



Trap Team Championship Results

The Okoboji High School Trap Team won the Class 1A Championship at the 2022 Iowa State Clay Target Tournament held in Ackley, Iowa, on June 4, 2022. The Okoboji Team which consists of 24 student athletes from 6th to 12th grade also took 1st Place in the Class IA Conference 2 Spring Trap League with 2039 points.

The Okoboji Trap Team shot 458x500 targets to win the State Title by 6 targets over runner-up Osage. The top five Okoboji shooters were as follows: Adam Anderson, 96; Peyton Hromatko, 92; Logan Johnson, 91; Dalton Vinke 91; and Sullie McKeen, 88.

The Okoboji Trap Team also won four individual medals at the State Shoot: Adam Anderson, Varsity Male 2nd place with 96; Laylah Kalsow, Varsity Female 2nd place with 87; Ella Stoll, Varsity Female 3rd place with 86 and Kolton Yungbluth, Novice Male 1st place with 83.

At the State Shoot Nathan Hinshaw and Dalton Vinke both shot perfect 25x25. In the 250 target Spring League Ella Stoll, Laylah Kalsow, Seth Staydohar, and Nathaniel Franklin shot perfect 25x25, RJ Kalsow shot two perfect 25x25, and Logan Johnson shot three perfect 25x25.Logan Johnson and Laylah Kalsow were both named to the Top 5 Iowa All State Trap Team.






Family Services Resource Guide







Nashville Recording Artist to Appear at PLAC


Singer/songwriter/guitarist Neil Dover is scheduled to appear at the Pearson Lakes Art Center in Okoboji on Tuesday, July 26.

Many citizens are concerned with the congestion the additional RV – Mobile Home Parks will bring to the lakes area. Although the RV- Mobile Home Parks themselves may pay a small amount of property tax, the Recreational Vehicle and Mobile Homes themselves do not pay any property tax. Nor do they pay any Hotel-Motel Tax or State Sales Tax on their rental fees. Our local communities have to subsidize the community services provided to RV – Mobile Home Parks, such as police-fire protection, ambulance, and hospital costs.

As the lowa Great Lakes Association we are concerned for the lakes environment that too many local governments have been too quick to approve additional RV - Mobile Home Parks without giving full attention to their impact to traffic and boat congestion. Not to mention their environmental impact. We are not anti-growth, but believe growth can be accommodated and still protect our environment.



IOWA GREAT LAKES ASSOCIATION (IGLA) was formed thirteen years ago with a view to protecting all of the Iowa Great Lakes. We have inherited a wonderful natural environment and want to preserve that beauty for generations to come. We are a 501 C4 non-profit organization. Imagine Iowa Great Lakes Announces Completion of The Beautification of Lake Street in Arnolds Park

pleased to announce the completion and grand opening of Lake Street at Arnolds Park Amusement Park

The goal of this project was to create a safe and welcoming pedestrian mall environment that would serve as an entrance to the amusement park, boardwalk, and Berkley Bedell State Pier. Removable bollards would allow the street to be closed off to vehicles during peak times, and beautification elements such as overhead lighting, clay pavers, landscaping, and colorful vertical elements create a unique environment for events on the street. Harmony park was also renovated to provide a durable and colorful surface with dynamic lighting and seating elements around existing musical play pieces.

Construction began in the fall of 2021, with a significant portion of the work completed throughout the winter months. A temporary building/tent was utilized to allow crews to maintain adequate conditions for site preparation and concrete installation - all paver bases, light pole footings, and curb/gutters were installed in 100' sections to maintain consistent

combined storm sewer was installed under the center of the roadway, which allowed space for light pole footings and large volumes of planting soil for trees and perennial plantings outside the back of curbs. Special care was taken to protect existing

Bur Oak trees, and special amendments were added to the soil to minimize stress from construction. Over 50,000 pavers were laid on the project, which have permanent engravings to mark farmers market tent locations.



Country View Acres Homeowners File Lawsuit to Stop RV Park in Environmental District

Country View Acres Homeowners have filed a lawsuit challenging a large RV park planned for environmental land commonly referred to as Woodlyn Hills. This lawsuit challenges the county's approval of a 174-site RV park on land mostly classified as "Environmental District" – meaning it is affected by seasonal flooding, could be considered a critical area, or otherwise best suited as open space.

One issue on appeal is the "public hearing" that took place in June, at which the developers were given time to present new information to the Board of Adjustment, while the public was prohibited from speaking. "The Board of Adjustment's failure to fully consider public input is one of the most disheartening parts of this process," explained Greg Hanson, the President of Country View Acres Homeowners. "We showed up to the public hearing in June to address our concerns, but we were told that public comments were closed. We watched the developer's new presentation, but had no opportunity to respond."

The lawsuit also alleges that the RV park violates the county's Comprehensive Plan and does not meet the necessary criteria for a conditional use in several material ways. "One concerning aspect of this RV park is the septic system that will be constructed in an environmental district, just south of Lower Gar," Hanson noted, "Septic systems can lead to contamination and leakage into the Iowa Great Lakes."

The lawsuit will be held in the Iowa District Court for Dickinson County.

Farmland Leasing Meetings for agriculture property owners, tenants, ag business representatives and lenders will be held at 11





Seasons Center Receives Grant

Seasons Center for Behavioral Health received a \$4,600 grant from the Emmet County Community Foundation for therapeutic

respite care for children and young adults in Emmet County.

Grant funds will be used to provide therapeutic respite care summer day camp services for youth (ages 4-17) and/or young adults (ages 18-21),



from Emmet County, who are experiencing behavioral health conditions and a history of trauma such as abuse, divorce of parents, parental substance abuse, family violence, or who have developmental conditions such as an Autism Spectrum Disorder. Week-long day camp services will be provided during the months of July and August (2022) at Camp Autumn, Seasons Center's therapeutic camp for youth with or at risk of behavioral health concerns or other developmental disabilities. Respite day camp activities will include outdoor adventures (swimming, fishing, kayaking), cooperative games, social skill building, arts and crafts, and new friendships. "Thanks to this grant, Seasons can offer children, youth, and

families the opportunity to experience respite in a setting that is both therapeutic and fun," said Dan Ries, CEO of Season Center. "Children/youth are able to relax, learn, and form positive new friendships while parents/caregivers are able to rest and recharge in order to be better able to care for themselves and their loved ones."

Seasons Center will work with families, partners, schools, and other community entities to identify children who could benefit from respite care services and do not have other financial means to obtain such services. Grant funds will support staffing, activity supplies, snacks, meals, and transportation to/ from Camp Autumn.

Drought "Detours" Pasture Grazing

Continuing drought in Northwest Iowa is forcing producers to alter their grazing plans. Fortunately, they have "detours."

"Top of the list is reduce stocking rate," said Beth Doran, beef specialist with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach. 'Early weaning calves is a proven method to reduce the energy requirement of the cow by 25-30 percent and lighten the grazing pressure on the pasture. Early weaning is more effective than supplemental creep feeding when forage production is short."

But Doran adds this is only part of the equation. If pasture is very short, producers may still be forced to remove a portion of the cows from the pasture or provide supplemental feed such as green-chopped corn or distillers grains.

"Assuming drought continues, consider placing all of the cows in a 'sacrifice' pasture," Doran said. "It's cheaper to renovate one pasture next year than all of the pastures.

Rotational grazing can help sustain pasture production, but increased recovery time between rotations is key during drought. This helps maintain the leaf which is the plant's solar factory and increases root development allowing for increased uptake of nutrients and moisture.

Doran reminds producers that cool season grasses - bromegrass, orchard grass and timothy - should never be grazed shorter than four inches to allow plant regrowth, and during drought, recovery may take 30-40 days. For warm season grasses, recovery time approximates 35-45 days.

Producers are also cautioned to monitor the growth of bluegreen algae in streams and ponds. Blue-green algae produces toxins that affect the nervous system and liver of the animal and can be deadly if consumed. Consequently, producers will need to provide clean water from another source. The algae may appear as a pale green scum on top of the water and cobalt-blue around the edges.

Producers needing supplemental feed are reminded to check with their crop insurance agent before harvesting corn for greenchop or silage.

Farm Service Agency (FSA) also has assistance programs that may be available in the county such as emergency loans, the Livestock Forage Disaster Program, and grazing or haying of CRP acres. Drought affected producers are advised to check with FSA to determine eligibility and complete an application.





They can also assist with office work, such as filing, copying, or putting admission packets together. There are six requirements to becoming a hospice volunteer. First, training is held to introduce the volunteer to hospice. Second, a test for tuberculosis (TB) is given. Third, the volunteer must have the two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. Fourth, they must complete a background check. Fifth, the volunteer must have transportation to the patient's place of residence. Sixth,
