

Male SAY in **Big South**

CHARLOTTE, N.C. -- For the third straight year, UNA defensive back **K.J. Smith** of Perry, GA has been named the Big South Conference Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

The honor recognizes the league's top male and female student athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.

Big South Sports Information Directors vote from a pool of each sport's Scholar-Athlete winner during the past season.

Smith also claimed the award as the top male studentathlete among all Big South institutions in 2019-20 and 2020-21. Thus, becoming the first male student-athlete in conference history to claim the honor three times.

Smith is a three-time, firstteam Academic All-America® member as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). He earned both his Bachelor's and Masters degrees from UNA during his playing career from 2018-21.





to help 158 local students per year find their paths to college. According to the U.S. Department of Education, 86% of Upward Bound participants enroll in postsecondary institutions immediately following high school graduation.

"The Upward Bound Program and the other TRIO programs are so important to the students in the communities we serve," said NW-SCC President Dr. Jeff Goodwin. "These programs offer academic and support services to help remove barriers that hinder students from pursuing a postsecondary education. Without these programs, many students would not be able to realize their dream of a college degree." NW-SCC houses an

Upward Bound program on each of the two campuses. Each program should receive funding for the next five years (2022-2027).

• Phil Campbell Campus Program -

\$439,973; serves Belgreen, Haleyville, Muscle Shoals, Phil Campbell, Red Bay, Russellville, Tharptown, and Vina high schools

 Shoals Campus Program - \$324,980; serves Central, Colbert County, Colbert Heights, Florence, Lexington, Rogers, Sheffield, and Wilson high schools along with the Florence Freshman Center

The program is aimed at students in grades 9-12 who will be the first in their families to graduate college and come from lower income

The Upward Bound program is one of four TRIO programs, including Talent Search, Student Support Services, and Upward Bound Math and Science at NW-SCC. The programs are 100% federally-funded by the U.S. Department of Education.

Insurance Insights **Use Less Gas With These Fuel Efficiency Tips**

Did you know you can save considerably at the gas pump just by modifying your driving habits? Regardless of the type of car you drive, good driving habits contribute to better fuel economy, which saves money and helps the planet, too.

Perform Routine Maintenance

Your car needs the right proportions of air and fuel to run efficiently. A well-maintained vehicle will run at its best. Keep Tires Rotated and Inflated to Ideal Pressure

To help evenly distribute the wear and tear on your tires, the recommendation is to have your tires rotated every 5,000 to 8,000 miles. Under-inflated tires tend to decrease mileage. (They're dangerous, too.) Check manufacturers' recommendations and make sure your tires are inflated to the maximum PSI, measured when cold.

Glide Into Your Stops

As you approach a stop sign or light, take your foot off the gas pedal earlier and let your car downshift before applying the brake.

Combine Short Trips Warm engines run more efficiently than cold ones. Planning your errands so you travel in a sequence instead of

backtracking is an efficient way to save time, as well as gas. Drive at Moderate Speeds

While every vehicle is different, mileage decreases quite rapidly over 50 mph in most cases. To save gas, stay at or under the speed limit, and drive at a consistent rate of speed. Use cruise control on long trips. Drive Friendly

Aggressive driving habits such as gunning the engine, speeding, screeching around corners and jamming on the gas pedal are major fuel wasters. Avoid fast acceleration and generally drive in a measured and moderate fashion to achieve top fuel savings. Travel Light

Extra weight in the car creates a drag on the engine and consumes extra gas. Don't haul around heavy loads if you don't have to. Check the trunk and back of the vehicle for unnecessary items that may be safely stored elsewhere.

Keep Your Car Aerodynamic

Good aerodynamics affect your car's fuel efficiency by reducing drag, especially at high speeds. Keep windows and moon roof closed on the freeway. Even keeping the car's exterior clean can make a difference.

Use the Highest Feasible Gear

Driving at high speeds in lower gears burns excessive fuel. On a manual transmission, pay attention to RPMs as you accelerate and shift into high gear as soon as you reasonably can.

Avoid Excessive Idling Idling uses a surprising amount of fuel — more than restarting the engine. If you need to wait in your parked vehicle for more than a minute or two, switch off the engine and only start up again when you're ready to continue driving. In extreme weather, it's nice getting into a comfortable car but be conscious of how long the vehicle is idling so fuel isn't wasted. **Ride Share**

You'll cut per-person fuel consumption in half when you share a ride. Ask friends and colleagues who live near you or frequent the same places you do to share a ride. You can split gas costs as many ways as there are passengers.

Should You Take Daily Aspirin for Your Heart?

Dear Savvy Senior,

I've been taking daily aspirin for almost 20 years now because I have a family history of heart disease. But I recently read that using aspirin is not recommended anymore. What can you tell me about this change in philosophy? Confused Aspirin User

Dear Confused,

There's no doubt that taking low-dose daily aspirin is beneficial to most people who've had a heart attack or stroke. But if you don't have heart disease, should you take it as a preventative measure? The answer for most people is probably not, according to new guidelines from the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF), a widely respected independent panel that develops recommendations on preventive health care. Here's what you should know.

New Guidelines

For years, aspirin has been a go-to pill Americans use to help ward off cardiovascular disease because of its blood thinning capability. But like most medicines, it can cause serious side effects. Aspirin irritates the stomach lining and can cause bleeding in the stomach, intestines and brain which can be life-threatening. And the risk of bleeding increases with age.

About one-third of Americans age 40 and older, and more than 45 percent of people over age 70 - who don't have cardiovascular disease - already take a daily aspirin to help prevent cardiovascular disease because it's been recommended for decades by many different health experts.

But in the past few years, new research has emerged showing that for many people without diagnosed heart disease, the risk of bleeding may outweigh the benefits of taking a daily aspirin. This research, along with the advent of other effective therapies in preventing heart attacks and strokes that don't cause bleeding – better blood pressure drugs and statins for lowering cholesterol – has narrowed the role aspirin plays.

Here's a breakdown of the updated USPSTF guidelines of who should, and shouldn't, take a daily aspirin, and for those who should, how to take it safely.

Who Should Take It?

There are two categories of people who can still benefit from using aspirin. People with established cardiovascular disease, especially those who have already had a heart attack or stroke. There's strong evidence that taking a daily low-dose aspirin significantly reduces the risk of a second cardiovascular event. And adults ages 40 to 59 with a 10 percent or higher risk for a cardiovascular disease over the next decade. They may see a small benefit to daily aspirin, but it should be an individual decision and discussed with your doctor.

Who Should Skip It?

People who are 60 and older - without established cardiovascular disease – who do not currently take a daily aspirin to prevent heart disease should not start now. This is particularly true for people with a history of bleeding, say from ulcers or aneurysms, or those taking medications such as blood thinners, steroids or anti-inflammatories such as ibuprofen or naproxen. If they already take a daily aspirin now, they should ask a doctor about how to proceed, because there may be a serious risk to suddenly stopping. How to Use it Safely

The best approach is to talk to your doctor about the potential risks and benefits of aspirin specifically for you. Because the risk of bleeding raises with dosage, if aspirin is recommended, take the lowest possible amount, which for most people is an 81 mg baby aspirin. And if you experience any stomach pain, talk to your doctor.

You should also know that in 2016 the USPSTF suggested that daily aspirin use could also help lower the risk of colorectal cancer along with cardiovascular disease. But the group now says there's not enough evidence to support that claim.





Gun violence is the second leading cause of death among children and teens in Alabama children after traffic accidents. An average of 88 Alabamian children and teens die by guns every year - 60% are homicides

According to Everytown (Everystat.org) data:

The rate of gun deaths has increased 47% from 2011 to 2020 in Alabama, compared to a 33% increase nationwide. That means in 2020 there were 356 more gun-deaths than in 2011.

In Alabama, the rate of gun suicides increased 18% and gun homicides increased 100% from 2011 to 2020, compared to a 12% increase and 70% increase nationwide, respectively

• In an average year, 1,090 people die by guns in Alabama, which has the 4th-highest rate of gun deaths in the US.

The societal cost of gun violence in Alabama exceeds \$15 billion annually, of which \$421.4 million is paid by taxpayers. That represents the 3rd-highest per capita cost among the states.

tumbler. The problem in the past was that sometimes I had more compost scraps to add to the bin than I had space in the compost tumbler. I didn't want to spend money on another large capacity tumbling compost bin because they can get very expensive.

I started grinding up my leftover food scraps, a couple of used napkins or paper towels, egg shells, etc. and adding water to come to the eight cup measure mark on my vitamin blender. I then put the ground up mixture into a five-gallon pail and add water up to the top of the pail. I water around my fruit trees or other plants and bushes with this solution. 



f ASK the ATTORNEY GRANDPARENT VISITATION **RIGHTS**

Years ago, our State Legislature and Legislatures across these United States passed laws giving grandparents visitation rights when there was a dispute with a parent. In other words, if the grandparents got into it with the parents there was a statutory right to go ask a court to award visitation to the grandparents over the parent's objections.

Judges were, understandably, kind to grandparents. Often, a thoughtless comment or cross words between a parent and a mother-inlaw or a father-in-law would put a

stop to visitation with a much-loved grandchild. These cases were truly heart-wrenching. They were especially emotional when a parent had died, and the surviving parent limited or would not allow visitation with the grandparents.

These are cases that are heard without a jury and lend themselves to judges really wanting people to resolve these cases among themselves. When they couldn't, the courts found themselves in the position of having to split the baby much like King Solomon.

In the early '90s, the United States Supreme Court ruled that State Statutory Grandparent visitation statutes were by and large unconstitutional. In some ways the analysis by the Supreme Court was based on a concept of what the law was at the time that the United States broke away from England. Historically, parents have had the absolute right to determine with whom their children associated. Not long after that decision other state courts followed suit. Alabama did as well. Last week the Alabama Supreme Court reaffirmed that a parent generally has the right to deny or limit visitation.

In the recent case, the trial court found that there was a great relationship between the grandparent and the child, and that the grandparent was a person of good character. The trial court then awarded visitation. The Alabama Supreme Court said without evidence that the child would suffer harm if the relationship was limited or denied, the trial court was without the authority to order visitation over the parent's objections.


