers to adjust speed and a raised palm means stop.
- Make sure a spotter is on board with the driver.
- Release the towrope as soon as you fall.
- When you're down, hold up a ski to make yourself visible.
- Don't approach or board the boat until the engine is off.

Jet Skiing Safety

- Keep the ignition safety switch lanyard on your wrist or hooked to your life jacket. This cuts power to the engine if you fall off.
- Be sure you meet your state's minimum operating age and education requirements.
- Follow basic boating rules and practice proper boating etiquette.
- Before leaving, check the PWC to be sure it's in working order and that you have the necessary equipment on
- Avoid dangerous maneuvers like using another watercraft's wake as a ramp.
- When pulling a person, your PWC should be able to seat you, a spotter and the person being towed.
- Keep your feet inside the PWC, and maintain a firm grip on the handlebars or the strap on a 3-seat jet ski.
- Ride defensively. Scan for boats and objects in your path, and drive at responsible speeds. Remember, most PWCs don't have a braking system, and you'll lose steering capability when the power is off.


