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Aunt T's Kitchen OUICK CAJUN CATFISH

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup nonfat buttermilk
- 2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- 1/2 cup cornmeal
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 4 catfish fillets, (1 1/4 pounds; see Tip)
- 4 lemon wedges

Preparation

1. Preheat broiler. Lightly oil a wire rack large enough to hold fish in a single layer. Place the rack on a baking sheet.

2. Whisk buttermilk and mustard in a medium bowl until smooth. Combine cornmeal, salt and paprika, onion powder, garlic powder, thyme, cayenne pepper and black pepper in a shallow dish. Dip each fillet in the buttermilk mixture, turning to coat. Transfer to the cornmeal mixture, turning to coat completely. Place the fillets on the prepared rack; they should not touch.

3. Broil 4 inches from the heat source until the fish is opaque in the center, about 3 minutes per side. Serve hot with lemon wedges.

CATFISH ALMANDINE

Ingredients

• 1 tablespoon plus 1 1/2 teaspoons extravirgin olive oil, divided



CATFISH

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1/4 cup sliced almonds
- 3 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup low-fat milk
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 pound catfish, cut into 4 portions
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley

Preparation

1. Heat 1 tablespoon oil and butter in a small saucepan over medium heat. Add almonds and garlic and cook until both are just beginning to brown, 1 to 3 minutes. Set aside.

2. Combine milk and egg in a shallow dish. In another shallow dish, combine flour, salt and cayenne. Dip fish in the milk mixture, then in the flour mixture; shake off any excess flour. (Discard any leftover mixtures.)

3. Heat the remaining 1 1/2 teaspoons oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium heat. Add fish and cook until lightly browned and opaque in the center, 4 to 6 minutes per side.

4. Return the almond-garlic sauce to the stove over medium heat. Add lemon juice and heat through, 1 to 2 minutes. Pour the sauce over the fish and sprinkle with parsley.

CATFISH WITH PECAN BROWN BUTTER

Ingredients

- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 4 (6 ounce) catfish fillets
- salt







- fresh ground pepper
- 1 pinch cayenne pepper
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup pecans, halved lengthwise
- 1 finely grated lemon, zest of
- 2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice
- lemon wedge, for serving

Preparation

Melt 2 tablespoons of the butter in a large skillet. Season the catfish fillets with salt and pepper and the cayenne. Coat the catfish fillets lightly with flour, then add them to the skillet and cook over moderately high heat, turning once, until golden brown on both sides and cooked though, about 10 minutes. Transfer the catfish fillets to a platter: tent with foil and keep warm.

Melt the remaining 4 tablespoons of butter in the skillet. Add the pecans and cook over moderately high heat, until the pecans and butter are browned and fragrant, about 3 minutes. Stir in the lemon zest and juice and season with salt. Spoon the pecan butter over the catfish fillets and serve immediately with lemon wedges.

SOUTHERN FRIED CATFISH

Ingredients

4 cups all-purpose flour crab boil seasoning salt, to taste 8 (5 to 6 oz) catfish fillets 1 cup corn meal oil, for frying



Preparation

Heat a fryer or a deep pot halfway filled with oil to 350°. Sprinkle both sides of each catfish with salt





and crab boil seasoning. In a separate bowl, combine the flour and the cornmeal. Dredge the catfish in the flour mixture and place in fryer. Deep fry for approximately 7 to 8 minutes until done. Drain on paper towels.

BAKED CATFISH

Ingredients

- 8 skinned catfish fillets
- 1 cup breadcrumbs
- 1 cup grated parmesan cheese
- 3/4 cup chopped fresh parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1/4 teaspoon dried basil
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/2 lb butter, melted
- lemon wedge
- parsley sprig



Directions

Preheat the oven to 375°F. Lightly coat a 13x9-inch baking dish with oil cooking spray.

Pat the fish drv.

Combine the dry ingredients in a shallow bowl and stir well.

Dip the catfish in the melted butter and roll in the bread crumb mixture.

Arrange the fillets in the prepared baking dish. Bake uncovered for 20-30 minutes or until the fish flakes easily.

Garnish with lemon wedges and parsley sprigs.

Hello everyone,

It's March, and I'm getting excited about the As I'm writing, I'm immersed in one of my favorite annual pastimes......March Madness!!

If you don't know what I'm referring to, it's the NCAA (College) basketball end-of -season tournament to determine the national champion for the 2015-'16 season. This year has been especially entertaining as many of the lower seeded teams are beating the higher seeded ones. I grew up playing a lot of basketball, and I still play at least once a week. One thing that surprises me as I watch the games is that it's very rare to see any of the players wearing protective mouthguards. Personally, I don't play without one. It's not a thick one, but it is enough to absorb the shock if I get hit in the mouth or under the chin which causes the teeth to slam together. I imagine that my patients would rather that I have a full compliment of teeth as I encourage them to maintain their pearly whites!

I was actually talking this week with the goalkeeper on the Northview High School Girls JV soccer team that I help coach about a mouthquard since her father was concerned about her risk of getting hit in the mouth by a ball or opponent. Naturally, she was concerned about not being able to communicate with her teammates if she had a guard in her mouth. I assured her that it doesn't have to be big and bulky. Mouthquards are best if they are custom fitted to the teeth rather than the rather large store-bought boiland-bite ones that are supposedly "one size fits all". The custom guards are made by first getting an impression of the upper teeth at your dental office. From there, a plaster model of your teeth is made, and then a sheet of heated flexible plastic is molded over the model using suction to create a formed fit. The thickness of a finished mouthquard is a minimum of 0.06 inches. So they aren't that obtrusive. If you are an athlete of any age, playing a sport that involves any contact, then YOU need to be wearing a protective mouthquard!! The cost is minimal compared to the cost of having to repair or replace any of your teeth. I guess you could say it would be pure MADNESS to play without one!!
