



Growing the housing and amenities available in Milford means an expanded workforce. New residents mean new customers for local businesses, which in turn increases tax revenue. With more revenue, cities can invest more in roads, public facilities, schools, the arts and parks. To learn more, visit MilfordCampus.com.

Your Questions Answered

- Is the City of Milford expected to run the Okoboji Sports Campus?

 No, the Okoboji Sports Campus is a non-profit organization and will not be turned over to the City of Milford. It will be privately owned and funded.
- The real estate development is expected to consist of a wide range of housing options including vacant lots for custom homes, apartments, assisted living communities, and primarily workforce housing. The expectation is to work with state incentive programs that will keep housing affordable and to provide new construction workforce housing not exceeding \$266,320 per single family house (as defined by Iowa
- A housing development in close proximity to an airport is not desirable or advantageous for land value or airplane noise. Land developers would likely have low to no interest in investing in such property, inhibiting this portion of the Milford Campus project. Without securing the airport land, there is no assurance the overall master plan would happen.
- What is a sports tourism facility? Will it compete with the YMCA? No, the Okoboji Sports Campus will not compete with the YMCA. The Okoboji Sports Campus will be a year-round sports venue that will host regional tournaments for traveling sports teams. The facility will generate revenue for the area through hotels, meals and gas on tournament weekends. The average family spends over \$800 per weekend when traveling for sports tournaments.* The YMCA has been and will continue to be part of planning discussions. The Okoboji Sports Campus and YMCA plan to work together to better our community.
- The South Okoboji Estates plan includes 400+ affordable, much needed, single and multi-family housing options, and will generate incremental property tax revenue.
- How will the City of Milford pay for the additional roads and infrastructure? Real Estate developers work with the local jurisdiction on implementing TIF to pay for public improvements such as streets, sidewalks, sewer, water, and other similar public components. This is paid upfront by the developer and is returned when the new building or home is constructed through the TIF assistance. TIF is a common tool for developers to help develop real estate in rural Iowa. TIF generates new property tax revenue by spurring development that would not otherwise occur, which results in a larger tax base for the City of Milford and the community.










This year the Okoboji FFA Tractor Ride called TRAWL will be traveling the following roads Sunday, July 24, between 8:00am



While doing genealogy research about her great-grandparents,

Suzanne Hovik Fuller started reading the issues of 1880-1881 Egan Express newspaper, Egan, The Girl Who Moved to the Dakota Territory. Town That Wasn't There

A former staff writer for The Minneapolis Star, she knew when she read that the first building on that land was a newspaper editor's office and home, she was reading a first-person account of how a town on the prairie was born and not how it "might" have happened. And her immediate thought was she wanted to take those stories and write a book featuring those pioneers and their challenges in starting a town. The book, The Girl Who Moved

to the Town That Wasn't There, was published by the Siouxland Heritage Museums, Sioux Falls, SD.

Suzanne, a resident of Sioux Falls, and her family spent many of the past fifty-five summers vacationing in the Spirit Lake area and purchased a vacation home on East Lake Okoboji fifteen years ago.

Her great-grandparents and their two daughters moved to Egan, and were the inspiration for the fictitious family she created. Their daughter, Virgie, and the town of Egan are the two main characters of the book

More than 265 newspaper articles, brought to life through

fiction, were referenced in the writing. That allowed the characters to experience history as it happened. Family heirlooms, letters, photos, recipes, and history added "true to the time" authenticity to the story. The determination of those early pioneers to establish a new

town was courageous and even more remarkable as they lived through that winter of "perpetual elemental fury." The book won the 2021 WILLA Literary Fiction for Chil-



Mojito Fish Steaks

4 firm-fleshed fish steaks 3/4" thick (such as salmon or swordfish)

2 tablespoons olive oil, plus more for brushing Sea salt

Freshly ground black pepper For the Mojito Mop:

3 tablespoons light rum Juice & zest of 1 large lime 1 tablespoon canola oil

1 teaspoon hot-pepper sauce 1 tablespoon sugar 4 tablespoons chopped fresh

mint leaves

Heat a gas grill to about 200°F. If using a charcoal grill, build a small charcoal fire at one end of the grill. If using a gas grill, set a burner at one end of the grill to medium-low. Coat the fish steaks with 2 tablespoons

olive oil and season with salt and pepper. Let rest for 5 minutes. Meanwhile, make the mop: In a small bowl, stir together the rum, lime juice, canola oil, hot-pepper sauce, sugar, and 3 tablespoons

of the mint leaves. Brush the grill grate with olive oil. Put the fish on the grill away from the heat, spoon 1 tablespoon of the mop over each fish steak, cover the grill, and cook until the fish flakes, about 1 hour, basting with mop about every 5 minutes. Serve each fish steak topped with chopped mint and the lime zest.




Thoreson to Speak at ILUUF

A THOUSAND ACRES -- A WINNER

Des Moines Metro Opera's A Thousand Acres: Great!

Never before this did we even think of reviewing an opera. So we will not really be reviewing the show based on Jane Smiley's novel. Instead we have a little color about a great performance by a cast of 11, including Milford's very-own John Michael Moore; and the orchestra conducted by Maestro David Neely in a pit in the middle of the stage -- a very intimate circular setting with a capacity for more than 450 opera buffs -- and truck loads of Iowa Public Broadcasting cameras along with all the assorted gear necessary to produce a special program to air later this year.

While we would like to say the show was a delight, that's impossible with the dark story content. (As John noted that this was "not truly an entertaining show, per se.") What we can say is that everyone involved, from the pit on up, did a terrific job that

garnered continuous applause at the show's conclusion. And from what John, Ms. Rambo and the Old Professor recall, there were at least five or six bows from the entire cast and crew with the audience continuing to ask for more when the show concluded. (None of us even kept track of the time. We were too busy applauding! John counted from memory over the weekend when we talked) John also explained that while the stage in Indianola is relatively small, it lends itself to the intimacy and enjoyment of every performance, regardless of the subject matter. It was a great and very memorable show!

A Thousand Acres will see two more performances on the Simpson College campus in Indianola before it closes on July 22nd...

John will be heading to New Orleans soon to begin rehearsals for a production there before making his way back to the Twin Cities for to participate in several stagings of The Messiah just before Christmas.

The Northwest Iowa Community Concert Band, directed by Rich Nicklay, will Celebrate 30 years at the Arnolds Park Amusement Park with its summer concert on Sunday afternoon, starting at 2:00, in the Majestic Pavilion. She's With Us to entertain Thursday, starting at 6:00, in front of the Clay County Courthouse. The Itty Bitty Boji Band will take the same stage on the 21st, and The South 71 Trio will perform on the 28th.

The Mainstreet Market events open to the public at 5:00 each Thursday night, with music performances from 6:00, 'til 8:00. We should remind you, too, that the Jazzed Up Big Band of Okoboji plays tonight

in the Roof Garden Ballroom, starting at 7:00. And the Dick Bauman Big Band plays at the Pearson Lakes Art Center every Monday night also starting at 7:00... Research Director RD had another A-Student this last week, with Donna Harris' entry noting that it was Gale Garnett who sang We'll Sing in the Sunshine. Donna, who lives in Spirit Lake, won two passes to the Okoboji Summer Theatre. That was the good news. The bad news is that much of RD's weekly effort was lost last week. We will try to paste things back together and starting with last week's Full Moon efforts now a week delayed. The laughing emoji, she said, brings to mind the song, *I Love to Laugh*, written by Richard and Robert Rherman, for the 1964 Walt Disney motion picture *Mary* Poppins. It was covered instrumentally the same year by Duke Ellington on his LP saluting the film...

RD's current efforts tell us that Vikki Carr turns 81 today!. A top-rated singer through the '60s, she was born Florencia Bisenta de Casillas-Martinez Cardona in El Paso, Texas, and had her biggest hit with the Grammy-nominated song, It Must be Him, written by Gilbert Becaud and Mack David. It reached number three on the billboard hot 100 charts and sold over one million copies to earn gold

Wednesday is Jump Day. In the music business that means finding highlyacclaimed songs from the gold vault of jazz standards that include songs like Jump, Jive, and Wail, by Louis Prima; One O'clock Jump, by Benny Goodman, and Jumpin' at the Woodside, first recorded by Count Basie in 1938. It quickly became one of his signature tunes.

Saturday will be Cowboy Day, calling for songs like Tumbling Tumbleweeds, written by Bob Nolan, who originally titled it Tumbling Leaves. In 2010, The Library of Congress selected a 1934 Decca recording by The Sons of the Pioneers to be added to the National Recording Registry. Also of interest to RD was -- that in 1963 Rawhide star Clint Eastwood used it on his Cowboy Favorites LP for Cameo-Parkway. The album also features three other "Rowdy" songs, The Last Roundup, Don't Fence me in, and Along the Santa Fe Trail...

A small stipend is also paid to board members.



Stop Eminent Domain for Private Gain

Eminent domain laws need to be changed at the state level. With three hazardous pipelines trying to move across Iowa, we are in desperate need to strengthen the laws. Eminent domain is intended for public utilities for the common good of the community.

These hazardous pipelines, Summit Carbon Solutions, Navigator Greenway, and ADM are all private companies looking to make big money off all taxpayers. They are all vying for federal tax dollars and carbon credits.

These companies propose to pay the landowners of Iowa a little bit of nothing for use of their land. They then get billions of dollars in tax money for their own pockets and never give more to landowners. Pipeline companies can sell the lines, change what they carry, or abandon them and landowners have no say.

Our property that Summit wants an easement for is 1.5 miles from Sandbar Slough and Big Spirit Lake. We are in the Spirit Lake watershed and drainage district. When something goes wrong with these hazardous pipelines, the asphyxiant vapors will move through the wetlands, slough, and Big Spirit Lake. The toxic vapors will kill people, plants, animals, fish and acidify the waters.

If Eminent Domain goes into play, Summit is proposing to put an easement through 40 acres of our property, even though they have designated only .46 of an acre on the southwest corner for their pipeline. They want all 40 acres so they can do whatever they want across it. Our house, barn with livestock, bins and sheds are located on these 40 acres, and this easement will be in place from now through eternity. We say no.

If these hazardous pipelines get into Iowa, the most fertile farm ground in the world will be destroyed. We all need to speak up to stop these hazardous CO2 pipelines.

100 Volunteers Needed for Northwest Iowa RSVP Pen Pal Program

A fourth-grade student recently told a Northwest Iowa RSVP volunteer assisting at the Okoboji Elementary School, "Our class doesn't get to have Pen Pals." Students and teachers want to have Pen Pals, but at least 100 more volunteers, age 55 and up, are needed to join the Dickinson County RSVP Pen Pal program to serve all the third and fourth-grade classes in Dickinson County schools wanting to participate.

Spirit Lake third graders in Mrs. Sara Laven's class have been writing to Pen Pals matched through the program each year since 2019. In this past school year, all 23 of Laven's students demonstrated improvement in the six literacy competency areas targeted by the program, including interest/enthusiasm for writing letters, writing vocabulary/proficiency, and improved social and intergenerational comfort, among others.

"The Pen Pal writing program has been one of the most beneficial things I've incorporated into my writing curriculum! It gives the students a real-world, authentic experience in the art of letter writing. It also teaches them valuable skills about communicating through the written word and addressing envelopes," explained Laven.

Beginning in the fall of 2022, Laven will transition from teaching third grade to teaching fourth-grade language arts at Spirit Lake Elementary School. She made a special request for the Pen Pal program to move with her and asked if it would be possible for all 85 of her fourth-grade students to participate. In addition to Laven's request, Okoboji Elementary School has four sections of fourth-graders who would like to participate in the program; last year only two sections were able to participate. Graettinger-Terril Elementary School

third-graders also participated in the Pen Pal program last year and would like to continue for the 2022-2023 school year.

Dickinson County RSVP needs a minimum of 165 senior volunteer Pen Pals to make this happen. Currently, Dickinson County

RSVP has a membership of 125 volunteers, with only 63 volunteers presently participating in the Pen Pals program.

Pen Pal volunteers don't need to commit a lot of time to the program, as they write one letter per month for three months during the term that fits their schedule best from either September to December, January through April, or February to May. Students then send one final letter and an invitation asking volunteers to attend a Meet and Greet party, an in-person event for students and volunteers to meet each other.

"The most wonderful part of the Pen Pal program is the culminating activity where students and volunteer Pen Pals meet in person. It is a day my students look forward to for many, many weeks ahead of time! It is one of the most heartwarming experiences of my school year," shared Mrs. Laven. "Students make wonderful connections with volunteers in our community, and many students and RSVP volunteers continue to exchange letters even after the school program has ended."

Northwest Iowa RSVP is an Ameri-Corps Seniors volunteer program. AmeriiCorps brings people together to tackle the country's most pressing challenges



through national service and volunteering. AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers serve with organizations dedicated to improving communities and helping make service to others a cornerstone of national culture.

DeNeitt VanDenBroeke, Dickinson County RSVP Coordinator, explains, "Mrs. Laven does a fantastic job teaching her students the valuable skills involved in communication and letter writing. We will happily follow Mrs. Laven to participate with at least one of her fourth-grade sections. Hopefully, we can gain enough volunteers to help all Spirit Lake fourth-grade students benefit from the Pen Pal program. Until then, we continue doing our best to recruit more volunteers to participate."

Northwest Iowa RSVP needs the help of more volunteers to ensure no third or fourth-grade students wanting to participate in the Pen Pal program need to say, "Our class doesn't get to have Pen Pals this year."
