WE'VE BEEN PERFORMING AN AWFUL LOT OF COMPUTER UPGRADES SINCE THE PANDEMIC

BEGAN. Despite the news that everyone is blowing money on everything, it does appear that computer owners are being

frugal with their money and realizing that they can upgradé their old computer rather than buy a new one. One of the more worthy upgrades to come along in a while are solidstate drives.

Computers have been using mechanical hard drives for decades. Mechanical hard drives operate similarly to a record player. Inside the little

hard drive case is a platter coated with a magnetic surface that spins at about 5,400 rotations per minute. A readwrite "head," similar to a stylus on a record player, travels back and forth on the platter reading and writing microscopic positive and negative magnetic charges. Your computer's processor interpreters those charges as binary 0s or 1s which are then translated into Tweets, cat pictures, and operating systems. These hard drives are a miracle of innovation and are amazingly quick, efficient, and reliable for storing and retrieving data.

However, mechanical hard drives are susceptible to many types of failures. For example, if you drop a laptop while it's on, that floating read/write head can make physical contact with the spinning platter and result in a spot on the hard drive that can no longer hold a positive or negative charge. This head/platter contact is known as a hard drive "crash." If data resided on that spot, that data is gone. The computer can tolerate a few of these bad spots but if you have too many, your computer may not boot and you could lose all your data. Hard drive crashes

like this are the main reason. we recommend you keep a backup of your data. The electric motors in these drives can also slow down over time resulting in computers that are agonizingly slow to boot and operate.

Solid-state drives (SSD) are rapidly supplanting mechanical drives in new computers. SSDs have no moving parts thus are more resistant to physical shock, run silently, and have quicker access time and lower latency. What that boils down to is a computer that accesses data very quickly. For instance, a mechanical hard drive will typically go from power off to fully booted in 3 to 5 minutes. SSDs will power on in less than 30 seconds for an older computer, and less than 5 seconds for new computers. When you click on an icon to load a program, it will launch

almost instantly on an SSD drive.

Someone with reasonable computer skills could clone their old hard drive to a new SSD for less than \$50. but expect to pay up to \$200 (parts and labor) for a skilled technician to do the job. That may sound like a lot of money (mainly because it is) but if you have an old, slow laptop and are considering purchasing a new one, this \$200 investment could easily delay that purchase for a few more years.

It was in his later college years at Auburn University that Evans' culinary interest took root. Working part-time at the Grand Hotel in Point Clear, the chef there, Seth Hargett, took Evans under his wing. Hargett even gave Evans his first knife. Evans later gifted that knife to his mother.
"She still has it in her

knife drawer and probably still uses it some," he said.

Hargett also gave Evans the book "Larousse Gastronomique" that enlightened him on French cuisine. It was so inspiring that Evans came to regard it as a sort of culinary bible.

"I spent my summer reading through that book and was so inspired that there was no way I wasn't going to pursue this career," Evans said.

The only chef in his family, Evans said that's just how he likes it, adding jokingly that it makes his line of work more interesting to his loved

Evans learned about the James Beard Award 20 years ago, soon after arriving in New Orleans.

He committed himself to working hard so that "Maybe I'd get my name on that list at some point," he said upon accepting the



award.

"It is unreal for me to be

standing here," he added. For this year's awards, Evans was among five finalists in his category, including a chef in Homewood and three chefs in New Orleans.

Evans noted years ago he read about a chef from Cullman winning the James Beard award and recalls identifying with that chef on many levels.

"He also opened a restaurant in Birmingham and I wanted to take that same path," Evans said.

"Alabama is home for me and it's always been about learning what I could, and getting experiences outside of what I grew up with. Through travel and exposure to so many different experiences, it made me really excited to come back to Alabama one day. Birmingham is my home now, and I couldn't be happier.'

God speaks and it is our obligation to TRUST and OBEY. God has spoken today through His Son Jesus Christ (Hebrews 1:1-2). 


When Biden was elected President he destroyed our status of being energy independent.



Medicare Minute

"Signing up for Medicare Part 2"

Most Americans qualify for Medicare by turning 65 but there are other ways to qualify such as being disabled, having End Stage Renal disease (ESRD) or ALS. Today we are going to look at how you would sign up if you are disabled.

If you are under the age of 65 and disabled, you will automatically be enrolled in Part A and Part B after you have received Social Security or Railroad Retirement Board (RRB) benefits for at least 24 months. If you are disabled, covered by your or your spouse's group health plan and wish to stay on that plan, my suggestion is to contact the plan and confirm that you can remain on the plan even though you have Medicare. This may allow you to delay your Part B until a later date.

You are eligible for Medicare if you have End Stage Renal Disease and you've worked the required amount of time under Social Security, RRB or as a government employee OR you're already getting or are eligible for Social Security or RRB benefits OR you're the spouse or dependent child of one of the previous requirements. You should contact Social Security or the RRB for the amount of time worked to be eligible for Medicare.

If you're under 65 and have ALS your Medicare benefits should begin the first month you start receiving your Social Security or RRB benefits. Again contact Social Security or RRB for a list of the benefits.

Whether it's SSI or RRB disability, ESRD or ALS, I would encourage you to NEVER voluntarily leave your current health plan until you have covered all your bases with your current plan and Medicare. In most cases once you leave you cannot go back!! If you are faced with any of these 3 situations and need additional assistance feel free to contact our office.

and democrats are going to sink whatever money it takes to not have to deal with her in 2023 and beyond.

Flores' campaign slogan is simple, "God, Family, Country" a phrase that appeals to the "traditional values" far beyond her majority-Hispanic district in the border city of Brownsville ten miles from the Texas tip. Flores is already getting slighted, but her dignity and her family's character are already shining through.

Her young daughter graciously absorbed an insulting elbow nudge from House Speaker, Pelosi Nancy during post-election family photo-op, and it was ALL caught on film.

Unfazed by Pelosi's rudeness and snobbery, Flores' daughter politely stood her ground and eased back into her spot without surprise hesitation.

It was a classic laid-tobare moment that needed no audio or explanation. It's how powerful democrats really feel about minority families who refuse to buy the democrat victimhood narratives used to keep them in line for generations.

All three grew up in the Rio Grande Valley, a working-class four-county region at the southernmost tip of Texas. The area has

long been a politically liberal, yet culturally conservative, place.

It was over 50 years ago when my family lived in

McAllen and very little has changed, except that fewer people from outside the area think they have to play by American law when it comes to immigration rules, both coming out of Mexico and Washington DC.



Dear Athletic Support: It's too hot outside to breathe. Seriously. I bet I've already taken four showers today, and it's not even suppertime yet. Luckily, my son is between sports right now. His travel baseball league just ended a week or so ago. We're waiting for football to gear up. If it's this hot when it gets started, what are we going to do? I don't want him to have to miss football. He's a tough kid. So is there anything I can do to prepare him for this

Sweatin'

Dear Sweatin': When it comes to heat exhaustion, "tough" doesn't have anything to do with it. In fact, it's that sort of thinking that can get a kid in trouble, fast.

There's no toughing out the heat.

But there is a lot that can be done when it comes to preparing for the heat. That's the ticket, and it's good news for you and your son because you can start getting ready for those extremely hot early practices right

The first, and most important step, is hydration.

Your son needs to drink enough water (yes, sports drinks are fine too, but I'd try to balance this out) so that when he pees his urine is clear. The same color as the water in the toilet bowl.

I know this may sound gross, but it's the absolute best indicator for hydration. Like



other things when it comes to human anatomy, every body is different.

That's why I can't tell your son he has to drink nine Gatorades a day to be properly hydrated. But I can tell him — and you — to check the toilet bowl.

You want multiple days of clear urine in the days leading up to extreme heat exposure. We used to tell our players you don't drink when you're thirsty, you just drink.

In college we had these big water bottles we had to carry around with us everywhere and charts taped above the toilets in the locker room. The charts were reminders to check our pee for proper hydration levels. As strange as all this may sound, those two procedures instilled in me a lifelong habit of drinking plenty of water.

The only other thing you can do leading up to the hot practices is make sure your son gets acclimated. This just means he needs to be off the couch and out in the heat on a regular basis before football season starts.

To sum it up, if your son drinks until his urine is clear and gets used to being out in the heat, then the dog days of summer should be a breeze.

Final note: If your son experiences any signs of heat illness, you should seek medical attention immediately.
