Separation of Church and State.

A couple of weeks ago, one of our "Speak Out" contributors challenged some of my statements in my July 10th article entitled "Make America Great Again" or "Build Back Better".

I purposely waited and gave much thought regarding a rebuttal because I believe in facts rather than personal opinions. I respect my fellow "Speak Out" contributor's views and her right to freedom of the press. Therefore, my rebuttal will include specific facts and not my personal opinions.

To begin, there is no mention of "separation of church and state" in any founding document including the Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution or any of the Amendments to the Constitution. He reassured this group that a "legislature could 'make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof,' thus building a wall of separation between Church & State."

This phrase is not a cornerstone of the First Amendment. Liberals now state that this phrase is part of our founding documents and use that concept to restrict Christianity because they wish God completely out of our culture. I agree with my fellow contributor that America does not have a national religion. But that does not mean that Christianity can have no influence in American life today as many would have it.

Recent letters have spoken to the difficulty in finding credible journalism.

Unfortunately, every single thing produced by a human person has a bias -- it comes from a specific person, who has the viewpoints they do. Our job as media consumers is to be critical of the content we see, listen to, and read.

One of the best things a news consumer can do is to look for multiple, credible, sources saying the same thing. Be wary of phrases and words that invoke strong emotion or are blatant opinions. Double-check other news outlets for specific details.

News on television must both conform to "between commercials" timeframes and are hosted by networks, funded by commercials. In general, print or audio-only will have more context and less "gimmicky" fear-mongering (because there is not an incentive in keeping you until the next commercial, as exists with video). Aim for a mixture of print, audio, and video -- and as always, corroborate.

Sites like AdFontes Media have actually built huge databases to analyze outlets' balance of fact and opinion, and where they "lean" on the "liberal/conservative" spectrum and have charts for websites, television shows, podcasts and other content. Search for "the Media Bias Chart" if you'd like to see them.

In general, the Associated Press, PBS and NPR are some of the most objective national news sources one can find. If you look up the Media Bias Chart, you'll see them nearest the middle.

Fortunately, we are also home to several local press organizations such as the Mount Morris Shopper, the Livingston County News, the Batavia Daily News, the Warsaw Country Courier, Video News Service, the Batavian, and more.

As local organizations, they are not beholden to large corporate advertisers and network executives; frankly, it's been aggravating to see local reporters, photographers and editors lumped in as "The Media" and painted with the same brush as FOX and MSNBC.

Ultimately we need journalists, because none of us have time to absorb the enormity of material in, say, a Supreme Court argument -- and simply because the majority of us aren't physically present for everything we need or want to know about. We cannot eliminate human bias and are unlikely to reduce hyperbolic clickbait. But by being responsible about what we consume and share, and supporting the organizations doing good journalism, we at least take steps in the right direction.
